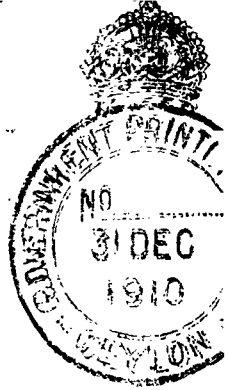
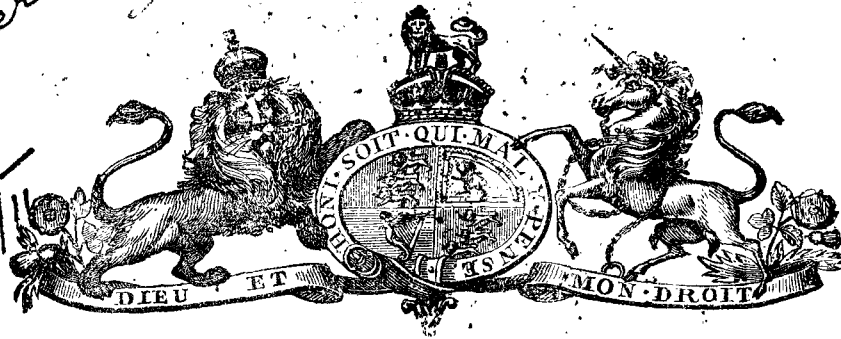

By His Excellency Sir HENRY EDWARD McCALLUM, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

HENRY McCALLUM.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor bearing date September 20, 1905, issued under the provisions of section 55 of "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," it was appointed that from and after October 1, 1905, the Police Court and Court of Requests for the division of Jaffna in the Northern Circuit should be held at Jaffna and Mallakam instead of at Jaffna only:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Police Court and Court of Requests should instead be holden at Jaffna only:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in exercise of the power in Us vested by the above recited section, do hereby appoint that the said Police Court and Court of Requests for the division of Jaffna in the Northern Circuit shall, as from and after January 1, 1911, be holden at Jaffna only.

And We do hereby cancel the said Proclamation dated September 20, 1905.

CHAPTER VI.

Establishment and Regulation of Markets.

30. All fresh fish caught in the sea and brought on shore in any vessel whatsoever and landed in any part of the seabeach within the Municipal limits of the town of Galle, and all other fish brought otherwise within such limits, shall be taken by the owners thereof to the fish auction shed in the Galle bazaars.

31. Such fish shall first be sold by public auction in the said fish auction shed by the renter, who shall be entitled to recover a commission of 4 per cent. on the proceeds.

32. No fresh fish other than that purchased at such auction sale can be sold within the Municipal limits of the town of Galle without a license from the Council.
