By His Excellency Sir Hugh Clifford, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Officer Administering the Government of the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

HUGH CLIFFORD.

HEREAS the chief headman's division of Alutkuru Korale South, in the District of Colombo, Western Province, was by a Proclamation dated September 24, 1891, and published in the Government Gazette No. 5,091 of October 2, 1891, brought under the operation of the Village Communities Ordinance, No. 24 of 1889:

And whereas by a Proclamation dated November 4, 1910, and published in the Government Gazette No. 6.410 of November 11, 1910, the town of Gampaha, in the Western Province, belonging to the said division, was brought under the operation of "The Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance of 1892," and it is expedient that the same should be excluded from the operation of "The Village Communities Ordinance, 1899":

Now know Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government, in exercise of the powers vested in Us by section 4 (a) of "The Village Communities Ordinance, 1889," as amended by Ordinance No. 14 of 1893, and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, as from and after October 1, 1911, exclude the said town of Gampaha, in the District of Colombo, Western Province, from the operation of "The Village Communities Ordinance, 1889."

#### PROCLAMATION.

#### HUGH CLIFFORD.

WHEREAS by section 94 of "The Road Ordinance, 1861," it is enacted that whosoever shall leave or permit to be left on any road, to which the provision in sub-section (4) of the said section shall be extended, as thereinafter mentioned, any cart or other carriage, without the oxen, horses, or other animals being yoked or harnessed thereto, unless such cart or carriage shall have accidentally broken down there, and in case of such accident, for a longer time than may be necessary for its removal, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 50:

And whereas by the said section it is further enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation, to declare that the aforesaid provision shall extend and be applicable to any road in this Colony, or to any section of such road, whenever it shall appear to the Governor and Council that a sufficient number of halting places has been constructed along the same:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Us, the Officer Administering the Government and Council, that a sufficient halting place or "gala" has been constructed about a quarter of a mile from Waga station, along the road from Labugama to Hanwella, in the Colombo District, Western Province:

Now know Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon, in exercise of the power in Us vested as aforesaid, and with the advice aforesaid, do hereby declare that the above-recited provision in sub-section (4) of section 94 of the said Ordinance shall, as from and after the date hereof, extend and be applicable to the road hereinbefore mentioned.

And We do in all other respects confirm the said Proclamations of January 12, 1893.

The Right Hon. L. HARCOURT, M.P., to the OFFICER ADMINISTERING THE GOVERNMENT OF CEYLON.

Ceylon.—Miscellaneous.

Downing street, August 17, 1911.

SIR,—I HAVE the honour to express to you the gratification of His Majesty's Government at receiving representatives of the Military Forces of the Oversea Dominions for the purpose of taking part in the Coronation festivities which have just terminated.

- 2. His Majesty's Government feel that the association of the Contingents in London had a good effect in bringing together officers and men from the widely severed portions of the Empire.
- 3. A most favourable impression was created by the appearance of the Troops on the Coronation days, as well as at the Parade to St. Paul's Cathedral on June 18, and also at the Parade on June 30, when His Majesty was pleased to present them with the Coronation Medal.
- 4. Much interest was caused by the inspections made by His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales; by Lord Haldane, the Secretary of State for War; and by Viscount Kitchener of Khartoum, Field Marshal, Commanding the Coronation Troops.
- 5. His Majesty's Government trusts that the troops will carry back with them a pleasant recollection of their visit.

#### VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended September 2, 1911.

-The total births registered were 94 (3 Europeans, 4 Burghers, 60 Sinhalese, 10 Tamils, 10 Moors, 5 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1911, viz., 213,825) was 22.9, as against 20.5 in the preceding week, 21.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 157 (1 European, 13 Burghers, 69 Sinhalese, 39 Tamils, 27 Moors, 3 Malays, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 38.3, as against 39.0 in the previous week, 33.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 157 total deaths, 36 were of infants under one year of age, as against 32 in the preceding week, 28 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 27 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

Selected Causes of Death.—Twenty deaths were registered from Phthisis (against 15 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year), of which 5 each were in St. Paul's and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 3 in Maradana hospitals, 2 each in New Bazaar, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya South, and 1 in Kotahena.

- 2. Sixteen deaths were registered from *Pneumonia* (against 19 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year), of which 5 were in St. Paul's, 4 in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 3 in Maradana hospitals, 2 in Kotahena, and 1 each in San Sebastian and New Bazaar. Four deaths were registered from *Bronchitis*.
- 3. Fourteen deaths were registered from Enteric Fever (against 17 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year), of which 5 were in St. Paul's, 2 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena, and Kollupitiya South, and 1 each in Pettah, Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and Slave Island. There were 41 cases reported during the week, against 31 in the previous week.
- 4. Fifteen deaths were registered from Infantile Convulsions, 10 from Enteritis (6 infants), 8 Dysentery, 7 Debility (4 infants), 6 Senility, 4 Worms, 3 Tetanus (all infants), 3 Meningitis, 3 Nephritis, 3 Puerperal Septicamia, and 41 from Other Causes.
- 5. One case of Smallpox was reported as in the previous week; also 13 cases of Measles, against 4 in the previous week; and 2 of Chickenpox, against 5 in the previous year.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 83.2°, against 80.7° in the preceding week and 80.6° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.854 in., against 29.832 in. in the preceding week and 29.906 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.03 in., against 1.22 in. in the preceding week and 0.33 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
