- (a) Metalled 183 lines of road, used 504 cubes of metal; gravelled 38 lines of road; patched ruts, 293 squares and 1 line, used 109 cubes of metal; cleared jungle on sides of road, 444% lines; trimmed and lowered sides, 3,033% lines; cleared side drain, 1,118 lines; spread and rolled gravel, 70 squares and 12% lines; patched wheel tracks, 8 lines; removed nine landslips, used 37 cubes gravel; lopped branches of trees, 76 lines; trimmed and formed road, lines.
