#### MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, March 24, 1911.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated March 18, 1911.

3. Mr. L. B. Fernando moved that the recommendations of Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of March 10, 1911, be adopted. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.—Carried.

4. Report of the Special Committee appointed to consider what steps should be taken in connection with the Coronation of His Majesty King George V., was brought before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

With reference to item 5 of the above report, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene moved that the Orphanage, Kotahena, Good Shepherd Convent, and Orphanage, Church of England, St. Margaret's, Polwatta, be added to the list of institutions, and that a sum of Rs. 100 be voted to each of those institutions for the purpose of a special treat, and also that the amount of Rs. 50 provided for the Leper Asylum be increased to Rs. 100.—Resolved that the sum of Rs. 3,500 recommended to be voted in item No. 6 be increased to Rs. 4,000.

Resolved—That the report be adopted as amended (copy annexed).

5. Report of the Special Committee appointed to consider the Chairman's memorandum on the control of Drainage Works under construction was brought before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

Mr. H. L. de Mel moved that the report be adopted. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

6. Question of changing of financial year of the Council was brought before the Council.—Resolved that the financial year of the Council do commence from July 1, 1913.

7. Letter from Hon. the Colonial Secretary, No. 23 of February 24, 1911, inquiring whether the Council approves of the recommendation of Mr. E. L. Mansergh that Mr. M. R. Atkins, Chief Assistant Resident Engineer, Colombo Drainage Works, be paid a salary of Rs. 800 per mensem from January 1, 1911, rising by annual increments of Rs. 50 per mensem, with a travelling allowance of Rs. 50 per mensem as at present, was brought before the Council, having been previously circulated.

Resolved—That the Government be informed that the Council approves of the recommendations of Mr. E. L. Mansergh that Mr. M. R. Atkins, Chief Assistant Resident Engineer, Colombo Drainage Works, be paid a salary of Rs. 800 per mensem from January 1, 1911, rising by annual increments of Rs. 50 per mensem with a travelling allowance of Rs. 50 per mensem as at present. Maximum salary to be Rs. 950 per mensem.

8. Draft by-law to control the regulation of traffic on streets were brought before the Council.

Dr. David Rockwood moved that the draft by-law be adopted. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.

*Report of the Special Committee appointed on February 17, 1911, to consider and report what steps should be taken in connection with the Coronation of His Majesty King George V.*

The Special Committee recommend that—

- (1) The draft address appended hereto be adopted and presented as an illuminated address.—Cost Rs. 250.
- (2) The poor be fed and cloth distributed; Ward Members will undertake this work.—Total cost Rs. 1,600.
- (3) Gas Company be asked to submit estimate for illumination of Town Hall, Jubilee Fountain, and Vegetable Market, between 7 P.M. and midnight.
- (4) Secretary to arrange for decoration of Town Hall.—Cost Rs. 100.
- (5) Rupees 50 to each of the following institutions:—(a) Victoria Home for Incurables; (b) Home for the Aged; (c) Leper Asylum; (d) Orphanage, Kotahena, Good Shepherd Convent; (e) Orphanage, Church of England, St. Margaret's, Polwatta, for the purpose of a special treat.
- (6) Rs. 4,000 should be voted to meet expenditure.
- (7) The Chairman should invite householders to decorate and illuminate their premises. (Circular of June 18, 1902. Chairman to issue similar circular).

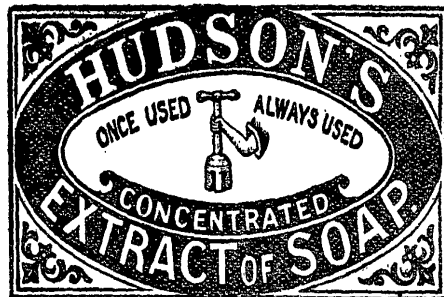
