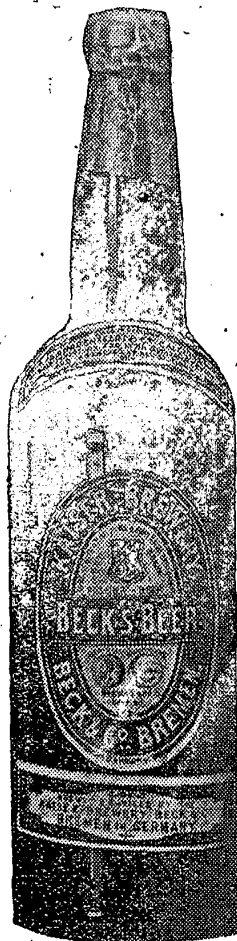

Thomas Cockerill.—"Improvements in and relating to the production of indiarubber."

Abstract.—The latex is electrically coagulated in a machine of the type described in the inventor's specification No. 1,012 of 1907, but has a movable belt-like anode by means of which the rubber is removed as coagulated.

The cathode consists of a series of links or plates provided with sealing devices at the joints. Means are provided for keeping the moving anode and cathode apart, for preventing escape of latex by transverse dams, and side deckle straps which are kept in position tight to the surface of the anode. Provision is further made for consolidating rollers, an impressing roller for stamping, and means for drying the rubber, recovering the latex from the mother liquor and for washing the electrodes.
