BY-LAW REFERRED TO.

Where the Sanitary Board has made, constructed, or has commenced to make or construct any public drain intended to improve the sanitation of any town brought under the operation of the Small Towns Sanitary Ordinances, it shall be the duty of all owners or occupants of any compounds or lands through which such drain passes or shall pass, if so required by the Board, to reduce the level of such compounds or lands in such manner as may be directed by the Board in order to insure the proper drainage of such lands, and any owner or occupant neglecting or refusing to carry out such work, when so required, shall be guilty of an offence and punishable with fine which may extend to Rs. 20, or on default of payment of such fine with rigorous imprisonment which may extend to fourteen days.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended June 18, 1910.

Births.—The total births registered were 99 (1 European, 5 Burghers, 57 Sinhalese, 11 Tamils, 20 Moors, 2 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1910, viz., 185,704) was 27·8, as against 20·5 in the preceding week, 20·6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25·1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 118 (0 Europeans 6 Burghers 56 Sinhalese, 31 Tamils, 21 Moors, 3 Malays, and 1 Other). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 33·1, as against 28·9 in the previous week, 38·7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 33·7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 118 total deaths, 34 were of infants under one year of age, as against 30 in the preceding week, 27 in the corresponding week of the previous year and the average for last year.

Still Births.—The number of still births registered during the week was 7.

Selected Causes of Death.—Eighteen deaths were registered from *Pneumonia* (against 12 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year), of which 6 were in Kotahena, 3 each in St. Paul's and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 2 each in Pettah and New Bazaar, and 1 each in Maradana hospitals and Slave Island. Five deaths were registered from *Bronchitis*.

2. Twelve deaths were registered from *Phthisis* (against 11 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year), of which 3 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 2 each in Slave Island and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in Fort and Galle Face Ward, St. Paul's, Kotahena, New Bazaar, and Maradana hospitals.

3. Ten deaths were registered from *Old Age*, 8 from *Enteritis* (including 3 infants), 7 *Infantile Convulsions*, 6 *Debility* (all infants), 4 *Diarrhoea* (3 infants), 4 *Worms* (1 infant), 3 *Dysentery*, 3 *Tetanus* (2 infants), 3 *Premature Birth*, 3 *Starvation* (1 infant), and 23 from *Other Causes*.

4. Nine deaths were registered from *Enteric Fever* (against 5 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year), of which 4 were in St. Paul's, 2 each in New Bazaar and Maradana hospitals, and 1 in Kotahena. There were 29 cases reported during the week, against 22 in the previous week.

5. Three cases of *Measles* was reported, against 1 in the previous week; and 19 of *Chickenpox*, against 20 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82·1°, against 82·8° in the preceding week and 82·2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·863 in., against 29·881 in. in the preceding week and 29·964 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 4·02 in., against 1·72 in. in the preceding week and 0·80 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
