TENDERS are hereby invited for the purchase of the under-mentioned timber:—All dead and fallen ebony trees and branch wood lying in the Kantalai Forest Reserve, in the Trincomalee District, which can be collected up to December 31, 1911.

2. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed, and the original should be addressed to the Assistant Conservator of Forests, Batticaloa Division, Batticaloa, and the duplicate forwarded to the Conservator of Forests, Kandy.

3. The tenders should either be delivered at the Office of the Conservator of Forests, Kandy, or at that of the Assistant Conservator of Forests, Batticaloa, or be sent through the post.

4. Tenders should be marked "Tender for purchase of Ebony" in the left hand top corner of the envelope, and should reach the Office of the Assistant Conservator of Forests, Batticaloa, not later than 12 noon on Saturday, July 15, 1911.

5. The tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application at the Office of the Assistant Conservator of Forests, Batticaloa, and no tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form. Alterations must be initialled, otherwise the tenders will be treated as informal and rejected.

6. A deposit of Rs. 20 will be required to be made at the Treasury or at the Kachcheri, and a receipt produced for the same before any form of tender is issued. *Schedule.*

(a) To supply to the Jaffna Depôt, between July 1, 1911, and June 30, 1912, from irrigable areas under the Karachi scheme on the eastern side of the North-Central road, between the 157th and 159th mileposts to a distance of 2 miles inwards, 1,500 tons more or less of common firewood.

All trees cut for this purpose must be cut within a foot of the ground, and the area worked must be stripped clean, and work must proceed steadily from one direction. The leaving of small patches of firewood jungle will not be allowed.

The supply must be completed before the close of May, 1912, and not less than 125 tons should be delivered monthly.

(b) To supply to the Jaffna Depôt, between July 1, 1911, and June 30, 1912, from Iransaimadu tank sawing depôt, 500 tons more or less of refuse wood from sleeper works. Wood to be loaded into railway wagons at Killinochchi.

The supply must be completed before the close of May, 1912, and not less than 40 tons should be delivered monthly.

**TENDERS** are hereby invited for the supply of firewood to the Railway Department from the under-mentioned forests during the financial period from July 1, 1911, to June 30, 1912, viz. :—

*For Specials on the Main Line.*

(a) To fell, transport, and deliver near the 43rd milepost on the Main Line, between Alawwa and Polgahawela stations—

- (1) 1,000 stacked cubic yards of firewood from the forest known as Dewalakelemukalana, lot 76, situated within the village limits of Yatigaloluwa, about 2 miles distance from the Railway line.
- (2) 1,000 stacked cubic yards of firewood from the forest known as Talakolakandemukalana, lot 1, situated within the village limits of Waduwwa, about 3 miles distance from the Railway line.
- (3) 2,500 stacked cubic yards of firewood from the forest known as Dehelgomuwekandemukalana, lot 54, situated within the village limits of Dehelgomuwa, about 6 miles distance from the Railway line.
- (4) 2,500 stacked cubic yards of firewood from the forest known as Batagollemukalana, lot 39, situated within the village limits of Andarapone, about 5 miles distance from the Railway line.

Fuel from all the above-mentioned forests can be brought out by means of the Waduwwa Gansabhawa road.

(b) To fell, transport, and deliver near the 37th milepost on the Main Line, between Ambepussa and Alawwa Railway stations—

- (1) 3,000 stacked cubic yards of firewood from the forest known as Moramandiyekkele, lot 2, and six other adjoining forests, situated within the village limits of Talwatta, about 3½ miles distance from the Railway line.

- (2) 150 stacked cubic yards of firewood from the forest known as Galagawakelekosgahamukalana, lot 57, situated within the village limits of Abbowa, about  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles distance from the Railway line.
- (3) 1,500 stacked cubic yards of firewood from the forest known as Gongawalamukalana, lot 40, situated within the village limits of Otarakiriwanpola, about 4 miles distance from the Railway line.
- (4) 1,000 stacked cubic yards of firewood from the forest known as Egodakandemukalana, lot 19, and the adjoining forest, situated within the village limits of Pallekekulanda, about 3 miles distance from the Railway line.

(c) To fell, transport, and deliver at the Alawwa station yard—

- (1) 5,000 stacked cubic yards of firewood from the forest known as Badapeliyagodamukalana, situated within the village limits of Ihalakalapatiya and Nugawela. The fuel can easily be extracted by means of village road, which joins the main Giriulla-Alawwa road at the 5th milepost. Total distance to Alawwa 7 miles, 5 of which are along the main road.
- (2) 5,000 stacked cubic yards of firewood from the forest known as Pangollemukalana, situated within the village limits of Busnapahuwa and Welikare. There is a road connecting the forest with the main Giriulla-Alawwa road, by means of which the fuel can be extracted. Distance to Alawwa about 7 miles, 5 miles being main road.
- (3) 1,500 stacked cubic yards of firewood from Gallinda and adjoining forests, situated within the village limits of Maboṣṣitiya. Fuel from these blocks can be extracted by means of a village road. Distance to Alawwa about 5 miles.

All in Udukaha Korale East.

(d) To fell, transport, and deliver at the Polgahawela Railway station yard—

- (1) 4,000 stacked cubic yards of firewood from the forest known as Moragahamulamukalana, lot 57, and the adjoining forests, situated within the village limits of Arambepola, in Udupola Medalassa korale. Distance to Polgahawela Railway station, 8 miles.

(e) To fell, transport, and deliver at Alawwa station yard for the "stages"—

- (1) 2,000 stacked cubic yards of firewood from the forest known as Wagolla, which is situated within the village limits of Riloluwa. This forest is situated  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles to the west of the Giriulla-Alawwa main road. Total distance to Alawwa 9 miles.

- (2) 3,000 stacked cubic yards of firewood from Kiri bathkohe and adjoining forests, situated within the village limits of Kebellawita. Fuel can be extracted to Alawwa by means of a village road.

All in Udukaha Korale East of Dambadeniya hatpattu.

Each piece of wood should be 3 feet in length, and not less than 12 inches nor more than 36 inches in girth. The following species should not be cut for firewood, viz.:—Etamba, lunumidella, rukattana, divikaduru, kaju, wal-kaduru, cotton, erabadu, dadap, kekuna, amba, and gedumba.

All other deposits will be returned upon signature of a contract.

8. Each tender must be accompanied by a letter signed by two responsible persons, whose addresses must be given, engaging to become security for the due fulfilment of the contract.

9. Cash security at the rate of 5 per cent. on the amount of each contract will be required before contracts are entered into, and all other necessary information can be ascertained upon application at the office referred to in section 6.

10. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions above laid down have been strictly fulfilled.

11. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of a tender.
