*Bay of Bengal—Burma Coast—Rangoon River—Spit
Lightvessel replaced.*

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 351, dated December 13, 1902, issued by this office, a telegraphic communication has been received from the Principal Port Officer, Burma, stating that the Spit lightvessel showing twelve-mile light has been replaced outside Elephant point, 200 ft., S. 19° W. of former position. The temporary light has been withdrawn.

*Korea, West Coast—Mokpho Approach—Barren Group—
Shoal to the South-Westward.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 89 of 1903) of the existence of a sandy shoal, with a least depth of 1½ fathom over it in the approach to Mokpho. From it the summit (295 ft.) of the westernmost of the Barren islands bears N. 31° E., distance 1½ mile, and Fire island summit (817 ft.) S. 74° E.

*Japan—Yezo Island, West Coast—Oterranai (Otaru)
Anchorage—Breakwater extended—Buoy.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 90 of 1903) that the breakwater which is being constructed from Pondomari, Oterranai or Otaru anchorage, has been extended in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 7 cables, and that a red buoy exhibiting two red fixed lights has been moored to mark the extremity of this extension. From it Suitengu Yama bears S. 57° W., distant $9\frac{1}{2}$ cables, and Hiraio Misaki S. 22° E.

Approximate position: lat. $43^{\circ} 12\frac{1}{2}'$ N., long. $141^{\circ} 1\frac{1}{2}'$ E.

It is presumed that the red conical buoy with topmark shown on the Chart $4\frac{1}{2}$ cables S. 28° E. from Pondomari has been withdrawn.

*China, North—Gulf of Pechili—Shantung—Chimatau—
Light temporarily exhibited.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 93 of 1903) that a white fixed light, visible from a distance of about ten miles, is reported to be exhibited from a brick tower erected on the westernmost of the three peaks on Chimatau promontory.

Approximate position: lat. $37^{\circ} 41\frac{1}{2}'$ N., long. $120^{\circ} 14'$ E.

This is stated to be a private light, and it cannot therefore be implicitly relied on.

*China Sea—Palawan Island—Altnacraig Shoal—Its
Position given—Washington Head—Shoal Sounding
given.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 94 of 1903) that Lieutenant W. B. Fletcher, U.S.S. Quiros, reports that his vessel, when in the vicinity of Altnacraig shoal, ran for a distance of $1\frac{1}{2}$ mile over shoal water, the least sounding obtained being six fathoms. When the ship was in a position from which East island centre bore S. 32° W., distant $8\frac{1}{2}$ miles, and the highest peak of Pulute range N. 72° W., a shoal head with apparently a depth of about one fathom over it, bore S. 45° E., distant three-quarters of a cable.

Approximate position: lat. $9^{\circ} 0'$ N., long. $118^{\circ} 19'$ E.

The western edge of the shoal appeared to extend in a south-westerly direction for about one mile as well as to the southward and eastward, and to be of considerable extent.

P. D. against this shoal on the Chart has been expunged.

Also, that a sounding of seven fathoms was obtained with Cape Washington bearing N. 87° E., distant $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles, and Lita Lita island S. $12'$ E.

Approximate position: lat. $8^{\circ} 51'$ N., long. $117^{\circ} 23'$ E.

Variation, 2° easterly in 1903.

Santapilli Light—Character altered.*

The Presidency Port Officer, Madras, has given notice (No. 4 of 1903) that on July 1, 1903, the character of Santapilli light will be altered from a white fixed to a group flashing light giving two flashes every ten seconds; also that the building on which this light will be exhibited is a cement tower situated S. 48° E. mag. from the present lighthouse.

The light will be 140 ft. above sea level and visible in clear weather at a distance of 18 miles from all directions seawards.

White Light exhibited.*

The Presidency Port Officer, Madras, has given notice (No. 5 of 1903) that, whenever information is received from agents of steamship companies that a steamer is expected after sunset, a temporary white light will be exhibited from the port flagstaff, Ammapatam, at the height of 46 ft. above high water, and visible five miles in clear weather.

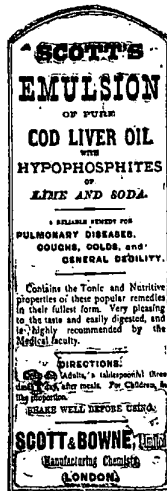

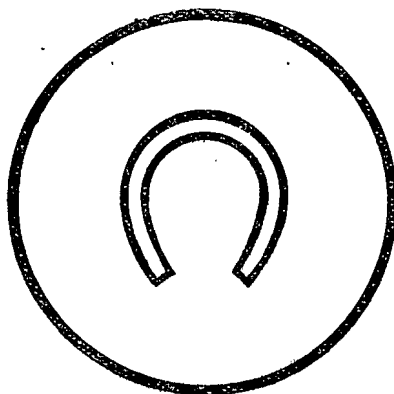
