2. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover, and should be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Office of the Controller of Revenue, Colombo.

3. Tenders should either be deposited in the tender box in the Office of the Controller of Revenue, or be sent

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended September 9, 1911.

Births.—The total births registered were 102 (1 European, 11 Burghers, 48 Sinhalese, 19 Tamils, 14 Moors, 6 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1911, viz., 213,825, was 24.9, as against 22.9 in the preceding week, 26.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.6 the weekly average for last year.

The total deaths registered were 144 (0 Europeans, 9 Burghers, 68 Sinhalese, 35 Tamils, 25 Moors, 4 Malays, and 3 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 35.1, as against 38.3 in the previous week, 31.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 144 total deaths, 29 were of infants under one year of age, as against 36 in the preceding week, 19 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 27 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 8.

Selected Causes of Death.—Seventeen deaths were registered from Phthisis (against 20 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year), of which 5 were in New Bazaar, 3 each in San Sebastian and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 2 in Slave Island, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena, Maradana hospitals, and Kollupitiya North.

- Sixteen deaths were registered from Pneumonia, as in the previous week (against 12 the weekly average for last year); of which 5 were in Maradana hospitals, 4 in St. Paul's, 3 in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 2 in Kotahena, and l each in Pettah and Slave Island. Five deaths were registered from Bronchitis.
- 3. Seven deaths were registered from Enteric Fever (against 14 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year), of which 3 were in St. Paul's. 2 in Kotahena, and I each in Pettah and New Bazaar. There were 27 cases reported during the week, against 41 in the previous week.
- Twelve deaths were registered from Enteritis (including 2 infants), 11 Senility, 8 Dysentery (1 infant), 7 Infantile Convulsions, 6 Debility, 5 Premature Birth, 4 Nephritis, and 45 from Other Causes.
- One death was registered from Smallpox in the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Kanatta, of a Sinhalese removed from Moratuwa. Three cases of Measles were reported, against 13 in the previous week; and 2 of Chickenpox, as in the

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.3°, against 83.2° in the preceding week and 80.5° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.857 in., against 29.854 in. in the preceding week and 29.917 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2.95 in., against 0.03 in. in the preceding week and 0.35 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
