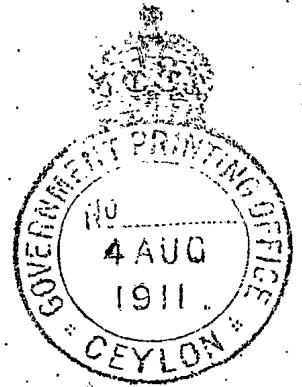

By His Excellency Sir HUGH CLIFFORD, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Officer Administering the Government of the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

HUGH CLIFFORD.

KNOW YE that We, the Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon, in exercise of the power in Us vested by section 1 of Ordinance No. 8 of 1911, intituled "The Ceylon Incorporated Law Society Ordinance, 1911," do hereby appoint and ordain that the said Ordinance shall come into operation on September 1, 1911.

Given at Kandy, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-eighth day of July, in the Year of Our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Eleven.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir HUGH CLIFFORD, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Officer Administering the Government of the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

HUGH CLIFFORD.

WHEREAS by section 94 of "The Road Ordinance, 1861," it is enacted that whosoever shall leave or permit to be left on any road to which the provision in sub-section (4) of the said section shall be extended as hereinafter mentioned any cart or other carriage without the oxen, horses, or other animals being yoked or harnessed thereto, unless such cart or carriage shall have accidentally broken down there, and in case of any such accident for a longer time than may be necessary for its removal, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 50: And whereas it is further enacted by the said section that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation to declare that the aforesaid provision shall extend and be applicable to any road in this Colony or to any section of such road, wherever it shall appear to the Governor and Council that a sufficient number of halting places has been constructed along the same:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Us, the Officer Administering the Government and Council, that a sufficient halting place as specified in Schedule B hereto has been constructed to serve the roads mentioned in Schedule A hereto in the town of Mullaittivu, in the Northern Province:

Now know Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government, in exercise of the power in Us vested as aforesaid, and with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Our Proclamation declare that the above recited provision in sub-section (4) of section 94 of the said Ordinance shall extend and be applicable to the roads mentioned in Schedule A hereto, in the District of Mullaittivu, Northern Province, as from and after August 7, 1911.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this First day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Eleven.

THE QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASES ORDINANCE, No. 3 OF 1897.

IT is hereby notified for public information that His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 4 of the above-named Ordinance, and with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to vary regulation No. 22 of the regulations dated September 17, 1907, and published in the *Government Gazette* No. 6,207 of September 20, 1907, by the addition thereto of the following regulation (to be numbered 22 A), namely:—

22 A. Every person holding such permit as aforesaid or holding a permit granted by the Chairman, Plague Committee, must inform the Health Officer at the port of landing of his intended place or places of residence, and must during such period as may be ordered by the Health Officer report himself daily to such officer as may be designated.

ORDINANCE NO. 1 OF 1871.

SCHEDULE.

SMOKING AND LIGHTS.

1. Smoking within the Customs premises is absolutely prohibited.
2. No lights shall be used except in glazed lanterns.

CARTERS AND COOLIES.

1. No person shall work as cooly or cartman within the Customs premises who shall not hold a permit signed by the Collector of Customs. Such permit shall be issued free of charge, and the Collector of Customs may for misconduct withdraw such permit either for a time or altogether.

Cart Permits.

2. No cart shall ply for hire within the Customs premises unless it has been duly licensed under "The Vehicles Ordinance, 1901," and carries also a permit by the Collector of Customs, Galle.
3. A tin plate bearing the Collector's permit number will be issued on application. A charge of 15 cents will be made to defray the cost of the tin plate. There will be no other charge.
4. The tin plate shall be affixed to the off or right side of the frame next to the plate denoting the number of the cart's license under the Vehicles Ordinance. If the original tin plate is lost, a duplicate will be issued on payment of Re. 1.
5. The Collector's permit must be renewed annually not later than March 31.
6. Application for a Collector's permit must be made to the Collector of Customs.
7. The Collector may for any misconduct on the part of the person in charge of a licensed cart cancel the permit issued by him and prohibit the entrance of the cart within the Customs premises for any specified period or impose a fine.
8. A Register of Cart Permits issued by the Collector of Customs shall be kept by the Head Clerk in the annexed Form A :—

9. Carters shall observe the Police regulations as to the rule of the road, and comply with the orders given from time to time by the Collector of Customs for regulating their entrance and departure from the Customs premises.

(1) All loaded carts must leave the Customs premises by the Barrier Gate, unless special written authority is obtained from the Collector of Customs.

(2) The Barrier Gate will be closed at 4 P.M. (Saturdays 2 P.M.), and may be kept open (on special application) till 6 P.M. for removal of import cargo.

Loading.

10. No cartman or other person shall within the Customs premises at Galle drive any vehicle carrying goods elsewhere than to or from a Customs warehouse, wharf, or jetty.

11. No cartman or other person shall transport beyond the Customs premises at Galle any goods without a note in writing signed by a Customs Officer describing such goods.

12. No delivery contractor shall be admitted to the Customs premises unless he shall have deposited with the Collector of Customs the sum of Rs. 100 as security for the performance of his duties.

13. No driver of any cart in which goods have been loaded from any warehouse shall move his cart from such place of loading without having in his possession a cartnote signed by the Landing Waiter, and no carter shall remove in his cart any goods other than those described in the aforesaid cartnote.

14. No carts shall be left on the road without their drivers, who should remain with their carts during the whole period they are on the premises.

IT is hereby notified under section 3 (1), Criminal Procedure Code, that on and after August 1, 1911, the villages named in column 3 and situate in the korales named in column 2 shall form and be within the limits of the Police Station named in column 1 of the annexed schedule.

"THE VILLAGE COMMUNITIES' ORDINANCE, 1889."

It is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 7 of the above-mentioned Ordinance, and with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to approve of the rules set forth in Schedule I. hereto made, under the provisions of section 16 of the said Ordinance, by the

Committees elected by the inhabitants of the subdivisions set forth in Schedule II. hereto in the Chief Headmen's divisions called (1) the Four Gravets and Akmimana, (2) Wellaboda pattu, (3) Bentota-Walallawiti korale, (4) Talpe pattu, (5) Gangaboda pattu, and (6) Hinidum pattu, in Galle District; (1) the Four Gravets, (2) Wellaboda pattu, (3) Gangaboda pattu, (4) Morawak korale, and (5) Kandaboda pattu, in Matara District; and (1) West Giruwa pattu, (2) East Giruwa pattu, and (3) Magam pattu, in Hambantota District of the Southern Province, in addition to the rules dated October 29, 1903.

NOTE.—Rule No. 74 A is of local application to the Four Gravets (Naimana-Makawita subdivisions), Wellaboda pattu, Gangaboda pattu, Morawak korale, and Kandaboda pattu of the Matara District only.

SCHEDULE I.

Rules.

69 A. No person shall keep a cart or carts standing on the roadside longer than is necessary for the loading or unloading of the same unless in charge of a competent person.

74 A. Wells and pits shall be enclosed by means of walls or fences not less than 2½ feet in height, and all abandoned wells and pits should be filled in or otherwise effectually closed up by the owner or occupier of the land on which they are situated within forty-eight hours after notice requiring such closing up is given in the village by beat of tom-tom at the instance of the Village Committee or the Government Agent or the Assistant Government Agent. The owner as well as the occupier of any land in which there is a well or pit not enclosed as aforesaid or not closed up after notice as aforesaid shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 20.

96 A. Whoever attempts to commit an offence punishable under any of the above-mentioned rules, or to cause such an offence to be committed, shall be liable to punishment as if he had committed the offence.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended July 29, 1911.

Births.—The total births registered were 84 (1 European, 5 Burghers, 45 Sinhalese, 15 Tamils, 11 Moors, 3 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1911, viz., 213,825) was 20.5, as against 23.6 in the preceding week, 23.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 186 (1 European, 9 Burghers, 90 Sinhalese, 52 Tamils, 25 Moors, 7 Malays, and 2 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 45.4, as against 37.3 in the previous week, 33.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.2 the weekly average for last year. The death-rate this week is the highest recorded since the third week of January, 1909.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 186 total deaths, 41 were of infants under one year of age, as against 33 in the preceding week, 30 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 27 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 4.

Selected Causes of Death.—As many as 23 deaths were registered from *Pneumonia* (against 17 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year), of which 6 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 4 each in Pettah and San Sebastian, 3 in Maradana hospitals, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena, New Bazaar, Slave Island, Kollupitiya North, and Kollupitiya South; 5 deaths were registered from *Bronchitis*.

2. Eighteen deaths were registered from *Phthisis* (against 13 in the previous week and the weekly average for last year), of which 5 were in Maradana hospitals, 3 each in San Sebastian and St. Paul's, 2 each in Kotahena, New Bazaar, and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and 1 in Kollupitiya North.

3. Ten deaths were registered from *Enteric Fever* (against 12 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year), of which 3 were in Maradana hospitals, 2 each in St. Paul's and Kotahena, and 1 each in Pettah, New Bazaar, and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals). There were 31 cases reported during the week, against 30 in the previous week.

4. Seventeen deaths were registered from *Senility*, 15 from *Dysentery*, 13 *Enteritis* (4 infants), 13 *Infantile Convulsions*, 9 *Debility* (7 infants), 5 *Diarrhoea* (2 infants), 4 *Worms* (1 infant), 4 *Malaria* (1 infant), 4 *Premature Birth*, 3 *Tetanus* (all infants), 3 *Ulcers*, and 36 from *Other Causes*.

5. Two deaths were registered from *Smallpox*, which occurred in the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Kanatta, of 2 Sinhalese, 1 each from Pettah and St. Paul's. There were 2 cases reported during the week, against 3 in the previous week; also 2 of *Measles*, against 4 in the previous week; and 4 of *Chickenpox*, against 10 in the previous week.

6. Two deaths were registered from *Cholera* of 2 Tamils, 1 in the New Bazaar and the other in the Infectious Diseases Hospital, a patient from Pettah.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82·6°, against 82·0° in the preceding week and 79·2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·865 in., against 29·890 in. in the preceding week and 29·857 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was nil, against 0·24 in. in the preceding week and 0·78 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
