WHEREAS the building hereinafter described has been erected for the purpose of public slaughter house, and under the provisions of section 22 of the Butchers' Ordinance, No. 9 of 1893, was certified to the Governor by the "proper authority," to wit, the Government Agent of the Eastern Province, to be sufficient for the purposes of a public slaughter-house:

On or before January 15 in each year every owner of cattle shall give to the Police Vidahn of the village wherein he resides a list of all the cattle in his possession, showing the sex, age, colour, and brandmarks of each, distinguishing buffaloes from black cattle. Any cattle owner failing to furnish a list within the time specified shall be liable to a fine of 50 cents a head of all cattle not reported by him, and if such owner fails to furnish the list when thereafter demanded by the Police Vidahn, he shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 10.

SCHEDULE.

- 1. Examiners, date, and place of examination.—The examiners shall be one or more officers of the Survey Department appointed annually by the Surveyor-General.
- 2. The examination shall be held during the first quarter of each year. A notice of the time and place at which the examination will be held shall be published one month beforehand in the Government Gazette.
- 3. Subjects of examination.—The examination shall comprise the following subjects:—

Mathematics.—Algebra up to quadratic equations, plane trigonometry, and the mensuration of surfaces and solids.

Drawing.—Setting out, plotting, tracing, and office work, including a report on a survey.

Field work.—Chain surveying, theodolite surveying, and levelling, including the adjustments of the theodolite and level and setting out curves.

- 4. (a) Any candidate found referring to notes or books or to be in communication with a surveyor whilst under examination shall be debarred from proceeding with it and considered to have failed in all subjects.
- (b) Candidates shall produce instruments in good order, and no excuse will be admitted on account of defective instruments during examination.
- (c) No candidate shall be allowed to compete who presents himself ten minutes after the appointed time.
- (d) Adjustments.—Forty minutes shall be allowed for the correct adjustment of each instrument.
 - (e) The maximum collimation error allowed shall be 0.01 foot at two chains.
- (f) Candidates who fail in adjustments shall be debarred from taking further part in the examination.
- (g) Field work.—During the progress of field work, the examiner shall inspect the candidates on the ground.
- (h) Candidates shall be expected to be at work in the field between the hours fixed by the examiner.
- (i) Field and level books should be kept clearly and in ink or the work will not be accepted. Each page must be numbered, paged, and dated, and full reference properly made. No erasures shall be allowed. Mistakes should be corrected so that the original figures are plainly visible, and a short explanation written opposite the correction. Level books must be clearly referenced and properly reduced.
- (j) Field and level books must be new, and must bear the name of the candidate neatly printed on the outside of the cover.

The field book must contain—

- (a) The record of the survey.
- (b) Report on the same.
 - (c) Co-ordinates.
 - (d) Computation of areas.

The level book must contain-

- (a) Flying levels.
- (b) Longitudinal section.
- (c) Check levels.
- (d) Cross sections.
- (e) Computation of earthwork.

No loose sheets shall be accepted. All field and level books must be delivered to the person appointed to receive them after work is over for the day. They should be called for the next morning by the candidates at the time fixed by the examiner.

(k) Surveying.—The largest angular misclosure allowed shall be one minute per mile of traverse. The largest misclosure allowed in chainage shall be five links per mile.

- (l) Levelling.—The largest misclosure allowed in levelling shall be 0.06 foot per mile.
- (m) The closing readings must in all cases be taken only in the examiner's presence or of some person deputed by him.
- (n) Office work.—Plans and sections must be accurately plotted. They should be neat and well drawn. All lines must be drawn with the drawing or ruling pen, crow-quills being used for lettering only. Survey plans must be plotted to the scale of one chain to an inch. Two working days shall be allowed for drawing up the plans.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended April 9, 1910.

Births.—The total births registered in the City of Colombo in the week were 64 (1 European, 9 Burghers, 39 Sinhalese, 7 Tamils, 8 Moors, 0 Malays, and 0 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1910, viz., 185,704) was 18.0, as against 24.4 in the preceding week, 21.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 66 (0 Europeans, 5 Burghers, 30 Sinhalese, 13 Tamils, 15 Moors, 2 Malays, and 1 Other). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 18.5, as against 24.1 in the previous week, 34.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 33.7 the weekly average for last year. This is the lowest mortality in any week since the beginning of 1906.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 66 total deaths, 13 were of infants under one year of age, as against 22 in the preceding week, 36 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 27 the average for last year.

Still Births.—The number of still births registered during the week was 5.

Selected Causes of Death.—Eight deaths were registered from Pneumonia (against 10 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year), of which 2 each were in St. Paul's, Kotahena, and Maradana hospitals, and 1 each in San Sebastian and New Bazaar. Three deaths were registered from Bronchitis.

- 2. Six deaths were registered from *Phthisis* (against 7 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year), of which 2 were in Kollupitiya, and 1 each in San Sebastian, St. Paul's, Kotahena, and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals).
- 3. Six deaths were registered from Enteritis (including 1 infant), 6 from Infantile Convulsions, 3 Tetanus (2 infants), 3 Starvation (2 infants), 3 Old Age, 3 Nephritis, and 23 from Other Causes.
- 4. Two deaths were registered from *Enteric Fever* in Kota'iena, against 3 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year. There were 4 cases reported during the week, against 12 in the previous week.
- 5. Three cases of *Measles* were reported, against 2 in the previous week; and 16 of *Chickenpox*, against 76 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.7°, against 81.2° in the preceding week, and 84.8° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.900 in., against 29.902 in. in the preceding week and 29.922 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1.95 in., against 2.66 in., in the preceding week and 0.07 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
