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### MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo, held in the Town Hall on Friday, January 21, 1910.

The Council met this day at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice dated January 15, 1910.

*Present* :—Mr. E. M. de C. Short, Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias; Major A. W. de Wilton; Mr. H. Tiruvilangam; Mr. P. D. Warren, C.M.G.; Mr. L. B. Fernando; Mr. A. Fairlie; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Mr. Arthur Alvis; Mr. H. L. de Mel; Mr. E. G. Jayawardene; and Mr. G. H. Alston.

The Minutes of the General Meeting of December 17, 1909, having been printed, and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of December 17, 1909, be confirmed.

It was agreed, on the suggestion of the Chairman, to take up item No. 1 on the agenda later in the day, when the Council would be more fully represented.

2. The Chairman moved the re-appointment of the following Special Committees, viz. :—(i.) Widening, improvement, and extension of Maradana road; (ii.) Permanently engaging Mr. N. G. Powar as Municipal Assessor. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

3. The Chairman brought up the correspondence with regard to the ferry service on the Colombo lake and the claim of the Government to the absolute ownership of the lake, and moved that the matter do lie over for further consideration. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.—Carried.

4. The Chairman brought up letter from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, No. 207 of November 30, 1909, forwarding for the views of the Municipal Council, copy of a letter from the Resident Engineer, Colombo Drainage Works, regarding the renewal of the agreement of Mr. M. R. Atkins, Assistant Engineer, Colombo Drainage Works, and stating for the information of Council, that 4 months' half-pay leave is the maximum that is allowed by Government to temporary employes, and moved that the terms of the proposed further engagement be approved. Mr. Arthur Alvis seconded.—Carried.

5. The Chairman brought up letter from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, No. 215 of December 29, 1909, stating that Mr. T. Reid has been appointed Additional Municipal Magistrate from 28 idem, on a salary of £400 per annum, rising to £500 by annual increments of £25, and moved that provision be made in the Supplementary Budget accordingly. Mr. Arthur Alvis seconded.—Carried.

At this stage item No. 1 on the agenda, namely :—To elect members to form the four Standing Committees for 1910, in terms of section 5 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1902, was taken up.

Messrs. Alston and Fairlie informed the Council that they did not desire to be elected to serve on the Committees, as they were leaving for Europe in March.

The balloting then proceeded, and the Chairman declared the result as follows :—

- (1) The Committee on Law and General Subjects :—(1) Major A. W. de Wilton ; (2) Mr. H. Tiruvilangam ; (3) Mr. L. B. Fernando.
- (2) The Committee on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation :—(1) Sir Allan Perry, Kt. ; (2) Mr. H. L. de Mel ; (3) Dr. David Rockwood.
- (3) The Committee on Finance and Assessment :—(1) Mr. H. A. Jayawardene ; (2) Mr. Arthur Alvis ; (3) Mr. E. G. Jayawardene.
- (4) The Committee on Municipal Works :—(1) Mr. C. P. Dias ; (2) Mr. Arthur Alvis ; (3) Mr. E. G. Jayawardene.

6. The Chairman moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider the Draft Municipal Pension Minutes postponed at last meeting. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.

(Council in Committee.)

The Draft Minutes were then gone through section by section and amended.

The Chairman moved that the Pension Rules as amended be adopted. Mr. P. D. Warren seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman moved that the Council do resume, and that the Pension Rules as amended in Committee be adopted. Mr. P. D. Warren seconded.—Carried.

7. The Chairman brought up the question of including in the Municipal Ordinance a draft schedule of maximum fees chargeable on professions, arts, trades, and callings, in addition to the sections empowering the Council to levy fees, if found necessary, postponed at last meeting.

Mr. E. G. Jayawardene moved that the question be postponed and referred to the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment for consideration of the details of the schedule and for a recommendation thereon. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.—Carried.

8. The Chairman brought up the question of the special increments for 1910, under the clerical scheme, postponed at last meeting, and moved that item No. 13 of the extracts from Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of December 7, 1909, be adopted, namely, the grant of special increments to Mr. J. E. Solomon, Clerk, Accountant's Department, Rs. 48 ; Mr. J. H. P. Walker, Clerk, Secretary's Department, Rs. 48 ; Mr. S. W. Gomes, Correspondence Clerk, Rs. 48 ; Mr. J. G. Balthazaar, Assistant Council Clerk, Rs. 48 ; Mr. J. Ludekens, Clerk, Works Department, Rs. 48 ; Mr. N. B. Cooray, Store Clerk, Works Department, Rs. 48 ; and also that Mr. F. S. Fonseka, Accountant, Assessment Department, be placed on Rs. 72 scale of increments, and that Mr. Caldera, Precise Clerk, be given a similar increment for three years, when he will reach the salary formerly drawn by him.—Mr. G. H. Alston seconded.

After some discussion, the Council adopted the recommendation of the Committee with the exception of the proposed increment to Mr. Caldera.

9. The Chairman brought up the recommendation of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment for striking off irrecoverable items of water-rate, postponed at last meeting.—The recommendation of the Committee was adopted.

10. Application from Mr. N. M. Ingram, Assistant Engineer, for 9 months' leave, from March 3, 1910, to proceed to England.

Mr. H. L. de Mel moved that Mr. Ingram be granted 9 months' leave from about March 3, 1910, three months on full pay and six months on half pay. Mr. E. G. Jayawardene seconded.—Carried.

11. Pension to Mr. H. M. Alwis, Head Gardener, Victoria Park.

The Council decided that the post held by Mr. Alwis, of Head Gardener, Victoria Park, be treated as having been on the Fixed Establishment from the date of his appointment.

The Chairman moved that Mr. Alwis be given a pension of Rs. 560 per annum from date of retirement. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.—Carried.

12. The Chairman moved that the Council do adopt the valuation of properties contained in the assessment books of 1909 for the year 1910, subject to such alterations as the Finance and Assessment Committee may from time to time find necessary, in respect of the following Wards, viz., St. Paul's, Slave Island. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.—Carried.

13. The adoption of the valuation of properties in the area added to the Municipality along the Eastern boundary for the year 1910, subject to such alterations as the Committee on Finance and Assessment may from time to time find necessary.

The Council, on the suggestion of Mr. H. L. de Mel, agreed that the matter should be held over for next meeting, and referred it to the Committee on Finance and Assessment for consideration of the valuations.

The following were considered together :—

14. Further extension of leave to Mr. J. E. Solomon, Clerk, Accountant's Department, from December 12 to 31, 1909, owing to continued ill-health.

15. Excess of leave over 30 days granted to Peon Hinni Appoo, from October 20 to December 16, 1909, owing to ill-health.

16. Authority of Council required to pass the excess leave over 30 days granted to Municipal Officers during 1908 and 1909, as per statement circulated.

Mr. E. G. Jayawardene moved that the leave granted by the Chairman be confirmed. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.—Carried.

17. Mr. E. G. Jayawardene moved the adoption of the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health, that the insanitary cesspit privies at Nos. 44 and 68, Grandpass road, and 104, Hulftsdorp street be closed, the parties concerned having failed to show cause to the contrary. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.—Carried.

18. Report of the Resident Engineer of the Colombo Drainage Works, for the month of November, 1909, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.

19. City Analyst's reports on the Town water for November and December, 1909, were laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.

20. The Progress Report of Work done for December, 1909, was laid on the table.

21. Reports of Inspectors on licensed carriages were laid on the table.

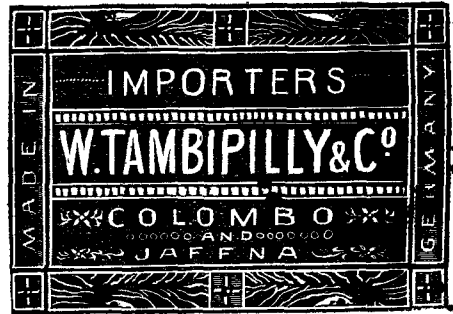
