MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on February 25, 1911, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated February 21, 1911.

Present :—The Hon. Mr. L. W. Booth, Chairman ; Mr. E. Beven ; Dr. G. P. Schokman ; Mr. W. C. Price ; Mr. E. L. Wijegonewardana ; and Mr. V. M. Saravanamuttu.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on January 21 having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

Health Officer's Report for January, 1911.

Scavenging.—The scavenging of the town and its suburbs was satisfactorily carried out during the month.
Drains.—These were kept clean as possible.
Water Supply.—Good.
Alleys.—These have been kept clean as possible.
Laundries.—Fairly well kept.
Dairies.—Fairly well kept.
Bakeries.—All fairly well kept. Three bakeries have been registered under the present bakery by-laws.
Eating-houses.—All fairly well kept.
Public Market.—Clean and well kept.
Exposing Shed and Slaughter-house.—Well kept. The unbuilt portion of the drain leading from the cattle exposing shed should be built with the least possible delay.
Night Soil Depot.—Well kept.
Public Latrines.—Well kept.
Food Supply.—Good and ample. During the month 514 cattle, 206 buffaloes, 114 sheep, 259 goats were passed and slaughtered. 7 head of cattle, 3 buffaloes, 3 sheep, and 9 goats were rejected.
 The following organs were condemned and buried:—Cattle, 6 lungs; buffaloes, 1 lung, 7 livers; sheep, 2 lungs, 4 livers; goats, 27 lungs, 4 livers.
Public Health.—The health of the town was good. During the month 2 cases of chickenpox, 2 cases of enteric, and 2 cases of smallpox were reported. All necessary precautions were taken to prevent a spread of the diseases.

Abstract.—The inventor was granted a patent for a machine for making wire bound box blanks in 1897 under the number 528. No direct reference to that machine is made in the present Specification although the invention appears to provide an improved machine for making the same wire bound box blanks.
