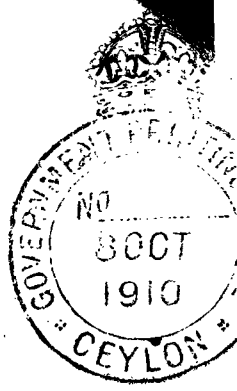
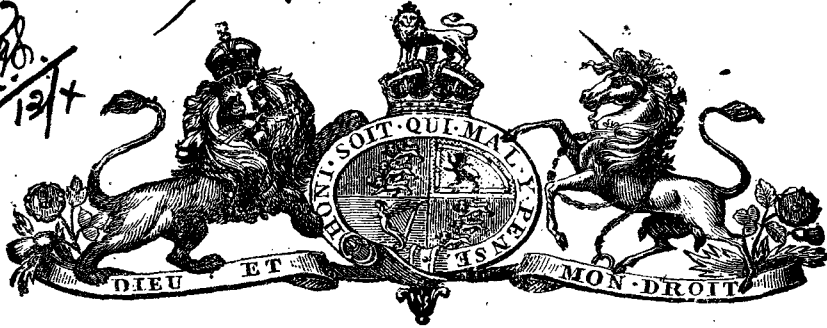

HENRY MCCALLUM.

WHEREAS the buildings hereinafter described erected for the purposes of public slaughter-houses, and under the provisions of section 22 of the Butchers' Ordinance, No. 9 of 1893, were certified to the Governor by the proper authority, to wit, the Government Agent of the Eastern Province, to be sufficient for the purposes of public slaughter-houses :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, in exercise of the power vested in Us by section 22 of the said Ordinance, do hereby declare and proclaim the buildings erected on the land called Vemputtona, situated in division No. 1, Kattankudy, and on the land called Vemputtona, situated in division No. 6, Kattankudy, within the limits of the town of Kattankudy, Batticaloa, to be public slaughter-houses for the purposes of the said Ordinance, as from and after the date hereof.

218 A. No motor cars, except those going out of town or coming into town or going to or from a house in Victoria drive, shall be driven on the said drive between the hours of 4.30 P.M. and 6.30 P.M.

No horses shall be trained on Victoria drive between the hours of 4.30 P.M. and 6.30 P.M.

CHAPTER XV.

248 A. The driver of every cart the body of which is not supported on springs shall while driving keep the cart as near as possible to the left-hand edge of the road in the direction in which the cart is proceeding. He shall not drive his bullock or bullocks at a greater pace than a walk, and shall not pass or attempt to pass any similar cart proceeding in the same direction as his own cart, unless that similar cart is halted. He shall not halt his cart at right angles to the road.

WHEREAS by section 94 of the Road Ordinance, No. 10 of 1861, it is enacted that "Whoever shall leave, or permit to be left, on any road to which the provisions in sub-section (4) of the said section shall be extended, as hereinafter mentioned, any cart or other carriage, without the oxen, horses, or other animals being yoked or harnessed thereto, unless such cart or carriage shall have accidentally broken down there; and in case of such accident, for a longer time than may be necessary for its removal, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 50:"

And whereas it is further enacted by the said section that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation, to declare that the aforesaid provisions shall extend and be applicable to any road in this Colony, or to any section of such road, whenever it shall appear to the Governor and Council that a sufficient number of halting places has been constructed along the same:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Us, the Governor and Council, that a sufficient number of halting places, as set forth in the schedule hereto, has been constructed along the Anuradhapura-Trincomalee road, a distance of 41 miles, from 46½ milepost to the boundary of the Province, 87½ milepost, in the District of Anuradhapura, North-Central Province:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, in exercise of the powers in Us vested as aforesaid, and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the above-recited provision in sub-section (4) of section 94 of the said Ordinance shall extend and be applicable to the road hereinbefore mentioned, as from and after October 10, 1910.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. *The Board may order cesspools to be closed and dry-earth closets substituted.*—The Chairman when especially empowered thereto by resolution of the Board may by notice in writing require the owner or occupier of any house or building or land having a cesspool on his premises to close such cesspool and substitute a dry-earth closet therefor.

2. *Permission to bury in private premises.*—Permission may be granted in writing by the Chairman to any householder to have night soil from his own premises buried or otherwise disposed of on his own premises.

3. *Removal of night soil to the Depot.*—Every person (unless specially exempted in writing thereto by the Chairman under by-law 2) on whose premises the dry-earth system is in operation is hereby required to cause the daily removal of night soil to a depot appointed by the Board for the disposal of the night soil.

4. *Name of person removing night soil to be registered at the Board Office.*—Any householders not having received written permission under by-law 2 may employ any person for the purpose of the removal and disposal of night soil. Provided that in the case of such private arrangements being entered into the name of such person so employed shall be registered at the office of the Board, and the place to which the night soil shall be removed and the method and time of removal and the disposal thereof shall be submitted to the Board for approval.

5. *Fee for removal of night soil.*—Every person employing a Local Board officer for the removal of night soil shall pay to the Board in advance such sum as shall be determined by the Chairman not exceeding Rs. 2 per mensem for each bucket in which such night soil is deposited on his premises for removal by such officer. The sum payable if not paid on or before the 10th of the month in respect of which it is due may be reported by the Chairman to the Police Court and recovered in the same way as if it were a fine imposed by the court.

IT is notified for information that His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, under the authority of section 31 (2) of Ordinance No. 8 of 1910, been pleased to make the following rules for the insurance of horses, the property of members of the Ceylon Volunteer Force, who have to use horses in the execution of their duties.

RULES.

Scheme for Volunteer Force Horse Insurance.

1. All matters in connection with the scheme for the insurance of horses shall be under the management of a Committee consisting of the Commanding Officer of the Ceylon Mounted Rifles, the Staff Officer of the Ceylon Volunteer Force, the Adjutant of the Ceylon Mounted Rifles, the Hon. Mr. A. G. Lascelles, K.C., and the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being.

2. It shall be compulsory for every member of the Ceylon Volunteer Force who has to use a horse or horses in the execution of his duty to insure such horse or horses under this scheme. Provided that no member shall be allowed to have insured at one and the same time more than two horses.

3. The Committee shall from time to time appoint Boards, consisting of the Government Veterinary Surgeon (or one of his qualified Assistants) and two members of each troop of the Ceylon Mounted Rifles, to value horses for the purposes of insurance. The Board shall sit in suitable centres, and no horse shall be insured without a valuation certificate from such Board.

4. Every horse proposed for insurance shall be insured for the value placed upon it by the Board of Valuers. Provided that in no case shall any horse be insured for a sum exceeding Rs. 750, and that a horse already insured under this scheme after valuation by the Board shall be liable for re-valuation once in every two years.

5. Only horses between the ages of 4 and 15 shall be accepted for insurance, and the insurance will cease to be in force when the horse is 15 years old. Horses suffering from osteoporosis, serious lameness, or other serious disease shall not be eligible for insurance.

6. Every horse on being insured shall be entered, with all particulars and a full description of the animal, in a register to be kept by the Adjutant of the Ceylon Mounted Rifles.

7. The insurance on any horse shall cease to be in force so soon as the horse ceases to be the property of the insurer, provided, however, that, if a horse is sold or transferred to another Volunteer, the insurance may also be transferred on payment by the transferee to the Treasurer of the Colony of a fee of Rs. 2.50.

8. The insurance shall only indemnify the insurer against the death or permanent disablement of the horse.

9. Payment of the amount for which the horse is insured will only be made in the case of death (a) on a certificate of an officer of the Volunteer Force who has seen the dead horse, or (b) on an affidavit by the owner; and in the case of permanent disablement, of a certificate from (a) a duly qualified Veterinary Surgeon, (b) an officer of the Board of Valuers, or (c) a member of the Committee.

10. No claim will be paid unless the owner can prove (a) that death or permanent disablement was not caused by any fault or neglect of himself or his servants; (b) that everything possible was done to save the horse.

11. No claim will be paid where the cause of the death or permanent disablement of the horse is in any way attributable to the animal being used for racing or steeple-chasing (exclusive of gymkhanas confined to members of the regular Army stationed in Ceylon or to members of the Ceylon Volunteer Force) or for polo. Claims arising from the use of the animal for hunting, hacking, and driving will be admitted.

12. The premium payable annually by the insurer shall be calculated at the rate of 3 per cent. on the amount for which the horse is insured, provided that should a member of the Force insure two horses, the premium payable on the second horse shall be calculated at the rate of 5 per cent. on the amount for which it is insured.

13. All premia shall be deemed to be due and payable in advance, and no horse shall be considered to be insured in respect of which the premium has not been paid at due date.

14. The Adjutant of the Ceylon Mounted Rifles shall collect all premia, fees, or other sums due from members of the Volunteer Force, and shall pay the same to the Treasurer of the Colony. The Treasurer shall carry all such sums paid to him to the credit of the General Revenue Accounts of the Colony.

15. The Treasurer shall pay out of the General Revenue of the Colony any claim on account of the death or permanent disablement of any horse insured upon the production to him of an order by the Committee.

16. Subject to the approval of the Governor in Executive Council, the Committee shall have the power to issue such further rules from time to time as they may consider necessary.

2. In the case of candidates who submit certificates of registration in the register of past birth, the certificates will only be accepted after consideration of the evidence by which the dates of birth were established. If the name appearing in the birth register differs, either by alteration or addition, from the name by which the candidate is known, the parent or guardian should, before obtaining a certificate, apply to the Registrar-General or his Assistant for such alteration in the manner set forth in section 7 of Ordinance No. 23 of 1900.

3. Clerks in Government-service, from whatever funds they may be paid, who have completed three years' satisfactory service, and are not members of the Customs, Postal, Survey, or Railway Departments, and those clerks employed by Provincial and District Road Committees whose appointments date prior to July 1, 1875, are eligible for examination irrespective of age and without fee. Their applications (in the same form, Schedule A) for admission to the examination should be forwarded to the Director of Public Instruction through the Heads of their Departments.

4. Applications are to reach the Director of Public Instruction not later than 2 P.M. on Monday, November 28, 1910; any applications received after that hour, by whatever cause delayed, will be absolutely rejected.

5. The Director of Public Instruction will return to the candidate his application, approved or disapproved as the case may be, after taking, if necessary, the orders of Government thereon. The approved application shall constitute the candidate's ticket of admission to the examination. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of application approved by the Director of Public Instruction. A candidate not producing such form, whatever may be the reason for his not so doing, will be refused admittance to the examination.

6. The examination will be held at Colombo only, in the place and under the supervision of the officer specified in Schedule B. Heads of Departments are required to grant to officers of their Departments, whose applications to present themselves for examination have been returned to them approved by the Director of Public Instruction, leave to present themselves at the examination.

7. The examination will be competitive. The number of places assigned for competition will be thirty.

8. The successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island.

9. The subjects for examination are those set out in Schedule C to this notice. The examination shall be held in two parts. The first part a qualifying examination in Handwriting, Spelling, and Arithmetic, and Book-keeping. Any candidate failing to obtain two-thirds of the marks allotted for Handwriting, half those allowed for Spelling and Arithmetic respectively, and one-third of those allowed for Bookkeeping shall be excluded from the remainder of the examination. Special attention will be paid to Handwriting, and candidates whose writing is untidy or illegible or contains defects in the formation of letters will be rigorously excluded. The kind of writing preferred will be that generally shown as the "Civil Service" hand. The second part of the examination shall be in the remaining subjects in Schedule C. Should a candidate obtain less than one-third of the aggregate marks for the three subjects—Composition, General Paper, Précis Writing—or less than one-fourth marks in any other subject, or if he be a Sinhalese or Tamil, less than one-half of the marks in his native language, such marks shall not be counted in his favour. In all the written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling.

10. Clerks of the description given in section 3 above, who have served Government continuously for over six years, will be allowed to compete amongst themselves, and will be eligible, if they obtain a minimum of 66 per cent. in Writing and 33 per cent. in the other compulsory subjects, for seven of the appointments offered for competition. Three of the appointments will be reserved as prizes for deserving clerks of the same description, who have served Government continuously for ten years and upwards, to be selected irrespective of examination. No service under the age of sixteen years will be reckoned for this purpose.

REGULATIONS.

1. No tea seed shall be imported into Ceylon from any place in India, except at the port of Colombo.
2. All tea seed imported into Ceylon from any place in India shall be subjected to a process of disinfection in Colombo, unless accompanied by a certificate from a Scientific Officer either of the Indian Tea Association or of the Imperial Department of Agriculture to the effect that the leaf disease called Blister Blight (*Exobasidium vexans*) does not exist within a radius of 10 miles of the estate or garden on which the seed was grown.
3. Tea seed imported from any place in India shall not be admitted into Ceylon if packed in soil.
4. The process of disinfection will be carried out at the risk of the consignee.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 1, 1910.

Births.—The total births registered were 86 (0 Europeans, 7 Burghers, 44 Sinhalese, 12 Tamils, 18 Moors, 4 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1910, viz., 187,554) was 23.9, as against 28.6 in the preceding week, 20.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.1 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 105 (1 European, 11 Burghers, 34 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 23 Moors, 5 Malays, and 1 Other), including the death of a town resident who died in the Enteric Hospital at Kanatta. The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 29.2, as against 26.7 in the previous week, 30.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 33.7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 105 total deaths, 27 were of infants under one year of age, as against 20 in the preceding week, 26 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 27 the average for last year.

Still Births.—The number of still births registered during the week was 11.

Selected Causes of Death.—Twenty deaths were registered from *Phthisis* (against 9 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year), of which 8 were in St. Paul's, 3 in New Bazaar, 2 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena, Maradana hospitals, and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and 1 in Pettah.

2. Eleven deaths were registered from *Pneumonia* as in the previous week (against 15 the weekly average for last year), of which 3 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 2 each in Pettah and Slave Island, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena, Maradana hospitals, and Kollupitiya North. Two deaths were registered from *Bronchitis*.

3. Twelve deaths were registered from *Infantile Convulsions*, 10 from *Enteritis* (4 infants), 7 *Dysentery*, 6 *Old Age*, 3 *Debility* (1 infant), 2 *Worms*, 2 *Tetanus* (both infants), 2 *Diarrhoea*, 2 *Cirrhosis of Liver*, and 25 from *Other Causes*.

4. One death was registered from *Enteric Fever*, of a Tamil in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals).

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80·7°, against 81·1° in the preceding week and 82·3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·910 in., against 29·939 in. in the preceding week and 29·942 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·18 in., against 1·35 in. in the preceding week, and 0·17 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
