# Part II.--Legal and Judicial.

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#### PASSED ORDINANCES.

Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

#### No. 2 of 1910.

An Ordinance to amend "The Branch Roads Ordinance, 1896."

#### HENRY McCALLUM.

Preamble.

HEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Branch Roads VV Ordinance, 1896" (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance"), in certain particulars: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Short title and construction.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Branch Roads (Amendment) Ordinance, 1910," and shall be read and construed as one with the principal Ordinance.

Substitution of new section 42.

For section 42 of the principal Ordinance there shall be substituted the following section:

Extension of Ordinance to roads other than cart roads.

42. (1) The Governor in Executive Council may, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, extend the application of this Ordinance or of any specified provisions thereof

to the construction, maintenance, and improvement, or to the maintenance and improvement only, of any road or bridge whatsoever to which this Ordinance would not, but for such Proclamation, be applicable.

- (2) Where a principal road has been or shall hereafter be constructed so as to connect with any branch road constructed under this Ordinance, or so as to connect any two such branch roads, the Governor may, in any case where he considers that it would be inequitable that the estates in the district should continue to contribute a moiety of the cost of improving and repairing such branch roads, allow each of such estates, instead of so doing, to contribute annually a fixed sum equal to the average amount of its contributions during the five years immediately preceding the construction of the principal road. Such fixed amount shall be carried to the credit of the general revenue of the Colony, and such branch roads shall be maintained and repaired out of general revenue as if they were principal roads.
- (3) For the purposes of this section the expression "principal road" means a road constructed or maintained under the provisions of "The Road Ordinance, 1861."

Addition of further proviso to section 23.

3 The following further proviso shall be added to section 23 of the principal Ordinance:

Provided further, that where the Provincial Committee is satisfied that a portion of any estate, being not less than one quarter of its total area, is unfit for cultivation, such portion shall not be taken into account in assessing the contribution towards the cost of repairs and improvements to which such estate is liable under this section:

#### No. 3 of 1910.

An Ordinance to amend in certain particulars "The Destitute Immigrants' Regulation Ordinance, 1907."

HENRY McCallum.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend in certain particulars "The Destitute Immigrants' Regulation Ordinance, 1907" (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance"): Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Destitute Immigrants' Regulation (Amendment) Ordinance, 1910," and shall be read and construed as one with the principal Ordinance.

Substitution of new section 6.

2 For section 6 of the principal Ordinance the following section shall be substituted:

Punishment of stowaways.

6. (1) Any person arriving at any port or place in Ceylon on board any British or foreign sea-going vessel who, by secreting himself on board or getting or remaining on board without the consent of either the owner, consignee, or master, or of a mate, or of the person in charge of the vessel, or of any other person entitled to give that consent, has obtained a passage without having paid for the same, shall be deemed to be a stowaway, and shall on summary conviction be liable to imprisonment of either description for any term not exceeding six months.

(2) Where any person has been convicted under this section, it shall be the duty of the Police Magistrate, on being satisfied that a passage has been provided for the convict in accordance with section 12, and that the vessel wherein such passage has been provided is ready to proceed to sea, to order the convict to be taken from jail and conducted in custody aboard such vessel.

Substitution of new proviso to section 12. 3 For the proviso to section 12 of the principal Ordinance the following proviso shall be substituted:

### Provided that-

- (a) The master of such vessel shall incur no liability to repay the said costs and charges if he proves that the destitute immigrant so landed was at the time of landing under an engagement of service or in possession of a sum of money of not less than one hundred and fifty rupees.
- (b) Where the destitute immigrant came on board as a stowaway, and the master, owner, agent, or charterer of the vessel is willing to provide him with a passage to some place where he can be lawfully landed, the master, owner, agent, or charterer shall not be liable under this section to pay any costs and charges in respect of such immigrant after he has been placed on board the vessel by which such passage has been provided.

#### No. 4 of 1910.

An Ordinance requiring Weekly Returns to be furnished by Licensed Retail Dealers in Arrack.

HENRY McCallum:

Preamble

WHEREAS it is expedient to require weekly returns to be furnished by licensed retail dealers in arrack: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Short title

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Arrack (Returns) Ordinance, 1910."

Definition.

2 In this Ordinance the term "licensed retail dealer" means a person licensed under the section which, by section 9 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1891, intituled "An Ordinance relating to Arrack, Rum, and Toddy," was substituted for section 26 of Ordinance No. 10 of 1844, intituled "An Ordinance to amend the Law relating to the Distillation and Sale of Arrack, Rum, and Toddy within these Settlements."

Weekly returns.

8 Every licensed retail dealer shall, with regard to each of his store-houses, godowns, and taverns, forward to the Government Agent of the Province, or to the Assistant Government Agent of the District, in which such store-house, godown, or tavern is situated, weekly returns in the form and at the times hereinafter specified.

Form of returns and time within which they must be jurnished.

4 Such weekly returns shall be in the form set out in the schedule hereto, and shall contain the particulars therein specified; and it shall be the duty of the licensed retail dealer to forward or cause to be forwarded such returns so as to reach the office of the Government Agent or of the Assistant Government Agent, as the case may be, within three days next following the seventh, fifteenth, twenty-second, and last day of each month.

Penalty.

5 If the licensed retail dealer fails to forward or cause to be forwarded any return within the period specified in that behalf by this Ordinance, or forwards or causes to be forwarded my return which is false, inaccurate, or defective in any material particular, he shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding one hundred rupees.
