

Whereas in pursuance of section 1 of the said Ordinances it was duly declared and notified on February 7, 1908, that if no claim to the land commonly called or known as Helagedarawatta, situate in the village of Timbiriya, in the Medagam pattu korale of the Wellassa division, in the Province of Uva, containing in extent 1 acre and 16 perches, and shown as lot 6i in preliminary plan No. 167 and in the annexed diagram, was made to John George Fraser, Special Officer appointed under section 28 of the said Ordinances within the period of three months from the date specified in the said notice, such land would be declared the property of the Crown, and dealt with on account of the Crown (vide Notice No. 2,949):
