In the Name of His Majesty EDWARD THE SEVENTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by section 40 (1) of "The Trade Marks Ordinance," No. 14 of 1888, it is enacted that the Governor in Executive Council, may from time to time make such general rules, prescribe such forms, and do such things as he thinks expedient, subject to the provisions of the said Ordinance, for prescribing the fees payable in respect of applications and registration; and (2) that any rules made in pursuance of the said section shall be published in the Government Gazette, and that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Executive Council, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette to alter, amend, or revoke any such rules:

And whereas certain rules were on the Twenty-eighth day of March, One thousand Eight hundred and Eighty-nine, made in pursuance of the said section of the said Ordinance and published in the Government Gazette of the Twenty-ninth day of March, One thousand Eight hundred and Eighty-nine, and by rule No. 3 of the said rules it was provided that the fees to be paid in pursuance of the said Ordinance should be the fees specified in the first schedule to the said rules annexed:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said schedule in certain respects:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, in Executive Council, do hereby amend the said schedules as follows, that is to say:

- 1. By adding the following paragraph after paragraph 1 of the said schedule relating to the fee payable on an application to register a Trade Mark:—
 - 1(a) On application to register the same Trade Mark in each additional class, Re. 1.25.
- 2. By adding the following paragraph after paragraph 2 of the said schedule relating to the fee payable on the registration of a Trade Mark:—
 - 2(a) For registration of the same Trade Mark in each additional class, Rs. 5.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by section 30 of "The Forest Ordinance, 1885," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, direct that from a date fixed by such Proclamation any forest or any portion thereof reserved under the said Ordinance shall cease to be reserved:

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 2nd day of November, 1892, the forest mentioned in the schedule thereto and situated within the limits therein specified, was, under the provisions of section 19 of the said Ordinance declared to be a reserved forest as from and after the date appearing in such Proclamation:

And whereas it is expedient that a portion of the said forest shall cease to be reserved:

Now therefore know Ye that We, the said Governor, do hereby proclaim that from and after the First day of May, 1903, the portions of land specified and set out in the schedule hereto being portions of the said forest reserved under the said Ordinance shall cease to be reserved.

By-laws referred to.

1. Registration of Dogs.—All dogs kept within the limits of the town of Weligama shall be registered in the office of the Assistant Government Agent, Matara.

2. Registration Fee.—An annual registration fee of 25 cents shall be payable for each dog kept within the said limits.

3. Certificate of Registration.—The certificate of registration referred to in section 5 of the Ordinance No. 25 of 1901, shall be in the form given in the annexed schedule marked A.

4. Owner of Dog to give notice to the Assistant Government Agent.—Every person who shall acquire, keep, or become possessed of a dog shall give notice thereof to the Assistant Government Agent, Matara, within 21 days of his acquiring or becoming possessed of such dog, and shall give a full description of the animal.

5. Occupier to fill up Schedule.—It shall be lawful for the Assistant Government Agent, Matara, to require every occupier of a house to fill up before March 31 in each year a schedule in the form B showing the number and description of the dogs kept in such house or in any premises attached thereto and to whom they respectively belong, and every such occupier shall be bound to accept, duly filled up with correct information, and return such schedule within one week from receipt thereof.

6. Refusal of Certificate.—The Assistant Government Agent, Matara, may refuse to issue a certificate to the owner of a dog, if in the opinion of the Medical Officer such dog is by reason of its suffering from some infectious or contagious disease a source of danger to the public.

- 7. The Assistant Government Agent may order Dogs to be destroyed when Certificate has been refused.—The owner of every dog in respect of which the conditions attached to the certificate have not been complied with, shall on being noticed to do so, produce the dog at the Assistant Government Agent's Office, Matara, and the Assistant Government Agent may, if he thinks fit, order the destruction of the dog.
- 8. Collars for Dogs.—Every dog kept within the limits of the town of Weligama shall wear a collar with the Kachcheri stamp, the registered number and year of registration stamped on it. No dog wearing such collar shall be liable to seizure. A register of the stamping of collars shall be kept in the Assistant Government Agent's Office.
- 9. Collars to be paid for if supplied by the Assistant Government Agent.—The Assistant Government Agent is hereby authorized to issue dog collars to every person applying for the same on a payment of 25 cents per collar. The collar to be stamped by the Kachcheri without further charge.
- 10. Stamping of Collars to be free.—Every person desirous of providing a collar for his dog shall be entitled to obtain the Kachcheri stamp and number on it without any charge.
- 11. Dogs seized to be detained.—All dogs seized under section 10 of Ordinance No. 25 of 1901, shall be detained by the Mudaliyar, or shall be delivered to such person as shall be authorized by the Assistant Government Agent to detain such dogs.
- 12. Payment for releasing a Dog after seizure.—No stray dog seized under the authority of the Assistant Government Agent shall be restored to its owner, except on payment of the registration fee, and of 50 cents for the first day and 25 cents a day for every subsequent day or part of a day in which such dog is detained.
- 13. Headmen to report owners of unregistered Dogs.—All Police Headmen living within the town of Weligama are required to report to the Mudaliyar the name and address of persons who keep unregistered dogs.
- 14. Conditions on which Certificates are issued.—Certificates for dogs shall have the following conditions attached thereto. The certificate is liable to be cancelled by the Assistant Government Agent after notice to be left at the address of the owner.
 - (a) Should the dog become so maimed or diseased as to be incurable and to be in the opinion of the Assistant Government Agent or the Medical Officer of the station unfit to live.
 - (b) Should the Assistant Government Agent be satisfied that the dog is habitually ill-treated or continually neglected by its owner.
 - (c) Should the dog be permitted by its owner to associate with dogs belonging to others at a time when it is suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.
