Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on September 17, 1910, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated September 13, 1910.

Present :—The Hon. Mr. R. B. Hellings, Chairman; Mr. E. Beven; Mr. W. D. Gibbon; Dr. G. P. Schokman; Mr. W. C. Price; Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardana; Mr. R. W. Jonklaas; and Mr. V. M. Saravanamuttu.

The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on August 20 having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—

- (a) Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1909 to August 31, 1910, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue and Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting), and (No. 2) Water Rate Accounts.
- (b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's Report for August.
- (d) Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of August.
- (e) The Reservoir Reading for August.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, and the Health Officer's Report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on Laundries, Bakeries, Dairies, Standpipes, and House Service taps inspected during August.

4. Correspondence:—

(1) Letter No. 15 of August 23, 1910, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, intimating that the Government Agent, Central Province, has been instructed to take order for the acquisition of a strip of land, a chain in width, on each side of the Hilpankandura, for the preservation from pollution of the water supply.—Read.

(2) Letter of August 30, from the Resident Engineer, Colombo Gas & Water Co., intimating that the agreement to light the streets with metallic filament lamps has expired, and inquiring whether the Council would renew the agreement for a further period.

Proposed by Mr. Jonklaas, seconded by Mr. Beven, that the agreement be renewed for the whole of the remaining period of the lighting contract, if better terms can be obtained.—Carried.

5. Papers *re* the Municipal Council School. To consider the Director of Public Instruction's suggestions as regards the salary and appointment of teachers.

Proposed by Mr. Jonklaas, seconded by Mr. Wijegoonewardana, that the Director of Public Instruction's proposals as to salaries be adopted, and that the teachers be appointed by the Director of Public Instruction.—Carried.

6. Proposed amendments to by-laws regulating the Water Supply. On motion by Mr. Beven the Council went into Committee. The amendments were then considered one by one and passed.

The Council resumed, and it was resolved that the amendments be adopted and forwarded to Government for confirmation.

7. Recommendations of Standing Committees:—

Finance and Assessment.

- (1) That the salary of the Head Overseer be charged to cost of establishment and that the post be made pensionable.
- (2) That the Municipal Council peons be each allowed two white drill coats annually.
- (3) That a wheeled stretcher be obtained, at a cost not exceeding Rs. 300, to remove persons meeting with serious accidents to hospital.
- (4) That the following assessments be sanctioned:—(i.) No. 5b, Gregory road, Rs. 600; (ii.) No. 799, Peradeniya road, Rs. 800; (iii.) No. 782, Peradeniya road, Rs. 200; (iv.) No. 58, Deyannewela road, Rs. 72; (v.) No. 1037, Peradeniya road, Rs. 140; (vi.) No. 30a, Katukelle Lake road, Rs. 90; (vii.) No. 6, Lady Torrington's road, Rs. 240; (viii.) No. 16b, Katukelle Lake road, Rs. 96; (ix.) No. 19a, Lady McCarthy's road, Rs. 480; (x.) No. 64a, Deyannewela, Rs. 20; (xi.) No. 17a, Matale road, Rs. 24; (xii.) No. 17b, Matale road, Rs. 24; (xiii.) No. 17c, Matale road, Rs. 24; (xiv.) No. 3a, Mavilmade, Rs. 20; (xv.) No. 40, Madawela road, Rs. 48; (xvi.) Madawela road, Rs. 48; (xvii.) No. 62, Madawela road, Rs. 60; (xviii.) No. 65, Madawela road, Rs. 42.

Municipal Works.

- (5) That three more lights be sanctioned for Halloluwa road and five for Peradeniya road.
- (6) That the estimate of Rs. 342.56 for guard rails for Halloluwa road be sanctioned.
- (7) That house service pipes be allowed to No. 247, Trincomalee street, and 45, Peradeniya road.

Resolved—That the recommendations be adopted.

8. Mr. Beven, with the leave of the Council, moved that this Council desires to place on record its appreciation of the services of Hon. Mr. R. B. Hellings, as Chairman. He was sure he was voicing the sentiments of all the Members when he said that he regretted the connection of Mr. Hellings with the Council was about to cease.

The retiring Chairman had presided over their meetings with tact and ability. Though his tenure of office was short he had gone with a whole hearted interest into everything that was connected with the town. The speaker thought it was no idle hope to indulge in to expect him back as their permanent Chairman in the near future.

Mr. Wijegoonewardana had much pleasure in seconding the motion, which was carried unanimously. Mr. Hellings briefly thanked Mr. Beven and the other Members for their kind appreciation of his services to the Council.

Health Officer's Report for August, 1910.

Scavenging.—The scavenging of the town, both day and night, was satisfactorily performed, notwithstanding the usual traffic and the large number of people who daily flocked into the town during the Perahera season.

Drainage.—The drains were kept clean and well flushed by the rain which fell during the month.

Water Supply.—Good, but not sufficient.

Alleys.—These were regularly limewashed and kept in a sanitary state as possible.

Laundries.—Generally well kept.

Dairies.—well kept.

Bakeries.—Generally well kept.

Eating-houses.—All fairly well kept.

Public Market.—Clean and well kept.

Exposing Shed and Slaughter-houses.—Well kept.

Night Soil Depot.—Well kept.

Public Latrines.—Clean and well kept.

Cooly Lines.—All fairly well kept.

Boutiques.—These were regularly inspected and found well kept. The food stuffs, &c., exposed for sale, were found to be good and wholesome.

Food Supply.—Good and ample. 511 cattle, 157 buffaloes, 113 sheep, and 287 goats were slaughtered during the month. 17 heads of cattle, 3 buffaloes, 2 sheep, and 7 goats were rejected. The following organs were condemned and buried:—1 liver and 3 lungs of cattle; 3 livers of buffaloes; 2 livers of sheep; 1 liver, 23 lungs, and 1 spleen of goats.

Public Health.—The health of the town was good during the month under review: 5 cases of chickenpox and 3 cases of enteric were reported. All necessary precautions were taken to prevent a spread of these diseases.

Harry Creasy. Improvements in and relating to India rubber and like stamps."

Abstract.—The invention relates to a method of making India rubber stamps by photographic reproduction using a gelatine film containing a bromide salt, the film being spread on glass and exposed under a halftone negative produced by a ruled screen.

The improvements introduced are: (a) spreading the gelatine on paper before exposure and afterwards transferring it to the glass; (b) hardening the gelatine with formaldehyde or chrome alum; (c) employment of a pigment mixed with the gelatine; (d) covering the surface with a layer of a waterproof material.
