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PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR.

IN the Name of His Majesty EDWARD THE SEVENTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by section 19 (1) of "The Vehicles Ordinance, 1901," it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may for any town, place, district, or province of this Island, from time to time, make such by-laws as may seem necessary or expedient for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the said Ordinance, and by section 20 (1) of the said Ordinance it is amongst other things enacted that the by-laws when so made shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall thereupon become as legal, valid, binding, and effectual as if the same had been inserted in the said Ordinance, and that all courts, judges, and magistrates shall take judicial notice thereof, and (2) that the Proclamation publishing the by-laws shall set out and define the limits of the town, place, district, or province to which such by-laws are to apply :

And whereas it is expedient to make certain by-laws for the division of Kegalla, within the limits hereinafter specified, for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the said Ordinance :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, have made the by-laws set out in schedule A hereto for the division of Kegalla, in the Province of Sabaragamuwa, within the limits set out and defined in schedule B hereto, for fixing the rates and fares for goods and passengers, as well for time as distance to be paid for vehicles as provided for by the said Ordinance.

On the North.—By a straight line from the 7th milepost on the road from Polgahawela to the Kandy road to a point 12 chains north north-east of the 49th milepost on the Kandy road.

On the North-East.—From the point 12 chains north north-east of the 49th milepost on the Kandy road to a point on the bridle road leading from Mipitiya bridge on the Kandy high road to the bridle path leading to Rambukkana, 12 chains along that path from the Mipitiya bridge.

On the South.—Along the bridle path to the Mipitiya bridge, thence along the bridle path to the junction with the Circular road, thence along the Circular road to the junction with the Bulatkohupitiya road, thence across the bridge over the Anguruwela-oya, thence along the cemetery road to the new cemetery, thence along the southern and western boundaries of the cemetery till it joins the cemetery road again, thence along the cemetery road to its junction with the Kandy road, and thence along the Kandy road to the junction of the Polgahawela road.

GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

NOTICE is hereby given that a Board appointed by His Excellency the Governor will sit on the 4th May, 1903, at the Council Chamber, for the purpose of opening and considering tenders for the purchase of the following Arrack Rents for the periods as stated:—

(1) *Western Province.*—The Arrack Rent of the Four Gravets of Colombo (Fort excepted), Lansiyawatta (including Wattala, Peliyagoda, and Ambatalenpahala), and Salpiti korale. For a period of two years from January 1, 1904.

(2) The Arrack Rent of the Negombo District, viz., Dunugaha, Ragama, and Dasiya pattus of Alutkuru korale north and Hapitigam korale. For a period of one or two years from January 1, 1904.

(3) The District of Kalutara. For a period of one or two years from the 1st January, 1904.

(4) *Southern Province.*—The Four Gravets of Galle and Akmimana; Talpe pattu, Wellaboda, Gangaboda, and Hinidum pattus; Bentota-Walallawiti korale. For a period of one or two years from 1st January, 1904.

No tender will be received after 12.30 P.M. on the appointed day.

Each tenderer should state in his tender the period or periods in respect of which he tenders, and the price or prices that he is prepared to pay.

Separate tenders should be made for the several rents as shown above, both the name and number of the rent being inserted in the tender.

Tenders, properly sealed, may either be posted, addressed to the Hon. Mr. E. im Thurn, C.B., C.M.G., Colonial Secretary, marked "Arrack Rent Tender," or delivered personally by the tenderer to the Board.

Forms of conditions of sale with lists of taverns can be obtained at any Kachcheri in the Island. Any further information required will be supplied by the Hon. the Government Agent, Western Province, on application made to him either personally or by letter.

Tenderers who cannot speak English and wish to communicate with the Board must bring their own interpreters.

No tender will be considered unless the tenderer is present in person or by his authorized agent at the Council Chamber, and is prepared to deposit forthwith the amount of one month's rent as tendered by him.

In the event of two or more tenders being for an equal amount the Board shall have the option of forthwith offering the rent for sale by public auction—the bidding to be restricted to the tenderers in question—or of calling for fresh tenders.

Purchasers of these rents will be allowed to sell arrack at any price not below Rs. 4.50 per gallon.

And notice is hereby further given that the purchasers of the Arrack Rents of the Four Gravets of Colombo (Fort excepted) and of Galle will be required to pay, in terms of the provisions of the Ordinance No. 9 of 1892, a stamp duty of Rs. 500 for each and every license issued under the Ordinance No. 13 of 1891 to sell arrack by retail at each and every tavern situated within the limits of the Municipalities of Colombo and Galle.

Regulation under "The Poisons Ordinance, 1901," empowering the Police to enter and inspect Premises and Books.

It shall be lawful for any officer of Police, not below the rank of Inspector, to enter upon any premises occupied by any person licensed to sell poisons under Ordinance No. 11 of 1901, in order that he may ascertain by inquiry and inspection whether the provisions of the Ordinance and the regulations made thereunder are duly observed, and for this purpose such Police Officers may inspect the register and prescription book.

MEMORANDUM.

Open Competitive Examinations for the following Services, viz. :—

The Civil Service of India ;
Eastern Cadetships in the Colonial Service ;
Clerkships (Class I.) in the Home Civil Service ;

will be held concurrently this year. The examinations will commence on August 3.

The limits of age for the several services are as follows, viz. :—

Civil Service of India	21-23	on January 1, 1903
Eastern Cadets	21-24*	on August 1, 1903
Home Civil Service (Class I.)	22-24†	on August 3, 1903

Candidates duly eligible in respect of age will be admitted to compete for any two or all three of these Services, subject to the following conditions :—

(1) That they fill put up and return to the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, an application on each of the prescribed forms within the time limited by the respective regulations.† (NOTE.—A separate form of application is required for each of the three Services.)

(2) That it is distinctly understood that every successful candidate who may have been admitted to compete for either the India or the Colonial Service, as well as for the Home Service, will be called upon to declare, immediately after the announcement of the result of the competitions, whether he prefers his name to remain on the list of candidates for the India or Colonial Service, or on the list of candidates for Clerkships in the Home Civil Service, and that the name of any candidate who fails to declare his choice when called upon to do so will be removed from the list of candidates for Clerkships in the Home Civil Service.

(3) That it is distinctly understood that every successful candidate who may have been admitted to compete for both the India and Colonial Services will be called upon to declare, after the announcement of the result of the competitions, whether he prefers his name to remain on the list of candidates for the Civil Service of India or on the list of candidates for Eastern Cadetships in the Colonial Service, and that the name of any candidate who fails to declare his choice when called upon to do so will be removed from the list of candidates for Eastern Cadetships

(4) That all declarations of choice are irrevocable.

Candidates admitted to compete for all three or any two of these classes of appointments will be required to pay a consolidated fee of £6.

Examinations for Eastern Cadetships, viz., for Cadetships in the Civil Services of Ceylon and of Hongkong, the Straits Settlements, and the Protected States of the Malay Peninsula.

REGULATIONS.

[The next examination for Eastern Cadetships will be held under these Regulations. Alterations may be made for any subsequent examination.]

1. The Cadets, who must be natural-born British subjects, are selected by open competitive examination held by the Civil Service Commissioners, to whom all inquiries on the subject should be addressed.

The examinations for these appointments will, as a rule, be held in the month of August of those years in which vacancies have occurred in the Civil Service of Ceylon or in that of Hongkong, the Straits Settlements, and the Protected States of the Malay Peninsula ; and the successful candidates will be allotted as and when opportunity offers, to the various Colonies or States in which vacancies may exist upon a consideration of all the circumstances, including their own wishes ; but the requirements of the Public Service will rank before every other consideration, and the Secretary of State retains full discretion to allot as he thinks fit.

§2. Candidates must have attained the age of 21 and must not have attained the age of 24 on the first day of August in the year in which the examination is held, and must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character. They must be of sound constitution, possessed of good sight, and physically qualified for service in tropical climates, and they will be called upon to undergo a strict medical examination to test these points.

* The following rule applies to candidates for the Colonial Service, but not to candidates for the Civil Service of India :—

In reckoning age for competition, members of the Militia, the Imperial Yeomanry, the Honourable Artillery Company, or the Volunteers (whether commissioned or non-commissioned) may deduct from their actual age any time spent on actual military service in connection with the war in South Africa, such time being reckoned by the number of days for which they received Army pay.

† The following rule applies to candidates for the Home Civil Service (Class I.), but not to candidates for the India or Colonial Services :—

In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz. :—(i.) Persons who have served in the Army or Navy may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have served towards pension ; (ii.) Persons who may be serving or who may have served in the Militia, the Imperial Yeomanry, the Honourable Artillery Company, or the Volunteers may deduct from their actual age any time spent on actual military service, such time being reckoned by the number of days for which they received Army pay ; (iii.) Persons who have served for two full consecutive years (a) in any Civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners ; (b) in the Royal Irish Constabulary ; or (c) as Registered Copyists in connexion with the Civil Service, may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years which they may have spent in such service.

The marks assigned to candidates in each branch (except in Mathematics and English Composition) will be subject to such deduction as the Civil Service Commissioners may deem necessary in order to secure that a "candidate be allowed no credit at all for taking up a subject in which he is a mere smatterer."

4. Application for permission to attend one of these examinations must be made in the writing of the candidate, at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Commissioners.

5. A fee of £6 will be required from every candidate attending an examination.‡

- (2) That every successful candidate who may have been admitted to compete for both the Indian and Colonial Services will be called upon to declare, after the announcement of the result of the competitions, whether he prefers his name to remain on the list of candidates for the Civil Service of India or on the list of candidates for Eastern Cadetships in the Colonial Service, and that the name of any candidate who fails to declare his choice when called upon to do so will be removed from the list of candidates for Eastern Cadetships.

To facilitate the recovery of such registration fee the occupier of every house within the town shall, on or before June 1 in each year, furnish to an officer authorized by the Assistant Government Agent to demand the same, a list, in the form in schedule annexed, of dog or dogs kept in such house, and the names of the owners thereof.
4. On payment of the registration fee on any dog the Assistant Government Agent shall, unless the owner provides his own collar to be stamped, furnish the owner with a stamped collar to be worn by such dog on payment of a fee of 25 cents.
5. Every inhabitant within the town limits becoming possessed of any dog or dogs after the furnishing of the list referred to in by-law 3 shall furnish the officer appointed by the Assistant Government Agent mentioned in the said by-law with an additional list of such dog or dogs within one month after acquiring the same, and the owner of such dog or dogs shall become liable to the registration fee for the current year within fifteen days after the list required by this by-law becomes due.
6. It shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Assistant Government Agent to require the production of any dog for which registration is applied for, and to decline to issue a certificate of registration until it is produced.
7. It shall be lawful for the Assistant Government Agent to refuse to issue a certificate of registration or to cancel a certificate already issued for any dog, which in his opinion is so maimed or diseased as to be unfit to live, or which is habitually ill-treated or continually neglected by its owner.
8. The owner of every dog for which a certificate has been refused or cancelled shall, on being noticed to do so, produce the dog at the house of the officer appointed by the Assistant Government Agent at a time to be stated in the notice and deliver it to the said officer, and every such dog may be destroyed or otherwise disposed of as the Assistant Government Agent shall think fit.

THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR'S SCIENCE PRIZE.

This prize (value Rs. 100) will be awarded under the following conditions in the year 1903 :—

1. Candidates must be over 15 and under 19 on October 31, 1903, and must be pupils attending some recognized 'boys' or girls' schools in Ceylon, who have passed either the Cambridge Local Examination (Senior or Junior), the London Matriculation, or the Entrance Examination of an Indian University. The Cambridge certificate must include a pass in English. Birth certificates must be forwarded, unless they have been already sent to the Office of Public Instruction.

2. The prize will be awarded for the best original essay on some subject connected with one of the following Sciences : Botany, Zoology, Geology, Mineralogy.

The essay must in every case be accompanied by a small collection of illustrative specimens, or original drawings or photographs of specimens. The following are the kind of subjects which would be suitable : the life-history of a plant ; the life-history or habits of one or more species of insects, birds, or animals ; the geology or flora of a small district. Credit will only be given for work which is clearly the result of the candidate's personal observation. No attention will be paid to material taken from books.

3. Every quotation from books, magazines, or other publications must be enclosed in inverted commas and accompanied by a reference. A list of books and publications consulted must be attached to each essay.

4. All essays must be forwarded to the Director of Public Instruction by the Headmaster or Headmistress of the school which the candidate is attending not later than November 2, 1903. They must be accompanied by a certificate from the Headmaster or Headmistress in the following form :—

"To the best of my knowledge and belief this essay is the original work of _____."

THE SEVENTY-FIRST ANNUAL REPORT OF THE CEYLON SAVINGS BANK.

Board of Directors :

REPORT FOR 1902.

I BEG to submit for the information of the Directors and of the Depositors the Annual Report on the work of the Ceylon Savings Bank during the year 1902.

The balance sheet and statement of accounts now submitted furnish full information as to the amount of business transacted during the past year, and it is gratifying to me to be able to state that the steady progress in the business during past years has been fully maintained during the year under review.

The amount to the credit of depositors on the 31st December last amounted to Rs. 4,173,543, which is the largest sum since the establishment of the Bank, and is a clear indication that the main object of the Institution—the promotion of thrift amongst the different classes—is being surely and steadily attained.

- (1) *Accounts opened* show an increase over that of any previous year, and is in excess of the year 1901, which was one of the largest for many years past by 148.
- (2) *Accounts closed*.—The number of accounts closed has also increased. The reason of this was fully explained in my Report for 1901. A further reason for the increase is due to the fact that owing to the departure of two European and the native regiments at the end of the year, a large number of the men who had opened accounts during their stay in the Island withdrew their savings prior to their departure.
- (3) *Number of Deposits* have increased by 1,189 over 1901.
- (4) *Number of Withdrawals* is slightly larger than during 1901, and the reason given under head of "Accounts closed" may be taken as the main cause of this increase.
- (5) *The Amount Deposited*, which showed a decrease during 1901, has recovered itself, and now shows an increase of Rs. 112,096 in 1902 over that of the previous year.
- (6) *The Amount Withdrawn* has considerably decreased in 1902.
- (7) *Number of Depositors* shows a steady increase of 2,152 new depositors over the previous year, and is the largest number for the past ten years.
- (8) *The Profit* for the year under review has also increased; this is mainly due to the increase in the interest accruing from loans on house property.

Investments—During the year a sum of Rs. 46,560 has been lent on house property in Colombo, making a total amount invested to Rs. 494,557-80, whilst old loans to the extent of Rs. 26,114 have been repaid.

The sum invested in Indian Paper was Rs. 146,214-53 during 1902.

A large number of applications for loans had to be refused owing to the fact that all the available funds which the Directors are permitted to lend on security of house property under the Savings Bank Ordinance had been fully lent.
