The Council met this day at 2 P.M., pursuant to notice dated October 9, 1911.

Present: -Mr. C. M. Lushington, Chairman; Mr. H. F. Tomalin; Mr. F. Perera; Mr. S. H. Titley; and Mr. C. E. de Vos

The Minutes of the General Meeting of Council held on September 9, 1911, a copy of which was sent to each member. were taken as read.

Resolved-That the minutes of the General Meeting of Council held on September 9, 1911, be confirmed.

1. Papers re destruction of stray dogs at nights.

Resolved.—That Mr. Balthazaar be authorized to shoot stray dogs at nights and also to demand and inspect the certificates of registration issued from this office. If no certificate is produced by the owner of the dog Mr. Balthazaar should report the matter to this office, and if he is authorized to prosecute such owner, half of the fine imposed is to be paid to him.

2. Extract from Minutes of Meeting of Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment and of the Special Committee on Waterworks of October 14, 1911.

Finance and Assessment.

(8) Application for an additional peon for the Municipal office.

Resolved—That an additional peon be appointed on Rs. 10 per mensem.

The scale of pay in future for peons to be as follows:—Rs. 10 per mensem for first five years; Rs. 11 per mensem for next five years; Rs. 12 per mensem for 11 to 15 years; Rs. 13 per mensem for 16 to 20 years; Rs. 14 per mensem for 21 to 25 years; Rs. 15 per mensem for 26 to 30 years.

Special Committee on Waterworks.

(3) Appointment of an head fitter for Waterworks, at Rs. 480 per annum.

Approved.—The post will not be pensionable, neither will any increments be allowed in future.

This appointment will replace the fitter for private water service connections at Re. 1 50 per diem referred to in the

interim report of this Committee to Council on May 18, 1911.
