GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

THE following rules and orders made by the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council under Ordinance No. 14 of 1873, entitled "An Ordinance relating to the Annual Pilgrimage to agama," for the conduct of the Kataragama pilgrimage and festival, are re-published for general Kataragama, information.

Rules.

- 1. For sanitary reasons the duration of the Kataragama festival and of the stay of pilgrims at Kataragama shall be, and it is hereby limited henceforward to four days, one (being the third before full moon day) for arrival, two (being the day of the full moon and the previous day) for worship, and the fourth (being that immediately following full moon day) for departure from Kataragama. Pilgrims arriving before the day first named, or staying beyond the period here prescribed, shall be guilty of an offence. The route granted by the Police authorities to the leaders of the bands shall distinctly specify the above-named periods.
- 3. It shall be lawful for the Police authorities or any Police Magistrate at any place on the line of march to prohibit from proceeding all persons who, by reason of disease, infirmity, weakness, advanced age, youth, want of supplies, or other sufficient cause, are considered unfit to undertake the journey, or who appear likely to fall ill and endanger the health of others; and to require such persons to find security to ensure their obedience to the orders so given. In default of such security being found, it shall be lawful for the said Police authorities or Police Magistrate to detain such persons in custody for a period not exceeding three days

4. In the event of cholera or other serious epidemic disease prevailing in Ceylon or Southern India about the period of the festival, it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive

Council, to prohibit all pilgrims from proceeding to the festival at Kataragama for that year.

5. In the event of an epidemic breaking out at Kataragama during the festival, it shall be lawful for the officers appointed to enforce the observance of orders, to declare the festival at an end, and to direct pilgrims at once to leave the village and proceed to their homes, and to prescribe the roads they have to travel.

- The officers appointed to enforce the observance of orders shall have power on the line of march to and from Kataragama, and at Kataragama-
 - (a) To appoint particular places to be exclusively used by the pilgrims for washing and bathing, for drawing water and drinking, and for natural offices;

(b) To appoint places for the occupation of each class of pilgrims;

(c) To prescribe routes for the journey of any body of pilgrims;

(d) To regulate the distribution of all food given to pilgrims;

(e) To fix separate places of abode for pilgrims who fall ill, to prohibit communication with them, and to detain them if unfit to travel.

Any person disobeying an order given by the appointed officers shall be guilty of an offence.

The Chief Officer of Police shall have power to require persons making the pilgrimage to join the main body of pilgrims, and pilgrims refusing or neglecting to join the main body after being so required shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

Any pilgrim committing a nuisance while on the march, within 100 yards of the l ne of march, or while halting, at any place other than that assigned for the purpose by the Police, or omitting to cover the

deposit with earth or sand, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

The Police are empowered and required to seize and destroy all food condemned as unwholesome on the march or in camp by the Medical Officer, or, if there be none, by the Chief Officer of Police, and any person resisting or obstructing the Police in the discharge of this or of any other duty prescribed by these rules shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

10. Any pilgrim tethering or keeping cattle in any place other than that assigned by the Police shall

be deemed guilty of an offence.

- 11. Any person selling meat in camp in any other place than that assigned for the purpose by the officer in charge of the camp, and any person selling food condemned as unwholesome by the Medical Officer, or in his absence by the Chief Officer of Police, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.
- 12. Any pilgrim who shall, during the occupation of the camp, use any other place for offices of nature than that provided for the purpose by Government, or failing to cover the deposit with earth or sand, and any person who shall during the same period bathe in or enter the river above the spot appointed by the officer in charge of the camp, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

13. Any person gambling, or being found drunk and disorderly in the camp, or in or about the

adjacent jungle, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

14. Any person suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and not reporting the same to the Medical Officer, or in his absence to the Chief Officer of Police, and any person abetting or assisting in the concealment of such disease, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

15. All pilgrims shall take up the quarters assigned to them by the Chief Officer of Police at the halting places and in the camp, and any pilgrim declining or neglecting to do so shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

WHEREAS by the Ordinance No. 14 of 1873, intituled "An Ordinance relating to the Annual Pilgrimage to Kataragama," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time, by notification in the Government Gazette, to make orders for any of the following purposes, and to appoint officers to enforce the observance of such orders, viz.:—

1. To restrict the number of persons who shall be allowed to proceed in such pilgrimage from the different parts of this Island, and the period of their stay at Kataragama.

2. To regulate the collection of people at the different starting and halting-places, and their march to

and from Kataragama.

3. To impose such conditions and restrictions as may be necessary to promote cleanliness, and to check the breaking out and spread of infectious diseases.

The following orders made by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under the Ordinance aforesaid, are published for general information:—

1. The number of pilgrims for the pilgrimage of the year 1893 is restricted to 150, viz., 25 pilgrims for the Colombo band, 25 for the Kandy band, 25 for the Galle band, 25 for the Kurunégala band, 25 for the

Batticaloa band, and 25 for the Badulla band.

2. No person shall take part in the pilgrimage of the year 1893 without having first obtained a ticket from the Government Agent of the Western Province for the Colombo hand, or from the Government Agent of the Southern Province for the Galle band, or from the Government Agent of the Southern Province for the Galle band, or from the Government Agent of the Kurunggala band, or from the Government Agent of the Eastern Province for the Batticaloa band, or from the Government Agent for the Province of Uva for the Badulla band.

3. Every pilgrim shall show his ticket when required to do so by any officer of police, or by any

officer appointed to enforce the observance of orders under the Ordinance aforesaid.

June 15.—British Consul at Alexandria telegraphs quarantine regulations for return pilgrimage imposed in Egypt on arrivals from all ports of Hidjaz and Yemen as far as Babelmandeb. Vessels without pilgrims or analogous crowds leaving these ports with clean Bills of Health before June 24 next will have ordinary cholera quarantine, but after 24th quarantine against return pilgrimage passengers embarking at Aden require certificates of fifteen days' stay there before embarkation. Egypt has imposed quarantine on arrivals from Bussorah, Fao, and Muhamrah.

By His Excellency Sir EDWARD NOEL WALKER, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

E. NOEL WALKER.

WHEREAS by "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," it is amongst other things enacted that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof for each of the Circuits into which the Island is by the said Ordinance divided for the purposes of the administration of justice, for the hearing, trying, and determining of all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence, or alleged crime or offence:

"For the Northern Circuit, twice at least at Jaffna and such other places in such Circuit as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint: such Sessions commencing at Jaffna in the month of February and the month of July in every year:"

And whereas it appears to Us expedient and Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court should, on the days hereinafter mentioned, be holden at Batticaloa and at Trincomalee, places within the said Northern Circuit in the said Ordinance mentioned:

Now know Ye that We, the said Lieutenant-Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do hereby direct and appoint that Sessions of the Supreme Court, in its criminal jurisdiction, shall be holden at Batticaloa on or about Monday, the Seventeenth, and at Trincomalee on or about Thursday, the Twentieth day of July, 1893.

Given at Kandy, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Eighteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-three.

"For the Midland Circuit, three times at least at Kandy and such other places in such Circuit as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint: such Sessions commencing at Kandy on March 10, on August 1, and on December 1 in every year:"

And whereas by the said Ordinance it is further provided that it shall be competent for the Governor, for sufficient reasons to him appearing, to order, after previous consultation with the Judges, other Sessions to be holden at the places in the said Ordinance mentioned, or at any other place in any of the said Circuits, or to alter the dates therein mentioned and to fix any other date for the commencement of the Sessions at any place:

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to alter as hereinafter the date fixed for holding the Second Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court at Kandy, viz., the 1st August:

Now know Ye that We, the said Lieutenant-Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do hereby direct and appoint that the Sessions of the Supreme Court, appointed by the said Ordinance to be holden at Kandy on August 1, shall, instead of that date, be holden this year at Kandy on Monday, the Seventeenth day of July, 1893.

WHEREAS by section 6 of "The Medical Wants Ordinance, 1880," it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, by Proclamation in the Gazette, group together estates into districts, and may in the same and in the like manner from time to time amend the grouping of any district or districts:

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 22nd day of October, 1891, the estates appearing in the schedule thereto were, as from and after the date therein mentioned, grouped together for the

purposes of the said Ordinance into the districts in the said schedule set forth:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the grouping of the Avisawella District as in the said schedule set forth, and to include within the said district, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, the

estates appearing in the schedule hereto:

Now know Ye that We, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, as from and after the 1st day of July, 1893, amend the grouping of the Avisáwélla District as in the said schedule to the Proclamation dated the 22nd day of October, 1891, aforesaid set forth, by including within the said district, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, the estates appearing in the schedule hereto.

And whereas the Legislative Council at a public session thereof held on the 30th day of November, 1892, by a resolution established a toll in respect of the Véyangoda-Ruwanwella road on the Véyangoda side of the Ruwanwella bridge, and within a mile of the said bridge, as from and after the 1st day of July, 1893:

And whereas it is expedient to appoint the rates at which the said toll so established in respect

DRAFT ORDINANCES.

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

An Ordinance for the prevention of Accidents by Gunpowder and other Explosives.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Law relating to the prevention of accidents by gunpowder and other explosive substances, and providing for the safe storage of such gunpowder and other explosive substances: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title and commencement.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Explosives Ordinance, 1893," and shall come into operation on the day of

Repeal.

2 From and after the date that this Ordinance comes into operation the Ordinance No. 12 of 1873, intituled "An Ordinance for the prevention of accidents by Gunpowder," shall be repealed. Provided that such repeal shall not affect the past operation of, or any liability, penalty, forfeiture, or punishment under, the Ordinance hereby repealed, or any rules passed thereunder, or any investigation or legal proceeding in respect of any such liability, penalty, forfeiture, or punishment as aforesaid.

Substances to which this Ordinance applies. 3 This Ordinance shall apply to gunpowder and other explosives as defined by this section.

For the purposes of this Ordinance the term "explosives" shall mean gunpowder, nitroglycerine, dynamite, gun cotton, blasting powders, fulminate of mercury or of other metals, coloured fires, and every other substance or mixture, whether similar to those above-mentioned or not, used or manufactured with a view to produce a practical effect by explosion or a pyrotechnic effect; and shall include fog signals, fireworks, fuzes, rockets, percussion caps, detonators, cartridges, ammunition of all descriptions, and every adaptation or preparation of an explosive as above defined.

- 4 Explosives shall not be kept at any place except in a public magazine or in a store lawfully licensed under this Ordinance for keeping explosives. Provided that this section shall not apply to the keeping of any explosives not exceeding ten pounds or to the keeping of any explosives not exceeding two hundred pounds in any premises registered under this Ordinance.
- 5 Any person may apply in writing for a license for a store to the government agent of the province within which such store is situated, stating his name, address, and calling, the proposed site and construction of the store, and the amount of gunpowder or other explosive he proposes to store therein; and the government agent shall, as soon as practicable, if the proposed site, construction of the store, and amount and description of the explosives are in accordance with the regulations made by the Governor in manner hereinafter mentioned, grant to the applicant on payment of such fee, not exceeding two rupees and fifty cents as may be fixed by the

6 The Governor may from time to time, with the advice of the Executive Council, make regulations to—

- (1) regulate the construction and materials and fittings of stores; and
- (2) prescribe the buildings and works from which stores are to be separated, and the distances by which they are to be separated: and

Regulations prescribing situation and construction of stores to be made by the Governor. with the advice of the Executive Council.

- (3) prescribe the maximum amount of explosives, not exceeding two tons, to be kept in stores, graduated according to their construction and situation, and their distances from the said buildings and works;
- (4) prescribe the number and description of explosives to be kept in the same store or registered premises;
- (5) prescribe where two or more explosives are allowed to be kept in the same store or registered premises the maximum amount of each such explosive to be kept therein;
- (6) prescribe restrictions and conditions subject to which more than one explosive may be kept in the same store or registered premises.

Provided that a regulation under this section shall not require the removal of any building lawfully in use at the date of the making of such regulation.

General rules for stores.

- 7 In every store licensed under this Ordinance the following general rules shall be observed; that is to say:—
 - (1) The regulations relating to stores, so far as they apply to such store, shall be duly observed;
 - (2) There shall not be at the same time in the store an amount of explosives exceeding the amount and description specified in the license; and
 - (3) The store shall be used only for the keeping of explosives and receptacles for, or tools or implements for work connected with, the keeping of such explosives; and
 - (4) The interior of the store and the benches, shelves, and fittings therein shall be so constructed or so lined or covered as to prevent the exposure of any iron or steel, and the detaching of any grit, iron, steel, or similar substance in such manner as to come into contact with the explosives, and such interior, benches, shelves, and fittings shall, so far as is reasonably practicable, be kept free from grit and otherwise clean; and
 - (5) The store shall have attached thereto a sufficient lightning conductor, unless it is made by excavation or is licensed for less than one thousand pounds of explosives; and
 - (6) Before repairs are done to or in any part of a store, the store shall, so far as practicable, be cleaned by the removal of all explosives and the thorough washing out of the store; and after such cleaning, these rules shall cease to apply to the store until explosives are again taken there; and
 - (7) Except after such cleaning, all tools and implements used in or in any repairs to the store shall be made only of wood, copper, or brass, or some soft metal or material, or shall be covered with some safe and suitable material; and
 - (8) Due provision shall be made by the use of suitable working clothes without pockets, suitable shoes, searching, and otherwise, or by some such means, for preventing the introduction into the store of fire, lucifer matches, or any substance or article likely to cause explosion or fire, or any iron, steel, or grit; but this rule shall not prevent the introduction of an artificial light of such construction, position, or character as not to cause any danger of fire or explosion; and
 - (9) No person shall smoke in any part of the store; and (10) A person under the age of sixteen years shall not be employed in or enter the store except in the presence and under the supervision of some grown-up person.

In the event of any breach (by any act or default) of the general rules in any store—

(a) All or any part of the explosives in respect to which, or being in the store when the offence was committed, may be forfeited; and

(b) The licensee shall be guilty of an offence, and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding one hundred rupees, and in addition (in the case of a second offence) one hundred rupees for every day during which such breach continues.

Nontransferability, renewal, and ferms of store licenses. 8 A store license shall be valid only for the person named in it, and shall annually, unless the circumstances have so changed that the grant of a new license would not be authorised by this Ordinance—, on application by post or otherwise, and payment of such fee, not exceeding fifty cents, as may be from time to time fixed by the Governor, be renewed by the government agent by endorsement or otherwise for that year, and unless so renewed shall expire.

Store licenses shall be in the form from time to time directed by the Governor.

Special rules for regulation of workmen in stores 9 Every licensee may, with the sanction of the Governor, make, and when made may, with the like sanction, repeal, alter, or add to special rules for the regulation of the persons managing or employed in or about such store, with a view to secure the observance of this Ordinance therein, and the safety and proper discipline of the said persons and the safety of the public.

The breach of any special rule made in pursuance of this section shall be an offence, and any person convicted thereof shall be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty rupees.

Registration of premises with the government agent.

10 A person desirous of registering with the government agent of the province in which any premises are situated such premises for the keeping of explosives shall register his name and calling, and the said premises (in this Ordinance referred to as his registered premises) in such manner and on payment of such fee not exceeding fifty cents as may be directed.

Such registration shall be valid only for the person registered, and shall be annually renewed by sending by post or otherwise notice of such renewal to the government agent, together with such fee not exceeding fifty cents, as may be fixed by the Governor.

General rules for registered premises.

- 11 The following general rules shall be observed with respect to registered premises:—
 - The regulations relating to registered premises, so far as they apply to such premises, shall be duly observed;
 - (2) There shall not be at the same time in any registered premises an amount of explosives exceeding the amount and description prescribed in the regulations:
 - (3) The explosives shall be kept in a house or building or in a fire-proof safe, such safe, if not within a house or building, to be at a safe distance from any highway, street, public thoroughfare, or public place; and
 - (4) The amount of explosives on the same registered premises shall not—
 - (a) if it is kept in a substantially constructed building exclusively appropriated for the purpose and detached from a dwelling-house, or in a fire-proof safe outside a dwelling-house and detached therefrom, and at a safe distance from any highway, street, public thoroughfare, or public place, exceed two hundred pounds; and
 - (b) if it is kept inside a dwelling-house, or in any building other than as last aforesaid, exceed fifty pounds, unless it is kept in a fire-proof safe within such house or building, in which case the amount shall not exceed one hundred pounds; and
 - (5) An article or substance of an explosive or highly inflammable nature shall not be kept in a fire-proof safe with any other description of explosives

or with gunpowder, and in every case shall be kept at a safe distance from the other explosive or gunpowder or the safe containing the same; and

(6) Neither the building exclusively appropriated for the purpose of keeping explosives nor the fire-proof safe shall have any exposed iron or steel in the interior thereof; and

(7) All explosives exceeding one pound in amount shall be kept in a substantial case, bag, canister, or other receptacle made and closed so as to prevent the explosive from escaping. Provided that where such explosive consists of safety cartridges made with gunpowder for the minimum amount limited by this sub-section shall be substituted an amount not more than five times the minimum amount mentioned in this sub-section.

In the event of any breach (by any act or default) of such general rules in any registered premises—

- (a) all or any part of the explosives in respect to which, or being in any house, building, place, safe, or receptacle in respect to which the offence was committed, may be forfeited; and
- (b) The person registered shall be guilty of an offence, and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding one rupee for every pound of explosives in respect of which, or being on the premises in which the offence was committed.

Restriction of sale of explosives in highways. 12 Explosives shall not be hawked, sold, or exposed for sale upon any highway, street, public thoroughfare, or public place.

If any explosives are hawked, sold, or exposed for sale in contravention of this section—

- (1) the person hawking, selling, or exposing for sale the same shall be guilty of an offence, and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding twenty rupees; and
- (2) all or any part of the explosives which are so hawked or exposed for sale, or are found in the possession of any person convicted under this section, may be forfeited.

13 Explosives shall not be sold to any child apparently under the age of thirteen years; and any person selling explosives in contravention of this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty rupees.

14 The Governor may, with the advice of the Executive Council, erect or set apart public magazines for the deposit of explosives in any province, district, or part of the Colony.

15 The Governor may, with the advice of the Executive Council, make regulations prescribing the rent and fees to be paid for the use of any public magazine, and providing for the proper management thereof, the storage therein, and removal therefrom of explosives, and all other matters relating thereto. And the said regulations shall be published in the Government Gazette, and shall thereupon become as legal, valid, and effectual as if the same had been inserted herein. Regulations already made under section 5 of the Ordinance No. 12 of 1873 shall continue to be in force until superseded by regulations made under this Ordinance.

16 Any person may deposit explosives in a public magazine subject to the regulations herein authorised to be made in respect of such magazine.

17 Any person desiring to remove explosives exceeding ten pounds from any place to another place in this Colony, whether by land or by water, shall apply to the government agent of the province whence it is intended to remove such explosives, stating the places from and to which the explosives are to be removed, the quantity and description of packages, and the time of intended removal; and the government agent, if the application is made on any lawful day

Penalty for sale of explosives to children.

Public magazines may be erected or set apart.

Governor may make regulations and prescribe fees in respect of public magazines,

Explosives may be deposited in public magazines.

Permit to remove explosives.

Penalty.
Seizure and forfeiture.

tetween the hours of 10 a.m. and 5 P.m., shall grant his permit in the form given in schedule A hereto for such removal. Provided that where it is intended to move such explosives from a place in one province to a place in another province, it shall be necessary to obtain a permit from the government agent of each province; and any person removing any explosives without such permit or permits, or contrary to the terms of such permit or permits, shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding two hundred rupees, and the explosives shall be seized and forfeited; and it shall be lawful for any police magistrate or inspector of police to direct that any explosives found in course of removal contrary to the provisions of this section shall be taken at the risk and expense of the owner to a public magazine, there to be kept at the risk and expense of the owner pending adjudication,

Explosives not to be sold without a license. 18 It shall not be lawful for any person to sell explosives in this Colony unless such person shall have previously obtained a license from the government agent of the province within which such person sells explosives. Every such license shall be written or printed on a stamp of five rupees, and shall be substantially in the form in the schedule to this Ordinance annexed. Provided that it shall be lawful for any government agent to refuse to issue a license if he shall consider that a sufficient number of licenses have been issued in the neighbourhood, that the applicant is not a fit person, or that he has not provided registered premises for the keeping of explosives; and the government agent may at any time recall and cancel such license should he see fit to do so.

Notice of license to be affixed.

19 The licensee of any store and the owner or occupier of any registered premises for the sale or storage of explosives shall affix to such premises in some conspicuous place a notice to the effect that explosives are kept or stored in such store or premises.

Exemption of explosives the property of the Crown 20 This Ordinance shall not apply to the keeping, making up, or conveyance of any explosives under the control of the military, the navy, or the volunteers, or any department of Government, or otherwise held for the service of the Crown, or of the Government, or for the use of Her Majesty's army, navy, or volunteers.

Licensing by government agent of firework factories.

21 Any person may apply in writing for a firework factory license to the government agent of the province in which such factory is situated, stating his name, address, and calling, and the proposed site and construction of the factory, and the amount and description of explosives he proposes to have therein and in any building therein; and the government agent shall, as soon as practicable, if the proposed site, construction of the factory, and amount of explosives are in accordance with the regulations regulating firework factories, grant to the applicant, on payment of such fee not exceeding , as may be fixed by the Governor, the license

applied for.

The powers of this Ordinance of making regulations with respect to stores and of prescribing general rules with respect to stores shall extend to making regulations and prescribing general rules with respect to firework factories and the buildings thereon; and any breach (by any act or default) of any such general rule shall involve the same penalties and forfeitures as a breach of a general rule relating to stores.

A firework factory license shall be valid only for the person named in it, and the provisions of this Ordinance with respect to the renewal, expiration, and form of store licenses and fees for such renewal, and to special rules for the regulation of persons managing or employed in or about stores, shall apply in like manner as if they were herein enacted and in terms made applicable to firework factory licenses and firework factories respectively.

Premises, &c., may be searched for explosives. 22 It shall be lawful for any inspector of police or other officer of police above the rank of inspector at all times by day or night to enter, inspect, and examine any store, firework factory, or premises registered under this Ordinance,

and to search any premises, carriage, or vessel in which explosives are suspected to be kept or carried contrary to this Ordinance; and all explosives found upon such inspection or search to be so kept or carried shall be immediately seized by the officer, and removed with all convenient speed to a place of safety, and stored there at owner's risk and expense pending adjudication.

Penalties.

- 23 From and after the coming into operation of this Ordinance any person who shall, contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance—
 - (a) keep or use a store as a store for explosives without having obtained a license therefor;
 - (b) keep or have in his possession a larger quantity of explosives than ten pounds, except in premises registered with the government agent of the province or in a licensed store or firework factory;
 - (c) self explosives without having obtained a license therefor;
 - (d) keep or use any premises as a firework factory without having obtained a license therefor—

shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of five hundred rupees.

Police court to have jurisdiction.

24 Every offence under this Ordinance shall be cognizable and bailable, and may be inquired into, tried, and determined by the police court of the district in which the offence was committed wholly or in part, and such court shall have jurisdiction to award the maximum punishment or penalty prescribed therefor, and to declare and adjudge any gunpowder or thing liable to forfeiture under this Ordinance forfeited, and to condemn the same, whatever may be the amount or value thereof, anything in the Criminal Procedure Code to the contrary notwithstanding.

Any police court imposing a fine under this Ordinance may award to an informer any portion not exceeding a molety thereof which may be actually recovered.

- 1. Resolved,-That Mr. Ormsby take the Chair.
- The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on March 9 were read and confirmed.
- The following documents were laid on the table :-

General Statements of Receipts and Disbursements on account of the "Municipal Fund," also separate Statements of Receipts and Disbursements in respect of the General Revenue, Police Assessment, and Water-rate Accounts from close of 1892 to February 28 and March 31; Progress Reports brought up to the same dates; Statements of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the months of February and March, and of cases instituted by the several Inspectors during the same period; also reports by the Health Officer.

Resolved,—That the General Statements of Receipts and Disbursements and Progress Reports of work done,

together with Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, be forwarded to Government, as required by section 90 of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, as also the Health Officer's reports.

Health Officer's Report for February, 1893.

Infectious Diseases.—Since my last report there has been no notification of any case of infectious disease. General Health.—The general health of the community is good.

Sanitation.—The sanitary condition of the town is fairly good. I would draw the special attention of the Inspectors to the courts and alleys off the main streets. I notice that the insanitary condition of the premises (51, Castle Hill street) mentioned in my last report remains in the same condition. It is urgently necessary that the improvements in that report stated should be carried out at once. The surrounding area of the water standpipe situated opposite No. 354, Trincomalee street, requires paving. The new drain pipe placed from the Military hospital to the Lake is completed, and works satisfactorily.

Latrines.—The public latrines are in good sanitary condition.

Market.—The market is also well kept and clean.

Cattle Sheds -The cattle brought for sale have been fairly good. A few animals have been rejected.

Slaughter-house.—The slaughter-house is kept clean, and in good order.
