The Council met this day, pursuant to notice dated April 3, 1911.

The Minutes of the General Meeting of Council held on March 11, 1911, a copy of which was sent to each Member, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of Council held on March 11, 1911, be confirmed.

1. Before the proceedings for the day commenced, the Council's permission having been obtained, the following matters were brought forward :—

- (1) The Chairman made a statement *re* the opening of the New Water Supply Scheme from the 1st instant.
- (2) The Chairman read a letter from Dr. J. H. Ebell expressing regret at his inability to be present at the meeting of Council and requesting that he may not be re-elected as he was proceeding to England on long leave from the 1st proximo.
- (3) The Chairman informed the Council that Mr. A. C. Hayley had tendered his resignation as he was proceeding to England.

(4) The Chairman gave notice that he would, at the next meeting of Council, submit the following motions :—

- (a) That this Council do place on record its appreciation of the good services rendered to the Council and to the public by Dr. J. H. Ebell in his capacity of nominated member and its great regret on hearing that ill-health has necessitated his resignation of his seat in Council on early departure for England.
- (b) That this Council do place on record the valuable services rendered by Mr. A. C. Hayley as a nominated Member of this Council since the year 1908.

(5) Mr. D. G. Goonawardena moved the re-election of Mr. F. Perera who had failed to attend three consecutive general meetings. Mr. F. Abeysundera seconded.—Carried.

2. Pursuant to notice Mr. D. W. Subasingha moved—That the Municipal Council of Colombo be requested to favour this Council with a statement regarding the most successful dust-laying experiment tried by them. Mr. F. Perera seconded.

Abstract.—This invention consists of a "runner" for a "wire shoot;" and of a length of wire spliced to the "shoot" near the terminal, fixed in the same vertical plane but not parallel to it and enclosing an angle between the diverging rope and wire. The runner is provided with two grooved pulleys, one running on the wire shoot and the other placed vertically below it, mounted in a frame with springs on each side in such a way that the pulleys can be forced apart but must return to their normal position of contact with the top and bottom of the wire shoot respectively by the action of the springs when the force separating them is relaxed. When the runner approaches the terminal of the "shoot" and passes the

splice referred to above, the pulleys are forced apart by the wire rope of the shoot and the wire spliced to it above or underneath and enclosing an angle, so that the runner is brought to rest by the brake action of the divergent rope and wire acting on the frame carrying the load, through the pulleys and springs.

The manner of construction of the runner is claimed, and in conjunction with the runner, the wire spliced on near the bottom terminal of the main wire shoot.
