By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by section 44 of "The Forest Ordinance, 1885," as amended by section 14 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1892, it is enacted that the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may make regulations respecting the transit of all forest produce by land or water: and whereas certain regulations were made under the provisions of the said section of the said Ordinance and published in the Government Gazette by a notification dated April 30, 1900:

And whereas by regulation 2 of such regulations it is provided that no forest produce shall be moved (a) in any district which has been proclaimed by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, from any land, except with a permit from the Government Agent or Assistant

Government Agent, or from some officer duly authorized by the Government Agent to issue permits; nor when a permit has been obtained shall any forest produce be moved otherwise than in accordance with the conditions of such permit:

And whereas it is expedient to proclaim the districts in the Western Province set forth in schedule hereto under the said regulation 2:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the districts in the Western Province set forth in the schedule hereto under the said regulation 2, as from and after January 1, 1903.

THE following regulations for the Colombo Patent Slip are published for general information.

THE COLOMBO PATENT SLIP.

Length, 800 ft.
Length of cradle, 220 ft.
Breadth of cradle, 40 ft.
Depth over keel blocks at lower end, at low water, 21 ft. 6 in.

Depth over keel blocks at upper end, at low water, 10 ft. 6 in. Inclination, 1 in 20. Capable of slipping a vessel of 1,000 tons gross.

REGULATIONS.

Charges.

1. The rent for use of the Slip, including taking up and launching, shall be Rs. 2 per ton gross for two days, payable in advance, and thereafter a fixed charge of Rs. 250 for each additional day or part thereof. The minimum charge shall be Rs. 250 per day irrespective of the vessel's tonnage.

2. No vessel shall remain on the Slip for a longer period than three days, unless by special

arrangement at the time of regulating.

3. If the Slip be required for another vessel, the vessel that has already occupied it for three-days must immediately vacate (unless arrangements have been made beforehand as above for a longer period), or pay a charge of Rs. 500 for every day or part thereof that she remains in occupation beyond the three days for which she was originally regulated.

4. These charges shall include all shore labour and materials required in preparing the cradle, hauling up and launching vessels, and use of blocks, shores, and staging. Vessels must supply all other materials, such as ropes, &c. Blocks, shores, &c., cut or destroyed will be charged for according

to damage done.

5. Caps split out will be charged Re. 1.50 each.

6. Vessels occupying the Slip once blocked and shored shall be charged for all labour supplied in shifting blocks or shores or for other purposes, excepting only for such shifting as may be necessary to admit of the proper cleaning and painting of the vessel.

Application for use of Slip.

7. Applications to put vessels on the Slipshould be made to the Superintendent on a printed form (A), which can be obtained at the Superintendent's Office, and on payment of a deposit of Rs. 500 for each vessel. Such applications will be entered in the order in which they are received in a slipping list. Any vessel may be entered for slipping before her arrival. The deposit paid in respect of any such vessel is liable to be forfeited in the event of the vessel not being ready to be slipped on the day arranged for between the Superintendent and the agents or master of the vessel.

8. No vessel shall be entitled to be put on the Slip without having the time and manner of her being put, and of her remaining, on the Slip previously regulated at the Office of the Superintendent, in books to be kept there for that purpose. The master or agent of a vessel shall therefore, as soon as practicable after her arrival in the Port of Colombo, submit an application under his own

signature for regulation in the Form B.

9. Until the Superintendent shall have issued to the agents or master a regulation order in the Form C, no such application as aforesaid shall be deemed to have been accepted, and no regulation as to the time and manner of a vessel being put on the Slip or of her remaining thereon shall be deemed to have been made.

Requirements before Slipping.

- 10. Prior to the time arranged for the vessel to be placed on the Slip the following preparations must be carried out on board the vessel, viz.:—
 - (a) Suitable hawsers and heaving lines must be in readiness on each side, fore and aft, and gantlines rove for masthead pendants.
 - (b) The vessel shall be trimmed upright and as near as possible on an even keel, and the bilges must be perfectly dry fore and aft and kept so, and they must be clear for inspection.

(c) The ballast tanks must either be full with their doors properly secured, or quite dry with their doors off ready for examination, if so required by the Superintendent.

- (d) The vessel's crew shall render every assistance on board or on boats when the vessel is being hauled up or launched, and in case of extra hands being required, they shall be provided at the vessel's expense.
- (e) All the vessel's water-closets and latrines must be thoroughly cleansed and securely fastened up before the vessel is put on the cradle, and no use whatever shall be made of them while the vessel is on the Slip.
- (f) If so required by the Superintendent the awnings shall be furled or taken down.
- 11. The vessel may, if considered necessary, be inspected by the Superintendent, and should he find that any of the above-mentioned instructions have not been carried out, the vessel may be refused to be placed on the Slip, and all expenses incurred in consequence shall be borne by the vessel.

Period of Occupation.

12. If before the expiration of the time for which a vessel has been regulated the Superintendent shall be satisfied, on written application to be made to him for that purpose, that circumstances not known when the vessel was regulated, or beyond the control of the parties engaged in the work, will prevent the completion within the period for which the vessel was regulated, of work which can only be done on the Slip, a new regulation may, if the Superintendent thinks proper, be made for such further time.

Priority of Slipping.

13. In regulating the order in which vessels are to be put on the Slip, the Superintendent shall be at liberty to give priority of regulating to all vessels belonging to Government, or to such vessels as shall require the use of the Slip for the least time not exceeding 24 hours, without regard to the order in which vessels stand on the slipping list. But no vessel to which priority shall have been given under this provision shall be entitled under any circumstances to remain on the Slip beyond the time for which she has been regulated.

Distressed Craft.

14. The Superintendent may, in his discretion, allow any vessel which shall have been put back in a damaged condition, or which shall under any other circumstances be in such a condition as may, in his judgment, render it necessary for her to be put on the Slip at once, to take priority of all other vessels standing on the regulating list.

Refusal to leave the Slip.

15. If any vessel shall not leave the Slip at the expiration of the period agreed upon, the Superintendent, whether such vessel may or may not be then watertight or capable of being floated, may, upon giving 24 hours' notice to the agents or master, slip or launch the vessel, and not be held responsible for any damage done to the vessel,

Shores and Blocks.

16. Blocks, shores, and stages will be provided as follows:—

Blocks.—One set for the length given at the time of regulation.

Bilge Shores.—In such numbers as may be required.

Stages and Stage Ropes with Uprights and Outriggers.—A sufficient number to make one tier of stages round the vessel.

Displacement of Weights.

17. No ballast, coals, or any weight shall, without authority of the Superintendent, be shifted in or taken on board a vessel during the time she is on the Slip; and no outboard work shall be carried on during the time she is being hauled up or slipped. Owners, agents or masters of vessels, and employers of labourers shall be responsible for any offence against this by-law.

18. Slip to be cleared and cleaned at vessel's expense previous to launching.

Licensees only to undertake Work.

19. No one shall be allowed to undertake any work in connection with vessels on the Slip until he shall have been licensed by the Government, and if any such licensee shall break or evade any of these by-laws, or use bad materials or fittings or appliances for the purpose of such work, or be unduly slow in the execution of such work, his license may be revoked, in which case he will not afterwards be allowed to perform any work in connection with vessels on the Slip.

20. Every license will be granted for a period of one year only at a cost of Rs. 50, and shall be renewable at the option of Government, who may refuse renewal in any case without communicating

any reason for such refusal.

21. A licensee shall be bound to employ foremen and tindals of experience to supervise the work that such licensee may be carrying out on vessels on the Slip, and the licensee, his foremen, and tindals shall be bound to use every reasonable means for preventing accidents to the men employed under them.

Breaking up Vessels.

22. No vessel shall be broken up while on the Slip without the consent of the Superintendent and under his supervision. His decision in the matter as to how it is to be broken up must be deemed

Notice to leave Slip.

23. The agents or master of any vessel using the Slip shall give the Superintendent 24 hours' notice in writing of his readiness to leave the Slip.

Slipping.

24. All vessels shall be hauled up under the direction of the Superintendent and in the presence of the master of the vessel or his representative.

Damage or Delay.

25. Neither the Government nor the Superintendent shall be held liable for any damage

or delay which may happen to any vessel either in taking up or launching.

26. Sundays, Christmas Day, and Good Friday shall be dies non. If work is done upon any dies non it shall be charged for at the ordinary rates, and in addition a penalty of Rs. 250.

Overtime Work.

27. The working hours for the Government staff at the Slip shall be from 6 A.M. until 5 P.M. Permission may be granted to work after hours on vessels lying on the Slip on written application being made to the Superintendent before 4 P.M. All expenses of the staff incurred thereby will be charged against the vessel.

Fires.

28. No person shall boil or heat pitch, tar, resin, turpentine, oil, or other combustible matter in the Slip premises, except in the places provided for the purpose, or for which the special sanction of the Superintendent has been obtained.

Breach of Regulations.

29. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing regulations shall be liable to pay a sum not exceeding Rs. 100 as ascertained and liquidated damages.

Rules referred to.

- 1. Charge of Village Properties.—All village paths, bridges, edandas, ambalams, wells, bathing-places, ferries, places for slaughter of cattle, and other village properties shall be in charge of the headman of the village, and also all places for the burial or cremation of the dead unless they have been placed in charge of some other person by by-law made under "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899."
- 2. List of Persons liable to Labour.—The village headman of each division shall prepare annually before the 1st February a list of names of all males within his division between the ages of 18 and 55, and a copy of it shall be forwarded to the Chairman of the Committee
- 3. Village Works.—On receiving information either from a headman or any other person that any village work should be constructed or repaired, the Village Committee shall make enquiry, and, if it approves of the work; shall prepare a list setting out the nature of the work and the names of the villages interested in it and make such subsequent alterations in the list as may be deemed expedient. The decision of the Committee as set forth in such list or amended list shall be final on the question as to what villages are interested.
- 4. Liability and Exemption.—Every male inhabitant between the ages of 18 and 55 residing in any of the villages interested shall be liable to contribute labour towards the works specified in the lists prepared by the Committee. Provided that priests of all religions, immigrant coolies from India, and persons exempted as unable to work by the Chairman of the Committee of the subdivision shall be exempted from performing work under these rules.
- 5. Labour.—The Committee shall specify the extent of the work to be performed, the time when it shall be performed, and the number of days labour that each person liable under the preceding rule shall contribute towards it. The headmen of the respective villages shall order out the labour in such manner as the Committee shall direct.
- 6. How Labour is to be Contributed.—If any person is unwilling to work he may commute his labour by the payment of thirty cents for each day to the Chairman of the Committee.
- 7. Neglecting to Contribute Labour.—Every person liable to contribute labour under these rules for any of the purposes mentioned herein, who fails to contribute such labour, or to pay its commuted value when duly noticed by the headman of his village to attend and perform such labour or pay its commuted value shall be liable to a fine not exceeding eighty cents for each day of such failure.
- 8. Places for Slaughtering Cattle.—In each Police Vidane's division a place of slaughtering cattle should be established, and slaughteing in any other than such established place shall be unlawful.
- 9. Erection of School House.—Wherever a school has already been or hereafter be established by Government, the construction and repair of the necessary schoolrooms shall be carried out under the provisions of the rules 2 to 7.
- 10. Attendance.—The Committee shall from to time determine the ages within which the children shall attend such schools, and the distances that they shall be required to travel from their homes to attend such schools.
- 11. Any parent or guardian who shall fail or neglect to send any of his children to school in accordance with the directions given by the Committee shall be guilty of an offence.
- 12 Exemption.—These rules shall not apply to children for whose education other provision to the satisfaction of the Committee is made by the parents.
- 13. Killing Fish by Poison.—Any person who shall kill fish by means of poison or dynamite shall be guilty of an offence.
- 14. Fishing in Paddy Fields.—It is not lawful for any person other than the proprietor or his agent to fish in paddy fields under crop, any person infringing this rule shall be guilty of an offence.
- 15. Prevention of Cattle Trespass.—All cattle owners shall tie up or pen their cattle, both by night and day, to prevent cattle trespass.
- 16. Tethering on Roadside.—No cattle shall be tethered upon any cart road or in such a manner as will allow them to stray on the road.
- 17. Quarantine during Cattle Disease.—No cattle shall be removed from any village in the subdivision where there is cattle disease, to or through any other village of the subdivision.
- 18. Segregation of Cattle.—Every proprietor of cattle shall be bound to separate every sick head of cattle belonging to him from the common herd, and to put it into a secluded place to be determined by the village headman, and to disinfect the place by fire or otherwise as the Committee may direct.
- 19. Burial of Sick Cattle.—When a sick head of cattle shall die the proprietor or herdsman shall bury the carcase without loss of time, not less than six feet deep. If the

proprietor or herdsman neglects to do so the village headman shall forthwith proceed to bury the carcase without loss of time at the expense of the proprietor.

- 20. Report of Cattle Murrain.—Every proprietor of cattle or herdsman who has a case of murrain or contagious cattle disease amongst his cattle shall forthwith report the circumstances to the village headman. He shall report the same to the Chairman of the Village Committee.
- 21. Boundaries on Private Lands.—Boundaries of private lands shall be marked according to custom, and any person ordered by the Committee so to mark a boundary refusing or neglecting to comply with the order shall be guilty of an offence.
- 22. Penalty for altering Boundaries.—Any person who shall alter, deface, or wilfully injure any such boundary shall be guilty of an offence.
- 23. Penalty for befouling Wells.—Any person who befouls a village ela, village well, or spring of water used for drinking purposes by the inhabitants of any village shall be guilty of an offence.
- 24. No person affected with a contagious or infectious disease shall bathe or wash clothes at a public well, spring, or ferry within the division.
- 25. Removal of dangerous Trees.—If upon due inquiry the Committee is satisfied that any tree is likely to fall upon any house or other occupied building, or is in a condition dangerous to the occupants or to other property, the Committee shall give due notice in writing to the owner of such tree to cut it down within such reasonable time as the Committee may allow. In case such owner shall neglect or delay to obey such order the Committee shall cause the work to be done at his expense.
- 26. Pelting Stones.—Pelting stones at houses, drawing caricatures and indecent figures, or writing insulting expressions on buildings is forbidden.
- 27. Disturbing Public Repose.—Any person disturbing public repose at night by singing indecent songs or by raising a disturbance is guilty of an offence.
- 28. Penalty for Abusive Language.—The use of abusive and indecent language for the purpose of annoying any other person or of provoking a breach of the peace is forbidden.
- 29. Cock-fighting and Gambling.—Lotteries, gambling, and cock-fighting are prohibited, and any person engaged in these pursuits shall be guilty of an offence.
- 30. Cart-racing.—No cart racing shall be permitted in any thoroughfare within the subdivision.
- 31. Furious Driving.—No person shall furiously or carelessly drive a hackery or any other vehicle in a public thoroughfare.
- 32. Loitering.—No person shall loiter in a thoroughfare or public place in the division or walk about after 9 P.M. on dark nights without a light, and without being able to show sufficient cause for so doing.
- 33. Sheltering Vagabonds.—No person resident in the district shall give shelter or lodging to any person whose character is open to grave suspicion.
- 34. Every owner of a garden neglecting without sufficient reason to clear it of filth and rubbish, when noticed to do so by the village headman, shall be guilty of an offence.
- 35. Hinderance or Vexatious Conduct.—No person shall obstruct or resist any headmen or authorized person in the discharge of his duties, and no headman or authorized person shall be guilty of any negligence or malicious or vexatious conduct under any of the foregoing rules.

1. An annual registration fee of Re. 1 shall be leviable upon each dog within the local Board limits. Such tax shall be due on and after April 1, and shall be paid in advance before April 30. Provided however, that no registration fees shall be levied on any dog in respect of which it is proved to the satisfaction of the Chairman that the registration fee has already been paid for the then current year in any other place.

2. To facilitate the recovery of the registration fee the occupier of every house within

2. To facilitate the recovery of the registration fee the occupier of every house within the town shall on or before March 15 in each year, furnish an officer thereunto authorized by the Board with a list in the form A annexed of the dogs kept in such house, and the names of the owners thereof. *

3. On payment of the registration fee, the Board shall furnish the owner of the dog with a certificate of the registration of such dog, the Board will also supply a stamped collar to be worn by such dog on payment of a fee of 25 cents, but if the owner prefers to have his own dog collar stamped, the Board will cause it to be stamped free of charge

charge.

4. The Chairman may refuse to issue the certificate of registration for any dog which in his opinion is so diseased as to be a source of infection to other dogs, or he may issue such certificate with such qualifying clauses as may be necessary; and the Chairman may order the disposal or destruction of any such dog for which the certificate of registration has been refused, or in which the certificate has been issued subject to certain conditions which have not been complied with.

5. Every inhabitant within the Local Board becoming possessed of any dog or dogs after the furnishing of the list referred to in by-law No. 2, and for which the registration fee has not been paid elsewhere, shall furnish the officer of the Board mentioned in the said by-law with a list of such dog or dogs within one month after acquiring the same, and the owner of such dog or dogs shall, subject to the provisions of by-law No. 1 become liable to the registration fee for the year ending April 30 next ensuing.
