VITAL STATISTICS OF CEYLON.

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL FOR THE FOURTH QUARTER OF 1909.

I.—Population.

THE estimated population of the Island on the last day of the quarter was 4,082,935, showing an increase of 10,560 on the previous quarter, due to an excess of 8,005 births over deaths, and an excess of 2,555 arrivals over departures of Indian coolies.

2. *Arrivals and departures of Indian coolies.*—The number of Indian coolies who arrived in the Island during the quarter amounted to 13,382 and of departures to 10,827, as against 19,377 arrivals and 16,068 departures, the averages for the corresponding quarters of the last eleven years.

II.—Marriages.

3. *Marriages.*—4,522 general marriages (*i.e.*, marriages other than Kandyan or Muhammadan) were registered during the quarter and 1,471 Kandyan marriages. Their distribution by Provinces and districts is given in Table I. in the Appendix.

4. Table VI. in the Appendix shows the marriages solemnized in the general community in each Province and district in the Island, the civil condition, nationality, the highest, lowest, and mean ages of the parties, the mode of solemnization, the number of bridegrooms and brides who were unable to sign their names in the register, &c. Table VII. gives similar information in respect of the Kandyan marriages.

III.—Births and Deaths.

5. *Births.*—The births registered during the quarter numbered 36,424 (37 Europeans, 248 Burghers, 24,985 Sinhalese, 8,538 Tamils, 2,406 Moors, 131 Malays, and 79 Others), and were in the proportion of 37·4 per 1,000 persons living, as against 33·8 in the previous quarter and 41·0 the average of the corresponding quarters in the period 1898–1908. See Table VIII. for each Province and district.

6. *Deaths.*—The number of deaths registered during the quarter amounted to 28,419 (22 Europeans, 145 Burghers, 17,244 Sinhalese, 9,043 Tamils, 1,802 Moors, 96 Malays, and 67 Others), and was equal to an annual rate of 29·2 per 1,000 persons living, as against the average 29·5 for the fourth quarters in the period 1898–1908 and 29·3 the rate in the preceding quarter. See Table IX. for each Province and district.

7. The births and deaths and their rates for the whole Island are compared with the previous quarter, the corresponding quarter of the previous year, and the average for the fourth quarters of 1898–1908 in the following Table A. For these particulars as to each Province and district, see Tables I. and II. :—

8. The birth-rate thus shows a deterioration on the average a deterioration shared by two-thirds of the districts in the Island, and was greatest in Kurunegala, Matara, and Hambantota. The death-rate shows a slight improvement, an improvement which is shared by 11 out of the 21 districts, and was greatest in Kurunegala, Matale, and Anuradhapura.

9. *Infantile mortality.*—The deaths of infants under one year of age numbered 6,905, and were in the proportion of 189 to 1,000 registered births. The rate of infantile mortality varied from 302 (for Tamils) in Trincomalee, 284 (for Sinhalese) in Anuradhapura, 270 (for Tamils) in Batticaloa, 264 (for Moors) in Puttalam, 262 (for Tamils) in Mannar, and 247 (for Sinhalese) in Badulla, to 148 (for Sinhalese) in Colombo, 142 (for Sinhalese) in Matara, 139 (for Sinhalese) in Galle, 131 (for Sinhalese) in Kalutara, 115 (for Sinhalese) in Negombo, and 100 (for Sinhalese) in Chilaw.

IV.—State of Public Health.

10. The general health of the population during the quarter was slightly better than usual, the death-rate having fallen to 29·2 from the average 29·5 for the fourth quarters in the period 1898–1908. The improvement was shared by four out of the nine Provinces, viz., Northern, Southern, North-Western, and North-Central. The death-rate for the quarter was a great improvement on the corresponding quarter of last year (34·9) (except in the Northern and Eastern Provinces), and was about the same as in the previous quarter (29·3).

11. The healthiest Province during the quarter was, as usual, the Western, with a death-rate for all races of 24·2, followed by the North-Western with 24·9; the unhealthiest was, as usual in the quarter, the Province of Uva, with a death-rate of 46·7, followed by the Eastern with 36·8. The healthiest district for all races was Negombo with a death-rate of 16·8, and the unhealthiest was Ratnapura with 47·4.

12. Tables III., IV., and V. in the Appendix show the number of births and deaths registered in the several Provinces and districts of the Island and in the revenue subdivisions of those districts for the quarter under review, and the average for the corresponding quarters in the period 1898–1908. The birth-rates and death-rates for all ages and for infants in the several Provinces and districts of the Island are shown for the Sinhalese only in the districts which are mainly inhabited by the Sinhalese, and for the Tamils only where Tamils form the bulk of the population. In the Puttalam and the Batticaloa Districts, which contain a resident population comprised of Sinhalese, Tamils, and Moors, the rates are given for each of these races.

13. *Western Province*.—The health of the Sinhalese inhabitants of this Province, who on the first day of the quarter were estimated to number 865,445, or a little less than a third of the entire Sinhalese population of the Island, was normal, the death-rate during the quarter being the same as the mean-rate (21·2) for the corresponding quarters in the period 1898–1908. During the quarter the Sinhalese of the Province were healthier than the inhabitants of any other Province, and recorded the lowest infantile mortality among the Provinces, viz., 137 per 1,000 births registered. Two out of the three districts show an improvement in the death-rate as compared with the average, the exception being Kalutara (25·2, average 22·5). The infantile mortality of the Negombo District (115 per 1,000 births registered) is the second lowest in the Island, coming next after Chilaw (100), and followed by Kalutara (131). The birth-rate of the Province (36·0) was a deterioration from the average 38·7, a deterioration shared by two of its districts, the exception being Colombo.

14. *Central Province*.—The Sinhalese inhabitants of this Province, who on the first day of the quarter numbered a little over 329,000, enjoyed better health than usual, their death-rate for the quarter, falling to 28·5 from the average 33·9. The improvement was shared by every district in the Province. As usual, the least healthy district was Matale (32·7, average 40·9), while Nuwara Eliya, which is usually the healthiest district, was this quarter almost on a par with Kandy : Nuwara Eliya 27·6 (average 30·3) and Kandy 27·5 (average 31·4). The birth-rate of the Province (39·2), however, shows a deterioration on the average (49·8), all the three districts sharing in the deterioration.

15. *Northern Province*.—The health of the Tamil inhabitants of the Province who form the bulk of the population, and were estimated to number a little over 352,000 on the first day of the quarter, was better than usual, their death-rate declining to 25·3 from the average 28·5. The improvement was shared by every district in the Province, and was greatest in Mullaitivu (36·5, average 42·5) and least in Jaffna, which contains the bulk of the Tamil population (324,977), and is the healthiest in the Province (24·6, average 27·7). The birth-rate of the Province (36·0) was worse than the average (38·1), the deterioration being confined to the Jaffna District.

16. *Southern Province*.—The Sinhalese inhabitants of this Province, who numbered 603,496 on the first day of the quarter, experienced slightly better health than usual, their death-rate for the quarter being 26·7, against the average 27·6. Two of its three districts shared in the improvement, the exception being Galle, whose death-rate (27·2) rose very slightly over the average (27·0). The improvement was greater in the Hambantota District (23·8, average 29·9) and in Matara (24·5, average 27·2). The birth-rate of the Province (38·5) was worse than usual (46·8), a deterioration noticeable in all its districts.

17. *Eastern Province*.—This Province, which at the beginning of the quarter was estimated to contain a population of 103,123 Tamils (of whom 85,632 were in the Batticaloa District and 17,491 in the Trincomalee District), 70,180 Moors, and 9,003 Sinhalese, presented death-rates of 39·4, 32·7, and 48·9, respectively, for the Tamils, Moors, and Sinhalese, against their respective averages of 32·2, 27·2, and 35·9 for the corresponding quarters in the period 1898–1908. Every section of the population thus experienced worse health than usual. The Sinhalese of the Province suffered most, and the Moors least. The unhealthiness among the Tamils was noticeable in the Batticaloa District, which contains the bulk of the Tamil population of the Province (39·2, average 31·7), and in a less degree in Trincomalee (40·1, average 37·5). The birth-rate of the Province showed an improvement for the Sinhalese section of the population, and a deterioration for the Tamils and Moors.

18. *North-Western Province*.—The Sinhalese, who form the bulk of the population of the Province, and were estimated to number 332,128 persons on the first day of the quarter, enjoyed better health than usual, their death-rate for the quarter falling to 23·8 from the average (31·0) for the corresponding quarters of the last eleven years. All its three districts shared in the improvement. The improvement is greatest in the Kurunegala District (from 34·4 to 25·6), and least in the Chilaw District (from 18·4 to 16·8). Chilaw was the healthiest district in the Island, and records the lowest infantile mortality among the districts, viz., 100 per 1,000 births registered. The Tamils of the Province fared worse

than usual, and than the Sinhalese or the Moors, while the Moors fared better than usual, the death-rate of the Tamils rising to 43·5 from the average 41·9, and of the Moors declining to 31·4 from the average 35·8. The Sinhalese were the healthiest section in the Province. Their birth-rate (30·8) was a deterioration from the average (46·1), as also of the Moors, but the Tamil rate was better than usual.

19. *North-Central Province*.—In the North-Central Province, which is the same as the Anuradhapura District, the Sinhalese death-rate declined from the average 39·9 to 33·8, and the birth-rate from 42·9 to 35·7. The infantile mortality in the Province, viz., 284 per 1,000 births registered, is the highest recorded in the Island.

20. *Province of Uva*.—This Province, which is co-extensive with the Budulla District, also showed a decline in the death- and birth-rates from the average 50·4 to 45·5 and from 53·9 to 50·4 respectively, and the infant mortality was 247 per 1,000 births registered.

21. *Province of Sabaragamuwa*.—The health of the Sinhalese inhabitants of this Province during the quarter was slightly better than usual, their death-rate having fallen to 28·0 from the average 30·0. The improvement was shared by both its districts, Ratnapura (34·0, average 34·9) and Kegalla (23·5, average 26·1). The birth-rate of the Province showed a deterioration from the average 49·6 to 42·5, a deterioration shared by both its districts. The improved death-rate in this and the two preceding Provinces was probably connected with the reduced birth-rate.

For the health of the estate population (mainly Tamil) in the Central, Uva, Sabaragamuwa, and Western Provinces, see *infra*, Chapter VI., "Estate Population."

V.—Causes of Death.

22. The causes of death registered in the Island during the quarter are shown in detail in Table X. in the Appendix, and select causes of death are shown in the following Table B :—

23. *Cholera*.—There were 4 deaths from cholera reported for registration during the quarter from Puttalam (1 Sinhalese, 2 Tamils, and 1 Moor). The Provincial Surgeon reports that the disease does not appear to have been introduced from outside, and has been attributed to bad water used for drinking, and he adds that the early cases were at the time of attack suffering from fever, probably malaria.

24. Among the other causes of death were debility 1,028, anaemia 868, old age 772, worms 787, general dropsy 677, thrush 192, abscess 192, malarial cachexia 189, rheumatism 179, paralysis 143, enteritis 130, tetanus 123, measles 55, influenza 34, whooping cough 12, and chickenpox 5.

25. *Deaths by violence; accidents*.—Of the 400 deaths attributed to accidents, 111 were due to drowning (of which 15 were by falling into wells), 66 to fall from trees, 53 to snake bites, 41 to burns and scalds, 15 to fall of heavy substances, 12 to fall from heights other than trees, 11 to gunshot wounds, 8 to taking poisonous substances, 6 to railway accidents, 5 each to lightning and to injuries at birth, 3 to motor car accidents, and 1 each to being run over by cart and stone roller; buffaloes were responsible for 2 deaths, spiked fish for 2, bulls, elephants, wasps, and bees for 1 each, and a tiger, a crocodile, and a frog for 1 each; 1 death was caused by suffocation, and 1 death by machinery.

26. *Homicide.*—Thirty-three deaths were due to homicide (24 Sinhalese, 9 Tamils) of which 7 were in Colombo, 3 each in Negombo, Kalutara, Kandy, Galle, Matara, and Kurunegala, 2 each in Hambantota and Ratnapura, 1 each in Matale, Jaffna, Badulla, and Kegalla.

27. *Suicides.*—Fifty-three deaths were due to suicides (1 Burgher, 28 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils), of which 29 were by hanging, 8 by gunshot wounds, 7 by poison, 5 by drowning, 1 by a cut, 1 by being run over by train, and 2 by other means.

28. *Execution.*—There were as many as 8 judicial executions (7 Sinhalese and 1 Tamil) registered in the Island during the quarter : 6 in Colombo, 1 in Kandy, and 1 in Galle.

VI.—Health of the Estate Population.

29. The total number of births reported for registration from the estates* in the Central, Uva, and Sabaragamuwa Provinces, and in the Colombo and Kalutara Districts of the Western Province during the quarter amounted to 3,690 (5 Europeans, 10 Burghers, 181 Sinhalese, 3,448 Tamils, 30 Moors, 8 Malays, and 8 Others), and the deaths numbered 4,193 (3 Europeans, 4 Burghers, 107 Sinhalese, 4,035 Tamils, 39 Moors, 2 Malays, and 3 Others), corresponding to an annual birth-rate of 34·8 and a death-rate of 39·6 as against their respective averages of 25·4 and 28·4 for the period of 1898 to 1908.

Deaths are in marked excess over births in Colombo, Ratnapura, and Matale Districts, and in less degree in the Districts of Badulla, Kalutara, and Kandy. The Ratnapura District leads with the highest death-rate of 116·1, followed by Kalutara (56·1) and Badulla (50·1); while Nuwara Eliya District shows the lowest death-rate 31·6, followed by Kandy 31·8. The highest birth-rate is noticeable in Ratnapura (54·8), and the lowest in Colombo (21·0).

30. The causes of death are shown in detail in Table XI. in the Appendix, and select causes are shown in the following Table C :—

VII.—Health of the City of Colombo.

32. The births registered in the city of Colombo numbered 1,271, and corresponded to an annual rate per mille of 27·3, being 3·1 per 1,000 higher than the average (24·2) for the corresponding quarters in 1898-1908.

33. The deaths registered numbered 1,475. To this have to be added 5 deaths of town residents, which occurred at the Enteric Hospital, Kanatta (outside the town limits), and which were registered by an extra-urban Registrar, making a total of 1,480, and corresponding to a rate of 31·8 per mille per annum, being 4·0 lower than the average (35·8) for the corresponding quarters in 1898-1908.

34. As usual in the city, the death-rate exceeded the birth-rate, owing mainly to the preponderance of males over females (chiefly among the Europeans, Indian Tamils, and Moors), to the presence of hospitals, which add to the normal mortality of the city, and to the registration of births being still somewhat defective.

* By "estate" is meant any land having ten or more acres in cultivation under coffee, tea, cacao, or cinchona grouped together by Proclamation into a district under the Medical Wants Ordinance, No. 17 of 1880.

35. The subjoined Table E gives the births and deaths and their rates for each race for the fourth quarters of 1909 and 1908 and the average for the fourth quarters in 1898-1908:—

36. The rates are calculated on the figures for the quarter estimated upon the basis of the population as enumerated and distributed at the Census of 1901. The rates for Europeans, Malays, and the races classed together as "Others," being calculated upon small populations, are not very reliable. Excluding the rates for these sections, the lowest death-rate was among the Burghers (24·1), against an average of 25·4; and the highest death-rate was among the Sinhalese 36·6 (average 38·1), followed by 32·2 among the Tamils (average 36·9) and 27·1 among the Moors (average 34·0). The Malays, who at the last Census numbered 4,493, show a death-rate of 26·7, against 33·8, the average for the corresponding quarters in 1898-1908.

37. The highest birth-rate in the quarter was among the Burghers 42·2, a rise of 9·8 per 1,000 over the average 32·4. The Sinhalese follow with a rate of 34·5, a rise of 5·6 over the average 28·9. The low birth-rates for Tamils and "Others" are due to their population being a fluctuating one and composed chiefly of adult males.

38. Table XII. gives in detail the deaths from various causes in each ward of the city of Colombo, and according to each nationality. The number of births and deaths in each ward of the city, their rates per mille per annum, and certain selected causes of deaths during the quarter are shown in the following Table F:—

39. The low birth- and death-rates of the Fort and Galle Face and the Pettah Wards are due to their population being, for the most part, a floating, male, adult one. Excluding these wards, the healthiest division in the city was Kollupitiya, with a death-rate of 14·8, while the unhealthiest was New Bazaar, which showed a death-rate of 30·6 per mille per annum.

40. The following Table G indicates the comparative healthiness of each ward and race in the city on the basis of the infantile mortality :—

41. The infant mortality was 288 per 1,000 births for the whole city, but rose as high as 415 in New Bazaar, 362 in San Sebastian, 350 in Slave Island, falling to 149 in Kollupitiya. Among the races, the Tamils lead with the highest mortality (351), followed by the Sinhalese and Moors. The Sinhalese mortality (303 for the city) rose as high as 600 in San Sebastian and 500 in New Bazaar. The Moor mortality (299 for the city) rose as high as 409 in Slave Island and 385 in St. Paul's. The Malays come next with a rate of 291 rising to 478 in Slave Island. The European rate (118) is the lowest for the city.

42. The highest mortality, as usual, was from phthisis and pneumonia, which were responsible for 174 and 160 respectively, followed by diarrhoea and dysentery 148, debility (mostly of infants from inability to suck) 115, infantile convulsions 112, enteritis 94, old age 66, bronchitis 57, tetanus 56, enteric fever 49, worms 33, and paralysis 26. One death was registered from measles of a Sinhalese in New Bazaar.

VIII.—Health of the Principal Towns.

43. This chapter deals with the Vital Statistics of the thirty-one towns of the Island proclaimed under sections 31 to 36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895. The Registrars of these towns are qualified medical men. No death occurring there is registered unless the cause is ascertained by the Registrar's personal inspection of the deceased, or certified by a qualified medical man in attendance on the deceased, and no dead body is buried or cremated without registration being effected.

44. Table XIII. in the Appendix shows the population at the last decennial Census of 1901, and the present estimated population and the births and deaths registered during the quarter, their rates, and the infantile mortality in each town, together with the monthly average birth- and death-rates and infantile mortality from July, 1907 (when monthly statistics were first published), to July, 1909, and the mean temperature and rainfall of each town in the quarter.

45. *Population.*—The estimated population of the thirty-one towns is 484,240, or more than one-ninth of the total population of the Island. The population of the city of Colombo (183,878) is a little over three-fifths of the population of all the other towns taken together (300,368).

46. *Births.*—The births registered in the thirty-one towns during the quarter numbered 3,674, of which 1,935 were of males and 1,739 of females, and correspond to an annual birth-rate per 1,000 of 30·10, as against 26·62 during the previous quarter and 32·09 during the corresponding quarter of the previous year. Of the towns (excluding Vavuniya and Lunugala, which have a population under 1,000) the highest birth-rate for the quarter was observed in Mannar (51·10), and the lowest in Hatton and Dikoya (11·34), followed by Kurunegala (11·45). In the other towns the birth-rate ranged from 45·20 in Chilaw, 44·99 in Hambantota, and 41·92 in Gampola, to 21·13 in Nawalapitiya, 17·30 in Anuradhapura, and 16·78 in Nuwara Eliya. The city of Colombo records a rate of 27·42, as against 22·29 in the previous quarter and 25·68 during the corresponding quarter of the previous year.

47. *Deaths.*—The number of deaths registered in the thirty-one towns during the quarter was 4,305, of which 2,412 were of males and 1,893 of females, and correspond to an annual death-rate of 28·42 per mille, as against 29·20 during the preceding quarter and 37·64 during the corresponding quarter of the previous year.

48. Corrected death-rates as well as crude death-rates are shown in Table XIII. By a corrected rate is meant the rate calculated for the population of each town on the basis that its age- and sex-constitution is the same as for the Island, and also excluding from the total deaths (as in the crude rate) hospital deaths of estate coolies and other persons who are not town residents. The corrected rate should thus furnish a more satisfactory test of the comparative health of the towns than the crude rate.

49. The death-rate for all towns this quarter (28·42) is slightly lower than in the previous quarter, and much lower than in the corresponding quarter of the preceding year (37·64). Corrected death-rates not being available before the middle of 1907, an average cannot be stated for the quarter for the purpose of comparison. Taking, however, the average of the monthly mortality rates up to June of the year, the death-rate for the quarter shows also a decline from this average (32·29). This improvement is noticeable in twenty-four out of the thirty-one towns, the principal exceptions being Ratnapura and Jaffna. The mortality in Ratnapura has been abnormal since August, when it was 42·24 (average 38·29); it remained at the same level in September, and, with a slight rise to 44·88 in October, declined almost to the average in November (38·19). But this was not maintained, for in the month following it suddenly rose to the extraordinary rate of 60·73. The high mortality in this month is attributed to climatic causes. The mortality of Jaffna began to deteriorate also in August, when it was 35·31, against the average 33·69. The rate rose to 38·10 in September, and higher still to 51·03 in October, but declined to 34·67 in November and 37·04 in December. The high mortality in October is attributed to climatic influence, hot days and nights with chilly mornings causing pneumonia and bowel complaints, and high mortality among infants.

50. Of the towns, excluding Vavuniya and Lunugala, the lowest corrected mortality during the quarter was recorded in Nuwara Eliya (12·82), and the highest in Ratnapura (48·04). In the other towns the death-rate ranged from 18·82 in Tangalla, 19·06 in Kegalla, and 20·55 in Moratuwa, to 39·81 in Mullaittivu, 40·99 in Jaffna, and 43·46 in Puttalam. The city of Colombo shows 29·15, as against 30·86 in the previous quarter and 42·81 in the corresponding quarter of the previous year.

51. In the following Table H the birth- and death-rates for each town for the quarter are compared with the rates for the fourth quarter of last year and the average birth- and death-rates for the corresponding quarters of the preceding eleven years:—

52. The death-rates shown in this Table are crude rates, inclusive of hospital and jail deaths. For corrected rates, which are available only from July, 1907, see Table XIII.

53. *Infantile mortality.*—The infantile mortality of the thirty-one towns was equal to a rate of 248 per 1,000 births registered, as against 270 in the previous quarter and 306 in the corresponding quarter of the previous year. In the towns having an estimated population of 5,000 or more, the mortality ranged from 500 in Anuradhapura, 329 in Jaffna, 323 in Trincomalee, and 305 in Matale, to 178 in Negombo, 167 each in Kalutara and Nuwara Eliya, 149 in Moratuwa, 133 in Matara, and 84 in Weligama. In Colombo the rate was 287, against 336 in the previous quarter and 422 during the corresponding quarter of last year.

54. *Causes of deaths.*—Table XIV. in the Appendix gives for each town and race the principal causes of deaths registered during the quarter, and shows the infantile mortality separately from the general mortality (one year and over).

55. *Infants.*—Out of the 4,305 deaths from all causes at all ages in the thirty-one towns, 912 or nearly one-fifth were among infants under one year. Of these, the chief causes were 270 *convulsions* (of which 98 in Colombo, 39 in Galle, 14 in Negombo, 13 in Matara, 12 in Trincomalee, 11 in Batticaloa, 10 in Kandy), 173 *debility* (of which 72 in Colombo, 22 in Jaffna, 11 in Kandy, 10 in Moratuwa), 100 *premature birth* (of which 24 in Colombo, 17 in Jaffna, 10 each in Moratuwa, Kandy, and Galle), 67 *tetanus* (of which 42 in Colombo, 11 in Jaffna, 8 in Moratuwa), 62 *pneumonia* (of which 28 in Colombo, 7 in Galle), 57 *diarrhoea* (of which 16 each in Colombo and Jaffna, 6 in Galle), 55 *bronchitis* (of which 24 in Colombo, 15 in Jaffna).

56. *General mortality (one year and over).*—Out of the 3,393 deaths of persons one year and over in age, there were 789 due to *diarrhoea* and *dysentery*, of which 128 were in Colombo, 89 in Ratnapura, 73 in Jaffna, 68 in Kandy, 53 in Badulla, 42 in Negombo, 33 in Matale; 351 to *pneumonia*, of which 122 were in Colombo, 33 in Trincomalee, 26 in Galle, 15 in Batticaloa, 14 each in Negombo and Moratuwa; 328 to *phthisis*, of which 169 were in Colombo, 39 in Galle, 18 in Kandy, 13 in Jaffna, 12 each in Matara and Kurunegala; 158 to *dochmias duodenalis*, of which 22 each were in Kandy and Matale, 15 in Colombo, 9 each in Kalutara and Nawalapitiya; 106 to *enteric fever*, of which 49 were in Colombo, 14 in Kandy, 7 in Moratuwa; 81 to *malarial cachexia*, of which 18 were in Kurunegala, 10 in Batticaloa, 9 each in Matale, Jaffna, and Badulla; 69 to *remittent fever*, of which 18 were in Jaffna, 11 in Galle, 9 in Colombo; 54 to *bronchitis*, of which 33 were in Colombo, 5 in Jaffna; 51 to *Bright's disease and nephritis*, of which 23 were in Colombo; 38 to *puerperal fever*, of which 20 were in Colombo.

57. *Percentage of principal causes of deaths at all ages.*—Of the total number of deaths at all ages in the towns, diarrhoea and dysentery accounted for 20 per cent., bronchitis and pneumonia 12 per cent., phthisis and infantile convulsions nearly 8 per cent. each, debility 7 per cent., and fevers 5 per cent.
