PASSED ORDINANCES.

Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

No. 9 of 1910.

An Ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 17 of 1869, intituled "An Ordinance for the General Regulation of Customs in the Island of Ceylon."

HENRY McCallum.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend Ordinance No. 17 of 1869, intituled "An Ordinance for the General Regulation of Customs in the Island of Ceylon," hereinafter called "the principal Ordinance": Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Customs (Amendment) Ordinance, 1910," and shall be read and construed as one with the principal Ordinance, and this Ordinance, the principal Ordinance, and the Ordinances amending the same may be cited collectively as "The Customs Ordinances, 1869 to 1910."

Substitution of new section 27.

2 For the section which by section 3 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1901 was substituted as section 27 of the principal Ordinance, the following section shall be substituted:

Provision with respect to unlading goods, depositing and removing of the same from the King's ware-house, and penalties for failure to remove within prescribed time.

27. No goods shall be unladen from any ship until a sufferance shall have been granted by the Collector for the landing of the same, and no goods shall be landed except at the place appointed and expressed in such sufferance, and all goods so landed shall be taken and deposited in the King's warehouse, and within three clear days from the date of landing the importer shall make a full and complete entry thereof as hereinafter provided, and shall either pay down all duties which shall be due and payable on such goods, or shall duly warehouse the said goods, or, if the goods be free

of duty, shall so enter the same; and in default of such entry being made and the said goods being removed within three clear days as aforesaid, such goods shall be liable to double rent for every period of twenty-four hours during such time as they may remain in the warehouse; and all goods unladen, landed, or removed without such sufferance, or contrary to the directions in such sufferance, shall be forfeited. In computing the said period of three clear days, Sundays and public holidays shall not be taken into account; but, in ascertaining the period for which any goods are liable to double rent, account shall be taken of Sundays and public holidays, and a fractional part of a period of twenty-four hours shall count as a full period of twenty-rour hours.

An Ordinance to amend "The Ceylon Penal Code, 1883."

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend in certain particulars "The Ceylon Penal Code, 1883," hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance": Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Penal Code (Amendment) Ordinance, 1910," and shall be read and construed as one with the principal Ordinance.

Amendment of section 296 A. 2 For the section, which by section 6 of "The Penal Code Amendment Ordinance, 1909," was added as section 296 A of the principal Ordinance, the following section shall be substituted, namely:

Persons under sixteen years of age found guilty of murder.

296 A. Provided that' sentence of death shall not be pronounced on or recorded against a person who, in the opinion of the court, is under the age of sixteen years, but in lieu thereof the court shall sentence such person to be detained during the Governor's pleasure.

No. 11 of 1910.

An Ordinance relating to the Compulsory Retirement of Public Officers.

HENRY McCallum.

Preamble.

WHEREAS the Rules by which the compulsory retirement of public officers from the Public Service is now regulated have been made without Statutory Authority, and it is expedient that Statutory Authority should be supplied for such Rules and also for any further Rules with regard to the retirement of public officers which may hereafter become necessary: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Public Officers (Retirement) Ordinance, 1910."

Power to make rules for compulsory retirement of public officers.

- 2 (1) The Governor, subject to the approval of the Secretary of State, may make, and when made, may revoke, vary, or amend, rules regulating the age at which, and the conditions subject to which, public officers shall be required to retire from the public service.
- (2) In particular and without prejudice to the generality of the power conferred by the preceding sub-section, such rules may—
 - (a) Prescribe the age at which the retirement of public officers or of any particular class of public officers shall be compulsory.
 - (b) Provide, in such cases and subject to such conditions as may be prescribed, for the extension of the employment of public officers beyond the age prescribed by rule for compulsory retirement, and for the exemption of any particular class of public officers from the operation of any rule relating to the compulsory retirement of public officers.
 - (c) Prescribe an age earlier than the age at which retirement from the public service is compulsory at which the Governor may, subject to such conditions as to notice and otherwise as may be prescribed, require public officers to retire from the public service.

Legalization of existing rule.

'3 Rule No. 17 of the minute or collection of rules relating to pensions published on the ninth day of December, 1908, shall be deemed to have been lawfully made, and as valid as if it had been made in pursuance of express statutory authority.

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

An Ordinance to amend "The Widows' and Orphans'
Pension Fund Ordinance, 1898."

Preamble.

W HEREAS it is expedient to amend in certain particulars "The Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund Ordinance, 1898" (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance"): Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Short title and construction.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund (Amendment) Ordinance, 191," and this Ordinance, the principal Ordinance, and the Ordinances amending the same shall be read and construed together, and may be cited collectively as "The Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund Ordinance, 1898 to 191."

Amendment of section 35.

- 2 For sub-section (3) of the section which by section 3 of "The Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund Ordinance, 1907," was substituted as section 35 of the principal Ordinance, the following sub-section shall be substituted, namely:
 - (3) In the event of a contributor being a widower without children, or whose children should have ceased to have any future claim for pension, at the time when he retires or otherwise quits the public service, or subsequently becoming such a widower as aforesaid, such widower or in the event of his death the legal representative of such widower shall be entitled to be paid from the fund, but without any interest, a moiety of the contributions made by such widower since the death of his last wife, or the date on which the last child having a future claim for pension ceased to have such claim, as the case may be, whichever shall happen last; and after payment of such moiety to such widower or his legal representatives, such widower and all persons claiming by, through, or under him shall cease to have any interest in the fund, and shall have no claim thereon.

Statement of Objects and Reasons.

THE Draft Ordinance is introduced with the view of improving the position of contributors who, after leaving the Public Service, have ceased to have a claim on the Fund.

- 2. Under the present Ordinance contributors, who at the date of their retirement from the Public Service are widowers without children eligible for pension, are relieved from further contributions, and are entitled to a refund of a moiety of their contributions to the Fund from the date when they ceased to have an interest in the Fund. This privilege is, however, strictly limited to contributors who had already ceased to have a claim on the Fund at the date of their retirement.
- 3. By the Draft Ordinance it is proposed to extend this concession to contributors who, after leaving the service, become widowers without claim on the Fund.
