SIR,—IN reply to the Royal Order which Your Excellency was good enough to address to me asking my opinion on the question whether, in virtue of international arrangements, the Island of Newfoundland and the Coast of Labrador have a right to the enjoyment of the benefits of the Second Column of the present Tariff as being British Possessions:

His Majesty the King (whom God preserve!), and in his name the Queen Regent, has been pleased to direct that your Office be informed that it would not be reasonable to refuse to the British Colonies the same commercial treatment that is conceded to the mother country, seeing that England concedes the same commercial treatment to Spanish Colonies as to Spain, and that it must be in consequence of an unintentional omission that this is not stated in the Royal Order of the 29th June.

By Royal Order, communicated to me by the Minister of State, I acquaint Your Excellency with this for your information, and to enable you to give any necessary orders in the direction indicated to the Custom-houses of the Peninsula and the adjacent Islands.

This is published in the *Boletín* for the information of the Custom-houses, in order that the treatment of the Second Column of the present Tariff may be conceded to products of British Possessions, as provided in the preceding Royal Order.

DRAFT ORDINANCES.

M I N U T E.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

An Ordinance to amend the Law relating to Butchers and the Slaughter of Cattle.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the law relating to butchers and the slaughter of cattle, and to provide for the establishment of public slaughter-houses: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

CHAPTER I.

Commencement and short title.

1 This Ordinance shall come into operation on the day of _____, 189____, and may be cited as the "Butchers' Ordinance, 189____."

Repeal.

2 There shall be repealed, as and from the date of this Ordinance coming into operation—

- (a) the Ordinances specified in the schedule A to this Ordinance, to the extent in the third column of that schedule mentioned;
- (b) so much of any other Ordinance as is inconsistent with this Ordinance.

Provided that this repeal shall not affect—

- (a) the past operation of any enactment hereby repealed, nor anything duly done or suffered thereunder; nor
- (b) any right, privilege, obligation, or liability acquired, accrued, or incurred under any enactment hereby repealed; nor
- (c) any penalty, forfeiture, or punishment incurred in respect of any offence committed against any enactment hereby repealed; nor
- (d) any legal proceeding or remedy in respect of any such right, privilege, obligation, liability, penalty, forfeiture, or punishment as aforesaid, and such legal proceeding or remedy may be carried on as if this Ordinance had not passed.

Where any unrepealed Ordinance incorporates or refers to the provisions of the Ordinance hereby repealed, such unrepealed Ordinance shall be deemed to incorporate or refer to the corresponding provisions of this Ordinance.

Interpretation.

3 In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires—

"Government Agent" shall include the government agent for the time being of the province and the assistant government agent for the time being of the district in which anything shall be done or may be required to be done under the provisions of this Ordinance.

"Licensed Butcher" shall include every person who obtains a license under section 5 of this Ordinance.

"Cattle" shall include oxen, bulls, cows, calves, and tame buffaloes.

"Animals" shall include cattle, sheep, goats, and pigs.

"Town" shall mean any town wherein a municipal council or local board of health and improvement has been or may hereafter be established, and any town wherein a police force is now or shall hereafter be established.

- Proper authority.** 4 The "proper authority" hereinafter mentioned shall be, within any town wherein a municipal council or local board of health and improvement has been or may hereafter be established, the chairman of such council or board or any person duly authorised by him in writing, and without the limits of any such town the government agent or any person duly authorised by him in writing.
- License for butchers.** 5 Every person carrying on the trade of a butcher shall apply for and obtain from the proper authority an annual license to carry on such trade. Every such license shall be, as near as may be, in the form B in the schedule hereto, and shall cease to be in force on December 31st next ensuing the date thereof.
- Butchers licensed for towns to give bonds.** 6 Every person before he obtains a license to carry on the trade of a butcher within any town shall, together with two sufficient securities, execute and deliver to the proper authority issuing the license a joint and several bond for a sum not exceeding five hundred rupees, and the said bond and the conditions thereof (which conditions shall be settled by the proper authority) shall be, with such variations as the circumstances require, in the form C in the schedule hereto.
- License may be refused.** 7 It shall be lawful for the proper authority, in the exercise of his discretion, upon just and reasonable grounds, to refuse to issue an annual license under the provisions of this Ordinance.
- Licenses voided on breach of bond.** 8 On any judgment being recovered against any licensed butcher for breach of any of the conditions of the bond entered into by him, the license held by such butcher shall be deemed to be null and void from the date of such judgment.
- Fees for licenses** 9 Every annual license issued to a licensed butcher shall bear a stamp of five rupees, to be supplied to the proper authority by the licensed butcher before the issue of such license.
- Slaughtered cattle to be registered.** 10 Every licensed butcher shall, on the first Monday in every month, register in the office of the proper authority a true and accurate report (as nearly as possible) of the age, sex, colour, marks, and description of all cattle slaughtered by him in the preceding month, and the names and places of abode of the persons from whom the same were purchased or obtained, which said report shall be in the form D in the schedule hereto.
- Where and when animals to be slaughtered.** 11 No licensed butcher shall slaughter any animal at any place other than—
 (a) the place appointed by the proper authority; or
 (b) any public slaughter-house as hereinafter provided; nor between the hours of 6 P.M. and 6 A.M.
- Cattle to be exposed before slaughter.** 12 (1) No licensed butcher shall slaughter any cattle unless he shall have previously exposed the same to public view in some convenient spot appointed by the proper authority for a period of not less than twenty-four hours immediately preceding the time of slaughter.
 (2) No licensed butcher shall slaughter any animal suffering from any disease.
- Penalty on butchers.** 13 Every licensed butcher who commits a breach of any of the provisions of the three preceding sections shall, upon conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees, and in default of payment to imprisonment, either rigorous or simple, for a term not exceeding three calendar months.

CHAPTER II.

SPECIAL LICENSES FOR SLAUGHTERING CATTLE.

- Special license.** 14 It shall not be lawful for any person (not a licensed butcher) to slaughter any cattle unless he shall have obtained a special license from the proper authority for that purpose, which special license shall be, as near as may be, in the form

E in the schedule hereto, and shall bear a stamp of twenty-five cents, such stamp to be supplied to the proper authority by the licensee.

Place and conditions.

15 The person obtaining such special license shall not slaughter cattle except at the place named in such license or under any condition therein set forth.

Penalty.

16 Every person (not a licensed butcher) who shall slaughter cattle without a special license, or having obtained a special license shall slaughter cattle at a place other than a place named in such license, or in breach of any condition therein set forth, shall, upon conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees, and in default of payment to imprisonment, either rigorous or simple, for a term not exceeding three calendar months.

Notice of slaughter.

17 (1) No person shall slaughter cattle without giving forty-eight hours previous notice of his intention so to do to the person duly authorised by the proper authority to receive such notice.

Contents of such notice.

(2) Every such notice shall be in writing, and shall state, as nearly as possible, the age, sex, colour, marks, and description of each head of cattle, and shall be signed by the owner of the cattle intended to be slaughtered, and shall have attached to it a voucher or certificate of its ownership signed by the village headman.

Authorised person to inquire into truth of notice.

18 The duly authorised person on receiving such notice, shall make inquiry into the truth thereof, and, if correct, shall certify its correctness on the back thereof under his signature, which shall be a sufficient warrant for the slaughter of the cattle therein mentioned; and any duly authorised person who shall falsely certify, or shall neglect or refuse duly to certify such notice, shall, upon conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees, or to imprisonment, either rigorous or simple, for any period not exceeding three months.

Penalty.

19 Every person who shall slaughter cattle without giving the notice required by section 17, or who shall attach to such notice a voucher or certificate which is false, and every person who, having given such notice, shall slaughter cattle without having obtained from the duly authorised person the certificate required by section 18, shall, upon conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees, and in default of payment to imprisonment, rigorous or simple, for a term not exceeding three months.

Unlawful possession of beef.

20 Any person in whose possession shall be found any beef which he shall not be able satisfactorily to account for shall, upon conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees, notwithstanding that no owner shall appear to prosecute or claim the same as his property.

CHAPTER III.

PUBLIC SLAUGHTER-HOUSES.

Public slaughter-houses to be proclaimed.

21 Whenever a building shall have been erected for the purposes of a public slaughter-house within any town, and such building shall have been certified to the Governor by the proper authority as sufficient for the purposes of a public slaughter-house in such town, the Governor may, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, declare and proclaim such building to be a public slaughter-house.

Proper authority may make regulations.

22 It shall be lawful for the proper authority to make, alter, amend, or revoke rules and regulations in reference to public slaughter-houses and to places appointed for the slaughtering of cattle, as follows:—

- (a) as to the establishment, regulation, management, and general discipline thereof;
- (b) as to the fees to be charged for the use of the slaughter-house or for slaughtering;
- (c) as to the destroying or other disposal of diseased animals brought to a slaughter-house.

Provided that such rules and regulations shall not be contrary to any of the provisions of this Ordinance. Provided

also that no rules or regulations or alterations, amendments, or revocations of any rule or regulation shall have any effect until the same is confirmed by the Governor in Executive Council, and that notice of such confirmation shall be published in the *Government Gazette* in the English, Sinhalese, and Tamil languages respectively; and such rules and regulations when so confirmed and published shall be as valid and effectual as if they had been herein enacted.

Diseased animals to be seized and destroyed.

23 It shall be lawful for the person having the charge and control of a public slaughter-house to seize or cause to be seized all unhealthy and diseased animals, and to have the same destroyed or otherwise disposed of as may be directed by regulation.

Penalty for breach of regulation.

24 Any person guilty of any breach of any rule or regulation made in pursuance of this Ordinance shall be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees, or, in default of payment, to imprisonment, simple or rigorous, for any period not exceeding three months.

Municipal councils and local boards entitled to fees.

25 The municipal council shall be entitled to take and receive for the municipal fund all sums paid for fees and stamp duties for licenses by the inhabitants of the municipality under this Ordinance, and the local board of health and improvement of any town shall be entitled to take and receive for the local fund all such like sums paid by the inhabitants of such town.

"Compensation shall be allowed to executors and administrators by way of commission as well on property not sold but retained by the heirs as on property sold by such executors and administrators, at such rate not exceeding a

half per cent., and on cash found in the estate and on property specially bequeathed at such rate not exceeding a quarter per cent., as the court shall, after taking into consideration the circumstances of each particular case with reference to the trouble incurred by such executors or administrators, determine. In no case shall a larger sum than five thousand rupees be allowed to any executor or administrator as such compensation, unless it shall be made apparent to the court that such unusual trouble has fallen upon him as to entitle him, in the opinion of the court, to receive further remuneration."

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

An Ordinance to amend the Ordinance No. 3 of 1890, intituled
"An Ordinance to consolidate and amend the Law relating
to Stamp Duty."

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Ordinance No. 3 of 1890, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited for all purposes as "The Stamp Amendment Ordinance, 1893," and this Ordinance and the principal Ordinance may be cited collectively as "The Stamp Ordinances 1890 and 1893."

2 For section 61 of the principal Ordinance the following section shall be substituted, viz.:—

"The commissioner shall, in the month of December of each year, and not later than the fifteenth day of the month, give notice, by publication in the *Government Gazette*, of the rate in Ceylon currency at which for the purposes of this Ordinance the pound sterling, franc, and dollar shall be calculated during the year next ensuing. And when in any instrument any money is stated or expressed in pounds sterling, francs, or dollars, the value in Ceylon currency of such pounds sterling, francs, or dollars, for the purposes of this Ordinance, shall be calculated according to the rate so notified by the commissioner. And when in any instrument any money is stated or expressed in other than Ceylon currency, pounds sterling, francs, or dollars, the value of such money in Ceylon currency, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, shall be calculated according to the current rate of exchange on the day of the date of the instrument.

"(1) Instead of a schedule on stamped paper being annexed to any process issued by a court as required by section 16 of "The Fiscals Ordinance, 1867," adhesive stamps of the proper amount of fees and charges established under section 14 of that Ordinance shall be affixed to each process, and such stamps shall be cancelled and pricked or punctured by the proper officer of court in the manner prescribed by this Ordinance.

Commencement of Ordinance.

“ Provided that such fees and charges in respect of processes issued by district courts shall in no case exceed the rates specified in Part IV. of schedule B hereto.

“ Provided also that no such fees and charges shall be levied in respect of any process issued by courts of requests.

“(2) Every process which has been issued by the district court and returned by the officer to whom it was directed shall, on being reissued by such court, be liable to the fees and charges prescribed for the issuing of such process, and such fees and charges shall be recovered by means of stamps affixed to such process, and such stamps shall be cancelled and pricked or punctured by the proper officer of court in manner prescribed by the preceding sub-section.

“(3) It shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to prescribe the manner in which the amount of the fees and charges which may be due for and on account of processes issued or reissued by district courts in the first instance unstamped shall be recovered and brought to account as revenue.”

4 Whenever the district judge is satisfied that any person resident within the jurisdiction of his court has taken possession and in any manner of any part of the estate of any person deceased without obtaining probate of his will or letters of administration of his estate within six months after his decease, or within two months after the determination of any action or legal proceeding respecting the will or the rights to letters of administration, if there be any such action or legal proceeding that is not ended within four months after the death, the district judge shall order the person taking possession and administering as aforesaid to file in court an account of the estate of the deceased and of its value, and to pay double the amount of duty as would have been payable if probate and administration had been obtained, or to show cause to the contrary, and on cause being shown such order shall be made as seems just. The payment of any sum of money ordered by the district judge to be paid under this section shall be enforced by writ (free of stamp duty) of execution against the property and person of such person and against the estate of the deceased.

5 In addition to the affidavits, affirmations, and declarations exempted from stamp duty in Part I. of schedule B of the principal Ordinance, all affidavits, affirmations, or declarations required to be made under the provisions of “The Carriers Ordinance, 1885,” or the Customs Ordinance No. 17 of 1869 shall be, and the same are hereby exempted from stamp duty.

6 In addition to the duty imposed by the principal Ordinance, every gift or deed of gift of any property reserving to the grantor any life-interest or estate in the property, and every settlement or deed of settlement whereby the settlor reserves to himself a life-interest in the property settled, and every deed of gift granted under the local laws of the Kandyan provinces, shall be liable to a further stamp duty of 5 per cent. on the value of such property.

7 For Parts II. and III. of schedule B of the principal Ordinance the Parts numbered II. and III. in the schedule hereunto annexed shall be substituted.

8 This Ordinance shall come into operation from and after such date as the Governor shall appoint by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*.

No party shall be allowed to take any proceedings on or by virtue of any decree or judgment without first taking a copy thereof.

Provided also that no Attorney-General, Solicitor-General, Crown Counsel, or other Government officer suing, or being sued, or intervening in any suit *virtute officii*, and no person duly admitted to sue, defend, or intervene as a pauper, shall be required to use any stamps in civil proceedings. But if judgment for costs shall be given in favour of such Attorney-General, Solicitor-General, Crown Counsel, or other Government officer, or such pauper, the value of such stamps as would have been used by him if he had not been allowed to proceed without using stamps, or the value of such part thereof as shall be decreed by the said judgment, shall be paid by the party against whom such judgment shall have been given, to the Commissioner of Stamps, or to the secretary of the District Court or clerk of the Court of Requests in which such suit shall have been decided for and on behalf of such Commissioner; and in failure of payment the said Court shall proceed to recover the same in the manner directed in section 55 of this Ordinance in regard to pauper suits.

And no summons, warrant of arrest, or in execution, nor any other citation or writ whatsoever, which has once been issued out of the Court and returned by the officer to whom it was directed, shall, on any pretext whatever, be re-issued, unless any such process has been returned not served or executed, by reason that the party could not be found, or had left the jurisdiction of the Court, or by reason that no property of the debtor or none sufficient to satisfy the exigency of any writ of execution could be found. Provided further that in respect of any summons to a witness, the same may be re-issued at the discretion of the Court.

Provided also, that in appeals to the Supreme Court the appellant shall deliver to the secretary of the District Court or clerk of the Court of Requests, together with his petition of appeal, the proper stamp for the decree or order of the Supreme Court and certificate in appeal which may be required for such appeal.

NOTICES UNDER THE FOREST ORDINANCE.

WHEREAS by the sixth section of Ordinance No. 10 of 1885 it is enacted that whenever it is proposed to constitute any land a reserved forest, notice thereof shall be published in the Government Gazette—

- (a) specifying, as nearly as possible, the situation and limits of such land ;
(b) declaring that it is proposed to constitute such land a reserved forest ;

Philip Arthur Templer, Government Agent for the Central Province, by virtue of the powers in me vested by the Ordinance No. 4 of 1887, and with the sanction of His Excellency the Governor, do hereby declare that if no claim to the said land by or on behalf of any person able to establish a title thereto is made to me on or before the 31st day of December, 1893, the same will be resumed by the Crown in terms of the 2nd section of the said Ordinance.

WHEREAS by the 10th section of the Ordinance No. 8 of 1866, intituled "An Ordinance to provide against the spread of Contagious Diseases in this Island," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time to make such regulations or orders as may be necessary and expedient to prevent the introduction or spread of infectious diseases in the Colony:

And whereas smallpox is prevailing in the Badulla District whereby it has become necessary that precautionary measures should be taken for securing the public health of the Province of Uva:

The following regulations made by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the power and authority vested in him under and by virtue of the said Ordinance No. 8 of 1866, and in pursuance of every other power and authority vested in him in this behalf, are published for general information: and such regulations shall have effect and operation from the date hereof.

REGULATIONS made by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the provisions of the 10th section of the Ordinance No. 8 of 1866, intituled "An Ordinance to provide against the spread of Contagious Diseases in this Island."

1. The following officers shall be deemed "authorised persons" under and for the purposes of carrying out these regulations in their respective towns, places, or districts as hereinafter specified:—

The Government Agent of the Province.

The Police Magistrate.

The Senior Officer of Police.

The Chairman of the Board of Health (if any) or (in his absence) the Secretary of the Board of Health (if any).

The Assistant Government Agent of the District.

The Colonial Surgeon of the Province.

Any Government Medical Officer of the District.

2. It shall be lawful for any authorised person to cause persons infected with smallpox or other infectious or contagious disease in any house or place hereunder described to be removed to some public hospital or other place provided by Government:—

(1) In any house or place in which goods are exposed for sale.

(2) In any house or place of public resort.

(3) In any building in which there are no means of isolating the patients from the other inmates, or in any building where the retention of the patient is likely to prove a source of danger to others.

Provided that it shall be competent for any such authorised person as aforesaid, in case the removal of any person so infected in any house or place in which goods are exposed for sale is objected to, and the house or place is not otherwise open to objection, to allow the patient to be retained, on condition, however, that the sale of goods shall not be carried on in such house or place during such time as any person shall remain so infected in such house or place.

Provided further, that it shall be lawful for any such authorised person as aforesaid to allow any patient to be removed to any locality which such patient or his or her friends may choose, and to which the Medical authorities of the town or place, if any, do not object, instead of to the public hospital or place provided by Government.

3. Except as provided by these regulations, and except as provided by the said Ordinance No. 8 of 1866, it shall not be lawful for any person to remove or assist in removing any person suffering from cholera or other infectious or contagious disease, from the house or place in which such person shall be to any other house or place, without the sanction in writing of some duly authorised person.

4. It shall be lawful for any authorised person to prohibit the removal for interment of the corpses of persons who have died of any contagious disease along any particular thoroughfare, and to prescribe the thoroughfares leading to the place of interment along which such corpses shall be carried. Information of such prohibition shall be given by notice in writing under the hand of some authorised person, which shall be posted in two or more conspicuous places in the prohibited thoroughfare, and by publication in such other way as may be deemed necessary by such authorised person.

5. These regulations shall come into operation on this date, and shall continue in force until June 30, 1893, or to such other time as the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall extend the same.
