MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, March 24, 1911.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated March 18, 1911.

L. de Mel; Mr. E. G. Jayewardene; Dr. David Rockwood; Mr. P. D. Khan; Mr. G. L. Cox; and Mr. A. J. Martin.

Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of March 8; 1911.

- (2) Provision of Rs. 1,500 in the Supplemental Budget of 1911, to meet cost of disinfectants for the Conservancy Branch, not included in the Budget.—Recommended.
- (3) Estimate for erection of Collector's Ticket Room, St. John's Fish Market, Rs. 511 50.—Recommended.
- (4) Fixing of fee to be charged for cremations at the Livermentu Cemetery, Rs. 5.—Recommended.
- (5) Continued employment of an extra cooly for the Kanatta Cemetery.—Recommended.

Report of the Special Committee appointed to consider what steps should be taken in connection with the Coronation of His Majesty King George V. was brought before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated. With reference to item 5 of the above report, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene moved that the Orphanage, Kotahena, Good Shepherd Convent, and Orphanage, Church of England, St. Margaret's, Polwatta, be added to the list of institutions, and that a sum of Rs. 100 be voted to each of those institutions for the purpose of a special treat, and also that the amount of Rs. 50 provided for the Leper Asylum be increased to Rs. 100,—Resolved that the sum of Rs. 3,500 recommended to be voted in item No. 6 be increased to Rs. 4,000.

Resolved—That the report be adopted as amended (copy annexed).

Atkins, Chief Assistant Resident Engineer, Colombo Drainage Works, be paid a salary of Rs. 800 per mensem from January 1, 1911, rising by annual increments of Rs. 50 per mensem, with a travelling allowance of Rs. 50 per mensem as at present, was brought before the Council, having been previously circulated.

Resolved-That the Government be informed that the Council approves of the recommendations of Mr. E. L. Mansergh that Mr. M. R. Atkins, Chief Assistant Resident Engineer, Colombo Drainage Works, be paid a salary of Rs. 800 per mensem from January 1, 1911, rising by annual increments of Rs. 50 per mensem with a travelling allowance of Rs. 50 per mensem as at present. Maximum salary to be Rs. 950 per mensem.
