PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir ARTHUR ELIBANK HAVELOCK, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS by the 94th section of "The Road Ordinance, 1861," it is amongst other things enacted that whosoever shall leave or permit to be left on any road to which this provision shall be extended, as hereinafter mentioned, any cart or other carriage without the oxen, horses, or other animals, being yoked or harnessed thereto, unless such cart or carriage shall have accidentally broken down there, and in case of accident for a longer time than may be necessary for its removal, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding five pounds:

And it is thereby further enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation to declare that the aforesaid provision shall extend and be applicable to any road in this Colony, or to any section of such road, whenever it shall appear to the said Governor and Council that a sufficient number of halting-places have been constructed along the same:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Us that a sufficient number of halting-places as set out in the Schedule hereto annexed have been constructed along the road between Kemagoda and Tanamalwila :

Now therefore We, the said Governor, acting with the advice aforesaid, do hereby proclaim that the hereinbefore recited provision of the said Ordinance shall, from and after the date hereof, extend and be applicable to the said road.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Eighth day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-one.

IT is hereby notified for general information that His Excellency the Governor has been pleased, with the advice of the Executive Council, to make the following additions to paragraph 2 of the Schedule of Diets framed under Rule 211 of the General Rules, 1879, for the government of Prisons and the guidance of Prison Officers, made by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by the authority of section 76 of "The Prisons' Ordinance, 1877":—

The following diets may, on the order of His Excellency the Governor, be substituted for the penal stage and refractory diets for natives and Burghers now in force, and for such time and in such prisons as seems to him expedient:—

No. 1.—16 oz. bread, 2 oz. rice, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt.

No. 2.—8 oz. bread, 14 oz. rice, 4 oz. vegetables, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt, $\frac{1}{10}$ oz. pepper, $\frac{1}{4}$ of a cocconut, curry-stuffs in sufficient quantities.

No. 3.—12 oz. bread, 2 oz. rice, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt.

No. 1 Diet shall be given to all native and Burgher prisoners sentenced to a month's imprisonment or less, for the whole period of their imprisonment. It may be also given as a punishment on the order of the Superintendent, for a period not exceeding three days for any one offence, to all such prisoners reduced to the penal stage or to prisoners entitled to Diet No. 2; provided that no prisoner be kept on this diet for a period exceeding thirty days in succession.

No. 2 Diet shall be given to all native and Burgher penal stage prisoners sentenced to over a month's imprisonment, and this shall apply to all such prisoners reduced to the penal stage as a punishment, as well as to those who have never left the penal stage.

No. 3 Diet shall be given to all native and Burgher prisoners sentenced to confinement in a punishment cell for the period during which they are thus confined.

DRAFT ORDINANCES.

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

An Ordinance relating to the Registration of Titles to Land in this Colony.

- Preamble. **W**HEREAS it is expedient to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to the Registration of Titles to Land in this Colony: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:
- Short title. 1 This Ordinance may be cited for all purposes as "The Land Registration Ordinance, 189 ."
- Repeal. 2 There shall be repealed as from the commencement of this Ordinance the Ordinances specified in the First Schedule to this Ordinance to the extent in the third column of that Schedule mentioned.
- Proviso I. Provided that—
- (a) any office or branch office established under section 2 of "The Land Registration Ordinance, 1863," shall be deemed to have been duly established under this Ordinance; and
 - (b) the registrar-general of lands, the registrars of lands, and the clerks and other officers appointed under sections 3 and 5 of "The Land Registration Ordinance, 1863," shall continue and be deemed to have been duly appointed under this Ordinance; and
 - (c) any enactment referring to any Ordinance or enactment hereby repealed shall be construed to refer to this Ordinance or to the corresponding enactment in this Ordinance.
- Proviso II. Provided also that this repeal shall not affect—
- (d) the past operation of any enactment hereby repealed, nor anything duly done or suffered under any enactment hereby repealed; or
 - (e) any right, privilege, obligation, or liability acquired, accrued, or incurred under any enactment hereby repealed; or
 - (f) any penalty, forfeiture, or punishment incurred in respect of any offence committed against any enactment hereby repealed; or
 - (g) any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy in respect of any such right, privilege, obligation, liability, penalty, forfeiture, or punishment as aforesaid; and any such investigation, legal proceeding, and remedy may be carried on as if this Ordinance had not passed.
- I.—Registration Department, Officers and Rules.
- Registration office. 3 There shall be established in Colombo a land register office for Ceylon, and branch offices at such other places as to the Governor shall appear necessary.
- Registrar-general and registrars of lands. 4 The Governor shall appoint a fit and proper person to execute the duties and powers hereinafter mentioned, who shall be called "The Registrar-General of Lands"; and also one or more persons for each province or district of the Island, as he may deem necessary, to assist the said registrar in the execution of the said duties and powers, and who shall be called "Registrars of Lands." And all duties and powers hereinafter required to be exercised by any registrar shall and may be exercised by the registrar-general.

- Oath of office. 5 Every such registrar-general and registrar shall, before proceeding to execute any of the duties and powers aforesaid, take and subscribe before some justice of the peace an oath in the form A in the Second Schedule hereunto annexed, which oath, so taken and subscribed, shall be enrolled in the Supreme Court.
- Clerks and other officers. 6 The Governor may from time to time appoint such clerks and other ministerial officers as to him may appear necessary, to assist the registrar-general and registrars in the execution of the duties and powers aforesaid.
- Salaries. 7 The Governor may from time to time, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, direct to be paid out of the Colonial Treasury to such registrar-general, registrars, clerks, and officers as aforesaid, such salaries or remuneration as to him shall appear reasonable.
- Rules of office. 8 The Governor may from time to time, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, frame and establish rules and regulations regarding the manner in which the plans and books rendered necessary by this Ordinance are to be made and kept, and the manner in which all deeds and other papers filed or preserved in the said office are to be arranged; also the manner in which the accounts of the said office are to be kept, and generally to provide in every respect for the due working of this Ordinance.

II.—*Preliminary Survey.*

- Surveyor-general shall prepare surveys and plans. 9 The surveyor-general shall, with the sanction of the Governor, from time to time survey or cause to be surveyed, in such convenient divisions as shall serve the purposes of this Ordinance, the several villages and districts of the Island; and shall prepare or cause to be prepared plans thereof, marking thereon the various allotments belonging to or claimed by private individuals and those belonging to or claimed by the Crown, so far as the same can be ascertained. And for the purposes of such survey, or for the amendment of any survey already made, it shall be lawful for the surveyor-general, or any officer authorised by him in writing, to enter upon all lands situated within such villages or districts as aforesaid, and to require all persons having the custody or possession of any deeds or documents relating thereto to produce the same. And if any such person shall, without reasonable cause, refuse or neglect to produce the same within ten days after the same shall have been demanded, or if any person, when required, shall, without reasonable cause, refuse or neglect to give full information touching the custody or possession thereof, every such person shall be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.
- One month's previous notice of survey. 10 The surveyor-general shall be bound to give at least one month's previous notice, by such means as will secure the greatest publicity thereto, in the division intended to be surveyed, of his intention to survey the same, and of the day on which he intends to commence such survey.
- Surveys and plans already prepared may be acted upon. 11 In case the surveyor-general has already, at the date of the passing of this Ordinance, surveyed any division, and prepared a plan thereof, it shall not be deemed necessary to make a new survey of the same; but every such plan may be accepted and acted upon (with such amendments, if any, as to the said surveyor-general shall seem necessary), as if the same had been prepared in pursuance of this Ordinance.
- Plans to be delivered to registrar. 12 As soon as the survey and plan of any division shall have been completed, the surveyor-general shall report the same to the Governor, and shall at the same time deliver or transmit the said plan to the registrar.

III.—*Duplicates of Deeds and Instruments.*

- Duplicates to be transmitted to registrar. 13 Every district judge, commissioner, or justice of the peace before whom any deed or other instrument shall be executed under the provisions of the Ordinance No. 17 of 1852, shall deliver or transmit the same to the registrar of the district wherein such judge, commissioner, or justice

resides, and in case the land is situate in a district other than that in which such judge, commissioner, or justice resides, he shall likewise transmit or deliver a copy of such deed to the registrar of the last-mentioned district.

Registrar to bind and index all duplicates.

14 Every such registrar shall from time to time cause all duplicates transmitted or delivered to him under the preceding section, or by any notary under the provisions of the Ordinance No. 2 of 1877, to be bound in convenient volumes, distinguished by the name of the judge, commissioner, justice, or notary who has attested the same, and shall keep and preserve the same in his office, and shall also prepare and keep proper indexes thereof for general reference.

Inspection thereof.

And all such duplicates and indexes shall at all reasonable hours, upon a written application in that behalf, be open to the inspection and perusal of all parties claiming to be interested therein, or to their proctors or agents duly authorised thereto in writing, with liberty to demand and receive copies thereof or extracts therefrom.

IV.—Registration.

Registrars to prepare books for registration.

15 (1) Every such registrar shall prepare and keep such books as shall be required by the rules and regulations for the registration therein of any deed which may be brought to him for registration as hereinafter provided; allotting to each book some defined division of the province or district, so that every deed relating to lands situate therein may be registered therein in such manner as to facilitate reference to all existing alienations or incumbrances affecting the same lands. And every such book shall be kept in duplicate, and one copy thereof shall be kept in the land register office in Colombo, and the other in the branch office of the said province or district; and the same shall at all reasonable hours, upon a written application in that behalf, be open to the inspection and perusal of all parties claiming to be interested therein, or to their proctors or agents duly authorised thereto in writing, with liberty to demand and receive copies thereof or extracts therefrom.

Inspection thereof.

(2) The volumes and books kept under section 36 and section 37 of the Ordinance No. 8 of 1863 shall be deemed to be parts of the volumes and books kept under this Ordinance.

All deeds, &c., affecting land to be registered.

16 Every deed or other instrument of sale, purchase, transfer, assignment, or mortgage of any land or other immovable property, or of promise, bargain, contract, or agreement for effecting any such object, or for establishing or transferring any security, interest, or incumbrance affecting such land or property (other than a lease at will, or for any period not exceeding one month); or of contract or agreement for the future sale or purchase or transfer of any such land or property; and every deed or act of release, surrender, or annulment of or affecting any such deed or other instrument, and the probate of any will; and every grant of administration affecting any such land or property; and every judgment or order of court affecting any such land or other property; shall be registered in the branch office of the district in which such land or property is situate; that is to say, in the books mentioned in the preceding section, unless or until the division has come within the operation of "The Land Registration Ordinance, 1877," and if the division has come or hereafter comes within the operation of the said Ordinance, in the books mentioned in the 26th section of the said Ordinance.

Effect of non-registration.

17 Every deed, judgment, order, or other instrument as aforesaid, unless so registered, shall be deemed void as against all parties claiming an adverse interest thereto on valuable consideration, by virtue of any subsequent deed, judgment, order, or other instrument, which shall have been duly registered as aforesaid. Provided however that fraud or collusion in obtaining such last-mentioned deed, judgment, order, or other instrument, or in securing such prior registration, shall defeat the priority of the person claiming.

Proviso.

Production of deed, &c., and registration thereof.

thereunder; and that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to give any greater effect or different construction to any deed, judgment, order, or other instrument registered in pursuance hereof, save the priority hereby conferred on it.

18 (1) It shall be lawful for the party gaining an interest or benefit under any deed, judgment, order, or other instrument required to be registered under section 16, personally or by his agent to produce the same, or a duplicate or authenticated copy thereof, to the registrar of the district in which the land or property thereby affected is situate; and such registrar shall forthwith, upon delivery to him of the proper stamp for registration, register the same on the appointed page of the book assigned for the division, village, or district wherein the land thereby affected is situate, and shall transmit a note of such registration to the office of the registrar-general of lands to be filed of record.

Registrar may call for proof, and give notice to third parties.

(2) Every such registrar shall be entitled, if he see fit so to do, to require any person desiring such registration to show by affidavit or otherwise, as he may direct, that such deed, judgment, order or other instrument was duly made, granted, executed, or pronounced. And where he may have reason to apprehend that a fraud is about to be committed on any party, he shall be entitled, and is hereby required, to give notice to such party of the intended registration, in order to prevent the same being affected to his prejudice.

Deeds, &c., to be stamped before registration.

(3) No deed, judgment, order, or other instrument shall be registered, unless the same has been stamped with a stamp denoting that the duty payable thereon has been duly paid as hereinafter provided.

Stamp duties.

(4) The duty payable for the registration of the several instruments mentioned and described in the Third Schedule hereunto annexed shall be the amount set down in figures against the same respectively, together with the additional duty, if any, payable under section 20.

Registration to be endorsed on document.

19 The registrar shall immediately after such registration make and sign an endorsement thereof on the document produced as aforesaid, and deliver the same to the party effecting the registration, or his agent or representative; and the endorsement shall be as near as practicable in the form B in the Fourth Schedule hereunto annexed.

Where several lands are included in one deed, stamp duty to be levied in respect of each land.
Proviso.

20 In all cases of transfer by sale, gift, or otherwise, or of mortgage affecting more than one land, the additional stamp duty mentioned in the Fifth Schedule hereunto annexed shall be levied for the registration of each land other than the first land.

Provided that in cases wherein different allotments are treated and described as one property, and from their situation as respects each other can be included in one survey, the stamp duty shall be leviable as on one land only.

Where several lands included in the same deed are in more than one district.

21 (1) When several lands are affected by the same deed, and those lands lie in more districts than one, it shall be lawful for the party gaining an interest or benefit thereunder to apply to the registrar-general of lands in Colombo, or to the registrar of each of the districts in which the lands are situate, to have the deed registered.

(2) If the registrar-general is applied to, the duty for the registration of such deed in any one of such districts shall be the duty fixed by the Third Schedule hereunto annexed, together with the duty, if any, payable under section 20, with an increase of ten rupees for the additional registration in the other districts in which the lands are situate. The registrar-general, upon such application being made to him as aforesaid, shall forthwith cause to be despatched to the registrar of each of such districts the particulars required for the registration of the deed so far as concerns that district, and on receipt from the registrars of such districts of information that the registration has been effected in their districts respectively, the registrar-general shall make and sign an endorsement on such deed of the registration in the said districts.

(3) If the said deed is tendered for registration by the party gaining an interest or benefit thereunder to the registrar of each district in which the lands are respectively situate, the first registrar to whom the deed is tendered shall levy the duty fixed by the Third Schedule hereunto annexed, together with the duty, if any, payable under section 20 for the registration of such deed, and it shall be registered free of any further duty in the registry office of every other district in which the lands affected thereby are respectively situate.

Applications for registration of probates, &c.

22 When a party applies to have a probate or letters of administration registered, he shall produce to the registrar an authenticated copy of the inventory or list of appraisement filed in the case in which application for probate or administration was made, and shall further give such description of the land as the registrar shall require for the purposes of registration.

Deeds, &c., should describe lands accurately.

23 Every deed, judgment, order, or other instrument, or duplicate or authenticated copy thereof, produced for registration, shall contain embodied therein, or in a schedule annexed thereto, an accurate description of the property which is affected thereby, its boundaries, extent, and situation with respect to the village, pattu, koralé, or other division of the district. If such property consists of a portion only of one land or allotment, such portion shall be clearly and accurately defined by its particular boundaries and extent. And if such property consists of an undivided share in a land, it shall be so stated, and a particular description given as aforesaid of the entire land in which such share or interest is held, together with the extent of such share or interest.

Volume and folio of previous registry to be quoted.

24 When any property which shall have been once registered shall be subsequently sold, encumbered, or otherwise affected or dealt with, the deed or instrument purporting to transfer or otherwise deal with or affect such property shall state the volume and folio of the register in which such property has been previously registered, as the same shall appear in the register already made of such property.

Caveat in certain cases.

25 It shall be competent to any party to lodge with the registrar a caveat to prevent the registration of any transfer or security affecting any land or other property as aforesaid; and such caveat shall entitle such party to notice of any application for registration as regards such land or property, unless where the caveat limits the time of its operation, in which case it shall cease to have any force or value upon the lapse of such time. But no such caveat shall be sufficient to prevent the registration applied for, unless it be followed up within thirty days after service of the notice of application by an action before some competent court, and notice thereof to the registrar; in which case the registrar shall suspend the registration until the final adjudication of such action.

On death of owner, the executor or administrator shall be registered.

26 On the death of any registered owner or other interested party, all lands belonging to him, or in which he may have an interest, shall remain in his name until probate or administration of his estate shall have been granted, whereupon, and upon a written application in that behalf, the name of the executor or administrator shall be registered in the books, until a partition, transfer, or alienation of the lands shall have been effected, whereupon, and upon like application, such partition, transfer, or alienation shall be registered as hereinbefore provided.

On partition, a fresh registration shall be effected.

27 On the partition of any land registered as one allotment, the registrar shall, upon a written application in that behalf, register the new allotments on separate and fresh pages of the book, with such references as may be necessary to identify them with the original registration.

List of executors, &c.

28 The secretary of every district court throughout the Island shall, at the end of every month, transmit to the registrar of the province or district in which such court is situate, a list of all persons appointed executors, adminis-

trators, guardians, or curators, showing the numbers of the cases in which such appointments have been made. And such registrar shall also from time to time prepare alphabetical lists of the persons so appointed, and keep and preserve the same in his office, and also transmit a copy thereof to the land register office in Colombo. And all such lists shall at all reasonable hours, upon a written application in that behalf, be open to the inspection and perusal of all persons.

List of Government debtors, &c.

29 The government agent of every province of the Island shall, at the end of every month, transmit to the registrar or registrars in his province a list of all persons who shall have become debtors to the Crown, or sureties to such debtors. And every such registrar shall from time to time prepare alphabetical lists of such debtors and sureties, and keep and preserve in his office, and also transmit a copy thereof to the land register office in Colombo. And all such lists shall, upon a written application in that behalf, be similarly open to inspection and perusal of all persons.

Penalty on persons obstructing.

30 Any person who shall wilfully resist, obstruct, or hinder, or who shall incite or assist others to resist, obstruct, or hinder any person acting in pursuance of the authority given by this Ordinance, shall be guilty of an offence and be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

Penalty on abuse of authority.

31 Any person who shall, under pretence of performing any act under the authority of this Ordinance, use any unnecessary violence, or give any vexatious annoyance, shall be guilty of an offence and be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

On refusal or neglect of registrars, district court may, on a rule nisi, make an order.

32 In case any registrar shall refuse or wilfully neglect or delay to perform any duty imposed upon him by this Ordinance, it shall be competent for the district court of the district wherein the land thereby affected is situate, upon affidavit or other proof thereof, to issue a rule on such registrar, calling on him to show cause why such duty shall not be performed; and after cause shown, or upon default thereof, to make such order as the said court may deem right; which order shall have the effect of, and be put in execution in the same manner as, a judgment pronounced by such court.

Penalty for fraudulent registration.

33 Any person guilty of fraudulently registering any land or interest not belonging to him, and with intent to defraud or injure the owner thereof, or the person rightly interested therein, or any other person, shall be guilty of an offence, and be liable on conviction to imprisonment of either description for a term which may extend to three years.

List of fines imposed under this Ordinance.

34 Every magistrate and judge before whom any complaints or causes arising in respect of this Ordinance shall be tried, shall at the end of every month transmit to the registrar-general a list or account of all fines imposed and recovered by such magistrate or judge.

PASSED ORDINANCES.

Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice
and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

No. 5.—1891.

An Ordinance to incorporate the Public Service Mutual
Provident Association.

A. E. HAVELOCK.

Preamble.

WHEREAS an association consisting of persons employed in the Public Service of the Colony, and called "The Public Service Mutual Provident Association" (hereinafter referred to as the said association), was established in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, for the objects of promoting thrift, of giving relief to its members in times of sickness or distress, of aiding them when in pecuniary difficulties, and of making provision for their widows and orphans: And whereas the said association has heretofore successfully pursued the objects for which it was founded, and has applied to be incorporated, and it will be for the public advantage to grant the application: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Public Service
Mutual
Provident
Association
incorporated.

1 From and after the passing of this Ordinance, the assistant auditor-general, the chief clerk of the Secretariat, the chief clerk of the Audit Office, and such and so many persons as now are members of the said association, or shall hereafter be admitted members of the corporation hereby constituted, whose names shall be inscribed in the register mentioned in section 11, shall be and become a corporation with continuance for ever under the name of "The Public Service Mutual Provident Association," and by that name shall and may sue and be sued in all courts, and shall have full power and authority to have and to use a common seal, and change and alter the same at their will and pleasure.

General objects.

2 The general objects for which the corporation is constituted are hereby declared to be to promote thrift, to give relief to the members in times of sickness or distress, to aid them when in pecuniary difficulties, and to make provision for their widows and orphans.

Committee of
management.

3 (1) The affairs of the corporation shall, subject to the rules made as hereinafter provided, be administered by a committee of management consisting of the officers for the time being lawfully acting as assistant auditor-general, chief clerk of the secretariat, chief clerk of the audit office, and seven members to be elected once a year at the annual general meeting of the corporation.

(2) The first committee of management shall consist of the said officers and seven members who may be elected at any general meeting held under the provisions of section 15.

Powers of
committee.

4 The committee of management shall, subject to the provisions of this Ordinance and of any rules made under section 14, have full power and authority generally to govern, direct, and decide all matters whatsoever connected with the appointment of officers, agents, and servants, and with the administration of the affairs of the corporation and the accomplishment of the objects thereof.

Proviso.

Provided that the said committee shall not exercise any powers which are by this Ordinance or by any rules made under section 14 declared to be exercisable by the corporation in general meeting.

Proviso.

Provided also that no rule made by the corporation in general meeting shall invalidate any prior act of the said committee which would have been valid if such rule had not been made.

- President.** 5 The officer for the time being lawfully acting as assistant auditor-general shall be president of the said corporation and committee, and in case of his absence from any meeting a chairman for the occasion shall be chosen by the members present.
- Secretary and treasurer.** 6 The officer for the time being lawfully acting as chief clerk of the secretariat shall be secretary, and the officer for the time being lawfully acting as chief clerk of the audit office shall be treasurer to the said corporation.
- Treasurer's duties.** 7 The treasurer shall receive and keep account of all the moneys and funds belonging to the corporation, and shall pay all claims, loans, advances, and expenses authorised by the committee of management. He shall also prepare and submit quarterly to the said committee an account of the transactions of the corporation.
- Committee meetings.** 8 Meetings for the transaction of the business of the said committee shall be held at least once in every month, and the president, on the requisition of two committee members, shall call a meeting of the committee at any time for the transaction of such business as may be mentioned in the requisition.
- Quorum. President to have a casting vote. Vacancies how filled.** 9 Five members of committee shall constitute a quorum, and the president, or, in his absence, the chairman, shall have a casting vote in addition to his original vote.
- 10 On the death or absence from the Colony of any member of the committee of management not being an officer mentioned in section 3, or in the event of such member ceasing to be a member of the corporation, it shall be lawful for the remaining members of the said committee to elect any member of the corporation as his successor, and the member so elected shall continue in office until the annual general meeting of the corporation next following his election.
- Register.** 11 (1) The committee of management shall cause a register to be kept in which every person who at the date of the passing of this Ordinance is a member of the said Association, and every person thereafter duly admitted a member of the corporation hereby constituted shall have his name inscribed.
- (2) Every person holding an appointment in the Public Service or in any *quasi* public department who fulfils the requirements of the rules shall be eligible for admission as a member, and may, in the discretion of the said committee, be admitted a member.
- (3) The register shall contain the following particulars :—
- (a) The name, age on admission, address, and occupation of each member ;
 - (b) The date at which the name of any person was inscribed in the register as a member ;
 - (c) The date at which any person ceased to be a member.
- Books of account.** 12 The committee of management shall also cause proper books of account to be kept, which shall be open at all reasonable times to the inspection of members of the corporation, and of any person or persons whom the Governor may at any time appoint to examine the same.
- Remuneration to member or members of committee.** 13 It shall be lawful for the corporation by resolution passed at any general meeting to remunerate the services of any member or members of the committee of management, and from time to time to fix the amount of such remuneration, and to require such security from such member or members so remunerated as may be deemed sufficient.
- Rules.** 14 It shall be lawful for the corporation from time to time at any general meeting of the members and by a majority of votes to make rules for the admission, withdrawal, or expulsion of members, for the imposition of fines and forfeitures for breaches of rules, for the conduct of the duties of the committee of management and of the various officers, agents, and servants of the corporation, for the procedure in the transaction of business, and otherwise generally for the

management of the affairs of the corporation and the accomplishment of its objects. Such rules when made may at a like meeting be altered, amended, or cancelled, subject however to the requirements of section 19. Provided that no rule or alteration, amendment or cancellation of any rule shall have effect until the same is confirmed by the Governor in Executive Council. Notice of such confirmation shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and thereupon the same shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been herein enacted.

General meetings.

15 (1) The secretary, upon the request of the committee of management, or upon the written requisition of ten or more members of the corporation, shall call a general meeting.

(2) No general meeting shall be held unless the quorum of members prescribed by the rules be present, and unless at least seven days' notice, specifying the time and place of such meeting and the purpose for which it is to be held, has been given by advertisement in two or more of the local newspapers, or in such other manner as may be required by any rule made by the corporation; and no business shall be brought before or transacted at such meeting other than the business specified in such notice.

Annual general meeting.

16 (1) An annual general meeting of the members of the corporation shall be held not later than the 31st of August in each year, when there shall be submitted a balance sheet, a statement of assets and liabilities, and an account of receipts and disbursements during the previous twelve months, all which shall be prepared by the treasurer and duly audited.

(2) Such statement and account shall be examined, and the correctness of the balance sheet ascertained by one or more auditors to be elected by the corporation in general meeting, at least three months before the close of the year the accounts of which he is to audit, and such statement, account, and balance sheet shall, after audit, be published in the *Government Gazette*.

(3) If no election of an auditor or auditors is made in manner aforesaid, the Governor may, on the application of any member of the corporation, appoint an auditor and fix the remuneration to be paid to him by the corporation for his services.

Election of committee members.

(4) At such annual general meeting, the required number of members of the committee of management shall be elected and all business shall be transacted of which due notice shall have been given.

Who shall preside at general meetings.

17 The president of the corporation shall preside at all general meetings of the corporation, and in his absence the members present shall elect a chairman for the occasion. The president, or in his absence the chairman, shall have a casting vote.

Security from officers, agents, and servants.

18 It shall be lawful for the committee of management to require security to be given by any of the officers, agents, or servants appointed by them, and to determine the nature and value of such security.

Mode in which rule or order once made may be subsequently altered, amended, or cancelled.

19 No rule passed and no decision come to by the corporation in general meeting shall be altered, amended, or cancelled, except by at least a majority of two-thirds of the members present and voting at any subsequent general meeting.

Property vested in corporation.

20 (1) On the coming into operation of this Ordinance, all and every the property belonging to the said association, whether held in the name of the said association or in the name of any person or persons in trust for the said association, shall be and the same are hereby vested in the corporation hereby constituted, and the same, together with all after-acquired property and all subscriptions, contributions, donations, fines, amounts of loans and advances received or to be received, shall be held by the said corporation for the purposes of this Ordinance.

Debts due by and payable to corporation.

(2) All debts and liabilities of the said association existing at the time of the coming into operation of this

Ordinance shall be paid by the corporation hereby constituted, and all debts due to and subscriptions, contributions, fines, and amounts of loans and advances payable to the said association shall be paid to the said corporation for the purposes of this Ordinance.

Surplus funds
how to be
invested.

21 It shall be lawful for the committee of management to place the whole or any part of the surplus funds belonging to the corporation, and not required for loans, advances, and other current expenses, in fixed deposit in one or more of the local banks, or to invest the same in Indian Government securities or securities of the Government of the United Kingdom or of the Government of any British Colony including Ceylon, or in securities issued by any municipality in Ceylon, or in such other manner as may from time to time be approved by the Governor.

Appointment of
officers, agents,
&c.

22 The committee of management may from time to time under the common seal of the corporation appoint such officer or officers, agent or agents, as they may consider necessary for recovering all dividends, interest, or other revenue to be derived from such investments, or for otherwise carrying out the provisions of this Ordinance ; and all persons so appointed shall hold office during the pleasure of, and shall be entitled to such remuneration as may be determined by, the said committee.

Seal of the
corporation how
to be affixed to
instruments.

23 The seal of the corporation shall not be affixed to any instrument whatsoever, except in the presence of the president of the committee of management and of either the secretary or the treasurer, who shall sign their names to the instrument in token of their presence, and such signing shall be independent of the signing of any person as a witness.

Corporation may
hold property
movable and
immovable.

24 The corporation shall be able and capable in law to take and hold any property movable or immovable which may become vested in it by virtue of any grant, gift, testamentary disposition, or otherwise, and all such property shall be held by the corporation for the purposes of this Ordinance.

May demise
lands on lease.

25 It shall be lawful for the corporation to demise any of the lands vested in it for building or other purposes, on lease for any term not exceeding ninety-nine years, reserving the best yearly or monthly rental procurable for the same, and with the ordinary covenants for re-entry in case of non-payment of rent, breach of covenant, or otherwise.

May not sell,
exchange, or
mortgage lands
without leave of
court.

26 (1) It shall not be lawful for the corporation to sell exchange, or mortgage any of the lands vested in it without the leave of the district court of Colombo, which leave shall be applied for by petition addressed to the said court setting out the facts and reasons for which the corporation desires to sell, exchange, or mortgage such lands, and praying for a decree of the said court.

(2) A copy of every such petition shall be served on the Attorney-General at least fourteen days before the hearing of the petition.

(3) The Attorney-General may oppose the prayer of the petition, and if, after hearing him upon such opposition, the said court shall be of opinion that it will be for the general advantage of the corporation to grant the prayer of the petition, a decree may be made to that effect ; and any land so sold or exchanged or any land which, having been mortgaged, is sold in execution under a mortgage decree obtained from a competent court, shall be held by the purchaser or person taking the same in exchange free of the trusts created by this Ordinance.

Doubt or
ambiguity
how decided.

27 In case any doubt or ambiguity shall arise, and any controversy shall take place among the members of the corporation and of the committee of management, or either of them, as to the interpretation of this Ordinance or as to the powers of the said committee, the same shall be referred

to the Governor in Executive Council, whose decision shall be final and conclusive.

No. 6.—1891.

An Ordinance to permit the Conditional Release of First Offenders in certain Cases.

A. E. HAVELOCK.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to make provision for cases where the reformation of persons convicted of first offences may be brought about without imprisonment: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Power to court to release upon probation of good conduct instead of sentencing to imprisonment.

1 (1) In any case in which a person is convicted of any offence punishable with not more than three years' imprisonment before any court, and no previous conviction is proved against him, if it appears to the court before whom he is so convicted that, regard being had to the youth or to the character and antecedents of the offender, or to the trivial nature of the offence, or to any extenuating circumstances under which the offence was committed, it is expedient that the offender be released on probation of good conduct, the court may, instead of sentencing him at once to any punishment, direct that he be released on his entering into a recognizance, with or without sureties, and during such period as the court may direct, to appear and receive judgment when called upon, and in the meantime to keep the peace and be of good behaviour.

(2) The court may, if it thinks fit, direct that the offender shall pay to the complainant such compensation, or to the Crown by way of Crown costs such a sum of money, as the court shall think fit, and the compensation or sum of money so awarded, or some portion of the same, shall be payable within such period and by such instalments as may be directed by the court.

Provision in case of offender failing to observe conditions of his recognizances.

2 (1) If a court having power to deal with the offender in respect of his original offence, or any police court, is satisfied by information on oath that the offender has failed to observe any of the conditions of his recognizance, it may issue a warrant for his apprehension.

(2) An offender, when apprehended on any such warrant, shall, if not brought forthwith before the court having power to sentence him, be brought before a police court, and that court may either remand him by warrant until the time at which he was required by his recognizance to appear for judgment, or until the sitting of a court having power to deal with his original offence, or may admit him to bail with a sufficient surety conditional on his appearing for judgment.

(3) Where the offender is remanded the court shall forthwith cause a warrant of commitment to be made out and signed, addressed to the fiscal or deputy fiscal for the district in which the court is situated, and the offender, together with the warrant, shall forthwith be forwarded to the prison of the district in which the court remanding him is situated, or of the district where he is bound to appear for judgment, and the warrant of remand shall order that he be brought before the court before which he was bound to appear for judgment or to answer as to his conduct since his release.

Conditions as to the abode of the offender.

3 The court before directing the release of an offender under this Ordinance shall be satisfied that the offender or his surety has a fixed place of abode or regular occupation in the division or district over which the court has jurisdiction or in which the offender is likely to live during the period named for the observance of the condition.

Definition of "court."

4 In this Ordinance the term "court" includes a police court.

Short title.

5 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Probation of First Offenders' Ordinance, 1891."

MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo, held in the Town Hall on Friday, August 14, 1891.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M. pursuant to notice dated August 8, 1891.

Present:—Mr. H. H. Cameron, Mayor and Chairman; Hon. J. J. Grinlinton; Mr. R. K. MacBride, c.m.g.; Mr. J. S. Drieberg; Mr. E. Walker; Hon. A. de A. Seneviratne; Mr. C. Perera; Mr. C. P. Dias; Mr. Walter Pereira; Mr. D. F. Browne; and Mr. R. H. Morgan.

The Minutes of July 10 and 24, 1891, having been printed and a copy sent to each Member of Council, excepting the dissents recorded by Mr. C. Perera and Mr. W. Pereira, which were received after circulation of the Minutes of July 10, were taken as read.

Mr. Walter Pereira's dissent from the opinion of the majority on the Chairman's motions passed on July 10, relating to the appointment and salary of Mr. Robert Skelton as Superintendent of Works, and Mr. C. Perera's dissent from the motion relating to the salary of the Superintendent of Works, having been since printed, were read.

Mr. C. Perera's dissent from the Chairman's motion, relating to Mr. Skelton's appointment as Superintendent of Works, the printing of which was not completed, was laid on the table.

Resolved,—That the Minutes of July 10 and 24, 1891, be confirmed, and that Mr. C. Perera's dissent and Mr. Skelton's explanation with reference hereto, when printed, be circulated for the information of Members.

1. Pursuant to notice the Chairman moved "that provision be made for the remuneration of the Additional Municipal Magistrate to December 31, 1891."

Hon. J. J. Grinlinton seconded.

2. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. P. Dias moved "that the Council do strongly urge upon the Government the absolute necessity of raising and draining the marshy ground between the Kachcheri and the Factory, which is a source of great danger to the health of the residents of the neighbourhood, the officers of the Government Establishments, and of the pupils attending the schools and colleges in close proximity to the swamps in question."

Mr. Morgan seconded.

Mr. MacBride stated that the suggestion contained in the above motion had been anticipated by the Government, and that the Public Works Department was preparing a scheme for the drainage of the land in question.

The motion was carried.

3. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. P. Dias asked the Chairman "what arrangements have been made to meet the request of the ratepayers of the St. Sebastian Ward that the Volunteer Band should play at the Courts yard."

The Chairman stated that when item No. 24 in the Order of the Day came up for discussion, he would ask the Council what arrangements they would desire to make in the matter.

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. Walter Pereira asked the Chairman "whether he has received a petition, addressed to him and Members of the Council from the late licensee of meat markets numbered 10 and 50 in Barber street, New Bazaar Ward, praying for a license for the current year."

The Chairman answered in the affirmative, and explained that it was not noticed at the time that the petition was addressed to the Chairman and Members.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. R. H. Morgan asked, "with reference to the Resolution passed by the Council on June 16, 1891, 'that the Chief Engineer of Waterworks be asked to lay a waterpipe (without standpipe) along Wellawatta Lane, whether the pipe has been laid, and, if not, the reason of this long delay.'"

The Chairman explained that as the estimate now furnished by the Waterworks Engineer for the work amounted to Rs. 975, while the original estimate was Rs. 420, he could not authorise the work to be undertaken without further reference to the Council, and reference to the Council was delayed until the receipt of a reply to a letter addressed to Mr. E. Abdul Raheman of Wellawatta lane, inquiring how many of the householders of that lane would deposit the amount necessary for payment of house connections.

6. Pursuant to notice Mr. R. H. Morgan moved "that correspondence on the subject be laid on the table."

The Chairman seconded the motion.

The correspondence referred to was laid on the table.

7. Pursuant to notice Mr. R. H. Morgan moved "that the matter be considered by the Council."

This motion was, by leave of Council, allowed to stand over until the next meeting, and until the receipt of a reply from Mr. E. Abdul Raheman.

Resolved that no licenses for the sale of fruit and vegetables be issued within a furlong from a public market, and that such sale be prohibited by notice to existing markets, provided that accommodation is available in a public market. If no accommodation is available license may be issued on payment of a fee of Re. 1 per mensem.

Resolved,—That the consideration of the above recommendation be deferred.

9. A Statement of Receipts and Disbursements from January to July, 1891, and a Progress Report of Work done during the same period, were submitted.

Resolved,—That the Statement and Progress Report be referred to the Standing Committee.

It is proposed to expend the amount of the loan on Municipal improvements of a permanent nature.

(2) Debentures will be issued for the said amount bearing interest at the rate of 5 per cent. per annum, payable half-yearly on _____ and _____, and having a currency of fifty years.

(3) The form of Mortgage or Debenture Bond will be that given below. Each debenture will be issued for the sum of Rs. 100, or some multiple of Rs. 100.

(4) Tenders for the whole or any part of the above-named sum of Rs. 100,000 will be received by the Chairman of the Municipal Council up to noon on the _____

(5) Each tender should be in the form hereto annexed, and enclosed in a sealed cover, superscribed "Tender for Municipal Loan of 189," and sent to the Municipal Office, addressed to the Chairman, Municipal Council, Colombo.

(6) The tenders will be opened by the Chairman at the Municipal Office, on _____ at noon, a minimum rate having first been fixed by the Chairman.

(7) Parties tendering must pay into the Bank of Madras to the credit of the Municipal Fund a sum equal to 2 per cent. of the amount tendered, and forward the Bank's receipt with the tender.

(8) If the tender be accepted, the deposit will be taken in part payment, but it will be forfeited if, after the acceptance of the tender, the allotment is not fully paid on or before the _____

(9) Debentures will be issued as soon as possible after receipt of the amount of allotment.

(10) The deposit on tenders which may not be accepted will be returned on application.

(11) In the case of two or more tenders at the same rate (not being below the minimum) a *pro rata* allotment will, if necessary, be made.

(12) In order to avoid mistakes, a separate tender must be made for each rate tendered, and a separate deposit must accompany each tender.

(13) The annual income from the taxes which are offered as security for the loan amounts to Rs. 18,000, and is subject to no encumbrance whatever.

MR. CHARLES PERERA'S DISSENT.

1. I am obliged to dissent from the motion with regard to the raising of a loan for the Municipality, as I consider that under the present circumstances there does not appear to be any feasible means of meeting the liability without adding to the burden of the taxpayers by an increased rate of taxation.

2. In the first place, there is no statement as to the definite object for which the proposed loan is to be applied. Before any such proposal is sanctioned, it is absolutely necessary that the public should be informed as to what the improvements are which are said to be in contemplation, and I think also that the public and the Council should have before them an estimate of the expenditure for such alleged improvements.

3. About an hour before the time of meeting I received from the Chairman a Rough Estimate of Revenue and Expenditure for 1892, in which the Chairman has endeavoured to make out that, even after making provision for the payment of Rs. 14,000 yearly for the interest and sinking fund on the loan, there would still be left a balance of revenue amounting to Rs. 8,794 annually. I do not think that the figures in this estimate are even approximately correct, and I therefore cannot accept without hesitation the Chairman's proposition for paying the loan from the excess of revenue (derived from present sources alone) over the expenditure.

4. For instance, the Chairman estimates the expenditure for Public Works at Rs. 93,000. By what process of calculation he arrives at this figure I do not know. If we are to judge by experience of the past, the figure for expenditure on Public Works ought to be Rs. 120,000 or more; for since the Chairman took up the administration of the Municipality there has been a progressive increase of expenditure under this head. In 1888 it was Rs. 95,316; in 1889 Rs. 126,956; and in 1890 Rs. 124,219. It will therefore be apparent to any one that my estimate of Rs. 120,000 for Public Works is more approximately correct than the Chairman's figure of Rs. 93,000.

5. The revenue from Assessment the Chairman estimates at Rs. 220,000. This is the revenue raised under the name of the Consolidated Rates, comprising (a) maintenance of Police, (b) lighting streets, and (c) supply of water. From the sale of water an income of Rs. 54,000 is estimated. These two items together make Rs. 274,000. Now the expenditure for Police, gas, and water is estimated at Rs. 60,000, Rs. 65,000* (including extension of street lighting), and Rs. 130,000, respectively, aggregating together to Rs. 255,000. So that, from Assessment the revenue is estimated at Rs. 274,000 and the expenditure at Rs. 255,000, and therefore there is a surplus of Rs. 19,000 of revenue over expenditure under this head. Now, I maintain that it is not competent for the Council to lay out on other works any surplus of recoveries from Assessment, and that the whole revenue derived under this should be expended on Police, gas, and water. The law leaves us no alternative but this, and as I have shown below (paragraph 12) the Chairman agrees with this view of the matter. Apart from the illegality of appropriating for other works the

revenue derived from the Consolidated Rates, it is manifestly unfair to devote this surplus to any other work, considering that there is a considerable number of streets throughout the Municipality not provided with water or gas, the residents of which are yet made to pay these rates. The law therefore only binds us to a just course, and it is but right that the surplus under this head should be entirely devoted to providing lights and laying water to such streets as are without them. Therefore the surplus of Rs. 19,000 on the Assessment Account, which goes far to make up the surplus of revenue over expenditure in the Chairman's Rough Estimate, cannot, for the above reasons, be counted upon as helping to contribute towards the repayment of the loan, as it will necessarily have to be appropriated to the extension of street lighting and further laying on of water.

6. Then again the expenditure under the head "Miscellaneous" is estimated at Rs. 15,000. This figure ought to be somewhere about Rs. 20,000, considering that in 1888, 1889, and 1890, it has respectively been Rs. 22,607 Rs. 23,595, and Rs. 24,073.

7. Now to summarise my remarks on the Rough Estimate, the Chairman's estimate of Rs. 93,000 for Public Works, I have shown ought to be Rs. 120,000, increasing the expenditure by Rs. 27,000. Then again his estimate shows a surplus of revenue of Rs. 19,000 under the head of "Assessment." This balance, as I have said, ought to be appropriated to the extension of street lighting and laying of water, and cannot be scored off against the balance appropriated for repayment of the loan. It should be borne in mind that the decrease in expenditure on gas of late years was effected at the sacrifice of proper lighting of the city—a matter which was often commented upon by the Council (see Report of Committee on Chairman's Administration Report of 1888). For "Miscellaneous" expenditure, I have shown the figure ought to be Rs. 20,000, against Rs. 15,000 of the Chairman's estimate, again increasing the expenditure by Rs. 5,000. So that the statement would stand as follows:—

According to Chairman's estimate: Revenue Rs. 535,800; expenditure Rs. 513,006; balance Rs. 22,794 = surplus of revenue, of which Rs. 14,000 = interest and sinking fund on loan, Rs. 8,794 = balance.

According to my figures as above: expenditure Rs. 545,006; revenue Rs. 535,800; balance Rs. 9,206. Add surplus of revenue over expenditure on Assessment account (see paragraph 5), Rs. 19,000 = Rs. 28,206, excess of expenditure over revenue.

8. It will be admitted that my figures are not put down at hap-hazard, but are the results of deliberate calculation made comparatively with the figures of other years. This being so, I have, I think, shown that whilst the Chairman expects a balance of Rs. 22,794, of which he proposes to devote Rs. 14,000 towards the interest and sinking fund of the loan, what we could really expect is the expenditure exceeding the revenue by Rs. 28,206, if a fairly approximate estimate of the expenditure is made, as I have done above; and instead of incurring fresh liabilities we ought to look about for means of meeting the present difficulty by retrenchment and otherwise. So much for the Chairman's Rough Estimate.

9. It will now be apparent that we have no reason whatever for forming any expectation of repaying the loan from the revenue derived from present sources alone, and therefore we must look about for some other means of meeting the liability if it be incurred. What other course is there but to increase the rate of taxation, say at least by 1½ per cent., to enable us to augment the revenue?

10. I am bound strenuously to oppose any increase on the present rate of taxation, because I am convinced that even at present the burden presses too heavily on the taxpayers. At present the ostensible rate of assessment is 11 per cent.; but in reality the recoveries are made at the rate of 15 per cent., and although the tax-paying community may not be aware of this, the fact has forced itself upon the knowledge of the Council, for in the Committee's report on the Administration Report of the Chairman for 1888 adopted by the Council, the Committee say, "The Committee are of opinion that house property within the town should not be liable to any additional taxation. The 11 per cent. now levied is high enough, and we think it will be found that the rate reaches nearly 15 per cent.," and even the Supreme Court in the course of a judgment has observed that the basis of assessment in Colombo is quite unlike that in vogue in any other part of the civilised world.

11. When the Chairman took over the administration of the Municipality in 1888 there was an unexpended balance of Municipal funds amounting to Rs. 195,496 (see Committee's Report on Chairman's Administration Report for 1888). Since his time there have been introduced new sources for the increase of revenue by way of licenses for opium, petroleum, guides, auctioneers, and brokers; increase of stamp duty for advocates, proctors, and notaries;

other licenses ; and even in the new Ordinance with regard to commutation ; and yet with all these new sources of revenue contributing to the increase of funds, and even with illegal levies by way of recoveries in excess of Police, water, and gas rates, and with the unprecedented increase in Municipal fines during the past three years, it has been found necessary to trench upon the balance funds left in the Chairman's hands at the commencement of his administration. For it appears from the Supplemental Budget No. 1 (1891) that the whole balance funds left in the Chairman's hands on December 31, 1890, amounted to Rs. 77,337-39, and this was still further reduced till on April 15 of this year the balance was only Rs. 1,584-25. So that in addition to the former revenues it has been found necessary to spend, not only those derived from the new sources of revenue, but also a sum of Rs. 194,000 out of the large balance left in the Chairman's hands at the commencement of his administration, although there do not appear to have been any extraordinary works requiring such an appreciable expenditure undertaken during his time. Naturally the question arises as to how this money has been spent. I do not pretend to assign any reason ; but the fact still remains that without there being done any special works requiring any large expenditure, all the current income, as well as nearly the whole of the reserved balance, has been spent, practically leaving the Council without means to meet even the normal expenditure.

12. I have spoken of illegal levies by way of recoveries on Police, water, and gas rates, for I find that a sum of Rs. 114,063 has been recovered under these heads in excess of what has been actually spent on this account during 1888, 1889, and 1890. I maintain that the recovery of any amount under the consolidated rates in excess of what is actually spent for Police, gas, and water is in breach of section 127 of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887 ; and my position on this question seems to be appreciated by the Chairman, for in his Administration Report for 1888 he says, " This economy I judged it desirable to effect if possible in what is called the " Assessment Account," so as to establish, as nearly as possible, a just balance between the two sides thereof, for it seemed to me that, *whilst it is not competent for this Council to devote to other purposes than those specified in the 127th section of the Ordinance the funds raised under the name of the " Consolidated Rates,"—viz., (a) the maintenance of the Police ; (b) the lighting of public streets ; (c) the supply of water to the Municipality,—it is also undesirable to spend more upon those services than is paid by the public for the purpose.*"

13. It will be now apparent that although there have been introduced many new sources of revenue, the expenditure has also greatly increased, so much so that it has actually absorbed a large portion of the balance in the Chairman's hands at the commencement of his administration. What reasonable grounds are there then for presuming that there could be any appreciable balance left in future years to meet the proposed loan ? None whatever, and I have shown above that if a fairly approximate estimate of expenditure is made, even according to the Chairman's own statement of revenue, the expenditure would exceed the expected income. On the other hand, there are reasons for anticipating that the expenditure would still further increase by way of additional salaries and, notably, pensions, and even in other directions. The salaries in 1890, amounting to Rs. 62,314, as against Rs. 49,249 in 1887, and this has been far in excess of anticipation of the Secretary of State, who, in sanctioning the new Ordinance, went upon the scheme recommended by the Municipal Commission of 1886, which laid down a limit of Rs. 48,077 for salaries (including the Chairman's), rising thereafter to Rs. 52,931 as the maximum ; and also the expenditure on the Public Works Department, including scavenging, has risen from Rs. 139,468 in 1888 to Rs. 194,928 in 1890. Moreover, there is a source of expenditure which the Council will have to consider very soon, viz., to the duplication of the main water pipe between Labugama and Colombo. Mr. Burnett, in his report on the Waterworks, states this as a necessary work considering the increasing consumption of water in town (see Sessional Paper No. 35 of 1890, para. 64), and he estimates the expenditure at the lowest at Rs. 1,200,000 (*ibid*, para. 67). It is clear that the Council cannot meet this expenditure under existing circumstances, much less if the proposed loan is actually effected. Unless this enormous sum of money is provided by Government, which I do not think is likely, the Council will soon be face to face with a serious difficulty.

14. I do not personally desire to oppose the undertaking of any work beneficial to the inhabitants of the north Colombo, if, as was incidentally stated, the Korteboam recreation ground is to be established with a portion of the proposed loan. At the same time I cannot approve of any work beyond the means of the Municipality. I may mention that I interested myself through the Chairman in obtaining from Government two recreation grounds for the Maradana people, viz., the premises round the Maligakanda reservoir and the ground in Jail road. But even these have not been laid out, and are not available for use, even though a small outlay is all that is necessary.

The above facts make it clear that if the proposed loan is raised, the rate of taxation will necessarily have to be increased in order to meet the loan. And this I am bound strenuously to oppose, considering that the present rate of 11 per cent. (virtually 15 per cent.) is in itself oppressively weighing down the tax-paying class.

Progress Report of Work for August, 1891.

THE following is a general statement of work done under the various votes :—

- No. 1. General upkeep of roads : repaired roads, cleared and deepened side and cross drains, cut side grass, lopped overhanging branches, &c.
- No. 3. Upkeep of Bridge-of-boats : ordinary repairs to boats have been effected.
- No. 4. Upkeep of Victoria park : watered and manured flower plants, transported manure from Galle Face, swept rubbish, cleared weeds, &c. ; in progress.
- No. 5. Upkeep of Racquet court, &c. : watered and manured flower plants, transported manure from Galle Face, swept rubbish, cleared weeds, repaired Galle Face benches, &c.
- No. 6. Upkeep of Gordon Gardens : watered and manured flower plants, and kept garden clean.
- No. 7. Tools for road work and buildings : repaired old tools, &c.
- No. 8. Watering streets : streets have been watered on dry days.
- No. 9. Urgent works : repaired side and cross drains at Wekande, St. John's road, Butcher street, &c., and repairs to Town Hall roof.
- No. 10d. Whitewashing Madampitiya slaughter-house buildings, whitewashed the keeper's house, &c. ; in progress.
- No. 10e. Repairs to workshop roof : demolished boundary wall and put up a new gate ; in progress.
- No. 10f. Conservancy of Town Hall : cleaned doors and windows and whitewashed outer walls, &c.
- No. 10l. Repairs to toll houses : shifted tiles, repaired roof, whitewashed and tarred Welikada toll house ; in progress.
- No. 10m. Repair of Municipal latrines : repaired latrines at Nagalagam street, Dean's road, St. John's road, Hulftsdorp street, Bera, St. Thomas, St. Sebastian, Kew, Kollupitiya, &c. ; in progress.
- No. 10n. Repair of Municipal stables : spread gravel and stamped ; completed.
- No. 12. General conservancy of lake : cleared lake at Norris road, Darley road, Captain's garden, Union place, Sutherland road, Hunupitiya Lake road, &c. ; in progress.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE COLOMBO LAUNDRY COMPANY, LIMITED.

It is agreed that the regulations contained in the table C in the schedule annexed to “The Joint Stock Companies’ Ordinance, 1861, subject to the hereinafter-mentioned modifications, shall be deemed to be the regulations of the Company. The modifications are as follows:—

Transfer of Shares.—The Directors may decline to register the transfer of any share or shares held by a Shareholder, which in the interest of the Company they deem it inexpedient to register.

Every instrument of transfer shall be left at the office of the Company for approval by the Directors, accompanied by such evidence as may be required by the Directors to prove the title of the transferor. If the transfer be approved, such approval shall be certified in writing under the hand of two of the Directors endorsed on such instrument of transfer, and the Company shall thereupon register the transferee as a Shareholder. If the transfer be not approved, the proposed transfer shall be absolutely void, and notice of non-approval shall be sent to the Shareholder intending to transfer such share. If no notice of non-approval shall be sent to the Shareholder within thirty days, the transfer shall be deemed to have been approved.

Forfeiture of Shares.—Forfeited shares may be redeemed by the party whose shares have been declared forfeited at any time before they are disposed of, on payment of the amount of calls due, interest, and all costs incurred, and on payment thereof such shares shall re-vest in the person entitled thereto before the forfeiture, and be held by him in the same manner as if the call in respect of which they were forfeited had been duly paid.

Every Director shall hold not less than ten shares in the Company.

Powers of Directors.—Directors shall have the power to do the following things in the name and on behalf of the Company:—
