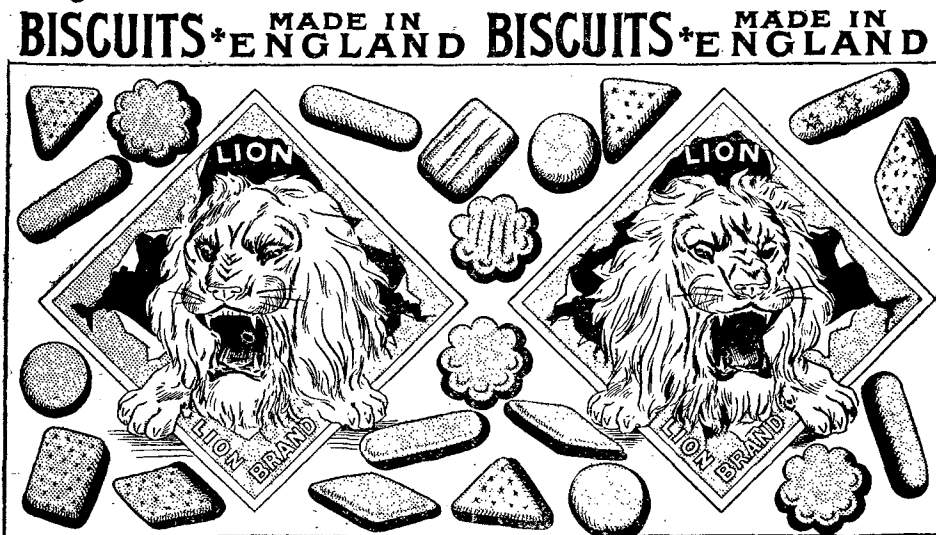

NOTICE is hereby given that an examination for candidates wishing to enter the Second Class of the Clerical Branch of the Public Service will take place on Monday, July 17, 1893.

2. Applications for admission to the examination by persons not now in the Public Service must be addressed to the Director of Public Instruction, must bear a stamp of Rs. 2.50, and must be in the form (Schedule A) attached to this notice. Forms are to be obtained at any Post Office, on application, or within four days' notice. A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth, showing him to be on the 1st July, 1893, between the ages of 18 and 21, and a certificate of good character, signed by a responsible person,* to the satisfaction of the Director of Public Instruction, must be attached to the form of application.

3. Clerks belonging to the First Class of the Public Service and those employed by Provincial and District Road Committees are eligible for examination irrespective of age, and without fee. Their applications (in the same form, Schedule A) for admission to the examination should be forwarded to the Director of Public Instruction through the Heads of their Departments.

4. Applications are to reach the Director of Public Instruction not later than noon of Friday, June 30; any application received after that hour, by whatever cause delayed, will be absolutely rejected.

5. The Director of Public Instruction will return to the candidate his application, approved or disapproved, as the case may be, after taking, if necessary, the orders of Government thereon. The approved application shall constitute the candidate's ticket of admission to the examination. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination at the station at which they present themselves, their forms of application, approved by the Director of Public Instruction. A candidate not producing such form, whatever may be the reason for his not so doing, will be refused admittance to the examination.

6. Examinations will be held at the stations and places and under the supervision of the officers specified in Schedule B. Heads of Departments are required to grant to officers of their Departments, whose applications to present themselves for examination have been returned to them approved by the Director of Public Instruction, leave to present themselves at the most conveniently situated station at which the examination is to be held.

7. The examination will be competitive for all candidates. The number of places assigned for competition shall be thirty.

8. The subjects for examination are those set out in Schedule C to this notice. The examination shall be held in two parts: the first part a qualifying examination in Handwriting, Spelling, and Arithmetic. Any candidate failing to obtain two-thirds of the marks allotted for Handwriting and half those allowed for Spelling and Arithmetic, shall be excluded from the remainder of the examination. The second part of the examination shall be in the remaining subjects in Schedule C. Should a candidate obtain less than one-fourth marks in any of the subjects other than Handwriting, Spelling, and Arithmetic, or, if he be a Sinhalese or Tamil, less than two-thirds marks in his native language, such marks shall not be counted in his favour.

9. Officers who have served continuously in the First Class of the Clerical Service since December 24, 1874, will be allowed to pass if they obtain one-third marks in two out of the three subjects, English, Arithmetic, and Native Language.

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :—

An Ordinance for the prevention of Accidents by Gunpowder and other Explosives.

| Preamble. | <p>WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Law relating to the prevention of accidents by gunpowder and other explosive substances, and providing for the safe storage of such gunpowder and other explosive substances : Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—</p> |
| Short title and commencement. | <p>1 This Ordinance may be cited as “The Explosives Ordinance, 1893,” and shall come into operation on the day of</p> |
| Repeal. | <p>2 From and after the date that this Ordinance comes into operation the Ordinance No. 12 of 1873, intituled “An Ordinance for the prevention of accidents by Gunpowder,” shall be repealed. Provided that such repeal shall not affect the past operation of, or any liability, penalty, forfeiture, or punishment under, the Ordinance hereby repealed, or any rules passed thereunder, or any investigation or legal proceeding in respect of any such liability, penalty, forfeiture, or punishment as aforesaid.</p> |
| Substances to which this Ordinance applies. | <p>3 This Ordinance shall apply to gunpowder and other explosives as defined by this section.</p> <p>For the purposes of this Ordinance the term “explosives” shall mean gunpowder, nitroglycerine, dynamite, gun cotton, blasting powders, fulminate of mercury or of other metals, coloured fires, and every other substance or mixture, whether similar to those above-mentioned or not, used or manufactured with a view to produce a practical effect by explosion or a pyrotechnic effect ; and shall include fog signals, fireworks, fuzes, rockets, percussion caps, detonators, cartridges, ammunition of all descriptions, and every adaptation or preparation of an explosive as above defined.</p> |
| Explosives exceeding 10 lb. to be kept only in public magazines, licensed stores, or in registered premises. | <p>4 Explosives shall not be kept at any place except in a public magazine or in a store lawfully licensed under this Ordinance for keeping explosives. Provided that this section shall not apply to the keeping of any explosives not exceeding ten pounds or to the keeping of any explosives not exceeding two hundred pounds in any premises registered under this Ordinance.</p> |

- (3) prescribe the maximum amount of explosives, not exceeding two tons, to be kept in stores, graduated according to their construction and situation, and their distances from the said buildings and works;
- (4) prescribe the number and description of explosives to be kept in the same store or registered premises;
- (5) prescribe where two or more explosives are allowed to be kept in the same store or registered premises the maximum amount of each such explosive to be kept therein;
- (6) prescribe restrictions and conditions subject to which more than one explosive may be kept in the same store or registered premises.

Provided that a regulation under this section shall not require the removal of any building lawfully in use at the date of the making of such regulation.

General rules
for stores.

7 In every store licensed under this Ordinance the following general rules shall be observed; that is to say:—

- (1) The regulations relating to stores, so far as they apply to such store, shall be duly observed;
- (2) There shall not be at the same time in the store an amount of explosives exceeding the amount and description specified in the license; and
- (3) The store shall be used only for the keeping of explosives and receptacles for, or tools or implements for work connected with, the keeping of such explosives; and
- (4) The interior of the store and the benches, shelves, and fittings therein shall be so constructed or so lined or covered as to prevent the exposure of any iron or steel, and the detaching of any grit, iron, steel, or similar substance in such manner as to come into contact with the explosives, and such interior, benches, shelves, and fittings shall, so far as is reasonably practicable, be kept free from grit and otherwise clean; and
- (5) The store shall have attached thereto a sufficient lightning conductor, unless it is made by excavation or is licensed for less than one thousand pounds of explosives; and
- (6) Before repairs are done to or in any part of a store, the store shall, so far as practicable, be cleaned by the removal of all explosives and the thorough washing out of the store; and after such cleaning, these rules shall cease to apply to the store until explosives are again taken there; and
- (7) Except after such cleaning, all tools and implements used in or in any repairs to the store shall be made only of wood, copper, or brass, or some soft metal or material, or shall be covered with some safe and suitable material; and
- (8) Due provision shall be made by the use of suitable working clothes without pockets, suitable shoes, searching, and otherwise, or by some such means, for preventing the introduction into the store of fire, lucifer matches, or any substance or article likely to cause explosion or fire, or any iron, steel, or grit; but this rule shall not prevent the introduction of an artificial light of such construction, position, or character as not to cause any danger of fire or explosion; and
- (9) No person shall smoke in any part of the store; and
- (10) A person under the age of sixteen years shall not be employed in or enter the store except in the presence and under the supervision of some grown-up person.

In the event of any breach (by any act or default) of the general rules in any store—

- (a) All or any part of the explosives in respect to which, or being in the store when the offence was committed, may be forfeited; and

- (b) The licensee shall be guilty of an offence, and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding one hundred rupees, and in addition (in the case of a second offence) one hundred rupees for every day during which such breach continues.

Non-transferability, renewal, and forms of store licenses.

8 A store license shall be valid only for the person named in it, and shall annually, unless the circumstances have so changed that the grant of a new license would not be authorised by this Ordinance—, on application by post or otherwise, and payment of such fee, not exceeding fifty cents, as may be from time to time fixed by the Governor, be renewed by the government agent by endorsement or otherwise for that year, and unless so renewed shall expire.

Store licenses shall be in the form from time to time directed by the Governor.

Special rules for regulation of workmen in stores.

9 Every licensee may, with the sanction of the Governor, make, and when made may, with the like sanction, repeal, alter, or add to special rules for the regulation of the persons managing or employed in or about such store, with a view to secure the observance of this Ordinance therein, and the safety and proper discipline of the said persons and the safety of the public.

The breach of any special rule made in pursuance of this section shall be an offence, and any person convicted thereof shall be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty rupees.

Registration of premises with the government agent.

10 A person desirous of registering with the government agent of the province in which any premises are situated such premises for the keeping of explosives shall register his name and calling, and the said premises (in this Ordinance referred to as his registered premises) in such manner and on payment of such fee not exceeding fifty cents as may be directed.

Such registration shall be valid only for the person registered, and shall be annually renewed by sending by post or otherwise notice of such renewal to the government agent, together with such fee not exceeding fifty cents, as may be fixed by the Governor.

General rules for registered premises.

11 The following general rules shall be observed with respect to registered premises :—

- (1) The regulations relating to registered premises, so far as they apply to such premises, shall be duly observed ;
- (2) There shall not be at the same time in any registered premises an amount of explosives exceeding the amount and description prescribed in the regulations ;
- (3) The explosives shall be kept in a house or building or in a fire-proof safe, such safe, if not within a house or building, to be at a safe distance from any highway, street, public thoroughfare, or public place ; and
- (4) The amount of explosives on the same registered premises shall not—
 - (a) if it is kept in a substantially constructed building exclusively appropriated for the purpose and detached from a dwelling-house, or in a fire-proof safe outside a dwelling-house and detached therefrom, and at a safe distance from any highway, street, public thoroughfare, or public place, exceed two hundred pounds ; and
 - (b) if it is kept inside a dwelling-house, or in any building other than as last aforesaid, exceed fifty pounds, unless it is kept in a fire-proof safe within such house or building, in which case the amount shall not exceed one hundred pounds ; and
- (5) An article or substance of an explosive or highly inflammable nature shall not be kept in a fire-proof safe with any other description of explosives

- or with gunpowder, and in every case shall be kept at a safe distance from the other explosive or gunpowder or the safe containing the same ; and
- (6) Neither the building exclusively appropriated for the purpose of keeping explosives nor the fire-proof safe shall have any exposed iron or steel in the interior thereof ; and
- (7) All explosives exceeding one pound in amount shall be kept in a substantial case, bag, canister, or other receptacle made and closed so as to prevent the explosive from escaping. Provided that where such explosive consists of safety cartridges made with gunpowder for the minimum amount limited by this sub-section shall be substituted an amount not more than five times the minimum amount mentioned in this sub-section.

In the event of any breach (by any act or default) of such general rules in any registered premises—

- (a) all or any part of the explosives in respect to which, or being in any house, building, place, safe, or receptacle in respect to which the offence was committed, may be forfeited ; and
- (b) The person registered shall be guilty of an offence, and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding one rupee for every pound of explosives in respect of which, or being on the premises in which the offence was committed.

Restriction of sale of explosives in highways.

12 Explosives shall not be hawked, sold, or exposed for sale upon any highway, street, public thoroughfare, or public place.

If any explosives are hawked, sold, or exposed for sale in contravention of this section—

- (1) the person hawking, selling, or exposing for sale the same shall be guilty of an offence, and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding twenty rupees ; and
- (2) all or any part of the explosives which are so hawked or exposed for sale, or are found in the possession of any person convicted under this section, may be forfeited.

Penalty for sale of explosives to children.

13 Explosives shall not be sold to any child apparently under the age of thirteen years ; and any person selling explosives in contravention of this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty rupees.

Public magazines may be erected or set apart.

14 The Governor may, with the advice of the Executive Council, erect or set apart public magazines for the deposit of explosives in any province, district, or part of the Colony.

Governor may make regulations and prescribe fees in respect of public magazines.

15 The Governor may, with the advice of the Executive Council, make regulations prescribing the rent and fees to be paid for the use of any public magazine, and providing for the proper management thereof, the storage therein, and removal therefrom of explosives, and all other matters relating thereto. And the said regulations shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall thereupon become as legal, valid, and effectual as if the same had been inserted herein. Regulations already made under section 5 of the Ordinance No. 12 of 1873 shall continue to be in force until superseded by regulations made under this Ordinance.

Explosives may be deposited in public magazines.

16 Any person may deposit explosives in a public magazine subject to the regulations herein authorised to be made in respect of such magazine.

Permit to remove explosives.

17 Any person desiring to remove explosives exceeding ten pounds from any place to another place in this Colony, whether by land or by water, shall apply to the government agent of the province whence it is intended to remove such explosives, stating the places from and to which the explosives are to be removed, the quantity and description of packages, and the time of intended removal ; and the government agent, if the application is made on any lawful day

between the hours of 10 A.M. and 5 P.M., shall grant his permit in the form given in schedule A hereto for such removal. Provided that where it is intended to move such explosives from a place in one province to a place in another province, it shall be necessary to obtain a permit from the government agent of each province; and any person removing any explosives without such permit or permits, or contrary to the terms of such permit or permits, shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding two hundred rupees, and the explosives shall be seized and forfeited; and it shall be lawful for any police magistrate or inspector of police to direct that any explosives found in course of removal contrary to the provisions of this section shall be taken at the risk and expense of the owner to a public magazine, there to be kept at the risk and expense of the owner pending adjudication.

Penalty.
Seizure and
forfeiture.

Explosives not
to be sold
without a license.

18 It shall not be lawful for any person to sell explosives in this Colony unless such person shall have previously obtained a license from the government agent of the province within which such person sells explosives. Every such license shall be written or printed on a stamp of five rupees, and shall be substantially in the form in the schedule to this Ordinance annexed. Provided that it shall be lawful for any government agent to refuse to issue a license if he shall consider that a sufficient number of licenses have been issued in the neighbourhood, that the applicant is not a fit person, or that he has not provided registered premises for the keeping of explosives; and the government agent may at any time recall and cancel such license should he see fit to do so.

Notice of license
to be affixed.

19 The licensee of any store and the owner or occupier of any registered premises for the sale or storage of explosives shall affix to such premises in some conspicuous place a notice to the effect that explosives are kept or stored in such store or premises.

Exemption of
explosives the
property of
the Crown.

20 This Ordinance shall not apply to the keeping, making up, or conveyance of any explosives under the control of the military, the navy, or the volunteers, or any department of Government, or otherwise held for the service of the Crown, or of the Government, or for the use of Her Majesty's army, navy, or volunteers.

Licensing by
government
agent of
firework
factories.

21 Any person may apply in writing for a firework factory license to the government agent of the province in which such factory is situated, stating his name, address, and calling, and the proposed site and construction of the factory, and the amount and description of explosives he proposes to have therein and in any building therein; and the government agent shall, as soon as practicable, if the proposed site, construction of the factory, and amount of explosives are in accordance with the regulations regulating firework factories, grant to the applicant, on payment of such fee not exceeding , as may be fixed by the Governor, the license applied for.

The powers of this Ordinance of making regulations with respect to stores and of prescribing general rules with respect to stores shall extend to making regulations and prescribing general rules with respect to firework factories and the buildings thereon; and any breach (by any act or default) of any such general rule shall involve the same penalties and forfeitures as a breach of a general rule relating to stores.

A firework factory license shall be valid only for the person named in it, and the provisions of this Ordinance with respect to the renewal, expiration, and form of store licenses and fees for such renewal, and to special rules for the regulation of persons managing or employed in or about stores, shall apply in like manner as if they were herein enacted and in terms made applicable to firework factory licenses and firework factories respectively.

Premises, &c.,
may be searched
for explosives.

22 It shall be lawful for any inspector of police or other officer of police above the rank of inspector at all times by day or night to enter, inspect, and examine any store, firework factory, or premises registered under this Ordinance,

and to search any premises, carriage, or vessel in which explosives are suspected to be kept or carried contrary to this Ordinance; and all explosives found upon such inspection or search to be so kept or carried shall be immediately seized by the officer, and removed with all convenient speed to a place of safety, and stored there at owner's risk and expense pending adjudication.

Penalties.

23 From and after the coming into operation of this Ordinance any person who shall, contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance—

- (a) keep or use a store as a store for explosives without having obtained a license therefor;
- (b) keep or have in his possession a larger quantity of explosives than ten pounds, except in premises registered with the government agent of the province or in a licensed store or firework factory;
- (c) sell explosives without having obtained a license therefor;
- (d) keep or use any premises as a firework factory without having obtained a license therefor—

shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of five hundred rupees.

Police court to have jurisdiction.

24 Every offence under this Ordinance shall be cognizable and bailable, and may be inquired into, tried, and determined by the police court of the district in which the offence was committed wholly or in part, and such court shall have jurisdiction to award the maximum punishment or penalty prescribed therefor, and to declare and adjudge any gunpowder or thing liable to forfeiture under this Ordinance forfeited, and to condemn the same, whatever may be the amount or value thereof, anything in the Criminal Procedure Code to the contrary notwithstanding.

Any police court imposing a fine under this Ordinance may award to an informer any portion not exceeding a moiety thereof which may be actually recovered.

Ceylon Government Railways.

CONVEYANCE OF COOLIES BY RAILWAY AT REDUCED RATES.

WHEREAS it has been found that persons other than *boná fide* coolies are conveyed by railway at the reduced rate set forth in paragraph 59 of the General Rules framed under section 5 of the Railway Ordinance of 1885, by means of irregular certificates, notice is hereby given that on and after July 1, 1893, for the purpose of obtaining the reduced rate, the following definitions and rules must be strictly observed :-

Interpretation Clauses.

"Cooly" means every labourer and kangany employed on an estate in other than domestic labour.

"Estate" means any land in which labourers are employed, and of which 10 acres or more are actually cultivated.

"Work" means the construction or maintenance of roads.

The reduced fare will only be granted to coolies who produce certificates on forms issued by the Railway, which have been filed up in accordance with the instructions on the form, and signed by the Manager or the Superintendent of the estate or work on which they have been or are about to be employed.

Government forms of certificates may be obtained free of charge on an application in writing signed by a person entitled to issue certificates, addressed to the General Manager.

ABSTRACT OF SEASON REPORTS FOR MAY, 1893.

WESTERN PROVINCE.

Paddy.—Yala plants are thriving throughout district, except in some places where they have been damaged by recent heavy rains.

KALUTARÀ DISTRICT.

Paddy.—The sowing for the yala is nearly over. The recent floods have not damaged the crops to any appreciable extent. On the whole the prospects of the ensuing harvest are fair.

NEGOMBO DISTRICT.

Paddy.—The yala plants are doing well, except in places where excessive rains have damaged them.

CENTRAL PROVINCE.

KANDY DISTRICT.

Paddy.—Kandy District, Udunuwara, Yatinuwara, Pata Héwáheta, and Udapalata : being sown and transplanted; prospects good. Harispattu : few fields only being sown owing to drought; prospects of these good. Uda Dumbara : maha, fair crop, still being reaped; yala fields in blossom; prospects good. Pata Dumbara : maha, poor crop; yala being sown.

Dry Grain.—Kandy District, Udunuwara, Yatinuwara, Pata Héwáheta, and Udapalata : kurakkan being sown and transplanted; prospects good. Harispattu : kurakkan prospects good. Uda Dumbara : kurakkan prospects good. Pata Dumbara : kurakkan, few fields sown owing to drought.

MÁTALÉ DISTRICT.

Paddy and Dry Grain.—Rainfall very poor. No cultivation whatever in Wagapanaha Pallesiya pattu, Inamaluwa kóralé, and Asgiri kóralé. Cultivation under streams thriving.

NUWARA ELIYA DISTRICT.

Paddy and Dry Grain.—Kotmalé : no work on paddy fields; chenas were cleared for kurakkan. Uda Héwáheta and Walapané : reaping of maha harvest commenced—fair crops; no work on chenas.

NORTHERN PROVINCE.

JAFFNA DISTRICT.

Paddy and Dry Grain.—Threshing of paddy continued in Karachchi and Punakari divisions. Dry grains payeru, ellu, and kurakkan reaped, and crops reported good. Cutting and curing of tobacco continued.

Weather.—Good showers of rain accompanied by thunder and lightning on the 10th, 12th, 13th, and 21st in the Jaffna, Valikamam East, Valikalām West, Vadamarachchi East, Tenamarachchi, Pachchilapali, and Punakari divisions. The wind blew strong from the south-west during the month.

MANNAR DISTRICT.

Paddy and Dry Grain.—Sirupokam rain failed; so far no cultivation possible anywhere. Dry grain crops also failed; relief works in operation.

MULLAITTÍVU DISTRICT.

Paddy and Dry Grain.—Tobacco cultivation proceeding in maritime and Karunaval pattus. There is scarcity in Karunaval pattu and Punakari and Tunukkai. Idapokam commenced in maritime pattus. Crop under Periyakulam in blossom.

Weather.—Failure of May rains except in Mulliavalai.

Health.—Fever and dysentery prevail to some extent.

VAVUNIYA DISTRICT.

Paddy and Dry Grain.—Failure of May rains; no sowing in the district; crop under restored tanks maturing; gingelly crop failed; commencement of relief works.

SOUTHERN PROVINCE.

GALLE DISTRICT.

Paddy.—The recent rains have damaged the growing crop of low-lying fields of Bentota-Walallawiti kóralé, Talpé pattu, Gaggaboda pattu, and Hinidum pattu; but the fields of Four Gravets and Wellaboda pattu, as also all the higher lands, are in excellent condition. The rains have now ceased, and on the whole a fair crop may be looked for.

HAMBANTOTA DISTRICT.

Paddy.—Young crop throughout district very extensive and promising. Impetus given to paddy cultivation by extension of Walawé irrigation works.

MÁTARA DISTRICT.

Paddy and Dry Grain.—Moruwak kóralé : paddy and fine grain good. Gaggaboda pattu : expected rain will damage paddy; fine grain good. Wellaboda pattu : rain likely to damage paddy; fine grain good. Four Gravets : expected rain will damage paddy. Weligama kóralé : paddy partly damaged by rain. Kandaboda pattu : paddy and fine grain little damaged by rain.

EASTERN PROVINCE.

BATTICALOA DISTRICT.

Paddy and Dry Grain.—Early munmari crops being threshed; gross yield on 30,000 acres sown = 235,000 bushels. Later munmari crops being reaped; 14,000 acres being sown; crop good, about eight-fold. Pinmari sowing in progress on about 8,000 acres.

Prices.—Paddy, Re. 1.25 per bushel; Indian corn and fine grain, Re. 1 per bushel.

TRINCOMALEE DISTRICT.

Few small tracts in Koddipattu abandoned for want of water; will now be included with other pinmari lands, as Allai tank has since sufficiently filled. Sowing in Tampalakam will be complete in about a fortnight; crops look promising.

NORTH-WESTERN PROVINCE.

KURUNĠĠALA DISTRICT.

Paddy and Dry Grain.—Wanni: last month's cultivation thriving; tanks low; dry grain crops now safe from failure; food scarce. Dambadeniya: sufficient rain for paddy cultivation; weather favourable for chena cultivation; seed paddy scarce. Dewameddi: crops stunted; probable poor return; rain insufficient. Hiriyala: young paddy and dry grain crops generally good; rain insufficient. Wendawili: crops looking well; 500 acres paddy and 50 acres chena cultivated this month. Katugampola: crops coming on well; less rain than in April.

CHILAW DISTRICT.

Paddy and Dry Grain.—Fields sown for yala in Central and Southern Divisions; about 635 bushels of paddy and 129 bushels of fine grain sown. In Northern Division fields in a few villages only sown, as there is not sufficient water in the tanks. In Southern Division the recent heavy rains have been unfavourable in many places to growth in cultivated fields. Young crop in Central Division thriving well; prospects good.

PUTTALAM DISTRICT.

Paddy.—In the Puttalam paddy cultivation has commenced only in the Akkaraipattu division; it has not commenced in other divisions for want of rain. In the Demala hatpattu ploughing for yala paddy crop has commenced, and the prospects are fair.

Dry Grain.—No fine grain in Puttalam paddy. In Demala hatpattu meneri crop middling.

NORTH-CENTRAL PROVINCE.

Paddy and Dry Grain.—Fields cultivated for the meda harvest reaped, and in some villages blossoming; fields for yala harvest are being sown. Very little gingelly and meneri cultivation, as chenas were restricted. A small proportion of the tanks have a sufficiency of water; the cultivation under the rest is likely to fail.

Weather.—A few slight showers. Rainfall at Anurādhapura, 49 inch. Want of rain badly felt.

Food.—Slight scarcity reported from NuwaraĠampalata.

Health.—Measles and sore-eyes in some villages.

PROVINCE OF UVA.

Paddy.—Early maha crops being reaped; results good; prospects of young crop generally good. No scarcity of water reported. Damage to crops from blight ("rata-roĠaya") reported from Yatikinda, and from worms; rains from Viyaluwa.

Dry Grain.—Fine grain (kollu) in Udukinda and Yatikinda promising well.

PROVINCE OF SABARAGAMUWA.

RATNAPURA DISTRICT.

Paddy and Dry Grain.—Yala sowing completed; prospects reported unfavourable in Kuruwiti and Kukulu koralés; favourable in other korales. Abundance of rain favourable for chena cultivation throughout district.

KĠGALLA DISTRICT.

Paddy.—Ploughing and sowing for yala still in progress throughout the district; paddy already sown in Beligal koralé, Three korales, and Lower Bulatgama, thriving well.

Dry Grain.—Clearing and sowing chenas in progress; kurakkan, mun, and gingelly already sown in Beligal koralé thriving well; kurakkan in Three korales and Lower Bulatgama also thriving well.

Health.—Fever is still prevalent throughout the district, especially in Beligal, Galboda, and Kinigoda koralés, where dysentery also prevails.

THE following telegram received from the Government of Bombay is published for general information:—

June 10.—British Consul at Alexandria telegraphs in consequence of the outbreak of cholera at Mecca, quarantine regulations applicable to Arabian ports during return of pilgrimage imposed, and all Coast Hedjaz considered cholera infected ends.
