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PART I.

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VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON IN THE MONTH OF JUNE, 1910.

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.

This report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 31 principal towns in the Island proclaimed under sections 31 to 36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

Births.

- 2. The births registered in the 31 towns during the month numbered 1,078 (567 males and 511 females), and were equal to an annual rate of 26.64 per 1,000, against 27.40 during the preceding month, 25.92 in the corresponding month of last year, and 29.94 the monthly average for the thirty months, July, 1907, to December, 1909. Of the towns (excluding Vavuniya and Lunugala, which have a population under 1,000), the highest birth-rate was in Gampola (60.09, average 35.91), and the lowest in Nuwara Eliya (2.69, average 15.43).
- 3. In the city of Colombo the births numbered 366 (192 males and 174 females), and were equal to an annual rate of 23.74 per 1,000, against 24.42 in the preceding month, 25.80 in the corresponding month of last year, and 25.12 the monthly average. Of the wards (omitting Fort and Galle Face and the Pettah, which contain a population mainly adult and floating), the highest birth-rate was in San Sebastian (26.83, average 21.59), and the lowest in St. Paul's (11.78, average 18.02).

Deaths.

- 4. The deaths registered in the 31 towns during the month numbered 1,285 (711 males and 574 females), and were equal to an annual rate of 25 '48 per 1,000, against 25 '08 during the preceding month, 29 '06 in the corresponding month of last year, and 31 '58 the monthly average. The health of the towns was thus better than usual, and nearly the same as in the previous month. The highest death-rate was in Hambantota (65 '38, average 30 '69), followed by Tangalla (61 '52 average 40 '15), and the lowest in Nawalapitiya (6 '87, average 22 '78), followed by Nuwara Eliya (8 '80, average 14 '30), while in the town of Lunugala there were no deaths of residents, the 12 deaths which occurred there being of non-residents. Mannar and Mullaittivu were unprecedentedly healthy in the month, the former with a mortality of 12 '48 against 36 '48 the average for the month, and the latter with 27 '90, average 48 '83. The improvement of Mannar is great from 64 '43 in March and of Mullaittivu from about the same rate in April and May.
- 5. In the city of Colombo the deaths registered numbered 482 (271 males and 211 females), and were equal to an annual rate of 27.22 per 1,000, against 25.15 during the preceding month, 33.94 in the corresponding month of last year, and 34.03 the monthly average. The city was thus healthier than usual, but slightly worse than in the previous month. Omitting the Fort and Galle Face Ward and the Pettah Ward, the lowest death-rate was in Kollupitiya (16.99, average 20.20), and the highest in New Bazaar (29.85, average 30.80).

Infantile Mortality.

- 6. The infantile mortality of the 31 towns was equal to a rate of 258 per 1,000 births registered, against 214 in the previous month, 277 in the corresponding month of last year, and 319 the monthly average. In the towns having an estimated population of 5,000 or more, the infantile mortality ranged from 625 in Anuradhapura (average 534), 529 in Batticaloa (average 233), to 100 in Negombo (average 206), and nil in Nuwara Eliya (average 370).
- 7. The infantile mortality in the city of Colombo was 352 per 1,000 births registered, against 257 in the previous month, 323 in the corresponding month of last year, and 407 the monthly average, and ranged from 500 in St. Paul's Ward (average 390) to 190 in Kotahena (average 356).

Causes of Death.

- 8. Injants.—Out of the 1,285 deaths from all causes at all ages in the 31 towns, 279 were among infants under one year. Of these, the chief causes were 96 Convulsions (including 36 in Colombo, 10 in Galle, 7 each in Matara and Batticaloa); 48 Debility (13 in Colombo, 6 in Jaffna); 27 Premature Birth (8 in Colombo, 5 in Jaffna); 19 Diarrhæa (13 in Colombo); 18 Tetanus (14 in Colombo, 4 in Jaffna); 15 Pneumonia (11 in Colombo); 13 Bronchitis (8 in Colombo, 5 in Jaffna).
- 9. Out of the 482 deaths from all causes at all ages in the city of Colombo, 129 were among infants under one year. Of these, the chief causes were 36 Convulsions (12 in Maradana exclusive of hospitals, 6 each in New Bazaar and Slave Island); 14 Tetamus (5 in St. Paul's, 4 in San Sebastian, 3 in New Bazaar); 13 Debility (6 in Maradana hospitals, 3 in Slave Island); 13 Diarrilea (4 each in Maradana hospitals and Maradana exclusive of hospitals and 3 in Kollupitiya); 11 Pneumonia (3 each in Kotahena and Maradana exclusive of hospitals); 8 Bronchitis (5 in New Bazaar).

- 10. General Mortality (One Year and over).—Out of the 1,006 deaths of persons one year and over in age in the 31 towns, there were 129 from Pneumonia (50 in Colombo, 12 in Galle, 9 in Batticaloa, 8 in Kandy); 21 from Bronchitis (including 12 in Colombo); 91 from Phthisis (55 in Colombo, 7 in Galle, 6 in Kandy); 119 from Diarrhaa (22 in Kandy, 12 each in Colombo and Kegalla); 72 from Dysentery (23 in Colombo, 8 each in Galle and Badulla, 6 in Trincomalee); 40 from Dochmius Duodenalis (of which 34 were of Tamils, almost all of whom were coolies); 39 from Enteric Fever (30 in Colombo, 3 in Moratuwa); 28 from Remittent Fever (8 in Jaffna); 26 from Malarial Cachexia (9 in Batticaloa); 22 Bright's Disease and Nephritis (including 11 in Colombo).
- 11. The highest mortality in the town of Colombo was from *Phthisis* (16 per cent. of all deaths one year and over), followed by *Pneumonia* (14 per cent.), *Enteric Fever* (9 per cent.). Out of the 91 deaths from *Phthisis* in all towns, 55 occurred in Colombo. This and *Pneumonia* and *Bronchitis* were responsible for 137 deaths at all ages in the city, or 28 per cent. of the deaths from all causes in it.
- 12. Taking all the towns together, Diarrhea and Dysentery contributed the highest mortality (16 per cent.), followed by Bronchitis and Pneumonia (nearly 14 per cent.), Infantile Convulsions (nearly 9 per cent.), Phthisis (over 7 per cent.).
