The examination in the Criminal Procedure Code prescribed under the Minute of March 26, 1900, for officers in the Fourth Class of the Civil Service, will also be held on January 16, 1912, as well as at the Kandy Kachcheri.

It is also hereby notified that candidates will be given the option of using Codes in the examination in the Criminal Procedure Code and the Penal Code; they must, however, state when sending in their names what their decision is, as the character of the papers set for those who use Codes and those who do not will be different.

The examination for officers in the Police Department, and the viva voce examination in the native languages for officers in the Public Works Department, the Irrigation Department, the Forest Department, and the Railway Department, will be held at the same time and place.

Candidates are required to send in their names not later than December 31, 1912.

Gentlemen in the Civil Service should state in their applications whether they are presenting themselves for the first or second examination, and whether they intend taking up Sinhalese or Tamil, and whether they wish to have the option of using Codes.

Rules for the Cadet Battalion of the Ceylon Light Infantry.

- 1. The Cadet Battalion will from and after September 1, 1910, consist of school boys between the ages of 12 and 16.
- 2. The training of the battalion will be confined to squad drill without arms and to physical drills and Swedish exercises as taught in the Royal Navy and British Army; dumb bells, Indian clubs, and bar bells will not be used. The cadets will be taught to shoot with the miniature rifle at "Solano" targets when available.
- 3. (i.) Government will allow to each approved school or college a capitation grant out of the Education Vote for every boy in the school or college who is passed by the inspecting officer as efficient, provided that the number so passed exceeds a certain percentage of boys between the ages of 12 and 16 at the beginning of the Cadet Corps year, which percentage will be fixed for each institution by the Director of Public Instruction after consultation with the head of the school or college.
- (ii.) The standard of efficiency to be reached before the capitation grant is payable will be--

(a) For Boys under 14.

(1) Fifty drills for the year, each lasting not less than one hour.

(2) A thorough knowledge of squad drill.

- (3) One route march test at the end of the year's training. Distance not less than five miles; time limit, including halts, two hours.
- . (4) Judging distance test as laid down in Musketry Regulations, 1909.

(b) For Boys over 14.

(1) Fifty drills' for the year, each lasting not less than one hour.

(2) A thorough knowledge of squad drill and map reading.

(3) One route march test at the end of the year's training. Distance eight miles; time limit, including halts, three hours.

(4) Musketry: annual course.

- (5) Judging distance test as laid down in Musketry Regulations, 1909.
- 4. The capitation grant shall be utilized to defray the cost of uniforms (as laid down in paragraph 5) and the pay of instructors. Where necessary any funds required will be advanced by Government in the first instance.
- 5. The uniform of the Cadet Battalion will consist of a single terai or slouch hat, haversack, football jersey with distinctive school badge, khaki short trousers with knickerbocker stockings. The hat, jersey and badge, and haversack will be provided out of the capitation grant.
- 6. One of the masters of the school or college will act as Company Commander of each school company. No boys will be given military titles and distinctions other than those of "sergeant" and "corporal." The uniform of the Company Commander will be khaki with Sam Browne sword belt.
- 7. The Cadet Battalion will not attend any camp of exercise. Route marching will form an important part of its training; and whenever possible the band of the Ceylon Volunteer Force will be made available for route marches.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended November 25, 1911.

Births.—The total births registered were 103 (1 European, 6 Burghers, 63 Sinhalese, 14 Tamils, 12 Moors, 6 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1,1911, viz., 213,825) was 25·1, as against 28·0 in the preceding week, 31·5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25·6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 151 (1 European, 13 Burghers, 66 Sinhalese, 36 Tamils, 28 Moors, 2 Malays, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 36.8, as in the previous week, against 31.5 in the corresponding week of last year and 31.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 151 total deaths, 34 were of infants under one year of age, as against 49 in the preceding week, 32 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 27 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 10.

Selected Causes of Death.—Seventeen deaths were registered from Phthisis, as in the previous week (against 13 the weekly average for last year), of which 5 were in Maradana hospitals, 3 each in St. Paul's, New Bazaar, and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and 1 each in San Sebastian, Ketahena, and Kollupitiya South.

- 2. Fourteen deaths were registered from *Pneumonia* (against 18 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year), of which 7 were in Kotahena, 3 in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 2 in Pettah, and 1 each in Sain Sebastian and Maradana hospitals. Six deaths were registered from *Bronchitis*.
- 3. Six deaths were registered from *Enteric Fever* (against 5 in the previous week and the weekly average for last year), of which 2 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and 1 each in Fort and Galle Face Ward, Pettah, Kotahena, and Kollupitiya South. There were 22 cases reported during the week, against 21 in the previous week.
- 4. Sixteen deaths were registered from Infantile Convulsions, 13 Dysentery, 10 Sentity, 8 Debility (5 infants), 7 Enterities, 4 Tetanus (all infants), 3 Worms, 3 Septicamea (1 infant), 3 Anchylostopiasis, 3 Heart Failure, and 37 from Other Causes.
- 5. One death was registered from Suspected Cholera of a Sinhalese boatman in St. Paul's. Ten cases of Measles were reported, against 14 in the previous week; and 5 of Chickenpox, against 9 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.4°, against 81.9° in the preceding week and 78.8° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.767 in., against 29.803 in. in the preceding week and 29.965 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1.71 in., against 2.63 in. in the preceding week and 0.26 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
