VITAL STATISTICS.

negistrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended July 9, 1910.

Births.—The total births registered were 79 (2 Europeans, 7 Burghers, 44 Sinhalese, 8 Tamils, 17 Moors, 0 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1910, viz., 187,554) was 22.0, as against 20.8 in the preceding week, 26.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 124 (3 Europeans, 6 Burghers, 54 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 24 Moors, 6 Malays, and 2 Others), including 2 deaths of town residents who died in the Enteric Hospital at Kanatta. The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 34.5, as against 31.4 in the previous week, 36.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 33.7 the weekly average for last year.

Injuntile Deaths.—Of the 124 total deaths, 30 were of infants under one year of age, as in the preceding week, and in the corresponding week of the previous year, against 27 the average for last year.

Still Births.—The number of still births registered during the week was 3.

Selected Causes of Death.—Twelve deaths were registered from Phthisis (against 15 in the previous week and the weekly average for last year), of which 3 each were in Kotahena and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 2 in Kollupitiya and 1 each in St. Paul's, New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals, and Slave Island.

- 2. Ten deaths were registered from *Pneumonia* (against 12 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year), of which 2 were in St. Paul's, and 1 each in Pettah, St. Sebastian, Kotahena, New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals, Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), Slave Island, and Kollupitiya. Two deaths were registered from *Bronchitis*.
- 3. As many as 18 deaths were registered from Diarrhea (including 11 infants), 12 from Enteritis (3 infants), 8 Dysentery, 5 Debility (3 infants), 5 Infantile Convulsions, 5 Old Age, 4 Worms, 4 Tetanus (all infants), and 32 from Other Causes.
- 4. Seven deaths were registered from *Enteric Fever* (against 10 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year), of which 2 each were in New Bazaar and Maradana hospitals, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and Slave Island. There were 21 cases reported during the week, against 25 in the previous week.
- 5. Two cases of Measles were reported, against 4 in the previous week; and 9 of Chickenpox, against 5 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82.0°, against 81.2° in the preceding week and 79.0° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.926 in., against 29.908 in. in the preceding week and 29.987 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.68 in., against 0.12 in. in the preceding week and 6.14 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
