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### MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, March 11, 1911.

The Council met this day at 2 P.M., pursuant to notice dated March 6, 1911.

*Present*:—Mr. C. M. Lushington, Chairman; Mr. D. G. Goonawardena; Dr. E. Ludovici; Mr. F. E. Abeysundera; and Mr. H. F. Tomalin.

The Minutes of the General Meeting of the Council held on February 25, 1911, a copy of which was sent to each Member, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of Council held on February 25, 1911, be confirmed.

1. Supplemental Budget No. 1 for 1911, as published in *Government Gazette* No. 6,426 of February 24, 1911.

Resolved that the Supplemental Budget No. 1 for 1911 be approved.

2. Hon. the Colonial Secretary's letter No. 1 dated March 4, 1911, delegating to the Chairman the powers conferred on the Government Agent under the provisions of section 17 of "The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Ordinance, 1909."—Read.

3. The following Extracts from Minutes of Meetings of Standing Committees on Municipal Works, Finance and Assessment, and Markets and Sanitation of February 25, 1911, were brought before the Meeting, viz.:—

#### *Municipal Works.*

(9) Report of the Superintendent of Works dated February 23, 1911, re repairs necessary to the autolux lamp, together with a tender from Messrs. Clarke, Spence & Co. offering to light a 500 candle power lamp, as an experiment for a period of three months for the sum of Rs. 37.50 per mensem; the lamp to remain the property of the firm; the charge per mensem to include everything, i.e., lighting, supplying of oil, upkeep, and supervision.

Resolved (1)—That the autolux lamp be returned to Messrs. E. B. Creasy & Co., and that their attention be invited to the guarantee contained in their letter dated February 23, 1911, that the lamp will last twelve months, and that they be informed that if the lamp is to be repaired and returned that the corroded parts be renewed with copper or brass; (2) that the offer of Messrs. Clarke, Spence & Co. be accepted.

*Finance and Assessment.*

(2) Report of the Superintendent of Works dated February 23, 1911, *re* repairs necessary to the autolux lamp, together with a tender from Messrs. Clarke, Spence & Co. offering to light a 500-candle power lamp as an experiment for a period of three months for the sum of Rs. 37.50 per mensem; the lamp to remain the property of the firm; the charge per mensem to include everything, *i.e.*, lighting, supplying of oil, upkeep, and supervision.

Resolved (1)—That the autolux lamp be returned to Messrs. E. B. Creasy & Co., and that their attention be invited to the guarantee contained in their letter dated February 23, 1911, that the lamp will last twelve months, and that they be informed that if the lamp is to be repaired and returned that the corroded parts be renewed with copper or brass; (2) that the offer of Messrs. Clarke, Spence & Co. be accepted.

(4) Application for an additional peon for the Municipal Office.

Resolved that an additional peon be allowed for work in the Municipal Office on a salary of Rs. 12.50 per mensem for three months in the year.

(5) Application from the widow of the late P. O. Wittensleger, Head Overseer, for a gratuity.—Recommended to Council.

(6) Hon. the Colonial Secretary's letter No. 22 of November 29, 1910, sanctioning as a special case the employment of Mr. H. F. Tomalin, Provincial Engineer, to supervise the work in connection with the New Water Supply Scheme, and to assist the Municipal Superintendent of Works for a period of one year from the date when the works are handed over to the Council at a remuneration of Rs. 100 a month.—Recommended to Council.

*Markets and Sanitation.*

(3) Papers *re* inclusion of dysentery as a notifiable disease in section 205 (1) of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910.—Recommended to Council.

Resolved that the Extracts from the Minutes of the Meetings of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Financial and Assessment of February 25, 1911, be approved, and that the recommendation of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation of February 25, 1911, be approved, with the amendment that whooping cough be also included as a notifiable disease.

4. Second interim report of the Special Committee re-appointed on January 23, 1911, to inquire into and deal with all matters connected with the New Water Supply Scheme.

Resolved that the report be adopted.
