#### MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

### MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo, held in the Town Hall on Friday, March 18, 1910.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated March 12, 1910.

Present:—Mr. E. M. de C. Short, Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias; Mr. H. A. Jayewardene; Mr. H. Tiruvilangam Mr. L. B. Fernando; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Mr. Arthur Alvis; Mr. H. L. de Mel; Mr. E. G. Jayewardene; and; Mr. P. P. W. D. W Mr. P. D. Khan.

The Minutes of the General Meeting of February 18, 1910, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of General Meeting of February 18, 1910, be confirmed.

- Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved that this Council decide that Mr. P. D. Khan continue to be a Councillor although he has failed to attend three consecutive General Meetings. Mr. H. A. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.
- 2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene presented a petition from the owners of properties of the villages of Kolonnawa and Kopiyawatta, taken within the eastern extension of Municipal limits, praying that the toll bar at Dematagoda may be removed, that they may not be condemned to pay conservancy charges twice over, and that the present rates may be so adjusted as to be in proportion to the extent of privileges they enjoy, and moved that the same may be considered and relief granted to the petitioners.—Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.

Mr. H. L. de Mel moved that the petition be referred to the Finance Committee for consideration, together with the petition from the residents of Narahenpitiya on the same subject, and for a recommendation to Council. Mr. N. H. M.

Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Municipal Works of March 10, 1910.

- (2) Estimate for dust prevention, Rs. 15,000.—Passed.
- (3) Estimate for extension of Maligakanda Office, Rs. 7, 500.—Recommended.

- (5) Estimate for relaying drains at Suduwella Depôt, Rs. 674 06.—Recommended.
- (6) Estimate for compositor's frames and stero boards for Printing Department, Rs. 525—Recommended.
- (12) Question of a motor car for officers of the Drainage Works, referred by Council on February 18, 1910, to this Committee for report.
- Resolved that the report be circulated to Council and recommended for their favourable consideration.
- (17) Gratuity to Kanawathi Kangany after 33 years' service under the Council.—Recommended that a gratuity of Rs. 177.32 be granted.

Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of March 11, 1910.

- (2) Estimate for compositor's frames and stero boards for Printing Department, Rs. 525.—Recommended.
- (6) Reconsideration of the question of the payment of tram fare allowance to Municipal Officers and servants. The Committee approves of the following rules in respect of tram fare allowance: (i.) No tram fare to be allowed when the residence to office by direct route is one mile or under; (ii.) no tram fare to be allowed for any section of the tram line which is not on the direct route between residence and office.
- (7) Continuation of the appointment of a collector of arrears of vehicles and animals taxes.—To be continued for
- (11) Mr. Heyn's report on the question of the system of registration and correspondence at present in use in the Secretary's Department.
- Resolved that Mr. Heyn's recommendations be acted upon and that that gentlemen be asked, in consideration of a suitable remuneration, to attend the office daily for a few weeks and supervise the initial stages of the proposed new system of registration and correspondence.
- (12) Re-transfer of premises No. 68, Dematagoda, vested in the Council for non-payment of arrears of taxes for 3rd and 4th quarters, 1906, to the administrator of the estate, he having paid all taxes, costs, and rent due to the Council.—Recommended to Council.
- (17) To strike off taxes due on No. I, Arbuthnot street, for 1908 and 1909, no notice of assessment having been served on the owner for these years .-- May be struck off.
- (18) To strike off arrears of tax due on No. 5a, Muhandiram's lane, from 1st quarter, 1908, to 4th quarter, 1909, as a special case.—May be struck off, the circumstances of the case being special.

Resolved that Council do go into Committee to consider items 3 and 4 on the agenda.

#### (Council in Committee.)

- 3. With reference to item No. 12 of the recommendation of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of March 10, 1910, the Chairman moved the proposal as set out in the report of the Resident Engineer. No. 191 of March 4, 1910, be approved, the cost not to exceed £400 f. o. b. Mr. H. A. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.

  Resolved that the remaining items Nos. 2, 3, 5, 6, and 17 of the a bove recommendations be adopted.
- 4. The Chairman moved that the recommendations (items Nos. 2, 6, 7, 11, 12, 17, and 18) of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of March 11, 1910, be adopted. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

Resolved that Council do resume and that the resolutions passed in Committee be adopted.

- Letter from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, No. 10 of January 18, 1910, forwarding copy of a report from the Hon. the Government Agent, Western Province, on the question of the inclusion of Wellawatta within Municipal limits, held over at the last meeting, was brought before the Council.
- Mr. E. G. Jayewardene moved that the matter be laid over for consideration at next meeting of Council. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.—Carried.
- 6. The Chairman brought up Municipal Engineer's letter No. 97 of January 24, 1910, on the subject of bracketing together under one number certain Estimates for upkeep of Municipal Buildings, 1910, held over at the last meeting, and moved that the votes be grouped as follows: Nos. 176, 177, 178, 179, 194, and 195; Nos. 183, 184, and 185; Nos. 186, 187, and 188; Nos. 190 and 191. Mr. H. A. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.
- The Chairman brought up letter No. 240 of February 22, 1910, from Mr. R. Skelton, Municipal Engineer, on the subject of his salary, and moved that it be referred to the Works Committee. Mr. H. A. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.
- 8. Letter from Messrs. Julius and Creasy, forwarding copy of a letter from Mr. Advocate F. J. de Saram (junior), relating to his fees for drafting the New Municipal Ordinance, was brought before the Council.
  - Mr. H. A. Jayewardene moved that the amount be paid. Mr. P. D. Khan seconded.—Carried.
- 9. The Chairman laid before the Council certain draft sections proposed to be substituted for section 164 of the new Draft Municipal Ordinance.—By leave of the Council this item was withdrawn for the present.
- 10. To confirm payment of ricksha allowances made to the late Mr. Boţeju, Vehicles and Animals Tax Collector, from March 1 up to the date of his death.
  - The Chairman moved that the allowance be granted up to November 30, 1909. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.
- Authority of Council required, for the satisfaction of Audit, to pass small items of expenditure incurred in 1909 under the Vote "Personal Emoluments."
  - The Chairman moved that the necessary authority be granted. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.
- The Chairman moved that the valuation of properties contained in the Assessment Book of 1909 for the year 1910, subject to such alterations as the Finance and Assessment Committee may from time to time find necessary, in respect of New Bazaar Ward, be adopted. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.
- The Chairman moved that the excess leave over 30 days granted to Mr. W. Lodewyke, Depôt Overseer, Narahenpitiya, owing to continued ill-health, from February 1 to 14, 1910, be confirmed.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on May 21, 1910, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated May 17, 1910.

Present:—The Hon. Mr. R. B. Hellings, Chairman; Dr. G. P. Schokman; Mr. W. C. Price; Mr. E. L. Wijegoonswardana; Mr. R. W. Jonklas; and Mr. V. M. Saravanamuttu.

The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on April 16 having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read, and confirmed by the Chairman.

The following documents were submitted:-

- (a) Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1909 to April 30, 1910, on account of the Municipa Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue and Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting) and (No. 2 Water-rate Accounts.
- (b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.

(c) Health Officer's Report for April.

(d) Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of April.

(e) The Reservoir Readings for April.

Resolved-That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Council's Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's Report be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government Gazette.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on Laundries, Bakeries, Dairies,

Standpipes, and House Service Taps inspected during April.

4. Correspondence:-

- (2) Circular letter No. 6, from the Superintendent of Census, re preliminary arrangements for the Census of 1911. It was agreed that the work should be carried out on the usual condition, viz., that the expenses be defrayed by Government.
  - (3) Letter of April 22 from Mr. P. M. Coster applying for a grant for the support of the Kandy public band. Resolved—That the application be refused.

Letter of April 25, from Mr. S. A. Owen, Member for Ward No. 4, intimating that he is leaving for Europe and expects to be away for about four months.—Read.

5 Pursuant to notice, Mr. Price asked:-

(a) Is the instruments in possession of the Council for gauging the electrical pressure of the current supplying electric light to the town in good working order?

(b) Have any gaugings of the electric pressure been made by the Superintendent of Works during the last 5 months, and if so what were the pressures obtained on each occasion?

The Superintendent of Works stated that the voltmeter at the Town Hall appeared to be in fairly good working order, and produced the records showing that the pressure registered though as a rule unsteady was, except on one occasion when there was a breakdown of one of the engines at the electrical works, above the minimum required by the contract.

Mr. Price moved—That the Council call attention of the Company to the unsatisfactory nature of the light in Kandy, and point out that little or no improvement has been gained by the introduction of the new lamps.

Mr. Jonklass seconded.—Carried.

Audit report for 1909.--

Resolved—That those excesses not yet covered by sanction of Council be voted.

7. Recommendation by the Medical Officer of Health—That the cesspit privy in premises Nos. 194, 196, Peradeniya road, be closed and a dry-earth closet substituted therefor.

Moved by Mr. Wijegoonawardana, seconded by Mr. Jonklaas, that the recommendation be adopted.—Carried.

8. Paper re the theatre case for sanction to pay claim and costs.

Resolved—That the amount (Rs. 2,643.67) be voted in full settlement.

# Health Officer's Report for April, 1910.

Scavenging.—The scavenging of the town and suburbs was satisfactorily performed during the month. The new incinerator is working very satisfactorily.

Drainage.—The condition of the drains, both large and small, were on the whole satisfactory owing to the frequent heavy showers that fell during the month.

Water Supply.—Good, but not sufficient.

Market.—Clean and well kept.

Bakeries.—Clean and well kept.

Dairies.—Clean and well kept.

Laundries.—Generally well kept.

Alleys.—These are regularly limewashed and kept as clean as possible. Several owners were prosecuted for not providing dry earth and disinfectants.

Latrines.—Clean and well kept.

Night Soil Depot.—Satisfactory and well kept.

Exposing Sheds and Slaughter-house.—These buildings were in good order and well kept.

Fish Boutiques.—Frequent inspections were made. Fish exposed for sale were good and fit for human consumption.

Eating-houses.—Well kept, and the food exposed for sale were good and wholesome.

Cooly Lines.—All the cooly lines were kept clean, the premises attached to them were cleaned and swept.

Food Supply.—All food stuffs exposed for sale, both in market and town, were regularly inspected and found to be good and sufficient. During the month 486 cattle, 178 buffaloes, 130 sheep, and 297 goats were slaughtered; 7 head of cattle, 4 buffaloes, 1 sheep, and 7 goats were rejected 1 liver and 2 lungs of cattle, 6 livers of buffaloes, 1 spleen, 11 livers, and 30 lungs of goats were condemned and buried.

Public Health.—The health of the town was good during the month. Forty-three cases of chickenpox, I case of enteric fever, 1 case of measles, and 1 case of acute diarrhoea were reported.

In this connection I may mention that hoof-and-mouth disease was reported on the 12th among the cattle belonging to the Municipal coolies. The Veterinary Surgeon was promptly informed and measures taken immediately to prevent a spread of the disease. Up to April 28, 41 cases were reported, of which 2 were fatal.
