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### MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, August 12, 1911.

The Council met this day at 2 P.M., pursuant to notice dated August 7, 1911.

Present:—Mr. C. M. Lushington, Chairman; Mr. D. G. Goonewardena; Mr. H. M. Makan Markar; Mr. H. F. Tomalin; Mr. D. W. Subasinha; Mr. S. H. Titley; Dr. C. B. Lourensz; and Mr. C. E. de Vos.

The Minutes of the General Meeting of Council held on July 8, 1911, a copy of which was sent to each Member, were taken as read.

Resolved—That the Minutes of the General Meeting of Council held on July 8, 1911, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice the Chairman moved:—That this Council do decide that Mr. F. E. Abeysundera continue to be a Councillor, although he has failed to attend three consecutive General Meetings. Mr. D. G. Goonewardena seconded.—Carried.

2. Letter No. 16, dated July 15, 1911, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, sanctioning gratuity of Rs. 90 to the widow of Mr. C. L. Bogaars, late Waterworks overseer.—Read.

Mr. F. E. Abeysundera came in at this stage of the proceedings.

3. Letter dated June 15, 1911, from Mr. A. C. Hayley thanking the Chairman and Members for the resolution passed at the Meeting of Council held in May 13 last.—Read.

4. Papers re proposal to levy rates and taxes on all buildings, lands, and tenements outside police limits.

Mr. D. G. Goonewardena moved—That rates and taxes be levied on all buildings, lands, and tenements outside police limits and within the Municipal limits of the town from January 1, 1912. Mr. C. E. de Vos seconded. On the motion being put to the vote, eight Members voted for the resolution, and one (Mr. Subasinha) against it.

5. Papers re steps taken in connection with the destruction of stray dogs.—To be circulated.

6. Application from Local Agent, Ceylon Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, re erection of a fountain and drinking trough.—Read.

7. Letter No. 4,064, dated July 26, 1911, from the Superintendent of Police, Southern Province, with a statement showing work done by special staff of constables from January to June last in suppressing the nuisance committed on the seashore.

Resolved,—That copies of the remarks made by the Members of Council be forwarded to the Superintendent of Police for his information.

8. Papers *re* contemplated action under section 205 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, *re* phthisis. Resolved—That the memorandum drafted by the Medical Officer of Health be approved.

9. Papers *re* revision of Municipal by-laws. Mr. C. E. de Vos moved—That the drawing out of a complete set of by-laws with an index be entrusted to the Council's lawyer, Mr. H. A. Soerts, on a fee of Rs. 1,000. Mr. D. G. Goonewardena seconded.—Carried.

10. *Extracts from Minutes of Meeting of Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of August 12, 1911.*

1. Papers *re* amendment of by-laws 8, 9, 10, and 13, chapter XII., *re* dog badges.

Resolved—That the following be added to by-law 9 after the words "twenty-five cents per badge"—"the badge shall be issued free to such person if he returns to the Municipal Office the preceding year's badge," and that rule 13 be deleted.

Resolved—That the extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of August 12, 1911, be approved.

Dissent of Mr. D. W. Subasinha from the opinion of the majority in connection with item 2.

With reference to the decision of the Council at its last meeting to levy rates and taxes on all buildings, lands, and tenements outside police limits of town from January 1, 1912, I have the honour to submit this my written dissent from the opinion of the majority.

It was contended by the proposer of the motion and also by the seconder—

- (1) That it is intended to carry out certain improvements to the town, and that money had to be found for this purpose;
- (2) That the payment of these taxes was incidental to residence within Municipal limits;
- (3) That inasmuch as the people living along the road to the Government Agent's residence, though blessed with good and wholesome water, had yet to pay the taxes for the water supplied by the Council, the residents to be affected by the suggested taxation should not complain if they are required to pay the taxes without getting any benefit therefor.
- (4) That the Council was not bound to give a *quid pro quo*; more so because the residents in the Fort were once called upon to pay taxes on water unfit for human consumption.

In reply to these contentions I beg to submit the following in addition to what I urged at the time.

That the nature of the improvements to be carried out has not been disclosed; nor was it stated where and in which ward these improvements would be carried out. It was not argued that there is any urgency about these improvements. It will be unfair to tax people without first telling them more explicitly the purpose for which their money is asked for.

While conceding that payment of taxes is incidental to residence within the Municipality, I maintain that it also necessarily means a participation in the benefits accruing from such payment. It is contrary to reason to exact taxes from people and to give them nothing in return for same.

The Hirimbure Ward, which I have the honour to represent, will be affected by the intended taxation. The residents in this ward are the poorest within the Municipality. Most of them earn their living by having small vegetable plantations; there are in this ward several paddy fields. As is well known, there is very good water in this ward, but they have neither lighting nor police protection. I submit that to levy taxes from these poor people on their vegetable enclosures, on their paddy fields, on their small coconut plantations, and on their huts and homes, and to give them no compensating benefits whatsoever in return will be extremely unjust. The hardships suffered by the poor people along the road to the Government Agent's residence and by the unfortunate residents in the Fort in having had to pay taxes on water unfit for human consumption, and the maintenance of the Udugama road by the villagers of the Hinidum pattu (as mentioned by the Chairman) will in no way justify the infliction of the proposed taxes on the people of Hirimbure.

It was mentioned by the Chairman that it is hoped to give the residents of Hirimbure the benefits and privileges at present enjoyed by the residents within police limits. I beg to submit that they are entitled to know when this hope is likely to be realized. They should at least be given a guarantee that these benefits will be extended to them within a reasonable period of time.

In this connection I may draw your attention to an attempt made, I understand in 1906, to raise the poll-tax at present paid within the Municipality. The burden of paying this would have fallen on the able-bodied men only, and the increase suggested was one of 50 cents only. The Council, however, decided not to raise it on the ground, as I am given to understand, that the people would find it difficult to pay the increased tax. The burden of paying the proposed taxes will fall on all poor and rich alike—on men as well as on women, and on the weak as well as on the able-bodied.

I beg to submit that if these proposed taxes must be levied, the people should be given all the privileges they pay for, and unless and until the Council is prepared to grant them these privileges it will be unfair to levy these proposed taxes.

*William Murray Miller.*—“An apparatus and a process for curing and preparing rubber from the latex of rubber trees and of a process or means for regulating the temperature of the hot gas employed therein.”

*Abstract.*—The apparatus consists of:—(1) two kilns, one for producing hot gases (products of combustion of fuel) suitably mixed by the use of dampers with cold air to regulate the temperature, and the other to produce smoke; each provided with (2) a fan to deliver the products to one or other of (3) two long horizontal cylindrical chambers mounted on rollers and provided with suitable gear to keep those chambers rotated about their longitudinal axes. The process is as follows:—The latex is fed into the far end of either of those rotating chambers to an amount that will cause the latex to spread in a thin film over the internal surface of the rotating chamber. Hot gases are first forced by the fan through the chamber by means of a central perforated pipe to evaporate the excess of water; and then cooler gases, which may be mixed with smoke from the other kiln to dry and cure the deposited latex.
