India, West—Bombay Coast—Bankot—Buoy placed to mark the Channel.

The Bombay Government has given notice (No. 14 of 1903) that a buoy has been placed to mark the channel into Bankot on the following bearings:—

Gogul point bears S. 50° 45' E.
Beacon eastward of Ramkuran point bears N. 69° 15' E., distance 1 mile 1 cable.
Devgad point N. 9° 15' E.
The bearings are true and are from the buoy.

The British Consul-General at Bushire has given information of the following notice to Mariners, dated

December 10, 1902, having been issued by the Acting Russian Consul-General at Bushire:—

Captain Roizenstein found 8 fathoms shoal off Ras-al-Mutaf S. W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. from Funnell Hill summit, 224 miles. One mile north of this place there is on the English Chart No. 2,837C, 10 fathoms.
