MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Special Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on August 12, 1911, at 8.15 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated August 7, 1911.

Present:—The Hon. Mr. C. S. Vaughan, Chairman; Mr. E. Beven; Mr. V. M. Saravanamuttu; Mr. R. W. Jonklaas; Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardene; Dr. G. P. Schokman; and Mr. W. C. Price.

Papers re the proposed extensions and alterations to the Queen's Hotel.

Mr. Beven moved—That the land at present held by the Hotels Company be leased to them on fresh deeds with plans attached, and that the amended plan of the buildings be approved.

Mr. Saravanamuttu seconded.

The Chairman moved as an amendment—That a plan of the land claimed by the Municipality be submitted to the Kandy Hotels Company, and that the Company be informed that the plans of the proposed extensions and alterations to the Queen's Hotel, now under consideration, are not approved in so far as they encroach on the land claimed by the Council.

Also that, in the event of subsequent alterations to buildings now standing on land claimed by the Council, no further building will be permitted on such land.

Dr. Schokman seconded.

The amendment was put to the Meeting and carried by 4 to 3. Ayes:—The Chairman; Dr. Schokman; Mr. Price; Mr. Wijegoonewardene. Noes: Mr. Beven; Mr. Jonklaas; Mr. Saravanamuttu.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on August 19, 1911, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated August 15, 1911.

Present :—The Hon. Mr. C. S. Vaughan, Chairman; Mr. E. Beven; Dr. G. P. Schokman; Mr. W. C. Price; Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardene; Mr. S. A. Owen; Mr. R. W. Jonklaas; and Mr. V. M. Saravanamuttu.

The Minutes of proceedings of the Meeting held on July 15 having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1910 to July 31, 1911, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue and Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting) and (No. 2) Water Rate Accounts.
- (b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's Report for July.
- (d) Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of July.
- (e) The Reservoir Readings for July.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, and the Health Officer's Report be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on Laundries, Bakeries, Dairies, Standpipes, and House Service Taps inspected during July.

4. Correspondence :—

(i.) Letter of August 10 from Mr. W. D. Gibbon sending in his resignation of his seat as a nominated Member of the Municipal Council of Kandy.

Mr. Beven moved—That this Meeting regrets that owing to ill-health Mr. W. D. Gibbon should have been obliged to send in his resignation, and desires to record its appreciation of the valuable services rendered by him to the Council.

Mr. Wijegoonewardene seconded.—Carried.

Copy of resolution to be forwarded to Mr. Gibbon.

(ii.) Letter of July 26 from Messrs. Miller & Co. re Council's claim of land on site on which the Company's new buildings are being erected.—Read.

(iii.) Letter of July 26 from the Hon. Secretary, Kandy District Planters' Association, thanking the Council for sanctioning the erection of a lamp on the approach road to the Hospital.—Read.

(iv.) Letter No. 17 of August 15, 1911, from the Superintendent of Municipal Works re the necessity for raising the salary attached to the post of Head Overseer.

Mr. Wijegoonewardene moved—That an Assistant Superintendent of Municipal Works be appointed in place of the Head Overseer on an initial salary of Rs. 1,000 per annum, rising after 3 years' service by annual increments of Rs. 100 to Rs. 1,500 per annum. Security to be furnished in Rs. 2,000.

Mr. Price seconded.—Carried.

(v.) Letter of August 17 from the Secretary, Kandy Hotels Company, applying for copies of correspondence between the Municipal Council and the Hotels Company re Council's lands occupied by the Hotel.

Resolved—That copies be furnished.

(vi.) Letter of August 17, from the Manager, Colombo Commercial Company, intimating that he is authorized by Mr. Mackwood, the Managing Director of the Hotels Company, to state that the present new buildings and subsequent alterations will be confined to the Company's land, so that the leased lands will revert to the Council, and pointing out at the same time that according to Mr. Mackwood's information the space between the lake wall and hotel land should be 59 feet and not 60 feet as claimed by the Council:

Resolved—That the space be taken as 59 feet instead of 60 feet as shown on the plan submitted with letter No. 1,750 of August 12/17.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. Beven asked—If a petition was received signed by 1,080 rate-payers on or about May 10, 1911, addressed to the Chairman, and, if received, why no acknowledgment or reply was sent, and to move for papers.

The Secretary admitted having received such a petition from the Chairman for report, and expressed his regret that through inadvertence he had failed to send an acknowledgment.

It was agreed to circulate the petition among the Members with the Secretary's report on it.

6. Pursuant to notice Mr. Beven moved—That application be made to the Governor to appoint an Assistant Chairman of the Council.

Mr. Saravanamuttu suggested that the matter be postponed for consideration at the next Meeting.

The mover having no objection this was agreed to.

7. Papers re the Perahera Booths.

Resolved—That the papers be circulated and brought up for consideration at the next Meeting.

8. Estimate for improvements to the Isolation Camp at Deyiyannewela, Rs. 1,550.10.

Resolved—That the estimate be sanctioned.

9. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

(i.) That only the appeal costs be paid in M. C. Case No. 17,302, against Mr. J. Ratnayake.

Finance and Assessment.

(ii.) That M. C. A. Samad be paid Rs. 89 as compensation for articles burnt by the Medical Officer of Health.

(iii.) That W. M. Muttu Carupen Cheffy be paid Rs. 15 for detention of two smallpox infected rickshaws.

(iv.) That four capes at Rs. 7.34 be obtained for the kanganyes under the Supervisor of Conservancy.

(v.) That Muttusamy, the market cooly, be allowed Rs. 4.50 as sick pay for June.

(vi.) That the annual value of No. 17, Lewella, be raised to Rs. 720.

Health Officer's Report for July, 1911.

Scavenging.—The scavenging of the town was satisfactorily done during the month.

Water Supply.—Good.

Drainage.—The drains were flushed and kept clean.

Alleys.—These were kept in a sanitary state as possible.

Bakeries.—Fairly well kept.

Laundries.—Fairly well kept.

Eating-houses.—Fairly well kept.

Public Market.—Clean and well kept.

Slaughter-houses.—Clean and well kept.

Night-soil depot.—Well kept.

Public latrines.—Fairly well kept.

Food supply.—Good. During the month 493 cattle, 135 buffaloes, 59 sheep, and 280 goats were passed. Nine head of cattle, 4 buffaloes, 5 sheep, and 5 goats were rejected; 4 livers and 7 lungs of cattle, 8 livers and 4 lungs of buffaloes, 3 livers and 3 lungs of sheep, 8 livers and 47 lungs of goats were condemned and destroyed.

Public Health.—The health of the town during the month was good. Five cases of chickenpox, 1 case of measles, 1 case continued fever, and 9 cases of smallpox were reported. Of the 9 cases of smallpox, 8 are concealed cases. All necessary precautions are being taken to prevent a spread of the disease.

Vaccination.—The total number vaccinated during July, 1911, is 1,769.
