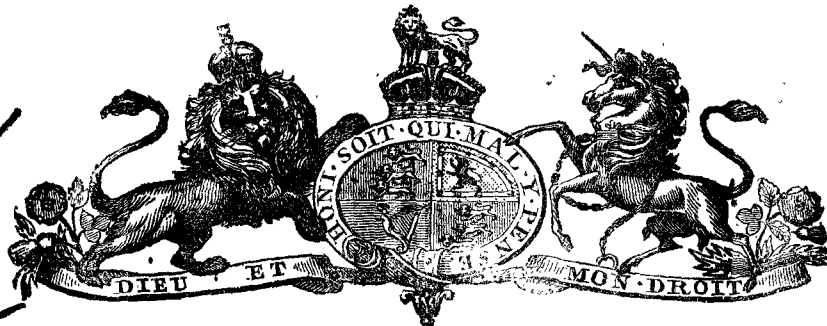

IT is hereby notified for general information that the Governor has been pleased to order that the rules which regulate the giving of guarantees against loss on the establishment of new Telegraph Offices shall in future be as follows:—

(1) If the new Telegraph Office applied for, in the estimate of the Postmaster-General and Director of Telegraphs, is likely to pay its expenses within five years of its opening, no guarantee shall be required.

(2) If the new Telegraph Office in the estimate of the Postmaster-General and Director of Telegraphs will not pay its expenses within five years, a guarantee shall be required.

(3) Guarantees given under the preceding paragraph shall be—

(a) For five years.

(b) For half the estimated loss.

(4) The sum that the guarantor shall be required to pay on the guarantee shall be half of the annual actual loss.

(5) The actual loss shall be calculated on the following basis :—

Expenditure.

(1) Capital cost of the telegraph line.

(2) Interest on same.

(3) Maintenance and depreciation.

(4) Cost of fittings and furniture.

(5) Interest on same.

(6) Maintenance and depreciation.

(7) Additional staff.

(8) Administrative charges.

Revenue.

(9) Total value of all Inland telegrams despatched, including official free messages, but excluding telegraph service messages.

(10) Total of Ceylon's share on Indian and Foreign telegrams despatched.

(6) The payment on the actual loss may be reduced by the sum representing the profit accrued to Government in previous years, on the working of telegraph offices in the same district, which received the traffic diverted into the new office.

THE following regulations made by the Chairman, Local Board, Moratuwa, under the provisions of section 9 of "The Rabies Ordinance, 1893," and approved by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, are hereby published for general information.

Regulations framed under Section 9 of the Rabies Ordinance, No. 7 of 1893.

(a) Every owner of a dog shall, after publication has been made by the Local Authority that an outbreak of rabies is apprehended at any place within his jurisdiction, cause such dog to be muzzled or led by a chain when in any public road or place within such limits and for such period as shall be notified in such publication. The muzzle shall be so constructed as to render it impossible for the dog while wearing the same to bite any person or animal, but not so as to prevent the dog from breathing freely or lapping water.

(b) A dog shall not be considered effectually controlled unless muzzled as above, or led by some competent person by means of a collar and chain, both of which shall be securely fastened to the dog's neck.

(c) Any dog found in any public road or place unprovided with a muzzle, or not under control by means of a collar and chain, may be seized by any Police Officer or any person duly appointed for the purpose by the Local Authority and removed to the nearest dog shelter or slaughter-house, there to be dealt with in the following manner :—

(1) If the dog is affected with or suspected of rabies, it shall be forthwith slaughtered.

(2) If the dog is not affected with or suspected of rabies, it shall be detained in the dog shelter or slaughter-house. Provided that where the owner or person having charge of a dog so detained is known, the Local Authority or some person duly authorized by him shall forthwith cause notice to be given to such owner or person of the fact of the dog having been so seized and detained, and the dog shall, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the breach of these regulations, be given up to such owner or person on payment of the reasonable expenses of detention.

(3) If the dog so seized and detained shall not have been claimed by such owner or person within three days after the seizure, or where such owner or person is known, within two days after the aforesaid notice has been given, the Local Authority shall cause the dog to be slaughtered or otherwise disposed of in such manner as the Local Authority deems expedient.

(d) The owner or person in charge for the time being of any dog which shall have been seized and detained under these regulations shall be liable to pay to the Local Authority the following charge :—

For detention for each dog 10 cents, and such charge shall be recoverable if the dog is not affected with or suspected of rabies by the sale thereof, unless the said charge shall have been paid before sale by the owner or person in charge of the dog. Otherwise the charge shall be recoverable in the manner provided by section 1 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1873, in respect to the order in which the property of public defaulters may be seized and sold.

THE following by-laws regulating bakeries and the sale of milk in Hambantota and Tangalla made by the Sanitary Board of Hambantota District, under and in pursuance of section 9 E (2) of "The Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance, 1892," as amended by section 2 of Ordinance No. 30 of 1909, and confirmed by the Governor and the Executive Council, are published for general information.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. Every bakery shall be well ventilated and well lighted, and the walls thereof plastered with lime mortar and whitewashed, the floor cemented, and drainage sufficiently provided.
2. No bakery shall be within 30 feet of any cesspit or latrine, nor in a position where bad odours shall reach it.
3. No place used as a bakery shall be used for any other purpose whatsoever.
4. All utensils and other furniture shall be kept clean.
5. The flour, water, and other materials used in the manufacture of bread shall be good and wholesome.
6. All refuse and dirt in and about the premises shall be swept off and drains well flushed.
7. No person suffering from a contagious or loathsome disease or has recently been in attendance on such person, or who is unwashed or is otherwise unclean, shall be employed in a bakery.
8. Every bakery and the management and conduct of the business shall be always open and subject to examination by the Chairman of the Sanitary Board, and all persons acting under the authority of the said Chairman.
9. It shall not be lawful for any person, within three months of these by-laws coming into force, to sell or supply milk to any person or persons within the towns of Tangalla and Hambantota, if his name and place of residence and every place used for the production, deposit, or distribution of such milk are not entered upon the register of the Sanitary Board to be kept for that purpose.
10. It shall not be lawful for any person selling or supplying milk to any person resident within the towns of Tangalla and Hambantota to store, keep, or deposit any milk in any room used for sleeping or dwelling in or in any other place or way calculated to render such milk unwholesome or injurious to health.
11. It shall not be lawful for any person to mix water with any milk intended for sale within the towns of Tangalla or Hambantota.

"THE GAME PROTECTION ORDINANCE, 1909."

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR in Executive Council being satisfied that the Association known as "The Ceylon Fishing Club" has made adequate arrangements for preserving and protecting trout in the waters mentioned in the schedule hereto has been pleased, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 16 (1) of the above-named Ordinance, to concede to the Ceylon Fishing Club the exclusive right of taking trout in the waters specified in the said schedule and in all streams falling into such waters.

His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, in exercise of the power vested in him as aforesaid, has also been pleased to rescind (a) so much of the Notification dated December 16, 1909, and published in the issue of the *Government Gazette* dated December 17, 1909, as specifies the streams and waters in which the exclusive right to take trout is conceded to the Ceylon Fishing Club, and (b) the whole of the Notification dated March 8, 1910, and published in the issue of the *Government Gazette* dated March 11, 1910.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended May 7, 1910.

Births.—The total births registered were 92 (2 Europeans, 6 Burghers, 60 Sinhalese, 11 Tamils, 8 Moors, 3 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1910, viz., 185,704) was 25·8, as against 16·6 in the preceding week, 22·0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25·1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 89 (3 Europeans, 4 Burghers, 46 Sinhalese, 18 Tamils, 13 Moors, 2 Malays, and 3 Others), including the deaths of a town resident who died in the Enteric Hospital at Kanatta. The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 25·0, as against 19·6 in the previous week; 33·8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 33·7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 89 total deaths, 17 were of infants under one year of age, as against 15 in the preceding week, 23 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 27 the average for last year.

Still Births.—The number of still births registered during the week was 5.

Selected Causes of Death.—Eleven deaths were registered from *Pneumonia* (against 5 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year), of which 3 were in Kotahena, 2 each in San Sebastian, Maradana hospitals, and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and 1 each in Pettah and St. Paul's. Five deaths were registered from *Bronchitis*.

2. Ten deaths were registered from *Phthisis* (against 9 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year), of which 4 were in Maradana hospitals, 3 in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and 1 each in New Bazaar, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya.

3. Eleven deaths were registered from *Infantile Convulsions*, 7 from *Diarrhoea*, 4 from *Tetanus* (including 2 infants), 3 *Dysentery*, 3 *Diabetes Mellitus*, and 28 from *Other Causes*.

4. Seven deaths were registered from *Enteric Fever*, against 3 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year, 2 in Kotahena, and 1 each in Pettah, San Sebastian, St. Paul's, Maradana hospitals, and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals). There were 12 cases reported during the week, against 7 in the previous week.

5. Three cases of *Measles* were reported, against 5 in the previous week; and 32 of *Chickenpox*, against 39 in the previous week.

State of Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82·5°, against 82·3° in the preceding week and 81·3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·941 in., against 29·937 in. in the preceding week and 29·851 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·88 in., against 0·15 in. in the preceding week and 3·06 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
