MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, March 12, 1910.

The Council met this day at 2 P.M., pursuant to notice dated March 8, 1910.

Present:—Mr. C. M. Lushington, Chairman; Dr. E. Ludovici; Mr. F. E. Abeysundera; Mr. A. C. Hayley; Mr. H. F. Tomalin; Dr. J. H. Ebell; and Mr. D. W. Subasinha.

The Minutes of the Meeting held on February 12, 1910, were read and confirmed.

Before proceeding with the business laid down in the Agenda paper, Dr. Ludovici, with the permission of the Council, said that he was sure all Members of Council would join him in congratulating the Chairman on his recovery from his recent illness and give him a cordial welcome back to his seat in the Council, and moved that it be recorded in the Minutes of the day's Meeting. Mr. D. W. Subasinha seconded.—Carried unanimously.

1. Dr. E. Ludovici, with the permission of the Council, withdrew the questions Nos. 1 to 3 on the Agenda paper, of which he had given notice.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. W. Subasinha asked, What will be a sufficient reservation of forest outside the catchment area at Hiyare and has such a reservation been made?

The Chairman replied that he had already requested the Hon. the Surveyor-General to mark off as reservation a 49-chain belt round the contour of the catchment area. Further, that he would take all necessary steps to prevent the contamination of the water supply by requesting Government to reserve the whole forest of about 4,000 acres for the conservation of the streams which would also benefit the water supply to Galle and the fields round about.

3. Pursuant to notice, Dr. E. Ludovici moved that the attention of Government be invited to the omission on the plan to lay water mains on some of the chief thoroughfares, and that Government be asked to have a water main laid in Templar's road, Kaluwella, which is one of the most populated and important roads in the suburbs. Mr. D. W. Subasinha seconded.

On the motion being put to the Meeting it was resolved that the matter be deferred for the next Meeting on the understanding that in the mean time the Provincial Engineer would inquire into the matter.

4. Submitted—(1) estimate for filling in swamp round the ramparts facing the esplanade Rs. 460, (2) estimate for Rs. 2,530 and report for raising the green near the new gate adjoining the ramparts (on the right hand side of the new gate as one goes out) and utilizing it as a play ground by deviating the drain now passing through the middle of it.

Resolved—That the estimate and papers be circulated and brought up at next Meeting.

5. Papers *re* sale of dry fish in private markets in Fish Market street bazaars.

Resolved—That the resolution (3) of Markets and Sanitation of December 11, 1909, be confirmed, and that licenses to sell dry fish in private markets in Fish Market street be not allowed.

6. Letter No. 3 dated March 3, 1910, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, *re* contribution from Municipal funds towards charitable purposes.—Read.

7. Letter No. 4 dated March 7, 1910, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, *re* Draft Ordinance to amend and consolidate the law relating to Municipal Councils.—Read.

8. Letter No. 460 dated March 4, 1910, from the Hon. the Director of Public Works, *re* requirements on account of expenditure to end of July, 1910.

The Chairman moved—(1) that the Chairman be requested to make arrangements with the Hon. the Treasurer as regards the disbursements, and (2) that a Special Committee composed of the following Members of Council, *viz.*, Mr. D. G. Goonewardena, Dr. E. Ludovici, Mr. H. F. Tomalin, Dr. J. H. Ebell, and the mover, three to form a quorum, be appointed to consider what steps shall be taken with a view to introducing a water-rate for the town, within Police limits, and for drawing out rules and regulations applying to the water supply scheme; also to report whether the

Colombo Water works Ordinance and by-laws would be suitable to meet the requirements of Galle; and to deal with any other matter concerning the water supply scheme generally. Mr. D. W. Subasingha seconded.—Carried.

9. Letter dated March 2, 1910, from D. B. Senaratna, renter of the Paradowawatta and Morawak korale road tolls for 1909, praying for compensation owing to prohibition of cart traffic during the outbreak of rinderpest.

Resolved—That the application be refused.

10. Papers re registration of servants of licensed stall holders in Green Market.

Resolved—That the matter be first referred to the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation and brought up at the next Meeting of Council.

11. Papers re schedule of fees for encroachment on streets under section 280 of the Municipal Council's Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887.

The Chairman moved that the fees set out in the annexed schedule be adopted. Mr. D. W. Subasingha seconded.—Carried.

12. Report of the Special Committee re-appointed on January 15, 1910, to report on the proposal to amend the rules relating to pensions to officers of this Council.

The Chairman moved that the rules framed by the Municipal Council of Colombo be adopted, with the amendment and additions recommended by the Special Committee. Mr. F. E. Abeysundera seconded.—Carried.

13. Report of the Special Committee appointed on February 12, 1910, to report on the distribution of 50 stand-posts referred to in Provincial Engineer's letter No. 71 of February 7, 1910.

Resolved—That the papers be circulated and brought up at the next Meeting of the Council.

ANNEXURE REFERRED TO IN ITEM 11.

Encroachments on Streets.

Balconies, galleries, verandahs, open or enclosed, or anything having a floor at or about the first floor level.

Sunshades, weather frames, eaves, or other similar projections, including only roofing or other projection from the weather (exclusive of permanent architectural features projecting not more than 2 ft. 6 in. and shown on the drawings approved by the Chairman, Municipal Council, when sanctioning the erection of the building of which they form a part).

Projecting signs parallel to the street fixed so as to expose only one side the street.

Projecting signs at right angles to side of street or fixed or exposed so as to exhibit two sides visible from street, including flagstuffs, masts, or poles, and the like.

Temporary buildings on streets, including hoardings and enclosures of all kinds.

Rs. 1.50 per annum per square foot, total floor areas encroaching on the street measured horizontally. Minimum fee Rs. 10.

Cents 50 per annum per square foot of encroachment on the street measured horizontally. Minimum fee Rs. 2.50 per annum.

Cents 25 per annum per square foot of visible surface. Minimum fee Re. 1.

Cents 50 per annum per square foot of visible surface. Minimum fee Rs. 5.

Cents 2½ per week per square foot of ground covered, including eaves and all projections.
