THE VILLAGE COMMUNITIES' ORDINANCE, No. 24 OF 1889.

T is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 7 of the above-named Ordinance, and with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to approve of the following rule, which has been made, under the provisions of sections 6 (1) and 6 (22) of the said Ordinance, by the Village Committees elected by the inhabitants of the chief headmen's divisions of Udunuwara, Yatinuwara, Tumpane, Harispattu, Pata Dumbara, Uda Dumbara, Pata Hewaheta, Udapalata, and Uda Bulatgama, in the District of Kandy; Matale North, Matale South, and Matale East, in the District of Matale; and Uda Hewaheta, Walapane, and Kotmale, in the District of Nuwara Eliya, Central Province, and the same are published for general information.

RULE REFERRED TO.

Every owner or occupier of land in which a private well or pit is situated shall protect such well or pit with a wall or fence at least $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet high, and shall cause such well to be cleaned at least once in every year. If any person convicted under this rule fails to so protect or cleanse such well or pit, the President or Chairman of the Village Committee shall direct the village headman to cause such works as may be necessary for this purpose to be carried out, and the expenses incurred shall be recovered from the person so convicted.

Rule REFERRED TO.

18 A. Where a defendant is a person of doubtful character. or whose antecedents are unknown to the local police or headmen, the President or Chairman may require such person to enter into a recognizance substantially in the Form D, with or without sureties at the discretion of the President or Chairman, to appear at the nearest identification office.

T is hereby notified for general information that the Governor has been pleased to order that the rules which regulate the giving of guarantees against loss on the establishment of new Telegraph Offices shall in future be as follows :--

(1) If the new Telegraph Office applied for, in the estimate of the Postmaster-General and Director of Telegraphs, is likely to pay its expenses within five years of its opening, no guarantee shall be required.

(2) If the new Telegraph Office in the estimate of the Postmaster-General and Director of Telegraphs will not pay its expenses within five years, a guarantee shall be required.

(3) Guarantees given under the preceding paragraph shall be-

(a) For five years.

(b) For half the estimated loss.

(4) The sum that the guarantor shall be required to pay on the guarantee shall be half of the annual actual loss.

(5) The actual loss shall be calculated on the following basis :---

(1) Capital cost of the telegraph line.

(2) Interest on same.

(3) Maintenance and depreciation.

(4) Cost of fittings and furniture.

(5) Interest on same.

(6) Maintenance and depreciation.

(7) Additional staff.

(8) Administrative charges.

Revenue.

- (9) Total value of all Inland telegrams despatched, including official free messages, but excluding telegraph service messages.
- (10) Total of Ceylon's share on Indian and Foreign telegrams despatched.

(6) The payment on the actual loss may be reduced by the sum representing the profit accrued to Government in previous years, on the working of telegraph offices in the same district, which received the traffic diverted into the new office.

CHAPTER XIX. A.

Common Lodging Houses.

396 A. Register.--A register of all common lodging houses shall be kept by the Chairman of the Municipal Council in the Form P in the Appendix hereto.

396 B. Registration of Houses.—Before a house can be registered as a common lodging house, an application must be made to the Chairman in the Form Q in the Appendix hereto setting forth the situation of the house, the number of the rooms to be set apart for lodgers, and the cubic capacity of each room so set apart, and for this purpose the schedule or form will be furnished by the Chairman.

396 c. Registration of Houses.—Any house to be registered as a common lodging house must be substantially built and in a good state of repair, the floors must be paved with tiles or cement concrete or with lime concrete rendered with one inch of Portland cement, and all the rooms which are to be used as sleeping rooms must be on all sides above the level of the ground immediately surrounding the houses. The house drains must be in good order, and constructed in accordance with the by-laws regulating house drainage, there must be adequate kitchen, ablution, privy, urinal, and ash-bin accommodation to the satisfaction of the Chairman ; and, unless when the supply of water is constant, there must be proper cisterns for the storage of water.

396 D. Licensing of Keepers.—Before any person can be licensed as a keeper of a common lodging house, an application must be made to the Chairman, and such application must be accompanied by a certificate of character from three or more householders—to be approved of by the Chairman—who shall give security for the carrying out of the regulations by the licensed keeper.

396 E. Licensing of Keepers.—When the Chairman is satisfied with the character of an applicant for a license to keep a common lodging house, he may issue a license to such applicant accordingly. The license shall state the number of persons which each room in the common lodging house is registered to accommodate, and should more than that number be found in any room at any time, the keeper of the common lodging house shall be guilty of an offence. Provided that in reckoning the said number two children under twelve years of age shall be counted as one person.

396 r. Reduction of the Number of Lodgers.—The keeper of a common lodging house shall reduce the number of lodgers in any room of his common lodging house upon receiving notice in writing from the Chairman stating the cause for making such reduction, and the period for which it shall continue in force.

396 G. Affixing Sign Boards, &c.—The keeper of a common lodging house shall affix and keep in a conspicuous position on the outside of his common lodging house a board having painted on it in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil in legible white letters and characters not less than two inches long, on a black ground, the words "Licensed Lodging House." He shall also affix and keep in a conspicuous place at the entrance to each room a board having painted on it in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil the number of persons the room is registered to accommodate.

396 H. Separation of Sexes.—The keeper of a common lodging house shall not permit males and females above ten years of age respectively to occupy the same sleeping apartment, except in the cases of husband and wife, and parents and children, and he shall not allow any person to occupy his house for immoral purposes.

396 I. Good Order.—The keeper of a common lodging house shall not knowingly permit persons of bad character to lodge in his house, and he shall maintain and enforce good order and decorum therein; and he shall also keep a register of the name, occupation, and native place of each lodger.

396 J. Ventilation.—The keeper of the common lodging house shall cause the windows of each of the sleeping rooms to be kept open to their full width for at least four hours each day, unless prevented by inclement weather.

: 396 K. Cleansing and Limewashing.—The keeper of a common lodging house shall cause the internal walls and ceilings of every part of his house to be thoroughly cleansed and limewashed during the third, sixth, ninth, and twelfth months of the year.

396 L. *Cleanliness, &c.*—The keeper of a common lodging house shall at all times . keep his premises in a clean and wholesome condition, and the fittings of the sleeping rooms shall be maintained by him in a thorough state of repair. He shall cause every room, passage, and stair to be thoroughly swept at least once a day.

396 M. Cleanliness, &c.—The keeper of a common lodging house shall cause all filth and house refuse or other offensive matter to be removed from his premises daily.

396 N. Infectious, Contagious, and Communicable Diseases.—If any person in a common lodging house becomes ill from any infectious, contagious, or communicable disease, the keeper of such common lodging house shall forthwith give notice thereof to the Municipal Inspector in whose ward the lodging house is situated, or to the nearest Police Station, or to the Chairman; and the keeper of such common lodging house shall cause the house to be vacated, and shall allow the bedding, clothing, and other articles used by the infected person to be destroyed or disinfected, and the house to be funigated, disinfected, and limewashed at the public expense in such manner as the Chairman may direct.

The keeper of such lodging house shall not receive any lodger until the premises shall have been inspected and certified by the Medical Officer of Health or his Assistant as free from infection.

396 o. Privy Accommodation.—Privy accommodation in the premises shall be under the dry-earth system, and if the Chairman deems necessary, a day cooly will be specially attached thereto. There shall be one standard bucket at least for every 12 lodgers. Provided that should the system of water carriage be introduced, the privy accommodation shall be such as the Chairman shall direct, and in all cases the privy accommodation shall be provided by the keeper of the common lodging house.

396 p. Water Service.—The premises shall be provided with water service from the reservoir at the expense of the keeper of the common lodging house.

396 Q. Inspection.—The premises shall be subject to inspection at all hours during day or night by Municipal Officers or by Police Officers not below the rank of Inspector.

396 R. Definitions.—A common lodging house is (a) any house or part thereof where persons not being members of the same family—to the number of ten and upwards—are housed.

(b) Any permanent structure in which employers of labour house their employés other than domestic servants or shopmen.

The keeper of a common lodging house is any person licensed to keep a common lodging house.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended May 14, 1910.

Births.—The total births registered were 99 (0 Europeans, 15 Burghers, 43 Sinhalese, 19 Tamils, 16 Moors, 4 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1910, viz., 185,704) was 27 ·8, as against 25 ·8 in the preceding week, 24 ·6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25 ·1 the weekly average for last year.

average for last year. Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 104 (2 Europeans, 2 Burghers, 36 Sinhalese, 37. Tamils, 19 Moors, 1 Malay, mand 7 Others), including the death of a town resident who died in the Enteric Hospital at Kanatta. The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 29.2, as against 25.0 in the previous week, 28.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 33.7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.--Of the 104 total deaths, 22 were of infants under one year of ago, as against 17 in the preceding week, 23 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 27 the average for last year.

Still Births.-The number of still births registered during the week was 3.

Selected Causes of Death.—Seventeen deaths were registered from Pneumonia (against 11 in the previous week and To the weekly average for last year), of which 5 were in Kotahena, 3 in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 2 each in Maradana hospitals and Slave Island, and 1 each in Pettah, San Sebastian, St. Paul's, New Bazaar, and Kollupitiya, &deaths were registered from Bronchitis.

2. Thirteen deaths were registered from *Phthisis* (against 10 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year), of which 4 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 3 in Maradana hospitals, 2 each in Fort and Galle Face Ward and St. Paul's, and 1 each in New Bazaar and Slave Island.

Ward and St. Paul's, and 1 each in New Bazaar and Slave Island. 3. Nine deaths were registered from *Diarrhea* (including 4 infants), 7 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 6 from *Enteritie*, 5 Old Age, 3 Debility (2 infants), 3 Worms, and 31 from Other Causes.

4. Six deaths were registered from *Enteric Fevr* (against 7 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year), of which 3 were in St. Paul's, 2 in Slave Island, and 1 in Kotahena. There were 5 cases reported during the week, against 12 in the previous week.

5. No cases of *Measles* were reported, against 3 in the previous week; and 12 of *Chickenpox*, against 32 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was $82 \cdot 0^{\circ}$, against $82 \cdot 5^{\circ}$ in the preceding week and $82 \cdot 8^{\circ}$ in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was $29 \cdot 919$ in., against $29 \cdot 941$ in. in the preceding week and $29 \cdot 890$ in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was $0 \cdot 82$ in., against $0 \cdot 85$ in. in the preceding week and $1 \cdot 21$ in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
