DRAFT ORDINANCES.

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

An Ordinance to prevent the Wanton Destruction of Birds, Beasts, and Fishes not indigenous to this Colony.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for the protection of certain birds, beasts, and fishes not indigenous to this Colony, but which have been or may hereafter be introduced into the Island: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Commencement of Ordinance.

1 This Ordinance shall come into operation at such time as the Governor shall appoint by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*.

Interpretation.

Proviso.

The words "birds," "beasts," "fishes" shall, for the purposes of this Ordinance, be deemed to mean such birds, beasts, and fishes as are mentioned in the schedule hereto annexed. Provided, however, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time or from time to time to declare that this Ordinance shall apply to any birds, beasts, and fishes to be named therein other than those mentioned in the said schedule, and upon such Proclamation being so published, the provisions of this Ordinance shall forthwith be held to apply to such birds, beasts, and fishes in the same manner and to the same extent as if such birds, beasts, and fishes had been mentioned in the said schedule. It shall also be lawful for the Governor. acting with the advice aforesaid, by Proclamation to be published as aforesaid, to exempt from the operation of this Ordinance any birds, beasts, and fishes for the time being subject to the provisions thereof, and any such Proclamation to revoke or amend by any subsequent Proclamation to be published as aforesaid.

Government agent may declare a close season. 3 It shall be lawful for the government agent of any province to declare by notification in the Government Gazette and by beat of tom-tom, and by such other means as shall give due publicity thereto, what shall be deemed the close season in such province or in certain districts thereof for a period not exceeding months during the year. It shall not be lawful for any person to take, kill, or destroy any birds, beasts, and fishes mentioned in the schedule hereto annexed within the province or districts during the period so declared close.

No person to take, kill, &c., without license. 4 No person shall take, kill, or destroy any birds, beasts, or fishes mentioned in the schedule hereto annexed without taking out a license empowering him to do so. It shall be lawful for the government agent of any province, within the limits of such province, or the chairman of the local board, where a local board is established, within the limits of such board, to grant such licenses on such conditions as shall be therein imposed, or to refuse the same, or to revoke the same after they shall have been once granted, as shall seem fit. Provided that any person to whom a license may be refused, or whose license may be revoked, shall be at liberty to apply to the Governor for redress; and it shall be competent to the Governor to make such order on the application as to him shall seem fit.

Reference to

Proviso.

5 The application for a license must be in writing; the license shall bear a stamp of rupees to be supplied by the applicant.

Application for license in writing. Stamp on license.

License not transferable.

6 The licenses granted under this Ordinance shall in no case be assignable or transferable, nor shall any person be deemed entitled to take, kill, or destroy any birds, beasts, or fishes mentioned in the schedule hereto except the person actually named in such license,

Killing, &c., in close season prohibited.

7 Nothing in the said licenses contained shall be held to allow the taking, killing, or destroying of birds, beasts, and fishes in the close season which is hereby expressly prohibited.

Governor to make regulations.

8 It shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time to make regulations respecting the taking, killing, or destroying of birds, beasts, and fishes mentioned in the schedule hereto, and such regulations at any time to repeal, alter, or amend, and all licenses issued under this Ordinance shall be subject to such regulations, and any breach thereof shall be punishable as a breach of such license. Provided that such regulations shall not be inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance; and all such regulations or any repeal, alteration, or amendment thereof shall be published in the Government Gazette.

Proviso.

Penalties.

- 9 The following penalties are imposed for the following acts, which are hereby declared to be offences under this Ordinance:—
 - (1) Any person who shall take, kill, or destroy any birds, beasts, or fishes mentioned in the schedule hereto within any province or district in respect of which the close season shall have been declared, and during the period so declared close, shall be liable on conviction to a fine of rupees, or to simple or rigorous imprisoment for a period not exceeding, or both.
 - (2) Any person who shall take, kill, or destroy any birds, beasts, or fishes mentioned in the schedule hereto without a license, or after the time for which the license shall be in force, or contrary to the tenour of such license, shall be liable on conviction to a fine of rupees, or to simple or rigorous imprisonment not exceeding, or both.
 - (3) Any person who shall transfer his license, and any person who shall accept a transferred license, shall each be liable to a fine of rupees, or to simple or rigorous imprisonment for a period not exceeding, or both.
 - (4) Any person in whose possession shall be found during the period which shall have been declared close in the province or district, any of the birds, beasts, and fishes mentioned in the schedule hereto, alive or dead, or the flesh thereof which he shall not be able to account for satisfactorily, shall be liable on conviction to a fine of rupees, or to simple or rigorous imprisonment which may extend to a period of , or to both.

Police court to have jurisdiction.

10 Every prosecution under this Ordinance may be instituted in the police court of the division in which the offence was committed or where the offender is found, anything in the Criminal Procedure Code 1883 or in any other Ordinance to the contrary notwithstanding.

Informer's share

11 It shall be lawful for the court imposing a fine under this Ordinance to award to the informer any share not exceeding a moiety of so much of the fine as is actually recovered and realised.

Burden of proof.

12 (1) In any prosecution instituted under this Ordinance against any person for having taken, killed, or destroyed any birds, beasts, or fishes without a license, the burden of proof that he holds a license shall be on the party accused, and until the contrary shall be proved he shall be deemed to have no license.

(2) When a person is charged with any offence against this Ordinance, he may, if he thinks fit, tender himself to be examined on his own behalf, and thereupon may give evidence in the same manner and with the like effect and consequence as any other witness.

REVENUE NOTICES.

OTICE is hereby given that the Hon. the Government Agent for the Central Province will receive sealed tenders for the purchase of the under-mentioned Arrack Rents of the Central Province from July 1, 1893, to June 30, 1894:—

- 1. Kandy Town and Gravets.
- 2. Dumbara and Páta Héwaheta.
- 3. Tumpane and Harispattu.
- Yatinawara and Udunuwara.
 Udapalata and Uda Bulatgama.
- 6. The Revenue District of Nuwara Eliya.

Officers may be made for each of these separately or for any combination of them, or one offer may be made for the rents of the whole Province.

The tenders, which must be in sealed envelopes superscribed "Tender for Arrack Rents," will be received at the Kandy Kachchéri until 2 o'clock P.M. on Wednesday, May 31, 1893, when they will be opened; and all persons making tender will be required to be present; in the absence of any tenderer no notice will be taken of his tender.

The persons whose tender is selected by the Government Agent for submission to the Governor will be required deposit at once one-tenth of the purchase amount in cash; and should the tender be accepted by His Excellency the Governor, to furnish approved security for one-half of the whole purchase amount, or in cash for one-third of the whole purchase amount, within thirty days of the date of the receipt by him of the notification of the Governor's acceptance of his offer.

No title deeds will be accepted as security without a letter signed by the owner stating his willingness to hypothecate the same as security.

All title deeds tendered as security should be accompanied by a certificate obtained from the Registrar of Lands that the land to which they refer is unencumbered. This certificate must be obtained at the cost of the party offering security.

After the completion of the securities the 10 per cent. deposit referred to shall remain with the Government Agent, and shall be taken and applied in part payment of the last instalment and in part of the eleventh instalment, so far as the said 10 per cent. deposit extends.

And notice is hereby further given that the purchase of the arrack rent of the Kandy town and gravets will be required to pay, in terms of the provisions of the Ordinance No. 9 of 1892, at stamp duty of Rs. 500 for each and every license issued under the Ordinance No. 13 of 1891 to sell by retail arrack and rum at each and every tavern situated within the limits of the Municipality of Kandy.

MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, April 14, 1893.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated April 8, 1893.

Present:—Mr. C. E. D. Pennycuick, Mayor and Chairman; Dr. W. R. Kynsey, C.M.G.; Captain F. Bayley; Mr. E. Walker; Hon. Col. F. C. H. Clarke, R.A., C.M.G.; Major R. E. Firminger; Major L. F. Knollys, C.M.G.; Mr. C. Perera; Mr. Walter Pereira; Mr. R. H. Morgan; and Mr. C. M. Fernando.

The Minutes of March 10, 1893, having been printed and a copy sent to each Member of the Council, were taken

Resolved,—That the Minutes of March 10, 1893, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. Perera moved "that steps be taken to prevent the removal of sand from the sea-shore at Galle Face, with a view to prevent any further damage being done thereby to the retaining wall of the Galle Face walk."

This motion was, by leave of Council, withdrawn, the Chairman having explained what steps he had already taken in the matter.

- A Statement of Receipts and Disbursements from January to March, 1893, and a Progress Report of Work done for March, 1893, were laid on the table.
- 3. A letter No. 26 of March 15, 1893, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, was read, intimating that the Secretary of State has not approved the proposed contribution of Rs. 10,000 a year from General Revenue towards the cost of a duplicate water main; and a further letter No. 39 of April 11, 1893, intimating that the Secretary of State cannot consent to a direct subsidy from the General Revenue to what is after all a municipal object.

 The Chairman moved "that the Hon. the Colonial Secretary be informed that the Council have heard with

regret the decision of the Secretary of State as regards the annual grant of Rs. 10,000 promised in the Colonial Secretary's letter of 25th May. That the decision in itself releases the Council from their undertaking to vest in trustees, for the purpose of providing additional pipes from Labugama, the sum derived from the levy of a license-fee on arrack taverns, which they are now clearly entitled to appropriate to general purposes, but that they will gladly agree to vest this sum in trustees, as determined on June 10, if the Government can supplement it with an equal amount from some other source. That it appears to the Council that, among other sources of revenue, the proceeds of sales of Crown lands lying within the boundaries of the Municipality might legitimately be devoted to this purpose

Captain Bayley seconded.—Carried,

4. Letters Nos. 18 and 23 of February 28 and March 10, 1893, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, were read, inquiring whether the Council would arrange to pay the cost of a small police force at Peliyagoda for regulating and protecting traffic at the entrance of the city.

The Inspector-General of Police (Major Knollys) having informed the Council that the above letter was written under some misapprehension, as the city traffic is sufficiently controlled by the police at the Grandpass station, the subject was not further discussed; and it was resolved that the Government be so informed.

- An application dated March 6, 1893, from the Hon. P. Coomaraswamy, was laid on the table, requesting permission to erect certain buildings at 21 and 22, Seabeach road, and the report of the Superintendent of Works, suggesting that the front of the proposed buildings should be brought forward to the general line of the street, and that Mr. Coomaraswamy be requested to give up an equivalent strip of land for the improvement of St. John's lane.
 - Mr. C. Perera moved "that Government be requested to sanction the proposed exchange of land." Hon. Col. F. C. H. Clarke seconded.—Carried.
- 6. A memorandum from the Hon, the Colonial Secretary forwarding Draft Ordinance as to supervision of dairies for opinion of Council, was laid on the table. Resolved,—That the papers be circulated.
- The City Analyst's report dated March 13, on the town water for February, 1893, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.

- 8. The Auditor-General's remarks on the accounts for November and December, 1892, received with letters Nos. 30 and 31 of March 17 and 18, and a letter dated March 30 (April 6) 1893, were laid on the table.
- 9. Reports of the Inspectors (except Mr. Daviot's) on licensed carriages, and on kerosine, poison, and gunpowder shops for April, 1893, were laid on the table.

Board may decline to register Transfers.—The Board may at their own absolute and uncontrolled discretion decline to register any transfer of shares by a Shareholder who is indebted to the Company, or upon whose shares the Company have a lien or otherwise, or in case of shares not fully paid up, to any person not approved by them.
- 24. Not bound to state Reason.—In no case shall a Shareholder or proposed transferee be entitled to require the Directors to state the reason of their refusal to register, but their declinature shall be absolute.
- 25. Registration of Transfer.—Every instrument of transfer must be left at the office of the Company to be registered, accompanied by such evidence as the Directors may reasonably require to prove the title of the transferor, and a fee of Rupees two and cents fifty, or such other sum as the Directors shall from time to time determine, must be paid, and thereupon the Directors, subject to the powers vested in them by Articles 23, 24, and 26, shall register the transferee as a Shareholder, and retain the instrument of transfer.
- 26. The Directors may, by such means as they shall deem expedient, authorise the registration of transferees as Shareholders without the necessity of any meeting of the Directors for that purpose.
- 27. Directors not bound to inquire as to validity of Transfer.—In no case shall the Directors be bound to inquire into the validity, legal effect, or genuineness of any instrument of transfer produced by a person claiming a transfer of any share in accordance with these Articles, and whether they abstain from so inquiring, or do so inquire and are misled, the transferor shall have no claim whatsoever upon the Company in respect of the share, except for the dividends previously declared in respect thereof, but only, if at all, upon the transferee.

28. Transfer Books when to be closed.—The transfer books may be closed during the fourteen days immediately preceding each Ordinary General Meeting, including the First General Meeting; also, when a dividend is declared, for the three next days ensuing the meeting.

TRANSMISSION OF SHARES.

29. Title to Shares of Deceased Holder.—The executors or administrators of a deceased Shareholder shall be the

29. Title to Snares of Deceased Holder.—The executors or administrators of a deceased Shareholder snall be the only persons recognised by the Company as having any title to the shares of such Shareholder.

30. Registration of Persons entitled to the Shares otherwise than by Transfer.—Any guardian of any infant Shareholder, or any committee of a lunatic Shareholder, or any person becoming entitled to shares in consequence of the death, bankruptcy, or liquidation of any Shareholder, or the marriage of any female Shareholder, or in any other way than by transfer, shall, upon securing such evidence that he sustains the character in respect of which he proposes to act under this clause, or of his title as the Company think sufficient, be forthwith entitled, subject to the provisions having contained to be registered as a Shareholden in respect of such shares or may subject to the regulations as to herein contained, to be registered as a Shareholder in respect of such shares, or may, subject to the regulations as to transfers hereinbefore contained, transfer the same to some other person.

SHARES (SURRENDER AND FORFEITURE).

32. The Directors may accept surrender of Shares.—The Directors may accept, in the name and for the benefit of the Company, and upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed, a surrender of the shares of the

33. 34. Surrendered or Forfeited Shares to be Property of Company, and may be sold, &c.—Every share surrendered or so declared forfeited shall be deemed to be the property of the Company, and may be sold, re-allotted, or otherwise

disposed of upon such terms and in such manner as the Board shall think fit.

35. Effect of Surrender or Forfeiture.—The surrender or forfeiture of a share shall involve the extinction of all interest in and also of all claims and demands against the Company in respect of the share and the proceeds thereof, and all other rights incident to the share, except only such of those rights (if any) as by these presents are

36. CALLS.

42. Directors may make Calls. - The Directors may from time to time make such calls as they think fit upon the holders of registered shares in respect of moneys unpaid thereon, and not by the conditions of allotment made payable at fixed times, and each Shareholder shall pay the amount of every call so made on him to the persons and at the times and places appointed by the Directors, provided that two months' notice at least shall be given to the Shareholders of the time and place appointed for payment of each call. If any Shareholder fail to pay any call due from him on the day appointed for payment thereof, he shall be liable to pay interest for the same at the rate of nine per cent. per annum from the day appointed for the payment thereof to the time of actual payment.

43. Calls, Time when made.—A call shall be deemed to have been made at the time when the resolution

44. Extension of time for payment of Call.—The Directors shall have power in their absolute discretion to give time to any one or more Shareholder or Shareholders exclusive of the others for payment of any call or part thereof on such terms as the Directors may determine. 45. BORROWING POWERS.

46. Power to Borrow.—The Directors shall have power to borrow money for the purposes of the Company, and for this purpose to grant bonds, promissory notes, bills, debentures, interest warrants, bonds for cash credit, trust deeds, or other documents, to issue letters of credit, and to grant mortgages or other deeds of security over all or any of the Company's lands, property, estate, and assets. Provided that nothing herein contained shall be held to prevent the Directors procuring from time to time, in the usual course of business, such temporary advances on the produce in hand or in the future to be obtained from the Company's estate or estates as they may find necessary or expedient for the purpose of defraying the expenses of working the said estate or estates, or of extending buildings, machinery, or plantations, or otherwise. Provided also that before the Directors execute any mortgage or issue any debentures they shall obtain the constitution of the Communication of the Commun they shall obtain the sanction of the Company in General Meeting, whether ordinary or extraordinary. A declaration under the Company's seal contained in or endorsed upon any of the documents mentioned in this Article, and subscribed by two or more of the Directors, to the effect that the Directors have power to borrow the amount which such document may represent, shall be conclusive evidence thereof in all questions between the Company and its Directors, and no such document containing such declaration shall, as regards the creditors, be void on the ground of its being granted in excess of the aforesaid borrowing power, unless it be proved that such creditor was aware that it was so granted

47. Assignment of Security.—Every debenture or other instrument issued by the Company for securing the payment of money may be so framed that the moneys thereby secured shall be assignable free from any equities between the Company and the person to whom the same may be issued.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

48. First General Meeting.—The first General Meeting shall be held at such time, not being more than twelve months after the registration of the Company, and at such place as the Directors may determine.

49. Subsequent General Meetings.—Subsequent General Meetings shall be held once in every year at such time and place as may be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting, and if no time or place is prescribed, at such time and place as may be determined by the Directors.

50. Ordinary and Extraordinary General Meetings.—The General Meetings mentioned in the last preceding clause shall be called Ordinary General Meetings; all other meetings of the Company shall be called Extraordinary General Meetings. General Meetings.

51. Extraordinary General Meeting.—The Directors may, whenever they think fit, call an Extraordinary General Meeting, and the Directors shall do so upon a requisition made in writing by not less than one-eighth of the number of Shareholders holding not less than one-eighth of the issued capital and entitled to vote.

52. Requisition to state object of Meeting; if Directors fail to call Meeting, Shareholders may do so.—Any requisition so made shall express the object of the meeting proposed to be called, shall be addressed to the Directors, and shall be sent to the Registered Office of the Company. Upon the receipt of such requisition the Directors shall forthwith proceed to convene an Extraordinary General Meeting to be held at such time and place as they shall determine. If they do not proceed to convene the same within seven days from the delivery of the requisition, the requisitionists may themselves convene an Extraordinary General Meeting to be held at such place and at such time as the Share-

53 Seven days' notice of Meeting to be given.—Seven days' notice at least of every General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, and by whomsoever convened, specifying the place, day, hour of meeting, and the object and business of the meeting, shall be given to the Shareholders entitled to be present at such meeting in manner hereinafter mentioned, but an accidental omission to give such notice to any Shareholder shall not invalidate the proceedings at any General Meeting.

54. Business requiring and not requiring Notification.—Every Ordinary General Meeting shall be competent, without special notice having been given of the purposes for which it is convened, or of the business to be transacted thereat to receive and discuss any report and any accounts presented thereto by the Directors, and to pass resolutions

thereat, to receive and discuss any report and any accounts presented thereto by the Directors, and to pass resolutions in approval or disapproval thereof, and to declare dividends, and to elect Directors and Auditors retiring in rotation, and to fix the remuneration of the Auditors, and shall also be competent to enter upon, discuss, and transact any business whatsoever of which special mention shall have been given in the notice or notices upon which the meeting was convened.

55. Notice of other business to be given.—With the exceptions mentioned in the foregoing Articles as to the business which may be transacted at Ordinary General Meetings without notice, no General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, shall be competent to enter upon, discuss, or transact any business which has not been specially men-

tioned in the notice or notices upon which it was convened.

Quorum.—No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting except the declaration of a dividend recommended by a report of the Directors or election of a Chairman, unless there shall be present in person at the commencement of the business three or more Shareholders entitled to vote.

57. If Quorum not Present.—If at the expiration of half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting the

51. If Quorum not Present.—If at the expiration of half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting the required number of Shareholders shall not be present at the meeting, the meeting, if convened by or upon the requisition of Shareholders, shall be dissolved, but in any other case it shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week at the same time and place, and if at such adjourned meeting a quorum is not present, those Shareholders who are present shall be a quorum, and may transact the business for which the meeting was called.

58. Chairman of Directors or a Director to be Chairman of General Meeting: in case of their absence or refusal a Shareholder may act.—The Chairman (if any) of the Directors shall be entitled to take the chair at every General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary, or if there be no Chairman, or if at any meeting he shall not be present within fifteen minutes after the time appointed for holding such meeting, or if he shall refuse to take the chair, the Shareholders shall choose another Director as Chairman, and if no Directors be present, or if all the Directors present decline to take the chair, then the Shareholders present shall choose one of their number to be a Chairman. decline to take the chair, then the Shareholders present shall choose one of their number to be a Chairman.

59. Business confined to election of Chairman while Chair vacant.—No business shall be discussed at any General

Meeting except the election of a Chairman whilst the chair is vacant.

60. Chairman with consent may adjourn Meeting.—The Chairman, with the consent of the meeting, may adjourn any meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place, unless due notice

shall be given.

61. Minutes of General Meeting.—Minutes of the proceedings of every General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary, shall be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose, and shall when so entered be signed as soon as practicable by the Chairman of the same meeting, or by the Chairman of the succeeding meeting, and the same when so entered and signed shall be evidence of all such proceedings, and of the proper election of the Chairman.

VOTING AT MEETINGS.

62. Votes.—At any meeting every resolution shall be decided by the votes of the Shareholders present in person or by proxy, and in case there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman at such meeting shall be entitled to give a casting vote in addition to the vote to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder, and unless a poll be immediately demanded by some member present and entitled to vote, a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has been carried, and an entry to that effect in the Minute Book of the Company, shall be sufficient evidence of the fact without

proof of the number of votes recorded in favour of or against such resolution.
63. Poll.—If a poll be duly demanded, the same shall be taken in such manner and at such time and place as the Chairman shall direct, and the result of the poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the meeting at which the poll was demanded. The demand of a poll shall not prevent the continuance of a meeting for the transaction of business other than the question on which a poll has been demanded.

- 64. Poll how taken.—If at any meeting a poll be demanded by some Shareholder present at the meeting and entitled to vote, the meeting shall, if necessary, be adjourned, and the poll shall be taken at such time and in such manner as the Chairman shall direct, and in such case every Shareholder shall have the number of votes to which he may be entitled as hereinafter provided, and in case at any such poll there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman of the meeting at which such poll shall have been demanded shall be entitled to a casting vote in addition to any votes to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder and proxy, and the result of such poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the Company in such meeting.

67. Guardian of Infant, &c., when not entitled to vote.—The parent or guardian of an infant Shareholder, the committee or other legal guardian of any lunatic Shareholder, the husband of any female Shareholder not entitled to her shares as saparate estate and the executor or administrator of any deceased Shareholder, or any one of such to her shares as separate estate, and the executor or administrator of any deceased Shareholder, or any one of such persons as aforesaid, if more than one, shall not be entitled to vote in the place of such infant, lunatic, female, or deceased person, unless such person shall have been registered as a Shareholder.

68. Voting in Person or by Proxy.—Votes may be given either personally or by proxy.
69. Non-Shareholder not to be appointed Proxy.—No person shall be entitled a proxy who is not a Shareholder of the Company.

70 Shareholder in Arrear not to Vote.—No Shareholder shall be entitled to vote or speak at any General Meeting unless all calls due from him on his shares or any of them shall have been paid.

71. Proxy to be Printed or in Writing.—The instrument appointing a proxy shall be printed or written, and shall be signed by the appointer, or if such appointer be a corporation, it shall be by the common seal of such corporation.

72. When Proxy to be deposited.—The instrument appointing a proxy shall be deposited at the Registered Office of the Company not less than twenty four hours before the time appointed for holding the meeting at which the person named in such instrument proposes to vote.

80.  - (a) If he accepts or holds any office or place of profit other than Managing Director or Secretary under the Company
 - (b) If he becomes bankrupt or insolvent, or suspends payment, or files a petition for the liquidation of his affairs, or compounds with his creditors.
 - (c) If by reason of mental or bodily infirmity he becomes incapable of acting.
 - (d) If he ceases to hold the required number of shares to qualify him for the office.
 - (e) If he is concerned or participates in the profits of any contract with or work done for the Company.

Exceptions.—But the above rules shall be subject to the following exceptions. That no Director shall vacate his office by reason of his being a member of any corporation, company, or firm which has entered into any contract with or done any work for the Company of which he is a Director, or by his being Agent or Secretary or Solicitor, or by his being a member of a firm who are Agents or Secretaries or Solicitors of the Company: nevertheless he shall the secretaries of the Company
not vote in respect of any contract work or business in which he may be personally interested.

92. How Directors removed and Successors appointed.—The Company may by a special resolution remove any Director before the expiration of his period of office, and may by an ordinary resolution appoint another person in his stead, and the Director so appointed shall hold office only during such time as the Director in whose place he is

appointed would have held the same if he had not been removed.

93. Indemnity to Directors and others for their own acts and for the acts of others.—Every Director or officer and his heirs, executors, and administrators shall be indemnified by the Company from all losses and expenses incurred by him respectively in or about the discharge of his respective duties, except such as happen from his respective wilful acts or defaults, and no Director or officer, nor the heirs, executors, or administrators of any Director or officer, wilful acts or defaults, and no Director or officer, nor the heirs, executors, or administrators of any Director or officer, shall be liable for any other Director or officer or for joining in any receipt or other acts of conformity, or for any loss or expense happening to the Company by the insufficiency or deficiency of title to any property acquired for or on behalf of the Company, or for the insufficiency or deficiency of any security in or upon which any of the moneys of the Company shall be invested, or for any loss or damage arising from the bankruptcy, insolvency, or tortuous act of any person with whom any moneys, securities, or effects shall be deposited, or for any other loss, damage, or misfortune whatsoever which shall happen in the execution of the duties of his respective office or in relation thereto, unless the same happen through his own wilful act or default.

94. No contribution to be required from Directors beyond amount, if any, unpaid on their Shares.—No contribution shall be required from any present or past Director or Manager exceeding the amount, if any, unpaid on the shares in respect of which he is liable as a present or past Shareholder.

respect of which he is liable as a present or past Shareholder.

Powers of Directors.

95. Powers of Directors.—The business of the Company shall be managed by the Directors either by themselves or through the Managing Director, or by an agent or agents, secretary or secretaries of the Company, in such manner as the Directors shall determine; and the Directors shall payout of the funds of the Company all costs and expenses as well preliminary or otherwise paid or incurred in and about the formation and the registration of the

Company, and in connection with the placing of the shares of the Company.

96. The Directors shall carry on the business of the Company in such manner as they may think most expedient, and in addition to the powers and authorities by any Ordinance or by these presents expressly conferred on them, they may exercise all such powers, give all such consents, make all such arrangements, appoint all such agents, managers, secretaries, treasurers, accountants, and other officers, clerks, assistants, artizans, and workers, and generally do all such acts and things as are or shall be by any Ordinance and by these presents directed and authorised to be exercised, given, made, or done by the Company, and are not by any Ordinance or by these presents required to be exercised or done by the Company in General Mosting, subject to a proportion of the presents of the company and are not by any Ordinance or by these presents required to be exercised or done by the Company in General Meeting, subject, nevertheless, to the provisions of any such Ordinance and of these presents and to such regulations and provisions (if any) as may from time to time be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting; but no regulations made by the Company in General Meeting shall invalidate any prior act of the Board which would have been valid if such regulation had not been made. The generalty of the powers conferred by any clause in these presents on the Directors shall not be taken to be limited by any clause conferring

any special or expressed power.

97. The Directors shall have power to make, and may make such regulations for the management of the business and property of the Company as they may from time to time think proper, and for that purpose may appoint such managers, agents, secretaries, officers, clerks, and servants for such period or periods, and with such remuneration and at such salaries, and upon such terms and conditions as they may consider advisable, and may pay the expenses occasioned thereby out of the funds of the Company, and may from time to time remove or suspend all or any of the managers, agents, officers, clerks, or servants for such reasons as they may think proper and advisable and without

assigning any cause.

98. The Directors shall have power to open from time to time on behalf of the Company any account or accounts with such bank or banks as they may select or appoint, and also by such signatures as they may appoint to accounts with such bank or banks as they may select or appoint, and also by such signatures as they may appoint to draw, accept, make, endorse, and sign cheques, bills of exchange and promissory notes, bills of lading, receipts, contracts and agreements, and other documents on behalf and for the purposes of the Company, also proxy or proxies to any

proctor or proctors.

99. The Directors shall also have power to appoint an agent or secretary or agents or secretaries, and to enter into agreements in connection therewith, also to appoint a proctor or proctors, attorney or attorneys, and whatever other officers they may consider necessary to assist in carrying on the business of the Company, and from time to time to revoke such appointment. They shall from time to time determine, as they shall see fit, the duties of the agent or secretary or agents or secretaries, and of the Managing Directors and other officers, and may delegate to him or them all or any of the powers hereby made exercisable by the Directors, except those relating to shares and any others as to which special provisions inconsistent with such delegation are herein contained, and they shall have power to fix the remuneration of such agent or secretary or agents or secretaries and Managing Director and other officers. They shall not, however, be entitled to delegate any powers of borrowing or charging the property of the Company to any agent of the Company or other person, except by instrument in writing, which shall specifically state the extent to which such powers may be used by the person or persons to whom they are so delegated, and the conditions under which they may be used, and such limitations and conditions shall be an essential part of the powers so delegated, and compliance therewith shall be a condition precedent to the exercise of these powers. The Directors shall also have the power to bring or defend any action suit presention or other level precedings in the power of the company.

have the power to bring or defend any action, suit, prosecution, or other legal proceedings in the name of the Company.

100. It shall be lawful for the Directors, if authorised so to do by the Shareholders in General Meeting, to arrange terms for the amalgamation of the Company with any other Company or individual or individuals, or for the sale or disposal of the business, estate, and effects of the Company or any part thereof, respectively, to any Company or person upon such terms and in such manner as the Directors shall think fit, and the Directors shall have power to do all such things as may be necessary for carrying such amalgamation, sale, or other disposition into effect so far as a resolution or special resolution of the Company is not by law necessary for such purpose, and in case any terms so arranged by the Directors include or make necessary the dissolution of the Company shall thereupon

be dissolved.

101. The Directors shall exercise in the name and on behalf of the Company all such powers of the Company as are not expressly required to be exercised by the Company in General Meeting.

Proceedings of Directors.

102. Meeting of Directors.—The Directors may meet for the despatch of business, adjourn, and otherwise regulate their meetings as they may think fit, and determine the quorum necessary for the transaction of business. Until otherwise determined, two Directors shall be a quorum.

103. A Director may summon Meetings of Directors.—A Director may at any time summon a meeting of Directors.

104. Who is to preside at Meetings of Board.—The Board may elect a Chairman of their meetings and determine the period for which he is to hold office, and all meetings of the Directors shall be presided over by the Chairman, if one has been elected and if present, but if there be a vacancy in the office of Chairman, or if at any meeting of Directors the Chairman be not present at the time appointed for holding the same, then and in that case the Directors present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

105. Questions at Meetings how decided.—Any question which shall arise at any meeting of the Directors shall

be decided by a majority of votes, and in case of an equality of votes the Chairman thereat shall have a casting vote

in addition to his vote as a Director.

106. Board may appoint Committees.—The Board may delegate any of their powers to committees consisting of such member or members of their body as the Board think fit, and they may from time to time revoke and discharge any such committee either wholly or in part, and either as to persons or purposes; but every committee so formed shall, in exercise of the powers delegated to it, conform to all such regulations as may be prescribed by the Board. All acts done by any such committee in conformity with such regulations, and in the fulfilment of the purposes of their appointment, but not otherwise, shall have the like force and effect as if done by the Board.

107. Acts of Board or Committees valid notwithstanding informal appointment.—The acts of the Board and of any committees appointed by the Board shall, notwithstanding any vacancy in the Board or committee, or defect in the appointment of any Director or of any member of the committee, be as valid as if no such vacancy or defect had

existed, and as if every person had been duly appointed, provided the same be done before the discovery of the defect.

108. Regulation of Proceedings of Committee.—The meetings and proceedings of such committee shall be governed by the provisions herein contained for regulating the meetings and proceedings of Directors, so far as the same are applicable thereto, and be not superseded by the express terms of the appointment of such committee res-

pectively or any regulation imposed by the Board.

109. Resolution in Writing by all the Directors as valid as if passed at a Meeting of Directors.—A resolution in Writing signed by all the Directors shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Directors duly called and constituted.

110. Minutes of Proceedings of the Company and the Directors to be recorded.—The Directors shall cause

minutes to be made in books to be provided for the purpose of the following matters, vide licet:-

- (a) Of all appointments of officers and committees made by the Directors.
- (b) Of the names of the Directors present at each meeting of the Directors, and of the members of the committee appointed by the Board present at each meeting of the committee.
- (c) Of the proceedings of all General Meetings.
- (d) Of the proceedings of all meetings of the Directors and of the committees appointed by the Board.

111. Signature of Minutes of Proceedings and effect thereof.—All such minutes shall be signed by the person or one of the persons who shall have presided as Chairman at the General Meeting, the Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting at which the business minuted shall have been transacted, or by the person or one of the persons who shall preside as Chairman at the next ensuing General Meeting, or Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting, respectively, and all Minutes purporting to have been signed by any Chairman of any General Meeting, Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting, respectively, shall, for all purposes whatsoever, be primá facie evidence of the actual and regular passing of the resolutions, and the actual and regular transaction or occurrence of the proceedings and other matters purporting to be so recorded, and of the regularity of the meeting at which the same shall appear to have taken place, and of the chairmanship and signature of the person appearing to have signed as chairman.

112. The use of the Seal.—The seal of the Company shall not be used or affixed to any deed or instrument except in the presence of two or more of the Directors, who shall attest the sealing thereof.

ACCOUNTS.

113. What Accounts to be kept .- The agent or secretary or the agents or secretaries for the time being, or if there be no agent or secretary or agents or secretaries the Directors, shall cause true accounts to be kept of the paid up capital for the time being of the Company, and of all sums of money received and expended by the Company, and of the matters in respect of which such receipts and expenditure take place, and of the assets, credits, and liabilities of the Company, and generally of all its commercial, financial, and other affairs, transactions, and engagements; and of all other matters necessary for showing the true financial state and condition of the Company, and the accounts shall be kept in such books, and in such a manner at the Registered Office of the Company as the Directors think fit.

114. Accounts how and when open to Inspection.—The Directors shall from time to time determine whether and to what extent, and at what times and places, and under what conditions or regulations, the accounts and books of the Company or of any of them shall be open to the inspection of the Shareholders, and no Shareholder shall have any

right of inspecting any account or book or document of the Company, except as conferred by the statutes, or authorised by the Directors, or by a resolution of the Company in General Meeting.

115. Statement of Accounts and Balance Sheet to be furnished to General Meeting.—At the Ordinary General Meeting in every year the Directors shall lay before the Company a statement of the income and expenditure and a believe sheet containing a supercount and liabilities of the Company made up to the end of the balance sheet containing a summary of the property and liabilities of the Company made up to the end of the

previous year.

116. Report to accompany Statement.—Every such statement shall be accompanied by a report as to the state and condition of the Company, and as to the amount which they recommend to be paid out of the profits by way of dividend or bonus to the Shareholders, and the statement, report, and balance sheet shall be signed by the Directors.

117. Copy of Balance Sheet to be sent to Shareholders.—A printed copy of such balance sheet shall, at least seven ays previous to such meeting, be delivered at or posted to the registered address of every Shareholder.

DIVIDENDS, BONUS, AND RESERVED FUND.

118. Declaration of Dividend.—The Directors may, with the sanction of the Company in General Meeting, from time to time, declare a dividend to be paid to the Shareholders in proportion to their shares, but no dividend shall be payable except out of net profit.

119. Interim Dividend.—The Directors may, if they think fit, determine on and declare an interim dividend or dividends to be paid to the Shareholders on account and in anticipation of the dividend on the then current year.

120. Reserve Fund.—Previously to the Directors recommending any dividend on the then current year.

120. Reserve Fund.—Previously to the Directors recommending any dividend, they may set aside out of the profits of the Company such a sum as they think proper as a reserve fund, and shall invest the same in such securities they shall think fit, or place the same in fixed deposit in any bank or banks.

121. Application thereof.—The Directors may from time to time apply such portion as they think fit of the reserve fund to meet contingencies, or for equalising dividends, or for working the business of the Company, or for repairing or maintaining or extending the buildings and premises or for the repairing or reserved on extension of the

repairing, or maintaining, or extending the buildings and premises, or for the repair or renewal or extension of the property or plant connected with the business of the Company or any part thereof, or for any other purpose of the Company which they from time to time deem expedient.

122. Unpaid Interest or Dividend not to bear Interest.—No unpaid interest or dividend shall ever bear interest

against the Company.

123. No Shareholder to receive Dividend while Debt due to Company.—No shareholder shall be entitled to receive payment of any dividend in respect of his share or shares whilst any moneys may be due or owing from him (whether

alone or jointly with any other person) to the Company in respect of such share or shares or otherwise howsoever.

124. Directors may deduct Debt from the Dividend.—The Directors may deduct from the dividend payable to any Shareholder all sums of money due from him (whether alone or jointly with any other person) to the Company, and notwithstanding such sum shall not be payable until after the date when such dividend is payable.

125. Notice of Dividend; Forfeiture of unclaimed Dividend.—Notice of all interest or dividend to become payable shall be given to each Shareholder entitled thereto, and all interest or dividend unclaimed by any Shareholder for three years after notice thereof is given may be forfeited by a resolution of the Board of Directors for the benefit of the Company, and if the Directors think fit may be applied in augmentation of the reserve fund.

126. Shares held by a Firm.—Every dividend or bonus payable in respect of any share held by a firm may be paid to, and an effectual receipt given by, any partner of such firm or agent duly authorised to sign the name of the firm.

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127. Joint-holders other than Firm.—Every dividend or bonus payable in respect of any share held by several persons jointly other than a firm may be paid to, and an effectual receipt given by, any one of such persons.

AUDIT.

- 128. Accounts to be Audited.—The accounts of the Company shall from time to time be examined, and the correctness of the balance sheet ascertained, by one or more Auditor or Auditors.
- Qualification of Auditors.—No person shall be eligible as an Auditor who is interested otherwise than as a Shareholder in any transaction of the Company, but it shall not be a necessary qualification for an Auditor that he be a Shareholder of the Company, and no Director or officer of the Company shall during his continuance in office be eligible as an Auditor.
- 130. Appointment and Retirement of Auditors.—The Directors shall appoint the first Auditors of the Company and fix their remuneration, and all future Auditors, except as is hereafter mentioned, shall be appointed at the first Ordinary General Meeting of the Company in each year by the Shareholders present thereat, and shall hold their office only until the first Ordinary General Meeting after their respective appointments, or until otherwise ordered by a General Meeting.
 - 131. Retiring Auditors eligible for re-election.—Retiring Auditors shall be eligible for re-election.
- 132. Remuneration of Auditors.—The remuneration of the Auditors other than the first shall be fixed by th Company in General Meeting, and this remuneration may from time to time be varied by a General Meeting.
- 133. Casual vacancy in number of Auditors how filled up.—If any vacancy that may occur in the office of Auditors shall not be supplied at any Ordinary General Meeting, or if any casual vacancy shall occur, the Directors shall (subject to the approval of the next Ordinary General Meeting) fill up the vacancy by the appointment of a person who shall hold the office until such meeting.
- 134. Duty of Auditors.—Every Auditor shall be supplied with a copy of the balance sheet intended to be laid before the next Ordinary General Meeting, and it shall be his duty to examine the same with the accounts and vouchers relating thereto, and to report thereon to the meeting, generally or specially, as he may think fit.
- 135. Company's Accounts to be open to Auditors for audit.—All accounts, books, and documents whatsoever of the Company shall at all times be open to the Auditors for the purpose of audit.

NOTICES.

136. Notices how authenticated.—Notices from the Company may be authenticated by the signature (printed

or written) of the agent or secretary, agents or secretaries, or other persons appointed by the Board to do so.

137. Shareholders to register Address.—Every Shareholder shall give an address in Ceylon which shall be deemed to be his place of abode, and shall be registered as such in the books of the Company.

138. Service of Notices.—A notice may be served by the Company upon any Shareholder either personally or by sending through post in a prepaid letter addressed to such Shareholder at his registered address or place of abode, and any notice so served shall be deemed to be well served for all purposes, notwithstanding that the Shareholder to whom such notice is addressed by dead pulses and until his avecuators or administrators shall have given to the whom such notice is addressed be dead, unless and until his executors or administrators shall have given to the Directors or to the agent or secretary or agents or secretaries of the Company their own or some other address.

139. Notice to Joint-holders of Shares other than a Firm.—All notices directed to be given to Shareholders shall, with respect to any share to which persons are jointly entitled other than a firm, be given to whichever of such persons is named first in the register of Shareholders, and notice so given shall be sufficient notice to all the holders of tuch shares.

140. Date and Proof of Service.—Any notice if served by post shall be deemed to have been served on the day son which the letter containing the same would in ordinary course of post have been delivered at its address, and in proving such service it shall be sufficient to prove that the letter containing the notice was properly addressed and put into a Post Office or post box, and the entry in the Company's books of the leaving or sending by post of any notice at or to such address shall be sufficient evidence thereof, and no further evidence shall be necessary.

141. Non-resident Shareholder must register Address in Ceylon.—Every Shareholder residing out of Ceylon shall name and register in the books of the Company an address within Ceylon at which all notices shall be served non him and all notices served at such address shall be deemed to be well served. If he shall not have named and

upon him, and all notices served at such address shall be deemed to be well served. If he shall not have named and

registered such an address, he shall not be entitled to any notices.

ARBITRATION.

142. Directors may refer Disputes to Arbitration.—Whenever any question or other matter whatsoever arises in dispute between the Company and any other Company or person, the same may be referred by the Directors to arbitration.

EVIDENCE.

143. Evidence in action by Company against Shareholders.—On the trial or hearing of any action or suit brought or instituted by the Company against any Shareholder or his representatives to recover any debt or money claimed to be due to the Company in respect of his shares, it shall be sufficient to prove that the name of the defendant is or was when the claim arose on the register of Shareholders of the Company as a holder of the number of shares in respect of which such claim is made, and that the amount claimed is not entered as paid in the books of the Company, and it shall not be necessary to prove the registration of the Company, nor the appointment of the Directors who made any call, nor that a quorum of Directors was present at the Board at which any call was made, nor that the meeting at which any call was made was duly convened or constituted, nor any other matter whatsoever, but the proof of the matters aforesaid shall be conclusive evidence of the debt.

PROVISION RELATIVE TO WINDING UP OR DISSOLUTION OF THE COMPANY.

144. Purchase of Company's Property by Shareholders.—Any Shareholder, whether a Director or not, or whether alone or jointly with any other Shareholder or Director and any person not a Shareholder, may become the purchaser of the property of the Company or any part thereof in the event of a winding up or a dissolution, or at any other

time when a sale of the Company's property or effects or any part thereof shall be made by the Directors under the powers hereby or under the Ordinance conferred upon them.

Each tender must be accompanied by a deposit of onetenth of the amount of the bid as caution money.

The person whose tender is selected by the Government Agent for submission to the Governor-should any be so selected - will be required to deposit at once one-tenth of the purchase amount in cash; and should the tender be accepted by His Excellency the Governor, to furnish approved security for one-half of the whole purchase amount, or in cash for one-third of the whole purchase amount, within thirty days of the date of the receipt by him of the notification of the Governor's acceptance of

No title deeds will be accepted as security without a letter signed by the owner stating his willingness to hypothecate the same as security.

All title deeds tendered as security should be accompanied by a certificate obtained from the registrar of lands that the land to which they refer is unencumbered This certificate must be obtained at the cost of the party offering security.

After the completion of the securities the 10 per cent deposit referred to shall remain with the Government Agent, and shall be taken and applied in part payment of the last instalment, and in part of the eleventh instalment, so far as the said 10 per cent, deposit extends.

The Government Agent will expose the farms for sale

at the Kachcheri at 1 P.M. on June 8 next, in such a manner as may seem to him expedient.

The Government Agent reserves to himself the right (subject to approval of Government) to accept or reject any bid or any tender, and to consider the sealed tenders with the bids at the public auction.
