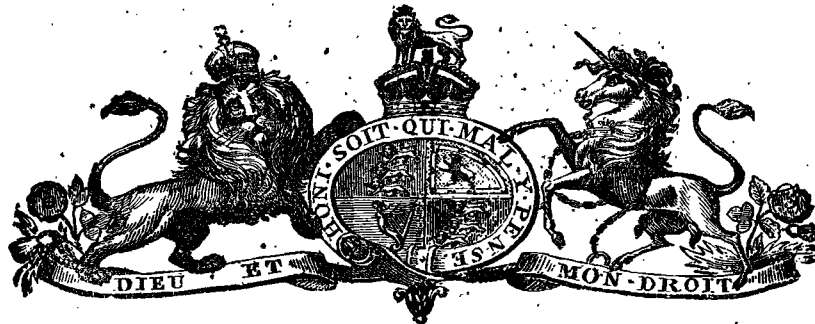

THE following rules framed under section 6, sub-section (8), of Ordinance No. 24 of 1889, by the several Village Committees in the Kegalla District of the Province of Sabaragamuwa, duly elected under section 16 of the said Ordinance No. 24 of 1889, and approved by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, are published for general information.

## RULES REFERRED TO.

*Section 6, Sub-section (8).—Prevention of Malaria.*

1. It shall be the duty of every householder to keep his compound clear of all weeds and brushwood within 20 yards of his own or of his neighbours' houses, and to remove and burn or bury all refuse, rubbish, tins, coconut shells, and other matter or receptacles which are likely to form breeding places for mosquitoes.

2. It shall also be the duty of every householder to fill in all hollows, holes, or other low places where water can collect and stagnate within 20 yards of his own or of his neighbours' houses on the receipt of a written notice from the Chairman of the Village Committee within fourteen days of the receipt of such notice. Provided that he shall have the right of appeal against the order contained in such notice to the Government Agent (or Assistant Government Agent). In the event of any householder failing to comply with such notice or to lodge an appeal within the said fourteen days, it shall be lawful for the Chairman of the Village Committee to cause the work of filling in to be done by labourers employed by the village headman, and to recover the cost of the work, together with reasonable cost of supervision, from such householder, in addition to such fine as may be lawfully imposed for the breach of this rule.

## RULES REFERRED TO.

*Section 6, Sub-section (8).—Prevention of Malaria.*

1. It shall be the duty of every householder to keep his compound clear of all weeds and brushwood within 20 yards of his own or of his neighbours' houses, and to remove and burn or bury all refuse, rubbish, tins, coconut shells, and other matter or receptacles which are likely to form breeding places for mosquitoes.

2. It shall also be the duty of every householder to fill in all hollows, holes, or other low places where water can collect and stagnate within 20 yards of his own or of his neighbours' houses on the receipt of a written notice from the Chairman of the Village Committee within fourteen days of the receipt of such notice. Provided that he shall have the right of appeal against the order contained in such notice to the Government Agent (or Assistant Government Agent). In the event of any householder failing to comply with such notice or to lodge an appeal within the said fourteen days, it shall be lawful for the Chairman of the Village Committee to cause the work of filling in to be done by labourers employed by the village headman, and to recover the cost of the work, together with reasonable cost of supervision, from such householder, in addition to such fine as may be lawfully imposed for the breach of this rule.

## THE CEYLON RAILWAYS ORDINANCE, NO. 9 OF 1902.

## RULE REFERRED TO.

62. No person shall open, by the use of a key or any other means, the door of a locked railway carriage or any other locked railway vehicle, or shall open any locked door or gate giving access to or from any railway premises, or shall enter or quit or shall attempt to enter or quit any railway vehicle or railway premises by getting through windows or climbing over doors, gates, or fences, or other barriers which have been placed by the railway authorities to prevent unlawful exit from or entrance to railway vehicles or premises, or shall break down or damage any railway door, gate, fence, or other barrier.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended December 2, 1911.

**Births.**—The total births registered were 99 (0 Europeans, 12 Burghers, 57 Sinhalese, 11 Tamils, 14 Moors, 0 Malays, and 5 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1911, viz., 213,825) was 24.1, as against 25.1 in the preceding week, 30.2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.6 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 181 (3 Europeans, 8 Burghers, 94 Sinhalese, 44 Tamils, 25 Moors, 2 Malays, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 44.1, as against 36.8 in the previous week, 29.2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.2 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 181 total deaths, 44 were of infants under one year of age, as against 34 in the preceding week, 28 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 27 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

**Selected Causes of Death.**—As many as 20 deaths were registered from *Pneumonia* (against 14 the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year), of which 6 were in New Bazaar, 3 each in St. Paul's and Kotahena, 2 each in Maradana hospitals and Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), and 1 each in Pettah, Slave Island, Kollupitiya North, and Kollupitiya South. Ten deaths were registered from *Bronchitis*.

2. Seventeen deaths were registered from *Phthisis*, as in the two previous weeks (against 13 the weekly average for last year), of which 5 were in Kotahena, 4 in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 3 each in St. Paul's and Maradana hospitals, and 2 in New Bazaar.

3. Nine deaths were registered from *Enteric Fever* (against 6 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year), of which 4 were in Maradana (exclusive of hospitals), 3 in Kotahena, and 1 each in Fort and Galle Face Ward and San Sebastian. There were 13 cases reported during the week, against 22 in the previous week.

4. Fourteen deaths were registered from *Enteritis* (including 1 infant), 13 *Infantile Convulsions*, 7 *Dysentery*, 7 *Tetanus* (6 infants), 7 *Debility* (3 infants), 6 *Senility*, 4 *Diarrhoea*, 3 each from *Malaria*, *Malarial Cachexia*, *Valvular Disease of the Heart*, *Puerperal Septicæmia*, *Premature Birth*, and *Want of Breast Milk*, and 49 from *Other Causes*.

5. One death was registered from *Beri-Beri* in St. Paul's of a Pattani fireman belonging to ss. Clan Sutherland.

6. Five cases of *Measles* were reported during the week, against 10 in the previous week; and 6 of *Chickenpox*, against 5 in the previous week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 80.1°, against 80.4° in the preceding week and 78.4° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.856 in., against 29.767 in. in the preceding week and 29.948 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was nil, against 1.71 in. in the preceding week and 0.19 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
