MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on Saturday, December 20, 1902, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with Notice dated December 16, 1902.

Present:—Hon. Mr. J. P. Lewis, Chairman; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; W. D. Gibbon, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; L. Creasy, Esq.; P. T. Habesboo Lebbe, Esq.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on November 22, 1902, were read, confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1901 to November 30, 1902, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue, (No. 2) Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting), and (No. 3) Water-rate Accounts; Progress Report of Works done brought up to the same date; Health Officer's Report for, and Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during, the month of November, 1902.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's report be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

Resolved—That an extract from the Health Officer's report respecting the General Health be appended to the Minutes. (Appendix A.)

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries inspected during November and register.

Resolved—That the Health Officer be requested to furnish a special report in cases where a report has been made that there are no privies.

4. *Correspondence*.—The following were submitted and read:—

Letter No. 77, dated October 25, 1902, from the Chairman to the Colonial Secretary, asking for reduction of the annual instalment on loan for improving the road round the lake, on certain conditions, and letter No. 37, dated December 6, 1902, from the Colonial Secretary, in reply, intimating the sanction by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, subject to the approval of the Secretary of State, to the request in Chairman's letter No. 77 of October 25, 1902, that the instalment of the balance of loan for improvement of the lake and road round it be reduced to Rs. 2,000.

5. Letter No. 115 of November 12, 1902, from the Government Agent, reporting result of sale of the opium license for 1903 for a sum of Rs. 6,720, and which had been circulated, was laid on the table.

Resolved—That acceptance of the amount offered (Rs. 6,720) be accepted.

6. Read report by the Special Committee appointed on November 22, 1902, to consider the Chairman's Annual Report. (Appendix B.)

Proposed by Mr. Sproule, seconded by Mr. Vanderwall, and unanimously carried, that the report just read be appended to the Chairman's Annual Report and forwarded to the Colonial Secretary.

7. Read recommendation by the Special Committee appointed to consider questions connected with water supply: that the following applications for house service pipes be granted:—

1. R. Gordon, No. 24, Colombo road.
2. Dada Mohamado, Nos. 232 and 233, Colombo street.
3. Diyawadana Nilame, Maligawa premises, new building.
4. S. Anappa, No. 1,053, Peradeniya road.
5. T. B. Panabokke, No. 53, Castle Hill street.
6. Sera Mudali Saibo, No. 199, Colombo street.
7. O. L. M. Mohamado Cassim, No. 35, King street.
8. O. L. M. Mohamado Cassim, No. 163, Colombo street.
9. Mrs. E. C. de Alwis, No. 88, Brownrigg street.
10. Bibile Bandara Menika, No. 58, Trincomalee street.
11. M. B. Dullewe, No. 83, Castle Hill street.

On the condition—

- (1) That Nos. 2 to 11 have half-inch pipes with one tap.
- (2) That a meter be fixed on each service, and a charge made for use of meter and for water consumed in excess of allowance.
- (3) That the tap be fixed at a height not exceeding 2 ft. above the floor level.

8. Recommendation by the same Special Committee that a meter be fixed on house service pipes to premises No. 202, Colombo street, as the occupier allows the occupants of neighbouring premises to draw water from his premises. Recommendation made on report of Chief Inspector, who had prosecuted the occupier of No. 202.

Resolved—That prosecution be proceeded with against occupier of No. 202 and brought to a conclusion, and that in the meantime the recommendation stand over.

9. Resolved—That the offer of Muruga Sinnan, owner of premises No. 72, Castle Hill street, to the increase of the assessment of his premises to Rs. 170 be allowed, as recommended by the Special Committee on water supply, and that his application for house service pipes to his premises be granted on same condition as previous application.

10. Supplemental Budget, a copy of which had been sent to each Member, was submitted and considered, and adopted as follows :—

11. Read letter dated December 13, 1902, from Mr. L. Vanderstraaten, Accountant, in reply to memorandum No. 2,364 of December 4, 1902, written in accordance with resolution under Minute 11 of the Meeting of November 22, 1902.

APPENDIX B.

REPORT OF THE SPECIAL COMMITTEE.

Report of the Special Committee appointed to consider and report on the Chairman's Administration Report for the year 1901.

1.—*Limits of the Municipality.*

Your Committee are glad to hear that the limits have now been defined, and suggest that early steps may be taken to issue a correct up-to-date Municipal map of Kandy on a scale of one inch to the mile and ward maps on a scale of one inch to the chain for general information.

2.—*Clerical Staff.*

The Committee trust that now the clerical establishment is put on a satisfactory basis, the numerous applications for increase of salary or extra work may cease.

3.—*Municipal Works.*

We suggest that the numerous timber covers of the manholes along the various streets may be converted by degrees into up-to-date iron manhole covers, and at least half of the present openings may be dispensed with. The Committee desire to draw attention to the inefficient condition of the street drainage and to recommend that ordinary open cement concrete drains may be extended by degrees throughout the town, and that one street should be completed before commencing another. Ordinary stopcocks to be provided to all watering standposts in order to stop the excessive waste of water that takes place from time to time, due to defects in the taps. The Committee feel bound to draw attention to the rapid silting up of the lake, due to want of proper means to catch the silt before it enters the lake.

The two main silt traps should be emptied at least twice in the year, and the acquisition of such paddy fields as may be required at the head of the lake to deposit the silt with a view to convert the space into public gardens in the future.

Victoria Drive.—The Committee strongly urge that the bridge over the spill of the lake at the junction of the Castle Hill road should be widened out to 30 ft., and the circular steps opposite the Queen's Hotel altered to widen the road 30 ft. from this point to as far as the United Service Library bridge.

Public Recreation Grounds.—The Committee hope that this important work may be vigorously pushed on:

4.—*Water Supply.*

The Committee recommend that His Excellency the Governor may be graciously pleased to have the question of the water supply for Kandy examined and reported on by the Director of Public Works with a view to supplement the present water supply, and to supply good drinking water throughout the Municipal Council limits.

5.—*Roseneath and amalgamated Estates.*

The Committee wish to draw attention to the fact that the profit to provide for the interest on loans for purchase of lands within the catchment area of the reservoir will practically cease at the end of this year, and that His Excellency the Governor should be approached with a view to reduce the rate of interest or repurchase from this Council the land over and above what is required for the catchment area.

6.—*Electric Light.*

The Committee urge that a proper apparatus to test the candle power of the electric light supplied by the Colombo Gas and Water Company, Limited, may be procured at the earliest possible date.

The Committee also recommend that alternative estimates for electric light or Kitson light may be framed and submitted to your Council for the extension of the light throughout the Municipal Council limits.

7.—*Sanitation.*

In view of the constant references made in regard to the sanitary condition of some of the alleys of this town, that His Excellency the Governor may be pleased to direct the Director of Public Works to submit a plan, estimate, and report for the removal of one of the alleys, and to provide in his estimate for compensation of land, &c., erection of a type design of a building that may be considered suitable for the purpose.

8.—*Scavenging.*

The Committee desire to improve the present system of dealing with the night soil by the introduction of incinerators in various and convenient places in the town, and to suggest that two incinerators may be at once provided.

9.—*Postal Facilities.*

The Committee draw attention to the fact that the promised increased postal facilities have not been carried out.

10.—*General.*

In conclusion, the Committee hope that they may be excused in bringing the following facts to the notice of your Council, that the town suffers from the want of a complete outer circular road. Kandy is acknowledged by tourists over and over again to be the most beautiful town of the East, and has in its vicinity the most beautiful Botanic Gardens of the world. It is difficult to believe that there is only one approach road to these gardens. The Council are unable, due to the want of funds, to construct the necessary drives, and the Committee strongly recommend that His Excellency the Governor may be approached with a view, in this particular case, to instruct the Director of Public Works to submit plan and estimate for the construction of the following roads :—

- (1) Peradeniya to Kotugastota bridge along the bank of the beautiful river.
- (2) From Katugastota to Lewella ferry, thence to the Kandy-Haragama road.
- (3) Peradeniya to Ampitiya *via* the reservoir, commanding the most beautiful scenery around Kandy.

11.—*Miscellaneous.*

The Committee, in closing this report, beg to be allowed to record their appreciation of the valuable and interesting Administration Report for 1901 of the Chairman of the Municipal Council of Kandy.

2. The Chairman, in submitting the Budget for 1903, read the following memorandum:—In submitting the Budget for 1903, I have to point out, (1) in respect of the general revenue, that the estimated revenue is Rs. 99,701. After providing for the cost of establishments, commission on collections, scavenging (Rs. 33,105.55), clearing silt from lake (Rs. 1,700), sanitation (Rs. 7,350), maintenance of ferry boats and approaches (Rs. 2,008.50), Public and Volunteer band (Rs. 1,200), payment of instalments and interest on loans (Rs. 5,818), maintenance of market and lighting (Rs. 4,107), there is a probable estimated balance available of only Rs. 21,137. The estimates submitted for maintenance of streets, roads, paths, buildings, &c., amount to Rs. 24,050. It has been necessary to reduce several estimates as detailed in the schedule, and the total sum has been reduced to Rs. 21,122.

Estimates have been submitted for sundry necessary works, recommended from time to time, amounting approximately in all to Rs. 45,000, such as drains round the market; concrete drains, Railway Approach road, Palace square, and other localities; renewing barrel drains in Colombo street; concreting pavements, Colombo street; retaining walls, Victoria drive and Lady Torrington road and Illukmodara ferry; repair of culverts, Halloluwa road; additional tanks for use of dhobies; survey of recreation ground; ventilating shafts on barrel drains and main sewer; repairs, &c., house of shelter (Deyannevela); new set of cooly lines at Bogambara; drains round cooly lines and latrines; improvement of market stalls; colour washing and repairs of the cemetery wall; and several other miscellaneous works. There is, however, no sum available to provide for cost of any of these at present. They are all necessary, and should be provided for before the question can be entertained of launching out into the construction of new roads and paths, which may be regarded as luxuries rather than necessities.

I am glad to state that it has been intimated that His Excellency the Governor has been pleased, subject to the sanction of the Secretary of State, to adopt the suggestion of my predecessor, that the annual instalment for repayment of the loan obtained for improvement round the lake be reduced by Rs. 2,000, on the understanding that this amount be expended annually for purpose of certain sanitary improvements, such as construction of concrete drains, pavements, barrel drains. This sum will in a small measure meet the cost of several very necessary works.

which will only clear off, or at any rate materially reduce, the existing debt on the account which at the commencement of 1902, was Rs. 12,109.23. This probable balance includes an estimated profit in working of the Roseneath and amalgamated estates of Rs. 2,000.

The Council then went into Committee and considered the Budget. (Appendix A.)

On Council resuming, it was proposed by Mr. Vanderwall, seconded by Mr. Sproule, that the Budget for 1903 be approved and adopted. This was unanimously agreed to.

Scavenging.—The scavenging of the town was satisfactorily carried out during the month.

Drains.—Virtually nothing has been done to the drains of the town since I have held the post of Health Officer; the surface drains are kept as clean as possible.

Water Supply.—Very good.

Alleys are still as they have been for years, and no improvement can happen until they are rebuilt on sanitary lines; they have been kept by the constant supervision of my Inspectors and myself as clean as such ill constructed buildings will allow.

Laundries.—Generally well kept.

Dairies.—All fairly well kept.

Bakeries.—Fairly well kept.

Market.—Generally well kept. On one occasion I had to report the market-keeper and his assistant. It was all that was necessary. I would still ask for Police supervision on Mondays and Fridays.

Cattle passed this Month.—Cattle, 498; buffaloes, 109; sheep, 146; goats, 250.

Slaughter House and Exposing Shed.—Well kept.

Cooly Lines.—Fairly well kept.

Boutiques.—Well kept.

Latrines.—Well kept.

General Health.—Good. Would compare well (and very well) with any home town, in spite of our overcrowded ill-built buildings and drainage system. One case of chickenpox (bad) has been reported during the month.
