PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR.

EDWARD THE SEVENTH, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

To all to whom these presents shall come.

GREETING.

WHEREAS Max Rosenberg of No. 1, Lily street, Slave Island, has, under the provisions of "The Naturalization Ordinance, 1890," applied to Us, the Right Honourable Sir West Ridgeway, G.C.M.G., K.C.B., K.C.S.I., &c., Governor of Ceylon, in Our Executive Council, that the privileges of naturalization may, in terms of the said Ordinance, be conferred on the said Max Rosenberg, and We, in Executive Council, acting in pursuance of the powers in Us vested by section 3 of the said Ordinance, have made an order bearing date the 27th day of February, 1903, granting such application :

And whereas the said Max Rosenberg has taken the oath of allegiance prescribed by section 4 of the said Ordinance, and has produced to Us a certificate of his having taken and subscribed such oath, and of the date of his taking and subscribing the same, and We are satisfied that the said Max Rosenberg has taken the prescribed oath within the period specified in the said section of the said Ordinance :

Now know Ye that We do hereby grant to the said Max Rosenberg all the rights and privileges of a British subject, and declare that the said Max Rosenberg shall, within the limits of this Colony, be entitled to all political and other rights, powers, and privileges, and be subject to all obligations to which a natural-born British subject is entitled or subject.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, under the Public Seal thereof, this Second day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Three.

SIR,—I HAVE the honour to acquaint you that the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs have informed this Department that future importations into the United Kingdom by the Parcel Post of samples of dutiable articles from Curators of Colonial Botanical Stations when addressed to the Director of the Royal Gardens at Kew, and marked "for official purposes only," will be allowed to go forward without payment of duty, on the understanding that such samples will not be permitted to go into consumption without payment of the duty thereon.

NOTICE is hereby given that a Board appointed by His Excellency the Governor will sit on the 6th April, 1903, at the Council Chamber, for the purpose of opening and considering tenders for the purchase of the following Arrack Rents for the periods as stated:—

Southern Province.—The Four Gravets of Galle and Akmimana; Talpe pattu, Wellaboda, Gangaboda, and Hinidum pattus; Bentota-Walallawiti korale. For a period of one or two years from 1st January, 1904.

Southern Province.—The Four Gravets of Matara, Gangaboda, and Kandaboda pattus, and Makawita; Weligam and Morowak korales; the Wellaboda pattu in the District of Matara; Magam pattu, Giruwa pattu West and Giruwa pattu East in the Hambantota District. For a period of one or two years from 1st January, 1904.

Province of Sabaragamuwa.—Sabaragamuwa District, Four Korales in the District of Kegalla. For a period of one or two years from the 1st January, 1904.

No tender will be received after 12.30 P.M. on the appointed day.

Each tenderer should state in his tender the period or periods in respect of which he tenders, and the price or prices that he is prepared to pay.

Separate tenders should be made for the several rents as shown above.

Tenders, properly sealed, may either be posted, addressed to the Hon. Mr. E. im Thurn, C.B., C.M.G., Colonial Secretary, marked "Arrack Rent Tender," or delivered personally by the tenderer to the Board.

Forms of conditions of sale with lists of taverns can be obtained at any Kachcheri in the Island. Any further information required will be supplied by the Hon. the Government Agent, Western Province, on application made to him either personally or by letter.

Tenderers who cannot speak English and wish to communicate with the Board must bring their own interpreters.

No tender will be considered unless the tenderer is present in person or by his authorized agent at the Council Chamber, and is prepared to deposit forthwith the amount of one month's rent as tendered by him.

In the event of two or more tenders being for an equal amount the Board shall have the option of forthwith offering the rent for sale by public auction—the bidding to be restricted to the tenderers in question—or of calling for fresh tenders.

Purchasers of these rents will be allowed to sell arrack at any price not below Rs. 4.50 per gallon.

And notice is hereby further given that the purchasers of the Arrack Rent of the Four Gravets of Galle will be required to pay, in terms of the provisions of the Ordinance No. 9 of 1892, a stamp duty of Rs. 500 for each and every license issued under the Ordinance No. 13 of 1891 to sell arrack by retail at each and every tavern situated within the limits of the Municipality of Galle.

Regulation 3 (2) (c): by adding the words "order that" after (c) and before the words "the passengers."

Regulation 7: by adding at the end the words "and any person acting in contravention of any such condition or restriction shall be liable to the penalties provided for breach of these regulations."
