MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, February 17, 1911.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated February 11, 1911.

Present :—Mr. K. W. B. Macleod, Acting Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias; Mr. C. A. Lovegrove; Sir Allan Perry, Kt.; Mr. H. A. Jayewardene; Major A. W. de Wilton; Mr. H. Tiruvilangam; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Mr. Arthur Alvis; Mr. H. L. de Mel; Mr. E. G. Jayewardene; Dr. David Rockwood; Mr. G. L. Cox; and Mr. A. J. Martin.

The Minutes of General Meeting of January 20, 1911, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of January 20, 1911, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice, Dr. David Rockwood moved that the question of leave pay and the distribution of available money among acting officers be referred to the Finance Committee to frame rules. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.—Carried.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. H. L. de Mel moved that estimates for connecting Municipal offices, buildings, and latrines with sewers be submitted to Council at an early date. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.

3. The motion standing in the name of Mr. H. L. de Mel was by leave of Council withdrawn.

4. The motion standing in the name of Mr. E. G. Jayewardene was postponed.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene presented a petition from Mrs. Amarapathy Ponnasamy, widow of the late S. P. Ponnasamy, Overseer, Works Department, and moved that the same may be considered, and that the matter be referred to the Special Committee on Works Department for consideration and to be dealt with. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.—Carried.

6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene presented a petition from K. Marthelis Perera, tea-seller, Base Line road, and moved that the matter be referred to the Standing Committee on Finance, and that the question of awarding his compensation be considered. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

7. The question standing in the name of Mr. E. G. Jayewardene was postponed.

8. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene moved for a return showing the number of properties sold by the Municipal Council during the years 1908, 1909, and 1910, for non-payment of assessment taxes, the return to give the following particulars :—

- Number of property and name of street.
- Amount of arrears of taxes for which each property was sold.
- The number of properties bought by the Municipal Council at such sales.
- The number of properties surveyed after such sales.
- The amount of survey fees recovered.
- How many properties bought at such sales have been retained by the Council as the result of such sales.
- The number of sales cancelled after the sale of such properties.

The Chairman informed Mr. Jayewardene that the return will be prepared and laid on the table.

9. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. G. Jayawardene asked whether the Chairman's attention has been directed to the fact that a patient in the Municipal Entéric Hospital escaped from Hospital in the month of January, 1911, and his corpse was discovered a few days after in the vicinity of the Hospital, and to ask whether it is true that during this time, when there were 12 patients in the male ward, there was only one attendant, and to move that the Medical Officer in charge be authorized to engage a sufficient number of attendants, as occasion demands, and that steps be taken (if not already done) to prevent a recurrence of the above episode.

The Chairman explained the matter and promised to take steps to prevent a recurrence.

- (40) Leasing of Victoria Bridge Toll Station at Peliyagoda.—Approved.
- (41) Authority required for the payment of Rs. 5 per mensem to the dhoby of the Enteric Hospital in excess of the sanctioned rate (Rs. 10).—Approved.
- (42) Conservancy Contractor's claim for Rs. 93.01, for extra men employed in consequence of the road to the night-soil depôt having been under water during the recent floods.—Approved.
- (43) Further employment of extra binder during 1911 on Rs. 15 per mensem, to be paid from Vote No. 6, "Extra Clerks," Finance Department.—Approved.
- (45) Transfer of Rs. 500, from Vote No. 37, "Contingencies," to Vote No. 45, "Destruction of Rats."—Passed.
- (46) Encroachment opposite premises No. 47, St. John's road, and disposal of it by Council for a sum of Rs. 750.—Recommended a lease if applicant so desires.
- (47) Authority to re-vote a sum of Rs. 450, value of "Underwood" typewriter, in Supplemental Budget, the amount not having been spent during 1910.—Passed.
- (49) Licensing of water fitting contractors.
- The Committee considers it is desirable that the law should be so amended as to permit the Chairman to require contractors to have licenses.
- (50) Letter from Mr. E. L. Mansergh, dated February 1, 1911, inviting the attention of the Council to the advisability of at once making provision for dealing with the sewerage of the areas recently added by the eastern extension of the Municipal limits.—Recommended that the eastern extension should be made an integral part of the present drainage scheme.
- (51) Question of leasing an encroachment on Municipal land at Welikada.—Recommended to Council that lease be granted (Council, and not Chairman, should be lessor).
- (53) Application from Mr. W. A. de Silva, Veterinary Surgeon, for 7 months' leave of absence to proceed to Europe.—Chairman to write to Mr. Seurgess and ask him to state exactly what the supervision will be, and whether he will undertake the entire responsibility.
- (54) Purchase of a "Remington" typewriter for the Sanitation Department, to be charged to Vote for Maintenance.—Recommended.
- (55) Letter from the Sanitation Engineer, No. 38 of February 3, 1911, requesting that the horse allowance granted to him and to the Assistant Sanitation Engineer be commuted, pending the purchase of horses.—Recommended that the allowances should in all cases be commuted, the officer making his own arrangements for his transport.
- (56) Employment of a peon for the Sanitation Department from February 1, 1911.—Passed.
- (57) Application from the Superintendent of the Fire Brigade for authority to expend a sum of Rs. 20 from Vote No. 3, "Uniforms, &c.," Fire Brigade, for payment of rewards to firemen for best kept uniforms.—Passed.
- (58) Authority to meet over-expenditure on certain votes from other votes from which moneys could be spared. (See annexure.) Financial Assistant's suggestion approved.
- (59) Authority required to reckon the leave (1 month and 9 days') taken by Mr. W. Ludowyke, Depôt Overseer, during his recent illness, as full pay leave.—Passed.
- (60) Retirement of Mr. J. A. Rodrigo, late Clerk of the Vehicles and Animals Department, and question of his extra half-pay leave.—Recommended.
- (61) Payment of Mr. Cox's expenses in England in connection with the selection of Assistant Sanitation Engineer and Drainage Inspector (£26 8s. 2d.).—Recommended.
- (62) Employment of 4 attendants for Revenue Inspectors at Rs. 12.50 per mensem.—Recommended.

13. Chairman's Memorandum on the Control of Drainage Works, still under construction, was laid before Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

Mr. Arthur Alvis moved that the matter be referred to a Special Committee consisting of the Standing Committees on Finance and Municipal Works, with Sir Allan Perry, Kt., and Mr. C. A. Lovegrove for report. Mr. H. A. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.

14. Report of the Special Committee appointed on January 20, 1911, to report upon the question of the inclusion of Wellawatta within Municipal limits was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated. Mr. Arthur Alvis moved the adoption of the Report. Dr. David Rockwood seconded.

Mr. H. L. de Mel moved as an amendment the following:—

While appreciating the utility of introducing efficient Municipal Government to Wellawatta, this Council regrets its inability to do so owing to heavy responsibilities already undertaken and its present financial position, and recommends that Government be requested to appoint a Committee to confer with this Council to consider (1) whether the present resources of the Council will permit efficient Municipal Government being given to Wellawatta; (2) what Crown land or betterment value of such land in the city Government is willing to give the Council; (3) whether a separate Municipality for Wellawatta should be established; (4) and in that event whether this Council should supply gas and water at a moderate cost. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.

On a show of hands being taken the amendment was lost by 11 to 3 votes.

The motion was then put and carried. Messrs. C. P. Dias, H. L. de Mel, and E. G. Jayewardene, dissenting.

15. Interim Report of the Special Committee re-appointed on January 20, 1911, to inquire into the further requirements of the Works Department, &c., was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

Dr. David Rockwood moved the adoption of the Report. Mr. A. J. Martin seconded.—Carried unanimously.

16. To consider what steps should be taken in connection with the Coronation of His Majesty King George V. on June 22, 1911.

Mr. H. L. de Mel moved, that a Special Committee consisting of the Standing Committees on Finance and Municipal Works with Dr. David Rockwood be appointed to consider the matter and report to Council. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

17. Application from Mr. Warwick Major to erect a temporary building at the Racquet Court to be used as a theatre. Resolved that Mr. Warwick Major's application be allowed.

18. Prohibition of the use of new road, Churchyard lane, Slave Island, by bullock carts, hackeries, motor lorries, and traction engines.

Resolved that the prohibition be adopted.

19. To adopt the valuation of properties contained in the Assessment Books of 1910, for the year 1911, subject to such alterations as the Chairman may, from time to time, find necessary in respect of the Slave Island Ward.

Resolved that the valuation of properties contained in the Assessment Books of 1910 for the year 1911, subject to such alterations as the Chairman may, from time to time, find necessary in respect of the Slave Island Ward be adopted.

20. Excess of leave over 30 days granted to John Perera, standpipe fitter, owing to ill-health from February 4, 1911.

Resolved that the leave granted by the Chairman be confirmed.

21. Excess of leave over 30 days granted to Thomas Cuyper, Petrol, Waterworks Department, owing to ill-health from February 4, 1911.

Resolved that the leave granted by the Chairman be confirmed.

22. Report of the Medical Officer of Health for fourth quarter, 1910, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.

23. Report of the Resident Engineer of the Colombo Drainage Works for the month of December, 1910, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.

24. City Analyst's reports on the town water for January, 1911, was laid on the table. The Bacteriological report for fourth quarter, 1910, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.
