PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

IN the Name of His Majesty EDWARD THE SEVENTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by section 9 of “The Poisons Ordinance, 1901,” it is enacted that the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council, may from time to time make, and when made revoke or vary such regulations as may seem necessary or expedient for the purpose of controlling and regulating the possession and sale of poisons, and for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the said Ordinance :

And whereas by sub-section 3 of section 10 of the said Ordinance it is further enacted that all regulations when so made shall be published in two successive issues of the *Government Gazette* in the English, Sinhalese, and Tamil languages, and shall be laid before the Legislative Council, if then in session, and if not then in session then so soon as possible after the commencement of the next ensuing session, and if within forty days after being so laid before the Legislative Council, any of

such regulations be objected to by the Legislative Council, the said Council may by resolution amend or annul any such regulations, and that all such regulations so amended, and such regulations as shall not be amended or annulled by the said Council, shall be proclaimed in two successive issues of the *Government Gazette* in the English, Sinhalese, and Tamil languages, and shall come into force upon such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, and shall thereupon be as legal, valid, and effectual and binding as if the same had been enacted in the said Ordinance :

And whereas the regulations set forth in the schedule hereto have been made by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under the provisions of section 9 aforesaid of the said Ordinance, and the same have under sub-section 3 of section 10 aforesaid of the said Ordinance been published in two successive issues of the *Government Gazette* on the Thirtieth of May and the Sixth of June, One thousand Nine hundred and Two, in the English, Sinhalese, and Tamil languages, and have likewise been laid before the Legislative Council then being in session.

And whereas no objection was made to the said regulations by the Legislative Council within forty days after their being so laid before the Legislative Council.

Now therefore know Ye that We, the said Governor, do hereby proclaim the regulations set forth in the schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

Regulations under "The Poisons Ordinance, 1901."

The list of poisons under Schedule A shall be divided into two parts.

2. The following shall come under Part I. :—

Arsenic and its preparations.
Prussic acid.
Cyanides of potassium and all metallic cyanides.
Strychnine and all poisonous vegetables.
Alkaloids and their salts.
Aconite and its preparations.
Emetic tartar.
Corrosive sublimate.
Cantharides.
Savin and its oil.
Ergot of rye and its preparations.
Datura and its preparations.
All poisonous vegetable alkaloids and their salts.
Atropine and its preparations.
Preparations of cantharides.
Preparations of metallic cyanides.
Preparations of strychnine.
All vermin killers containing any of the above preparations.

3. The poisons under Part I. shall not be sold by retail, unless the purchaser is known to, or is introduced by, some person known to the seller. An entry shall be made of every sale, by the seller, in a register in the form appearing in Schedule C annexed to the Ordinance.

4. The vessel, packet, and wrapper containing the poison shall be distinctly labelled with the name of the article and the word "Poison" in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil, and with the name and address of the seller.

5. The following poisons shall come under Part II. :—

Carbolic acid.
Oxalic acid.
Chloroform.
Belladonna and its preparations.
Essential oil of almonds, unless deprived of its prussic acid.
Opium and all preparations of opium or of poppies.
Chloral hydrate and its preparations.
Corrosive sublimate preparations and all other mercury salts.
Nux vomica and its preparations.

The above articles shall be sold only with the vessel, wrapper, and cover distinctly labelled with the name of the article, the word "Poison" in English, Tamil, and Sinhalese, and with the name and address of the seller.

6. Arsenic when sold by retail shall be mixed with powdered charcoal or indigo to colour it. All poisons enumerated in Part I. and Part II. shall be sold only to persons of mature age.

7. None of the foregoing regulations shall apply to any article when forming part of the ingredients of any medicine dispensed by an apothecary, or chemist and druggist on a doctor's prescription, but all such prescriptions, if containing any of the poisons enumerated, shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose (Prescription Book), with the name

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by the 4th section of the Local Board of Health and Improvement Ordinance, No. 13 of 1898, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation to be for that purpose published in the *Government Gazette*, to bring any town or towns under the operation of the said Ordinance, and to define the limits of such town or towns respectively for the purposes of the said Ordinance, and such Proclamation to amend, alter, or revoke as and whenever the Governor shall, with the like advice, determine :

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 30th day of December, 1879, the town of Kurunegala was brought under the operation of the said Ordinance, and the limits of the said town were thereby defined and redefined by a Proclamation dated 12th September, 1891 :

And whereas it is expedient for the purposes of the said Ordinance to amend the said Proclamation by redefining the limits of the said town of Kurunegala :

Now therefore We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the power and authority in Us vested by the said Ordinance, do hereby amend the said Proclamation of the 12th September, 1891, by declaring that from and after the 19th day of January, 1903, the limits of the said town of Kurunegala, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, shall be those set forth in the schedule hereto, and that the limits of the said town of Kurunegala as defined in the Proclamation of the 12th September, 1891 aforesaid, shall cease to be the limits of the said town of Kurunegala for the purposes of the said Ordinance as from and after the Nineteenth day of January, 1903.

Schedule referred to.

Rules and Regulations of the Colombo Museum referred to.

INSPECTOR OF WATCHERS.

50. The Inspector of Watchers shall be responsible, under the Director, for the safe custody of all articles of value in the Museum building.

51. He shall be bound to have two Watchers always on duty, inside the building when the Museum is open and in the verandahs when the Museum is closed.

52. The appointment of these Watchers, the length of time they shall be on duty, and the grant to them of leave of absence shall rest with the Director.

53. He shall be responsible for the opening and closing of the Museum at the proper hours, and shall see that no persons, except those on duty, remain within the Museum when it is closed to the public.

54. He shall be responsible for the delivery of the keys of the Museum, immediately after the building has been closed, to the Director (or the Librarian in his absence) every evening, from whom he shall receive them the next morning.

55. The Inspector of Watchers shall be in attendance during such hours as the Director may appoint.

CLERK AND DRAUGHTSMAN.

56. The duties of the Clerk and Draughtsman shall be to assist in the clerical work of the Department, and to execute drawings of specimens as required, his hours of attendance being from 10 A.M. to 4.30 P.M. daily.

GARDENER.

57. He shall be responsible that the grounds are kept clean and in order.

58. The hours of attendance of the Gardener shall be from 6 A.M. to 11 A.M. and from 2 P.M. to 6 P.M. on all days excepting Sunday.

WATCHERS.

59. The Watchers shall guard the collections, keep the cases clean and in order, open and close the doors daily, and oil the hinges and locks.

By-laws referred to.

1. *Registration of Dogs.*—All dogs kept within the limits of the Local Board of Matara shall be registered in the office of the Local Board, and shall be produced there before the Secretary or Inspector prior to registration.
2. *Registration Fee.*—An annual registration fee of one rupee shall be payable for each dog kept within the said limits.
3. *Certificate of Registration.*—The certificate of registration referred to in section 5 of the Ordinance No. 25 of 1901, shall be in the form given in the annexed schedule marked A.
4. *Owner of Dog to give notice to the Board.*—Every person who shall acquire, keep, or become possessed of a dog shall give notice thereof to the Board within 21 days of his acquiring or becoming possessed of such dog, and shall give a full description of the animal.
5. *Occupier to fill up Schedule.*—It shall be lawful for the Chairman of the Local Board before March 31 in each year to require every occupier of a house to fill up a schedule in the Form B showing the number and description of the dogs kept in such house or in any premises attached thereto, and to whom they respectively belong, and every such occupier shall be bound to accept, duly fill in with correct information, and return such schedule within one week from receipt thereof.
6. *Refusal of Certificate.*—The Chairman may refuse to issue a certificate to the owner of a dog, if in the opinion of the Medical Officer such dog is by reason of its suffering from some infectious or contagious disease, a source of danger to the public.
7. *Chairman, Local Board, may order Dogs to be destroyed when Certificate has been refused.*—The owner of every dog in respect of which the conditions attached to the certificate have not been complied with, shall on being noticed to do so, produce the dog at the Local Board Office, and the Chairman may, if he think fit, order the destruction of the dog.
8. *Collars for Dogs.*—Every dog kept within the limits of the Local Board shall wear a collar with the Local Board stamp, the registered number, and year of registration stamped on it. No dog wearing such collar shall be liable to seizure. A register of the stamping of collars shall be kept in the Local Board Office.
9. *Collars to be paid for if supplied by the Board.*—The Chairman is hereby authorized to issue dog collars to every person applying for the same on a payment of 37 cents per collar. The collar to be stamped by the Local Board without further charge.
10. *Stamping of Collars to be free.*—Every person desirous of providing a collar for his dog shall be allowed to obtain the Local Board stamp and number on it without any charge.
11. *Dogs seized to be Detained.*—All dogs seized under section 10 of Ordinance No. 25 of 1901 shall be delivered to such person thereto authorized by the Chairman or detained at the Local Board dog-pen.
12. *Payment for releasing a Dog after Seizure.*—No stray dog seized under the authority of the Chairman shall be restored to its owner without a payment of 50 cents for the first day and 25 cents a day for every subsequent day or part of a day in which the dog is detained, in addition to the registration fee.
13. *Headmen to report owners of Unregistered Dogs.*—All police headmen living within Local Board limits are required to report to the Chairman, Local Board, the name and address of persons who keep unregistered dogs.
14. *Occupier to hand over ownerless Dogs.*—The occupier of any house disclaiming ownership of a dog found in his premises is required, when demanded, to hand the dog over to the authorities who will decide as to the disposal of the animal.
15. *Conditions on which Certificates are issued.*—Certificates for dogs shall have the following conditions attached thereto:—
The certificate is liable to be cancelled by the Chairman after notice to be left at the address of the owner.
(a) Should the dog become so maimed or diseased as to be incurable and to be in the opinion of the Chairman or Medical Officer unfit to live.
(b) Should the Chairman be satisfied that the dog is habitually ill-treated or continually neglected by its owner.
(c) Should the dog be permitted by its owner to associate with dogs belonging to others, at a time when it is suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.
