MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, August 25, 1911.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated August 19, 1911.

Present :—Mr. K. W. B. Macleod, Chairman; Sir Allan Perry, Kt.; Major A. W. de Wilton; Mr. R. S. Templeton; Mr. L. B. Fernando; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Mr. E. G. Jayewardene; Dr. David Rockwood; Mr. G. L. Cox; Mr. Wm. Moir; and Dr. D. P. Banajee.

The Minutes of General Meeting of July 28, 1911, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of General Meeting of July 28, 1911, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene asked the Chairman to lay on the table a statement showing what the arrangements were that were made by his Executive Officers with regard to the conservancy of that part of the city which was affected by the gathering of people for the vel festival, and moved for papers.

Dr. David Rockwood seconded.—Carried. Papers were laid on the table.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene asked the Chairman whether it is true that the certificate from the Chairman required under section 192 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, to enable any person to occupy any building constructed after the commencement of this Ordinance, is withheld by him till the water-carriage system of conservancy is installed in the said building, and if the compliance with this requirement is to be made a condition precedent to the grant of such a certificate, asked whether there is any justification for such a procedure when there is not sufficient water at times in the city even for domestic consumption.

The Chairman replied that he hoped that the difficulty about water will be overcome by about the end of October.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene invited the Chairman's attention to the fact that on Sundays water is not available in the higher parts of the city, such as Hill street, Wolfendahl, Dematagoda, Kotahena, &c., and moved that the Chairman do give instructions that if it is necessary to supply the town with water direct from Labugama reservoir (and not from the Maligakanda reservoir, a process which leaves the higher parts of the city without water) that this should be done on any week day (preferably Tuesday and Friday) and not on Sundays, and with permission of Council, added the words "and that the matter be considered and some arrangement made if possible for the supply of water on Sundays from 8 A.M. to 12 noon." Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene moved that the Chairman do communicate with the Police Department with a view to the rigid enforcement of the by-law with regard to persons loitering on the streets after being warned to move on by the Police and that the police be directed to prosecute persons offending against the said by-law.

Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene moved that the Chairman do direct the police to prosecute drivers of hackeries drawn by bulls round whose necks are hung jingling bells and other noise-producing contrivances, which are calculated to terrify horses, the offence being in contravention of section 90 of Ordinance No. 16 of 1865, which provides for the punishment of persons who wilfully or negligently make any noise or do any act or thing in a manner calculated to terrify horses. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

6. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved that this Council do decide that Mr. A. J. Martin continue to be a Councillor, although he has failed to attend three consecutive General Meetings. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

7, 8, and 9. The following extracts from Minutes of Standing Committees on Municipal Works of August 11, 1911, on Finance of August 11, 1911, and on Sanitation and Markets of August 23, 1911, were brought before Council :—

Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Municipal Works of August 11, 1911.

(2) Estimates for the erection of the following public latrines :—Symond's road, Rs. 10,800 ; Quarry road, Rs. 10,800 ; Vauxhall street, Rs. 2,400.—Recommended.

(3) To sanction estimate for paving Church street with tar macadam and for laying in York street (between the Queen's statue and Main street) a hand rubble foundation with Val de Travers asphalt macadam, Rs. 35,306, and to transfer the sum of Rs. 20,000 required for the asphalt macadam from vote No. 266/07 to this estimate.—Recommended.

(5) Letter from Mr. P. H. Lanaway, Assistant Superintendent of the Fire Brigade, regarding his permanent employment on the expiration of his agreement.—Recommended that he should be offered Rs. 3,500 up to Rs. 4,000 by annual increments of Rs. 250.

(7) Authority required to expend the sum of Rs. 650 provided under vote No. I. 55 for the erection of a closet for visitors at Victoria park.—Recommended.

(13) Petition from the residents of Alfred place, Colpetty, requesting that the said road be taken over by the Council.—The Committee is of opinion that the land owners should approach the Council in the matter before the application is considered. The petitioners are only tenants and have no *locus standi* in the matter.

(14) Question of the salary to be paid to Mr. J. S. Speirs, Workshop Foreman, on his being taken on the permanent staff.—Mr. Speirs should be given salary as specified in clause XI. of his agreement. He must pass an examination in colloquial Sinhalese within a year from September 1 next.

Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Finance of August 11, 1911.

(2) Estimates for the erection of the following public latrines :—Symond's road, Rs. 10,800 ; Quarry road, Rs. 10,800 ; Vauxhall street, Rs. 2,400.—Recommended.

(3) To sanction estimate for paving Church street with tar macadam and for laying in York street (between the Queen's statue and Main street) a hand rubble foundation with Val de Travers asphalt macadam, Rs. 35,306, and to transfer the sum of Rs. 20,000 required for the asphalt macadam, from vote No. 266/07, to this estimate.—Recommended.

(5) Letter from Mr. P. H. Lanaway, Assistant Superintendent of the Fire Brigade, regarding his permanent employment on the expiration of agreement.—Recommended that he should be offered Rs. 3,500 up to Rs. 4,000 by annual increments of Rs. 250.

(7) Authority required to expend the sum of Rs. 650 provided under vote No. I. 55 for the erection of a closet for visitors at Victoria park.—Recommended.

(8) Draft Supplemental Budget No. 1 for 1911.—Recommended. The Committee considers that the present holder of the Head Clerkship of the Works Department should be given the initial salary attached to the post, viz., Rs. 2,000 a year from September 1, 1911, and provision made for the extra amount (Rs. 232) in the Supplemental Budget for 1911, in view of his having served a probationary period of six months and he being recommended as hard working and efficient.

(9) To sanction a further supplemental vote of Rs. 1,000 to vote No. C 2, Legal Expenses.—Recommended.

(10) Authority required for the purchase of drawing instruments and materials for the Waterworks Department at a cost of Rs. 750.—Recommended.

(11) Drafting of a complete set of new by-laws under the provisions of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910. Letter from Mr. F. Morgan de Saram, Advocate, accepting offer of Rs. 2,000 for the work.—Recommended.

(16) To sanction a supplemental vote of Rs. 500 to vote No. C9, Tram and Train Fare Allowances.—Recommended.

18. Employment of an extra messenger for the Veterinary Department at Rs. 12.50 per month until the return of Mr. W. A. de Silva, Veterinary Surgeon, from leave.—Recommended for three months temporarily.

(22) Letter from Mr. J. M. Blizzard, on the subject of payment of the premium for security guarantee. Question of payment of premium by Council in cases where no mention has been made in letters of appointment.—Recommended.

(23) Rinderpest at the night soil depôt. Quarterly inoculation of the cattle at the night soil depôt at a cost of Rs. 200, plus cost of carriage.—Recommended compulsory inoculation at the cost of the Council.

Extract from Minutes of Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of August 23, 1911.

(2) To sanction scheme of pay of apothecaries in the Municipal service as follows :—One special appointment, Rs. 1,200 to Rs. 1,440, by annual increments of Rs. 120. Pay of ordinary apothecaries, Rs. 600 to Rs. 1,080, by annual increments of Rs. 120.—Recommended.

(4) Letter from Medical Officer of Health, No. 170 of July 29, 1911, recommending that Dr. D. W. Perera, Medical Officer of the Slave Island Dispensary, be paid Rs. 1,000 per annum (the amount provided in the Budget) from January 1 of the current year. As the amount was voted by the Municipal Council for 1911, the Committee considers that Dr. Perera should receive Rs. 1,000 for 1911. It considers that the pay of Medical Officers should be on an incremental scale and that private practice should not be allowed. The Medical Officer of Health will prepare a scheme for consideration with the Budget for 1912.

(5) Employment of an extra messenger for the Veterinary Department at Rs. 12.50 per mensem until the return of Mr. W. A. de Silva, Veterinary Surgeon, from leave.—Recommended for three months.

(6) Employment of an extra female ambulance attendant at Rs. 5 per month and clothes.—The Committee considers that the occasions will be so rare on which the services of the proposed extra attendant would be required, that it is better to authorize the Health Department to employ a woman when one is necessary.

(7) Application from the Curator, Church of England cemetery, for an additional strip of land at the Kanatta cemetery.—Recommended that the strip of land desired should be sold to the Church of England authorities on the same terms as the Roman Catholic authorities were sold additional land allotted them.

(8) Rinderpest at the night soil depôt. Quarterly inoculation of the cattle at the night soil depôt at a cost of Rs. 200, plus cost of carriage.—Recommended.

7. Mr. L. B. Fernando moved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of August 11, 1911, be adopted. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.
8. Mr. L. B. Fernando moved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Finance of August 11, 1911, be adopted. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.
9. Mr. L. B. Fernando moved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of August 23, 1911, be adopted. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.
10. Letter No. 1,045 of August 18, 1911, from the Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, C.M.G., expressing his views with regard to the adoption of a southern outfall in connection with the Drainage Scheme, was laid before Council, having been previously printed and circulated.
The Chairman moved that the Council follow the advice given by the Hon. Mr. Cooper on the subject.—Dr. David Rockwood seconded.—Carried.
11. Draft by-law declaring the storage and manipulation of plumbago to be an offensive trade for the purposes of section 212 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910."—Resolved that the following by-law be adopted :—
The storage and manipulation of plumbago is hereby declared to be an offensive business for the purposes of section 212 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910."
12. To sanction the appointment of Mr. R. Nelson Watkins as Assistant Accountant.
Mr. E. G. Jayewardene moved that the appointment of Mr. R. Nelson Watkins as Assistant Accountant be sanctioned, and that the thanks of the Council be conveyed to Mr. Wardrop for his services in the matter.—Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.
13. Correspondence on the subject of the provision of motor cars for the use of Heads of Departments was laid before Council, having been previously printed and circulated.
The Chairman moved that the proposals of the Financial Assistant as set out in the Director of Public Works' letter No. 1,055 of August 19, 1911, be sanctioned. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.
14. Appointment of a draughtsman for the Municipal Engineer on a salary of Rs. 1,200 per annum.—Resolved that the initial salary of the draughtsman be fixed at Rs. 1,200 per annum with the usual increments allowed to draughtsmen.
15. Excess leave of 3 days, over 30 days, granted to Mr. W. B. de Saram, Revenue Officer.
Mr. L. B. Fernando moved that the leave granted by the Chairman be confirmed.—Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.
16. Excess leave of 15 days, over 30 days, granted to Mr. G. E. R. Goonewardene, Clerk of the Assessor's Department, absent owing to ill-health, from July 31 to August 14, 1911.
Mr. L. B. Fernando moved that the leave granted by the Chairman be confirmed. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.
17. Excess leave of 54 days, over 30 days, granted to Mr. C. W. Anthonisz, Clerk of the Public Health Department, absent owing to ill-health.
Mr. L. B. Fernando moved that the leave granted by the Chairman be confirmed. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.
18. Progress Report, No. 5 of the City Sanitation Engineer, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.
19. Report of the Chief Resident Engineer of the Colombo Drainage Works for the month of June, 1911, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.
20. City Analyst's report on the town water for July, 1911, and bacteriological reports for second quarter, 1911, were laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.
21. Statements of receipts and disbursements from January 1 to July 31, 1911, and progress report of work done for July, 1911, were laid on the table.
22. Reports of Inspectors on licensed carriages for July, 1911, were laid on the table.

Clemens Graaff.—"A method for extinguishing fires."

Abstract.—The inventor provides closed reservoirs or containers of extinguishing fluid, either fixed or portable, connected by pipes to suitable parts of a building or mine to be protected against fire, and to a suitable source for refilling those reservoirs with the fluid. To force the extinguishing fluid out of the reservoirs and along the pipes, a substance is introduced, at will or automatically, into the reservoirs, which when it comes in contact with the extinguishing fluid evolves gas and produces a pressure in those reservoirs. Or gas mixtures are exploded by ignition for the same purpose. The reservoirs are arranged in pairs or triplets so that as one reservoir is emptying the other or others are being filled and charged with gas evolving substance and extinguishing fluid.

Arthur William Alvis.—"An improved method of steeping indigo more than once."

Abstract.—The object of this invention is to allow a second steeping of the green indigo plant and so recover a larger percentage of the dye-containing sap. It is stated that previous failure in doing that is due to the destructive effect of the air on the exposed fermented plant when the liquor is run off after the first steeping. The inventor accordingly arranges the inlets and outlets of his steeping vat so that a fresh supply of water is admitted while the liquor of the first steeping is being run off; and so keeping the level of the liquor constant all the time; and so preventing exposure of the soaking plant to the air. He claims the construction and arrangement of indigo steeping vats as shown by his drawings and the arrangement of perforated inlet pipes near the top of the vat and of perforated outlet pipes at the bottom of the vat, with inlet and run off outlet at the same level near the top of the vat.
