NOW Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in exercise of the power vested in Us by section 4 of the Cattle Ordinance, No. 10 of 1898, and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby make the following regulation to be numbered 28, and added to the regulations proclaimed on December 19, 1908. And We do declare that the said regulation shall be in force throughout the Island.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date May 13, 1892, issued under the provisions of section 19 of the Forest Ordinance, No. 10 of 1885, a certain land known as Kandapola Sita Eliya forest, lying to the north of the Nuwara Eliya-Badulla road, described in the schedule to the said Proclamation, was declared to be a reserved forest subject to certain rights:

And whereas it is expedient that a portion of the land so reserved as aforesaid shall cease to be reserved:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in exercise of the power vested in Us by sub-section (2) of section 6 of the Forest Ordinance, No. 16 of 1907, do hereby direct that the portion of the said forest land specified and set forth in the schedule hereto shall cease to be reserved as from and after May 26, 1911, and that a right of way be and is levely allowed to the proprietors, agents, and servants of Hethersett and Goatfell estates over such portion of for st land, namely, over the road from Hethersett and Goatfell estates to Uda Pussellawa, as is referred to in the said schedule.

# Rules referred to.

HUGH CLIFFORD, Colonial Secretary.

- 1. A registration fee of 25 cents per annum shall be paid for each dog kept within the limits of the aforesaid Province.
- 2. Such registration fee shall be due on and after April 1 in each year, and shall be paid before May 1 annually.
- 3. To facilitate the recovery of such registration fee the occupier of every fouse within the aforesaid Province shall, on or before March 1 in each year, furn h to the Government Agent or to the officer authorized by him a list in the form h the schedule annexed of the dogs kept in such house, and the names of the winers thereof.
- 4. On payment of the registration fee on any dog the Government Agent shall, unless the owner provides a collar to be stamped, furnish him with a stamped collar for such dog on payment of a fee of 37 cents.
- 5. When any person residing within the limits of the aforesaid Province becomes possessed of any dog after March 1 in any year, the occupier of the premises where the dog is kept shall, within one month from the date when the dog is brought into his premises, furnish the officer named in rule No. 3 with an additional list showing every dog brought into his premises after the said date, and the name of its owner, and every such dog shall become liable to the registration fee for the current year within fifteen days after the list required by this rule becomes due.
- 6. It shall be lawful for the Government Agent or the officer appointed by him to require the production of any dog for which registration is applied for, and to decline to issue a certificate of registration until it is produced.
- 7. It shall be lawful for the Government Agent, North-Central Province, to refuse to issue a certificate of registration, or to cancel a certificate already issued for any dog which in his opinion is so maimed or diseased as to be unfit to live, or which is habitually ill-treated or continually neglected by its owner.
- 8. The owner of every dog for which a certificate has been refused or cancelled shall, on being noticed to do so, produce the dog at the house of the officer appointed by the Government Agent, North-Central Province, at a time to be stated in the notice and deliver it to the said officer, and every such dog may be destroyed or otherwise disposed of as the Government Agent shall think fit.
- 9. It shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Government Agent to seize all stray dogs and deal with them in terms of sub-sections (1) and (2) of section 10 of the Ordinance No. 25 of 1901.

#### BY-LAW REFERRED TO.

The owner of every house or building abutting on any street, which term shall include pavements, shall within twenty-one days after notice from the Board to that effect put up and keep in good condition proper troughs, gutters, and pipes for receiving and carrying the water from the roof and other parts of such house or building and discharging the same in such a manner as the Chairman, Local Board, shall direct, so that it shall not fall upon persons passing along the street. Such gutters shall not be less than 6 in. in diameter, and the down piping not less than 4 in. in diameter, with proper holdfasts, brackets, &c., and as may be directed by the Chairman, and be constructed of such material as the Chairman may approve.

## THE RABIES ORDINANCE, No. 7 of 1893.

T is hereby notified for public information that the local authorities set forth in Schedule I, hereto have, in exercise of the power vested in them by section 9 of the above-named Ordinance, made the regulations set forth in Schedule II. hereto, and that the same have been approved by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council.

All existing regulations which are inconsistent with the regulations in Schedule II. hereto are hereby revoked.

# SCHEDULE II. Regulations,

1. Every owner of a dog shall cause such dog to be muzzled or led by a chain when in any public road or place. The muzzle shall be so constructed as to render it impossible for the dog, while wearing the same, to bite any person or animal, but not so as to prevent the dog from breathing freely or lapping water.

2. A dog shall not be considered effectually controlled unless muzzled as above, or led by some competent person by means of a chain and collar, the latter to be

securely fastened to the dog's neck.

3. Any dog not, effectually controlled found in any public road or place may be (a) destroyed by any person specially authorized thereto by the local authority, or (b) seized by any police officer or any person duly appointed for the purpose by the local authority. If seized a dog shall be removed to such place as may be appointed, there to be dealt with in the following manner:—

(i.) If the dog is affected with, or suspected of, rabies, it shall forthwith be slaughtered.

(ii.) If the dog is not affected with, or suspected of, rabies, it shall be detained in any place appointed. Provided that where the dog is registered, and the owner or person having charge of a dog so detained is known, the local authority, or some person duly authorized by him, shall forthwith cause notice to be given to such owner or person of the fact of the dog having been so seized and detained, and the dog shall, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the breach of these regulations, be given up to such owner or person on payment of the reasonable expenses of detention.

(iii.) If the dog so seized and detained shall not have been claimed by such owner or person within six hours after the seizure, the local authority shall cause the dog to be slaughtered, or otherwise disposed of in such manner as the local authority may deem expedient.

The owner of any dog which shall have been seized and detained under these regulations shall be liable to pay to the local authority the following charge:-For detention for each day or part of a day Re. 1, or such sum as the local authority may determine; and such charge shall be recoverable, if the dog is not affected with, or suspected of, rabies, by the sale thereof, unless the said charge shall have been paid before sale by the owner or person in charge of the dog, otherwise the charge shall be recoverable in the manner provided by section 1 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1873 in respect to the order in which the property of public defaulters may be seized and sold.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended May 27, 1911.

Births.—The total births registered were 86 (I European, 11 Burghers, 48 Sinhalese, 11 Tamils, 7 Moors, 7 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the population as enumerated at the Census on March 10, 1911, viz., 211,287) was 21.2, as against 23.2 in the preceding week, 21.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 125 (0 Europeans, 10 Burghers, 63 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 20 Moors, 4 Malays, and 3 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 30.8, as against 28.9 in the previous week, 30.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 125 total deaths, 29 were of infants under one year of age, as against 34 in the preceding week, 25 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 27 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 4.

Selected Causes of Death.—Fifteen deaths were registered from Pneumonia (against 16 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year), of which 3 each were in Pettah, St. Paul's, Kotahena, and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and 1 each in San Sebastian, New Bazaar, and Maradana hospitals. Five deaths were registered from Bronchitis.

Thirteen deaths were registered from *Phthisis* (against 19 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year), of which 3 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 2 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena, and New Bazaar, and 1 each in Pettah, San Sebastian, Maradana hospitals, and Kollupitiya North.

- 3. Twelve deaths were registered from Infantile Convulsions, 8 from Enteritis (3 infants), 8 Debility (3 infants), 7 Diarrhæa (1 infant), 6 Dysentery, 4 Worms, 4 Old Age, 4 Apoplexy, 3 Nephritis, 2 Tetanus (both infants), 2 Premature Births, 2 Dockmius Duodenalis, and 23 from Other Causes.
- 4. Seven deaths were registered from Enteric Fever (against 5 in the previous week and the weekly average for last year), of which 3 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 2 in Maradana hospitals, and 1 each in Slave Island and Kollupitiya South. There were 14 cases reported during the week, against 19 in the previous week.
- 5. One case of Smallpox was reported during the week (of a vagrant Tamil from Southern India, where the epidemic is now prevalent); also 10 of Measles, against 14 in the previous week; and 21 of Chickenpox, against 37 in the previous week.
- 6. One case of Cholera was reported from the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Kanatta, of a cooly from the Ragama camp, where there has been a rather serious epidemic since the beginning of the month.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82.6°, against 84.1° in the preceding week and 84.2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.861 in., against 29.881 in. in the preceding week and 29.917 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 3.49 in., against 0.32 in. in the preceding week and 0.08 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
