### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by section 5 of the Ordinance No. 3 of 1870, intituled "An Ordinance to amend the Laws of Marriage in the Kandyan Provinces," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation, to divide the Kandyan Provinces enumerated in Schedule B to the said Ordinance into districts for the purposes of the registration of marriages under the said Ordinance, and from time to time to alter and amend such divisions :

And whereas the said Kandyan Provinces have, by Proclamation, from time to time been divided into districts for the purposes of the registration of Kandyan marriages :

And whereas it is expedient to alter the said divisions :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this our Proclamation alter and amend the divisions heretofore made of the said Kandyan Provinces, and specified in the first column of the annexed schedule, with effect from the First day of April, 1903, in the manner specified in the second column thereof.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-third day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Three.

#### CENTRAL PROVINCE.—Kandy District.

Divisions as defined by the Proclamation of 28th  
February, 1900.

##### 1.—Kandy Municipality Limits.

Boundaries :—North by the Mahaweli-ganga ; east by the Mahaweli-ganga as far as the Ilukmodara-ela, thence up the Ilukmodara-ela and the Alupothakadekandakandura, otherwise called Polwattakandura, until the Ampitiya-Talatuoya road is reached ; on the south a straight line drawn from the point where the said Polwattakandura crosses the said road to the easternmost point of the Fairieland estate (title plan No. 51,472), thence the eastern and southern limits of Fairieland estate and the watershed of the basin of the Kandy Waterworks reservoir up to the trace of the proposed conduit, thence along the trace of the conduit to the Hal-oya stream, thence along the Hal-oya and the eastern and northern boundary of Richmond estate, the western boundary of title plan No. 44,047, the northern boundary of Hantane, Mount Pleasant, Oorawella, and Augusta estates, a straight line drawn due west from the westernmost point of Augusta estate to the limit of Peradeniya estate, thence along the eastern boundary of that estate to the railway line, and along the railway line to the Mahaweli-ganga ; on the west the Mahaweli-ganga, a straight line at right angles to the Peradeniya-Gampola road 300 yards from the 68th milepost and extending 50 yards past the road, a line running northward parallel to the road, a line crossing the Colombo road 300 yards above the 68th milepost and extending 50 yards to the north of it, a straight line to the Mahaweli-ganga, the Mahaweli-ganga, a line parallel to the Katugastota-Galagedara road at a distance of 100 yards to the south of it up to the 2 $\frac{3}{4}$  milepost, a straight line at right angles to the road at the 2 $\frac{3}{4}$  milepost and extending 100 yards beyond the road, lines parallel to the Galagedara-Katugastota and Katugastota-Panwila roads at a distance of 100 yards as far as Pinga-oya, the Pinga-oya, a straight line passing at right angles through the 3rd milepost on the Matale road and extending 100 yards beyond it, lines parallel to the Matale-Katugastota and Katugastota-Panwila roads at a distance of 100 yards up to the 3rd milepost, a straight line at right angles to the road at the 3rd milepost to the Mahaweli-ganga, and the Mahaweli-ganga.

Divisions as defined by this Proclamation.

##### 1.—Kandy Municipality Limits.

Boundaries :—North, the Mahaweli-ganga ; east, the Mahaweli-ganga to a point 52 chains below the Lewella ferry, and thence a straight line drawn to the south-east corner of the Hermitage estate, thence along the eastern boundaries of the Hermitage and Fairieland estates (title plans Nos. 43,322 and 42,285) ; south and south-west, the southern and western boundaries of the Fairieland estate, thence from the south-west corner of the Fairieland estate along the watershed of the basin of the Kandy Waterworks reservoir to the eastern boundary of the land acquired for a conduit, thence along the eastern boundary of the said conduit to the Hal-oya, thence along the Hal-oya and a portion of the northern boundary of the Richmond Hill estate to the western boundary of the Borawadeniya or the Ambagahakumbura paddy fields, thence along the western boundary of the said fields to the railway bridge over the Meda-ela to the west of the slaughter-house, thence along the Meda-ela to the railway bridge over the Meda-ela at Getambe, thence along the southern boundary of the railway line to the Mahaweli-ganga ; west, the Mahaweli-ganga to a point 100 yards above the Katugastota bridge, and thence a line drawn in the same direction as the Kandy-Galagedara road, and on the southern side of it, at 100 yards distant therefrom, as far as the 2 $\frac{3}{4}$  milestone ; thence a line drawn at right angles to the said road to a point 100 yards to the north thereof, and thence back again at a distance of 100 yards therefrom as far as the 3rd milestone on the Matale road, thence a line drawn at right angles to the said Matale road to a point 100 yards on the eastern side thereof, and thence back again along the same road and 100 yards to the east thereof up to its junction with the Panwila road, and thence in the direction of the said Panwila road and 100 yards to the north thereof as far as the 3rd milestone, thence a line drawn at right angles to the said road as far as the Mahaweli-ganga.

Divisions as defined by the Proclamation of 28th February, 1900.

7.—Yatinuwara, Gangawatta (excluding Kandy Municipality), and part of Gangapalata Division No. 3.

Boundaries :—North by boundaries of Harispattu and Pata Dumbara divisions ; south by boundaries of Pata Hewaheta and Udapalata divisions ; east by boundaries of Pata Dumbara and Pata Hewaheta divisions ; west by boundaries of Gannoruwa, Eriagama, and Harispattu divisions.

29.—Pata Hewaheta, Gandahe Korale Division No. 1.

Boundaries :—North-west by boundary of Yatinuwara division ; north-east by boundary of Pata Dumbara ; south-east by boundary of Hewawisse korale ; south-west by boundary of Udapalata division.

Divisions as defined by this Proclamation.

7.—Yatinuwara, Gangawatta (excluding the Kandy Municipality), and part of Gangapalata Division No. 3.

Boundaries :—East by Mahaweli-ganga, the boundary of Udapalata, and Nanu-oya ; south by Nagasange-ela *alias* Meda-ela and railway line ; west by boundaries of Edanduwwa, Bulumulla, and Suriyagoda ; north by boundaries of Harispattu.

29.—Lower Hewaheta, Gandahe Korale Division No. 1.

Boundaries :—East by village boundary of Deltota, Nugaliyadda, Butawatta, and Hara-gama ; south by the boundaries of Udapalata and Yatinuwara ; west by boundaries of Yatinuwara and Kandy Municipality (as proclaimed on 21st February, 1902) ; north by Mahaweli-ganga.

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Our Proclamation alter and amend the limits of the said Kandy Municipality as specified in the first column of the annexed schedule, with effect from 1st April, 1903, in the manner specified in the second column thereof.

JAIL GUARDS.—GENERAL ORDERS.

*Principal Duties.*

When to use arms and when to desist.

20. The police shall endeavour to carry out their duty and their lawful orders on all occasions and in the face of opposition and danger. To enable them to do so they are furnished with arms, and these they are entitled to use in defence when the lives or limbs of themselves or others are endangered by those who unlawfully oppose them. They shall, however, be cautious never to use more force than is absolutely necessary, nor to continue it longer than is absolutely necessary. This is the only general rule that can be laid down for the use of arms.

To be prevented with as little violence as possible, but guards may defend life and limb in the execution of their duty with their arms if absolutely necessary.

21. It is the duty of sentries to prevent the escape of prisoners at all hazards. A sentry may fire at, or use his bayonet against, an escaping prisoner, if he cannot prevent his escape by any other means, or if the prisoner attacks him.

*Escapes.*

When an escaping prisoner is fired at, it is advisable that the first shot at least should be fired wide of the mark; and, if it is necessary to fire again, that the aim should be low, so as to avoid the danger of inflicting a fatal injury.

The rule for the use of arms given in the last regulation should be strictly adhered to.
