## MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

## Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on January 10, 1903, at 1 p.m.

*Present*:—The Chairman; N. Dias Abeysinha, Esq.; D. G. Goonawardana, Esq.; Dr. E. Ludovici; C. P. Hayley, Esq.; F. Abeysundara, Esq.; and Magdon Ismail, Esq.

1. Read and confirmed Minutes of Meetings held on December 13, 1902.

The Chairman moved—That the Council place on record its appreciation of the valuable services rendered by Dr. Anthonisz for a number of years as a Member of this Council, and regret the severance of his connection with it. Seconded by Mr. C. P. Hayley.—Carried.

3. Submitted Time Table specifying hours for scavenging Fort and suburb streets.

Resolved—That the Table be circulated among Members of Council.

4. In terms of section 5 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1902 the Council proceeded to elect by ballot Members to form four Standing Committees; that is to say, (1) A Committee on Law and General Subjects; (2) one on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation; (3) one on Finance and Assessment; and (4) one on Municipal Works. The following was the result of the ballot:—

(1) Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects:—Mr. N. Dias Abeysinha, Mr. C. P. Hayley, and Mr. D. G. Goonawardana.

(2) Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation:—Dr. W. E. Rudd, Dr. E. Ludovici, and a Mr. D. G. Goonawardana.

(3) Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment:—Mr. N. Dias Abeysinha, Dr. E. Ludovici, and Mr. F. J. Pigott.

(4) Standing Committee on Municipal Works:—Mr. F. J. Pigott, Mr. C. P. Hayley, and Mr. Magdon Ismail.

Resolved—That the quorum of each Standing Committee be fixed at two. Provided that when two Members only are present and they differ in opinion the matter be postponed for consideration to a fuller Meeting of the Committee.

5. The question of purchasing or not Kitson lamps having been brought up for consideration, it was resolved that the lamp be returned at the expiration of the term of hire, and that the matter be reconsidered when improvements have been effected to the lamp.

6. Resolved—That Meetings of Standing Committees be held on Saturdays, the former at 1.30 P.M. and the latter at 2 P.M.

(a) Metalled 183 lines of road, used 504 cubes of metal; gravelled 38 lines of road; patched ruts, 203 squares and 1 line, used 109 cubes of metal; cleared jungle on sides of road, 444½ lines; trimmed and lowered sides, 3,033½ lines; cleared side drain, 1,118 lines; spread and rolled gravel, 70 squares and 12½ lines; patched wheel tracks, 8 lines; removed nine landslips, used 37 cubes gravel; lopped branches of trees, 76 lines; trimmed and formed road, lines.
